California Bill Would Put Gays In Curriculum

California's Senate will consider a bill that would require schools in the state to teach students about the contributions LGBT people have made in history.

The bill, SB 1437, passed the Senate Judiciary Committee on Tuesday. It would require schools to buy textbooks "accurately" portraying "the sexual diversity of our society" and would require students to learn "the contributions of people who are lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgender to the economic, political, and social development of California and the United States of America."

The bill, if passed, could have a national impact, as California is the largest U.S. market for textbooks.

But the measure has drawn swift opposition.

"We're totally opposed to inserting sexual orientation into textbooks in our schools," Karen England, executive director of the public-policy group Capital Resource Institute, told the San Jose Mercury News. "This is more than just accepting it, it's forcing our kids to embrace it, almost celebrate it."


"This is not about discrimination. California is one of the most friendly gay, lesbian and transgender states in the nation," England said. "This is a bold and out-front attempt to do what I think has always been the goal of a small but very loud group." The bill's openly lesbian author, Sen. Sheila Kuehl, D-Los Angeles, rejects the criticism. "Teaching materials mostly contain negative or adverse views of us, and that's when they mention us at all," she said, noting homosexuality is routinely discussed in class in relationship to pathology. "In textbooks, it's as if there's no gay people in California at all, so forget about it." "Senate Bill 1437, as it looks to expand the list of categories to include sexual orientation, would be an important step for LGBT students and their allies in California schools," said Eliza Byard, deputy executive director of the Gay, Lesbian & Straight Education Network. "According to GLSEN's 2003 National School Climate Survey, we know that LGBT students have a greater sense of belonging when accurate portrayals of LGBT people are included in their school curriculum." Aejaie Sellers, executive director of the Billy DeFrank LGBT

Center in Santa Clara, told the Mercury News she thought the proposal was a good idea.

"Who knows," she asked, "that the author of 'America the Beautiful,' Katharine Lee Bates, was gay?"





Many Omaha area gay and lesbian homeowners who have had trouble with credit cards and so on have found that there is *one* place in Omaha where they can be treated with respect.


No "better than you" attitude, no "b.s.", no guilt just for being



Sexual Morality, Justice and Healing

(Omaha) The Rev. Debra W. Haffner, director of the Religious Institute on Sexual Morality, Justice and Healing will be the third speaker in the First Unitarian Church of Omaha's Holland Lecture Series on Wednesday, May 10. The lecture will be 7:30 PM at the Scott Conference Center.

Rev. Haffner will address sexuality in America, how conservative voices have dominated personal and public morality, and the growing progressive faith movement to reclaim sexuality as a life-giving and life-fulfilling gift for all people. The Religious institute calls for:

- A sexual ethic that accepts no double standards and applies to all persons, without regard to sex, gender, color, age, bodily condition, marital status or sexual orientation.
- Full inclusion of women and sexual minorities in congregational life including their ordination and the blessing of same sex unions.
- Lifelong, age appropriate sexuality education in schools, seminaries, and community settings.
- A faith-based commitment to sexual and reproductive rights, including access to voluntary contraception, abortion, and HIV/STD prevention and treatment.

Rev. Haffner is an ordained minister with the Unitarian Church in Westport, Connecticut and is the author of From Diapers to Dating: A Parent's Guide to Raising Sexually Healthy Children and Beyond the Big Talk: Every Parent's Guide to Raising Sexually Healthy Teens as well as several books for congregations on sexual health. She speaks and conducts workshops around the world and appears regularly in the national media. She has a Masters of Divinity from Union Theological Seminary and a Masters of Public Health from the Yale School of Medicine.

Rev. Haffner will speak at 7:30 PM on Wednesday, May 10 at the Scott Conference Center (6450 Pine Street). The event is free and will be followed by a reception. For more information, go to firstuuomaha.org.


19th Annual AA Heartland Roundup Keys of the Kingdom

A Gay Christian?

"I don't think homosexuality is a choice. Society forces you to think it's a choice, but in fact, it's in one's nature. The choice is whether one expresses one's nature truthfully or spends the rest of one's life lying about it." ~Marlo Thomas

Not going to church in my family was not an option. Sure I tried the occasional "I'm sick" here and there but it never worked. I even went to the extreme of putting my head in front of the heater to fake a fever, or putting cold water all over my body to fake a cold sweat; all failed attempts. My father's only response would be "Throw up and prove it."

Most kids would be upset at first after hearing this response, but don't doubt my abilities. If he wanted me to throw up, I was going to give him what he wanted. I went into the bathroom gave a few gags here, and a couple coughs there and low and behold I would throw up. Excited, I would go to tell my dad the news. My dad, pretending he didn't hear the news, would turn to me bright-eyed and smiling saying "Great, don't you feel better now? Now put on your clothes and let's go to church."

Church played a vital role in the development of the person I am today. I still hold dear the morals and lessons I learned as a young boy sitting in Sunday school. But I can't help but question something that condemns the very person that I am. I remember as a child lying in bed, praying to God to change the person that I was.

"Why me?" was the question that crossed my mind every night while tears rolled down my face. Why out of all my friends did God choose me to carry around this burden that shamed me so very much. It took four months of counseling, (Christian counseling meant to change my sexuality), numerous books, and constant prayer for me to finally accept the person that I was: a gay Christian.

I'll never forget the day I was sitting in a Sunday service and our pastor introduced a guest speaker. It was a man who was once gay but was changed by the power of God. I sat there dumbfounded. Is this guy a joke? Why on earth would someone think that you would have to change the way you love to make anyone happy? Still to this day it makes me angry and saddened to think of that poor young man.

The Bible is filled with verses condemning "sin" in general. And I agree that many of these "sins" are wrong and punishable. But to say as Leviticus 20:13 states "If a man lie with another man as he lie with a woman, both of them have committed an abomination; they should surely be put to death"-ridiculous. Yes I do believe I just called something out of the Bible ridiculous, let me explain.

This passage was taken from the part of the Bible that contains the Jewish Holiness Code, which were laws enforcing and protecting holiness. However this holiness code also permits polygamy, prohibits sexual intercourse when a woman has her period, bans tattoos and bans wearing clothes that are made from a blend of textiles (cotton/polyester blend). Why is it that the only part of the holiness code that we still choose to follow today is the part on homosexuality?



Sodomy is another word that often comes up when discussing homosexuals and their sexual acts. The funny thing is sodomy has nothing to do with homosexuals.

According to the Bible, Abraham's brother, Lot, moved into the city of Sodom. Lot was sitting at the city's gate when he saw two angels approaching. They needed a place to stay so Lot opened his home to the two men. Before the men lay themselves to bed, all the men of Sodom, young and old, surrounded the house and asked Lot to bring out his guests so they "might know them."

Might know them....hmm...I still stare at this phrase wondering how these simple words could honestly mean that all the men in this one town were homosexual and wanted to sexually know these two angels. Long story short, God destroyed the city of Sodom because of the immoral life these sodomites were living. But when you do more research on this topic you find out that the prophet Isaiah claimed that Sodom was destroyed for lack of doing justice (Isaiah 1:10; 3:9). Jeremiah, another prophet accused Sodomites of adultery, lying and the unwillingness to repent (Jeremiah 23:14). Not once is homosexuality mentioned anywhere near the story of Sodom. Yet the sexual relationships that homosexuals have are still surrounded by that one word, "sodomy."

In all actuality, there are 362 admonishments towards heterosexuals but only six towards homosexuals. With that said, the admonishments surrounding homosexuals are mere interpretations of biblical text.


As you can see this is something I am extremely passionate about. The important thing to remember is that there is no God (or whoever you believe in) that would ask you to change the person you are inside. Just because I may fall in love with a man does not destine me to a life of turmoil and pain in hell.

The Bible is something that I still hold dear and close to my heart. It's the interpretations of the Bible that I choose to ignore and brush aside.

Religion is meant to give guidance, hope and inspiration; not to condemn, depress and belittle any individual person.

I know that was a lot to take in, but I hope I opened up your minds to something new and interesting. If this was something that truly caught your attention, I recommend the book Stranger at the Gate by Mel White.

This book got me through years of questions, doubts, and fears, truly a book everyone should read once in their lifetime. Check
