GAY SCHOOL IN TEXAS

Three Texas educators have created the state's first high school for gay and lesbian students. The educators say the private school is needed because a study found 28% of gay and lesbian students drop out of school because of harassment. They say a tolerant atmosphere is badly needed. Co-founder Becky Thompson said, "A lot of schools aren't there for the needs of the kids. They're public schools, they're just going about the everyday business of getting the kids and shuffling them through. We're trying to be a little bit more nurturing, especially to this population." The Walt Whitman Community School opens September 2 near the Dallas airport. Annual tuition is \$7,000. Students who are not gay or lesbian can also attend classes.

ACTION IS THE CURE FOR HOMOPHOBIA

As I travel the country, I am both heartened and impressed with the level of energy and expertise of the activists I meet. At the same time, I am aware that we face an increasingly organized and insidious opposition.

We are witnessing an unprecedented wave of organized and orchestrated intolerance perpetrated by leaders of the right and targeting our communities.

Recently, three major movements have signaled a heating up of anti-gay rhetoric and mobilization against the gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgendered communities signaling a step up in the "culture wars." The actions and words coming out of these groups are cause for real concern.

Just recently, the Southern Baptist Convention took the unusual and extreme step in the name of preserving family values of asking its members to participate in a national boycott of one of the world's most family-oriented corporations. They ask for the full-scale rejection of Tigger and Mickey because of the company's "gay friendly" policies, including domestic partner benefits and Ellen's coming out. They cite Disney's active participation in America's moral decline. Rev. Tom Elliff, president of the Southern Baptist Convention, referred to gays as "moral trash".

All summer, Promise Keepers will be mobilizing for its massive gathering of one million Christian men at the foot of the steps of the U.S. Capitol this October. Although they claim to be a movement of Christian men living their lives by biblical values, in fact their leadership is closely linked to right wing organizations. Founder Bill McCartney has gained national notoriety for his anti-gay rhetoric, declaring that "homosexuality is an abomination of Almighty God," and that gay people are "curable". Promise Keepers' literature reads, "homosexuality violates God's creative design for a husband and a wife and is a sin." McCartney made his plans clear when he said, "Many of you feel like you have been in a war for a long time, yet the fiercest fighting is just ahead. God has brought us here to prepare us. Let's proceed. It's wartime!"

Finally, in another recent development, a conference of right-wing political activists and academics came together in Washington, D.C. at Georgetown University to demonize the GLBT community in the name of science and scholarship. The benign sounding conference "Homosexuality and American Public Life" included a who's who of right-wing homophobes including Robert Knight of the Family Research Council who argues that "there is a strong undercurrent of pedophilia in the homosexual subculture." Ex-gay Anthony Falzarano claims that the gay community "has been working for the last 30 years like an army of termites, secretly eating away the floorboards of moral integrity in this country."

Where is the silver lining? Our response to these acts has been heartening. In rejecting to the boycott, many are voicing support for Disney and its policies, including President Clinton — a Southern Baptist himself. Coalitions are coming together in cities and towns across the country to expose the true agenda of the Promise Keepers. And a broad range of scholars, students, and organizations are coming forward to challenge the bigotry of pseudo science.

The more we organize our supporters, the more marginalized the right wing becomes. We must be clear about our vision. Our country must move into the future guided on the principles of religious and political pluralism, freedom, and equality.

INTERVIEW WITH AMY GLUCKMAN AND BETSY REED, EDITORS OF HOMO ECONOMICS: CAPITALISM, COMMUNITY, AND LESBIAN AND GAY LIFE

Is it true, as Supreme Court Justice Antonin Scalia claims, that "those who engage in homosexual conduct have high disposable income?" [dissent in *Evans v. Romer*, the Colorado Amendment 2 decision] Or do gays earn less than their straight counterparts? Do gay men disproportionately work in the arts, health and beauty, and restaurant businesses? After Absolut and IKEA, Cindy Shaving k.d., what do mainstream marketers have in store next for gays? What benefits are you losing out on, and how are insurance companies screening you? What price is the closet? Can gays get along?

Two members of the *Dollars and Sense* editorial collective, Amy Gluckman and Betsy Reed, have edited *Homo Economics: Capitalism, Community, and Lesbian and Gay Life* (Routledge \$19.95 paper), a collection of essays on what they describe as the tense relationship between gay people and the economy.

KD: What prompted you two to do this book?

AG: Betsy and I became interested in this whole issue of gay marketing, where there seemed to be this sudden outpouring of commercial attention to the gay community, not only the development of gay business but advertising on the part of mainstream businesses to the gay community, so we wrote about that ["The Gay Marketing Moment"]. It got a tremendous response, and as we started to look further, we discovered that there was very little accessible information about economic issues in the gay community.

BR: I remember one meeting where Amy brought up the idea of the relationship between gay life and capitalism, and how it seems like the gay community owes a lot of its development to the modern economy in many ways, but as progressives, we were instinctively wary of that notion. So we were intrigued by that seeming contradiction. And then there was this explosion of marketing interest in the gay community, which also made us wary because it really did not appear as if this interest was borne of political awakening, but rather was the result of hard financial calculations on the part of corporations.

KD: In spite of gay culture growing with the modern economy, have the works in your book hammered out a link between being lesbian and gay and suffering economically?

AG: Those links haven't been established very well yet. Economists are just starting to think about this. I think that the issue of sexual orientation is more parallel to the issue of gender than race, in economic terms. Gay people have not experienced the seamless exploitation as a group that Black people have. Gay people, like women, are found in all classes. People of color are too, but there has been a more systematic historical link between race discrimination and class exploitation, and that doesn't quite translate to the gay situation.

KD: So, probably, the vulnerability you might have as a lesbian or gay man is a vulnerability dependent on class position. If you are poor, being gay is liable to be a real big vulnerability. If you're wealthy, it may not matter much at all, economically speaking.

BR: Lee Badgett ["Beyond Biased Samples: Challenging the Myths on the Economic Status of Lesbians and Gay Men" and (with Mary King) "Lesbian and Gay Occupational Strategies"] discovered that there were clusters of lesbians in occupations that tended to be both disproportionately low-paying and hostile to an out lesbian (but have a high turnover) and one of the possible explanations she suggests for lesbians gravitating towards those occupations is, it's a strategy for minimizing possible financial loss if you're disclosed as a lesbian.

KD: The interesting thing about gay men's employment, is that they have been disproportionately concentrated in higher paying professions than straight men, but, in fact, have been paid less than straight men within those occupations.

BR: One of our writers writes about the economic costs of the closet, how much it actually costs in financial terms to maintain an essentially fake identity. [Jeffrey Escoffier, "The Political Economy of the Closet: Notes Toward an Economic History of Gay and Lesbian Life Before Stonewall"] To separate your work and personal life, and to sacrifice the networking that usually happens at corporations.

socially, outside of the formal office life. Things like that are the points that are unique to the lesbian and gay economic situation.

AG: Escoffier also goes back a few decades and looks at the cost of being homosexual. If your social life required going to the bars every night, that's expensive. And if, for example, you and your lover couldn't share a household, you had to pay separate expenses. Leading this double life had a variety of costs throughout the 40's, 50's, and 60's.

KD: The first section of your book is called "A Community Divided." Do you think the gay and lesbian community (to the extent it can be called a community), has become more divided since the decades after WWII or, more recently, as the distribution of wealth has become increasingly stratified since the 80's?

AG: There's nothing new about class stratification. If you look at the history that Julie Matthei ["The Sexual Division of Labor, Sexuality, and Lesbian/Gay Liberation: Toward a Marxist-Feminist Analysis of Sexuality in U.S. Capitalism"] describes in the early 20th Century, there was an upper-crust lesbian social set that had a whole circle, and at the same time a working class lesbian life. But it's even harder today in some ways to separate reality from idea, hype, media image, and media visibility that takes on a life of its own.

BR: Gay politics and a gay political agenda has really depended on a feeling of solidarity and sameness, in some cases. And there have also been real tensions around that because oftentimes the people at the forefront of the gay movement have actually been those who are more privileged in the economic system: white, upper-middle

class. That's what we were trying to get at with the phrase "a community divided." There is a sense of community and solidarity and a lot of political good has come of that, but at the same time, representing the community as a sort of monolithic entity has definitely alienated a lot of people and done some political damage.

KD: Could you explain how you saw that alienation as part of the contradiction of our economic system for the lesbian and gay community?

BR: One of the most exciting things that we've seen in the last 50 years is the development of a strong, vibrant gay community in this country, and economics has a lot to do with that. The fact that, increasingly, women have moved into the work force and have been able to maintain their own households, free of dependence on a male wage earner, has been hugely important to the ability of lesbians to live. We have a piece by Lawrence Knopp ["Gentrification and Gay Neighborhood Formation in New Orleans: A Case Study"]. It's about the gentrification of a neighborhood in New Orleans, the Marigny neighborhood, and how it really enabled the community to form in a basic way. To have access to capital, to even form rental agencies dominated by gay men that reached out to gay men. That kind of thing was really important. But at the same time, I'd point to something that the historian John D'Emilio very presciently conceived of in a 1984 article, called "Capitalism and Gay Identity": despite everything that capitalism has done for gay life, gay people tend to be the scapegoats for economic anxieties that are produced under the economic system.

KD: Homophobia has taken very similar forms to anti-Semitism in terms of the stereotypes of

gay people and Jewish people. But also heterosexual feminists, and all those who lead lifestyles different than the dominant heterosexual nuclear family. So that's a central contradiction. The other contradiction would be that, while capitalism has allowed the development of very strong gay communities, it has also emphasized because of various class stratifications, the differences among gay people, and that has been an ongoing source of difficulty politically.

AG: In "Capitalism and Gay Identity," D'Emilio goes back to the 19th Century and shows that capitalism enabled gay life (originally more from men) in the sense that once an industrial workforce developed that was free of the farm and free of household-based production, single individuals could move to the city, get a job, and explore their identity. That's probably a fundamental way in which gay people can sort of be grateful to capitalism. That was one of my initial questions, as Dollars and Sense progressive, from a critical perspective: how grateful to capitalism should we be?

KD: How do you see the issue of "gays in the military" fitting in? It seems to me that this is really an issue where class and racial tensions within the lesbian and gay movement were played out. You had activists, progressives on the one hand saying they didn't want anyone in the military, so they didn't want to fight for gays in the military; on the other hand, you had other progressives saying, well look, people need jobs, people need to be in the military, and they shouldn't be subjected to these witch hunts. And the witch hunts have been targeted disproportionately at Black women.

BR: The "Don't ask, don't tell" policy is really damaging as a message to all sorts of employers.

KD: You mean that employers will say - "Hey, on the job, don't ask, don't tell."

BR: Right. It sends a message to the rest of society.

AG: Stay in the closet. One of our authors speculates that the reason why the gay military thing fell apart was that it was a deal cut at the top by people like David Mixner and Clinton's people before the election of '92. And it wasn't the result of the slow building up of organizing that was required, for example, organizing among gay service members, or organizing in low-income gay communities where the military is important for economic opportunity. If that organizing had been in place, thousands of phone calls could have lit up Congressional switchboards on our side of the issue, and the outcome might have been different.

There's a whole set of issues that is also real important in the book, and I wish we could have dealt with even more. The kinds of conflicts occurring because a segment of gay politics has been steadily moving towards the Right. You know, organizations supporting people like Governor William Weld (great on gay issues; terrible on everything else progressive) who's gotten a lot of support from some of the gay organizations in Massachusetts, because they don't care about the other issues. All they care about is gay issues. Not just that they don't care, but that they are actively on the side of punitive welfare reform, or are on the side of privatization of state services, that sort of thing.

There's a split between the part of gay activism that is moving towards the Right, and what remains of a more progressive gay movement that sees itself as part of a broader Left or progressive movement. I think that some of those folks in the more mainstream gay organizations are scratching their heads wondering, "Why aren't people accepting gay marriage? We're just like everybody else."

KD: It would be subversive. What would be the economic effects of gay marriage?

AG: It's obviously a benefit to be able to get your partner's social security, there's a whole variety of financial benefits to marriage, and there's no reason why that shouldn't be available to gay people. But the economic dynamics of marriage for a gay couple are not going to be the same as the economics of marriage for straight people, where the man has a lot more economic power than the woman, so there is an inherent source of inequality in the marriage. That is not an automatic feature

of gay marriages. If a woman is able to marry another woman, and have all the benefits that accrue to that, I think that really does change the picture.

KD: I want to put Amy on the spot and ask you a question you posed to Barbara Smith: "Do you think that, in spite of the discrimination that now goes on, capitalism could ultimately go along its merry way and assimilate gay people and gay rights, but otherwise remain the same?"

AG: I can't claim scholarship or expertise, but my speculation would be yes, that it can. That's what we already see. Many mainstream corporations have decided that there's more money to be made by advertising to the gay community than there is to be lost by risking some wrath on the Right or from cultural conservatives. The fortunes of the market are to overcome social taboos. The willingness of gay politics to shift to the Right to accommodate our economic system, and not talk too much about those who are most vulnerable to it - yeah, I think that probably most of the current demands of gay rights can be accommodated and perhaps will.

MICHIGAN WOMYN'S MUSIC FESTIVAL

Thousands of women will head off to the Michigan woods again this summer for the 22nd Michigan Womyn's Music Festival, August 12-17, 1997. Situated on 650 secluded acres, the festival offers plenty of camping in a village-like setting, creating a self contained women's town for the week.

On the schedule is a six day women's film festival, 300 workshops and three performance states featuring 40 sets of music, dance, comedy and theater. Broadening the concept of women's music to include punk rock as well as pop, jazz along with folk music.

NEBRASKA JOINS OTHER STATES WITH HATE CRIME LAWS

Finally! Nebraska, Louisiana, Arizona, and Delaware have joined the many other states that have hate crime legislation.

Not since 1990 when six states passed penalty enhancement laws have so many states put anti-gay hate crime laws on the books. The Nebraska measure provides for harsher penalties for offenses committed against a person or person's property because of race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, age or disability. The state had no such law until now — it goes into effect in September.

The Cornhusker state joins 20 other states (including Iowa) and the District of Columbia which have enhanced penalties of crimes motivated by hate against sexual orientation.

"WHO'S THE BOSS" STAR COMES OUT

Danny Pintauro, formerly Jonathan Bower of television's hit sitcom *Who's the Boss?*, came out of the closet by unusual means — through the *National Enquirer*.

The tabloid article relates the 21-year old actor's "coming out" experience, including how he told his parents and his "Who's the Boss?" co-stars Judith Light and Tony Danza. "I couldn't deny it anymore. It was just the right time to come out," he tells the *Enquirer*. The article includes a sidebar on the "coming out" process by the Gay & Lesbian Alliance Against Defamation's Entertainment Media Director Chastity Bono.

"The lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender community is indebted to people like Danny Pintauro who demonstrate the courage to 'come out'," said Joan M. Garry, GLAAD's Executive Director. "He should be proud in the knowledge that by telling his story he is a role model for gay youth who may be struggling with their own sexual orientation," Garry added.

MONTANA'S SODOMY LAW STRUCK DOWN

The Montana Supreme Court has unanimously struck down the state's sodomy law — ruling that sexual activity between consenting adults of the same-gender would no longer be illegal.

In the case of *Grayczan vs. Montana*, six gay and lesbian plaintiffs charged that the sodomy law violated their right to privacy which is guaranteed in the state's constitution. "Quite simply, consenting adults expect that neither the state nor their neighbors will be cohabitants in their bedrooms," said Justice James Nelson.

Montana's law was among the most severe of all the nation's sodomy laws because it prohib-

ited same-gender "sexual contact" — not just the customary ban on anal and oral intercourse, which straight people often enjoy. Violators of the law could have faced up to ten years in prison and a maximum \$50,000 fine.

Twenty states continue to have same-gender sodomy laws which make it illegal for some Americans to love whom they choose to love. Those states are: Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Maryland, Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Florida, Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana, Arkansas, Missouri, Oklahoma, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Arizona, Utah and Idaho.







GALP SUPPORT LACKING

Due to a lack of support from the community, the GALP support group has ended meetings until further notice. With a mailing list of 30+, there was almost no physical support at meetings or special functions. GALP had hoped to create an atmosphere where anyone could come and discuss the special events that are happening with children of gay parents and the needs of gay parents. We should remember that our children are not always as prepared as we are to cope with the name-calling, the abuse and the loss of friends and family.

An excerpt from GLPCI: *When Abigail Garner's gay father separated from her mother during her first grade year, she was put into a "loss group" in her elementary school to learn to deal with the divorce. But she didn't understand why she belonged in the group. "I just gained a dad," she remembered thinking, "what's my problem?"*

Teens with gay parents face prank calls, derogatory jokes, harassment, other parents who forbid their children to accept an invitation to a gay family's home, and teachers making anti-gay comments during class.

Children of gays and lesbians need to interact with others like themselves for a sense of fellowship, to learn coping skills, and for understanding.

Issues are often different for children of gays and lesbians than for their parents. While parents often go through a grieving process when their children come out, children are more likely to accept a gay or lesbian parent, but they lack strategies for coping with the response of their peers. Older children whose parents came out recently may also face issues around their own sense of sexual identity, and their learned homophobia.

If and when the need should arise, GALP will continue its discussion groups once again. For those who came to the monthly meetings, to the Easter picnics and to other special events designed to bring our families closer together, Thank You! We hope to see you again.



IN THE LIFE TO AIR AUGUST 2

For its August 1997 episode, a special edition of *IN THE LIFE*, America's gay and lesbian television newsmagazine, celebrates its first five years on the air. The hour-long special takes a nostalgic look at the stops and starts that made up *IN THE LIFE*'s early episodes, and continues on through five seasons as the series evolves into an in-the-field newsmagazine. When *IN THE LIFE* debuted five years ago, the idea that gays and lesbians should have a regular slot on national television was completely new — this was five years before Ellen.

IN THE LIFE, produced by the not-for-profit In the Life Media Inc. and presented by Thirteen/WNET in New York, is a newsmagazine series which chronicles the history and contemporary experience of the lesbian and gay community. It airs on nearly 100 public television stations. A complete list of national air dates can be found on the web at <http://inthelife.org>.

Correspondents Tanya Barfield and Darius de Haas join host Katherine Linton for these stories in this look back at five years of *IN THE LIFE*.

The Early Years: The story of *IN THE LIFE*'s first two seasons make up this opening segment. The pilot episode aired June 1992 with political "fumorist" — that's feminist/humorist — Kate Clinton as host. When that episode hit the airwaves in 1992, it didn't take long before the new gay series, on national PUBLIC television, came under attack in the PBS funding wars of the early 90's. In a sense, *IN THE LIFE* has Bob Dole

to thank for letting America know it was out there — his June 12, 1992 attack on *IN THE LIFE* from the floor of the U.S. Senate made headlines. Dole called *IN THE LIFE* the "gay Ed Sullivan show" — in a way he was right. *IN THE LIFE* stayed with, and played with, a variety show format for the first season. Clips will remind *IN THE LIFE* connoisseurs of episodes like In the Life goes Country, Lily Tomlin reading letters from Vito Russo, and In the Life goes to the movies with Charles Busch, where the famous drag artist played a whole handful of characters. Other guests highlighted from those early episodes will include the Lavender Light Gospel Choir, the singing group the Flirtations, writer/actor David Drake, country band Doug Stevens and The Outbound, and comic Lea Delaria.

The Great Events: From political conventions to cultural celebrations, *IN THE LIFE* cameras have been there to record history as it happens. Millions of people have been lucky enough to be there at these significant events, and millions more have turned to *IN THE LIFE*, as it has marked the milestones in the struggle for gay and lesbian civil rights. This segment includes reports from the 1993 March on Washington; Stonewall 25 and Gay Games IV, the 1994 remembrance and New York celebration of the 1969 Stonewall Riots; and the 1995 4th World Conference on Women in Beijing, China. Also included is an *IN THE LIFE* look at the 1996 Republican Convention in San Diego for a story about gay men and lesbians both under and outside the

"Republican Big Tent".

IN THE LIFE and the Arts: Even though *IN THE LIFE* eventually moved away from the original variety show format, it never lost its commitment to profiling artists and entertainers who help shape and define gay and lesbian culture. Music. Art. Dance. Drama. Humor. In any area of the arts, gay men and lesbians have made great contributions both to the gay community and to the mainstream by challenging stereotypes, celebrating differences, and confronting the devastation of AIDS. In celebration of the many talented individuals who have appeared on *IN THE LIFE* during its first five years, this segment features Marga Gomez, scenes from the Broadway musical Rent, choreographer Bill T. Jones, British actor Sir Ian McKellen, playwright Tony Kushner, and artistic director of the Public Theatre, George C. Wolfe.

An *IN THE LIFE* Tribute: This segment will pay tribute to the many people who have appeared on *IN THE LIFE* who have since died. Included are singer/activist Michael Callen, International Lesbian and Gay Film Festival director Mark Finch, drag artist Randy Allen, writer Andrew Hopkind, comedian Frank Maya, filmmaker Marlon Briggs, civil rights activists Dr. Betty Shabazz, Dick Sargent of "Bewitched" fame, and lesbian pioneer Peter Worth, who lived on Fire Island from the 1940's until her death last year.

Memorable Segments: Three past stories from *IN THE LIFE* will be shown in their entirety on the August/September episode. The first, about a young man from Romania, is an example of coverage beyond U.S. borders as international reporting has been an important part of *IN THE LIFE*. History has also taken a front-seat from the beginning and a segment about persecution of homosexuals during the holocaust, one of *IN THE LIFE*'s most powerful segments, will be shown. And in its fifth season, *IN THE LIFE* introduced a regular story feature called A Day in the Life, and an unforgettable Day in the Life with The Lady Chablis from Savannah will be included.

IN THE LIFE will be seen on Nebraska Educable on Saturday August 2 at 9pm.

OUR RIGHTS IN THE WORKPLACE

In 1968, *Boys in the Band* was rightly considered groundbreaking, "the frankest treatment of homosexuality I have ever seen on the stage," according to Clive Barnes in *The New York Times*. Produced at a little theater in Hollywood, it was perceived as an exact account of the prevailing mood of gay life in the '60's and a wonderfully accurate period piece. Today it seems immediate as ever because it's a fairly savage comedy about a potentially tragic situation: the conflict between personal instinct and the dictates of society. It's a very funny play because of

its sharp wit and a very sad play because the wit is often sharp enough to be painful. One of its famous lines, "Show me a happy homosexual and I'll show you a gay corpse," comes from Michael, the central character with a Catholic upbringing and the burden of God as well as society on his shoulders. Clive Barnes further stated, "The power of the play is the way in which it remorselessly peels away the pretensions of its characters and reveals a pessimism so uncompromising in its honesty that it becomes in itself an affirmation of life." *Boys in the Band* was written by Mart Crowley and is directed by Norm Filbert.

Other season shows include *Torch Song Trilogy* (Oct. 24-26 & Nov. 1-2); *Breaking the Code* (Feb. 6-8 & 13-15); and *Master Class* (June 5-7 & 12-14).



Now Jesse wants to make sure the unique transvestite voice isn't lost in our modern battle for politically correct art. And I say Hell! Why not plant some cash in my back pocket while we're at it?"

Go-Go Boys from Planet X! takes place right here in Omaha where the Evil Dragford of Planet X, Miss Formica DelRey, aided by her legions of Go Go Boy Slaves, plots to take over the earth and turn everyone gay. "This play is based on my own alien spacecraft abduction experience," says Miss LaVoris. She recalls being brought onboard a spacecraft one night while walking through Elmwood Park. "They put me on a table and inserted probes where the sun don't shine. Then the little bug-eyed shiny guys gave me a manicure and waxed my eyebrows. I looked damn good! You know all those ET's are flaming queens!" After attempts to sell her story to the *National Enquirer* and *Weekly World News* proved unsuccessful, Miss LaVoris turned to playwrighting.
