PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH (USA) RULES IN FAVOR OF HOLY UNIONS

On May 24 the highest court of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) ruled that the denomination's constitution does not prevent ministers from blessing same-sex unions and their laws do not bar openly gay men and lesbians from seeking the ministry. This decision will be discussed by delegates attending the General Conference of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) next month. The court's decision which will affect the 2.6 million members of the Presbyterian Church has been greeted with rejoicing by GLBT people and their supporters.

In his written response to the decision, the Rev. Elder Troy Perry, founder of the Universal Fellowship of Metropolitan Community Churches, states "It has been called by many 'the most affirming statement of gay relationships that has happened in the recent history of mainline Christianity.'" This ruling is in direct contrast to the actions of the United Methodist Church at its General Conference last month when the delegates upheld the decision to bar homosexual ministers and restated its belief that homosexuality is against the teachings of the Bible.
