Nebraska Families Pull Kids From Orlando 'Gay Days' Band Trip

Kearney, Neb. -- The parents of band members from a Nebraska high school are pulling their teenagers from a scheduled band trip to Orlando, Florida, during the city's "Gay Days."

Shelly Rodehorst of Kearney is among those who says she will not expose her children to homosexual behavior. She believes homosexuality is morally wrong.

She has pulled her son, a senior percussionist, and her daughter, a junior clarinet player, from the June trip.

Kearney High band instructors say only a few students have pulled out of the Florida trip because of Gay Days, but gay rights advocates say it is a big deal.

Gay advocate Andy Melichar says the parents, "because of their own fears, have decided not to let their kids go. And who's really suffering is the kids."

MASSACHUSETTS ISSUES MARRIAGE LICENSES TO SAME-SEX COUPLES

State GOP Convention Shuts Out Gays

The Log Cabin Republicans (LCR) blasted the head of the North Carolina Republican Party Wednesday for denying them access to the state GOP convention this weekend, but the group of GLBT Republicans also declined an invitation from rival Democrats to their state convention.

The North Carolina chapter of the LCR purchased a table at the North Carolina state convention on behalf of Log Cabin in early April. But just days ahead of the convention, North Carolina GOP Chairman Ferrell Blount returned the money, along with a stinging letter, which read, "Homosexuality is not normal," and informed the group it would not be allowed table space.

"The North Carolina Republican Party and the Log Cabin Republicans do not seem to share the same agenda," the letter also read.

LCR Executive Director Patrick Guerriero condemned Blount for "dividing" the party.

"Log Cabin Republicans believe that at a time when our country is at war, we ought to be bringing Republicans together, not dividing them, and certainly not excluding them from their own state convention," he said in a statement issued Wednesday.

The National Stonewall Democrats, a group of GLBT Democrats, promptly invited the LCR members to share table space at district Democratic conventions in North Carolina this Saturday.

"The Democratic Party has a big tent, and the Stonewall Democrats have a big enough table to share space with the Log Cabin Republicans," said Kathy Heggemeier, spokeswoman for the Stonewall Democrats in Wake County, N.C.

When asked by the PlanetOut Network if the group will accept, LCR spokesman Christopher Barron said, "Absolutely not."

"I thank them for the invitation, even though the

Making the Transitions

Everyday we make transitions. Be that society, work, or personal. There can be stress and tension built transitions.

Our society is now going through a transition with gay marriage legal in Massachusetts. There is tension among conservatives. As time moves on, our views in American society are becoming more and more polarized. Part of this, some would say, is the diminishing of the middle class. The gap between income brackets is widening. Some would also say religion is becoming more and more polarized with the growing evangelical fundamentalist movement across America. In the mean time more mainline Protestants are making steps to welcome the gay community.

What it is coming to is an "us versus them mentality." This is a shame. I often think it takes all types, meaning conservatives and liberals, to make things work. Can't we all get along and work together. The result is the political power is shifting. Liberals have won a battle, which means conservatives are going to bump up the stakes a notch. It will take several years for the air to clear in reality. Transitions are slow. I know in my faith there are still some churches holding out against female ordination and we have been doing that since the 1970's. There is still racial discrimination and we started to break that up decades ago. The reality is tensions will be thick for a while and the topic of homosexuality will be common to hear in everyday conversations at home and in the work place.

We deal also with transitions in work all the time. There are layoffs, supervisors change, new software systems are being used. This is sometimes put into our lives as stress. It seems that right when you have gotten familiar with one system and way of doing things the company will start to implement yet another "new and more efficient way of doing things." Work transitions can be hard, but it is important to not let the anxiety get to you. Worry does no one any good. It is important in times like these to let our work stay at work and our home be our home. Taking it one day at a time. You can worry and stress out, but is that going to keep your job? The answer is no! Worry and fear is really a mentality and something to be overcome. If you do your best, that is what you should focus on and if the day comes when something happens, be prepared to transition.

I have a week and half at one job. I am transition in trying to find another job. Am I worried or stressed? No! I just take it one day at a time believing in faith that something is bound to turn up. That is hard to do sometimes. Faith enables us to withstand what we don't understand. I also know that things

have a way of working out for the best in the end. No matter what happens, the sun will still rise and set and the world will keep spinning. It is not the end.

We also have personal stress in our life. We deal with friends and family and most often what we call "drama." That is ok too. It is best to take serious moments that need to be taken seriously, try to be light hearted when possible, shrug and let things role off your shoulders. Change is but a mere essential to our everyday life and we continue on down life's road.

Coors Supports Gay Marriage Ban

Pete Coors, whose brewing corporation generally wins kudos from the gay community for its equal-opportunity benefits and policies, said Monday he'd support amending the Constitution to define marriage as being solely between a man and a woman.

"It's important that we set this record straight for all judges in the future," Coors said in a radio debate with former Congressman Bob Schaffer, his opponent for the Republican nomination for the U.S. Senate. "It's unfortunate that we have to use the Constitution in this manner."

George Stillings, president of the Colorado chapter of the Log Cabin Republicans, a gay GOP group, said his organization was troubled by Coors' support of the amendment. The Adolph Coors Co.'s policies extending benefits to same-sex partners led the group to think Coors was a candidate it might endorse, Stillings said.

Schaffer, who supports the amendment, never was under consideration for endorsement by the group, Stillings said. Coors said he would only support the amendment as written by U.S. Rep. Marilyn Musgrave of Colorado. If that amendment comes up for a vote, he said on Fort Collins' KCOL radio, "I'm for it."







During the week more than 5,000 individuals from 164 GLBT musical groups will be performing.

in the state already take for granted."

The first licenses were given at Cambridge City Hall as the clock struck midnight on May 17. Same-sex couples across the state are lining up to receive marriage licenses. There is a three-day waiting period in Massachusetts before couples can marry, however it can be waived by a court. Each of the seven plaintiff couples in Goodridge v. The Department of Public Health — the groundbreaking case that made these marriages possible — will marry today. The case was successfully argued by Gay & Lesbian Advocates & Defenders.

"All of us here at HRC commend the incredible work of GLAD in making this day possible," added Jacques.

Bush Denounces Gay Weddings

(Washington) President George W. Bush isn't sending bouquets to same-sex couples marrying today in Massachusetts, the first state to legally endorse gay unions.

In a statement released as the President was observing the 50th anniversary of the landmark civil rights ruling in Brown V The Topeka Board of Education Bush accused Congress of foot dragging in passing a constitutional amendment limiting the rights of gays.

"I called on the Congress to pass, and to send to the states for ratification, an amendment to our Constitution defining and protecting marriage as a union of a man and a woman as husband and wife," the president's statement said.

"The need for that amendment is still urgent, and I repeat that call today."

"The sacred institution of marriage should not be redefined by a few activist judges," Bush said referring to the justices of the Supreme Court of Massachusetts which struck down that state's ban on gay marriage.

Later, Bush praised the justices of the Supreme Court for their ruling in Brown which banned the concept of separate but equal in education. The case is considered the catalyst for all civil rights rulings which followed, and has been cited in numerous gay rights cases.

"This president needs a high-school civics lesson, fumed Kevin Cathcart, Executive Director of Lambda Legal.

"It's dishonest and irresponsible to attack a court for doing its job. The court's job is to make sure that everyone's constitutional rights are protected, and that's exactly what happened in Massachusetts.

"President Bush is putting himself in the company of segregationists who made the same attacks on judges who upheld the constitutional rights of African-American people exactly 50 years ago today, after Brown v. Board of Education. These are different issues and a different generation, but the same old smear tactic. It didn't work to circumvent our system of justice 50 years ago, and it won't work today," Cathcart said.

Bush comments also drew criticism from the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force.

"The president's hypocrisy is appalling," NGLTF Executive Director Matt Foreman told 365Gay.com.

"When a 'few activist judges elected him pres he didn't complain, but when justices impose the rule of law in Massachusetts he wants to write discrimination into the Constitution." The Human Rights Campaign accused the President of "trying to turn the camera away from the nation's foreign policy and economic problems"

"President Bush is attempting to lead this nation into


discrimination. We will not let him hurt our families," said HRC President Cheryl Jacques.

Gay Democrats also assailed Bush for using the anniversary of an historic civil rights case to attack gays.

"Today the President denounced judicial activism in one statement while praising the same actions as judicial courage in another, said John Marble, Communications Director - National Stonewall Democrats.

"President Bush's speech today on Brown vs. Board of Education is a classic argument for civil recognition of same-sex marriage," said Marble.

"In denouncing separate and unequal institutions, President Bush praised the courage displayed by courts who 'ruled against prevailing opinion in order to expand the rights of all Americans'. Unfortunately, I think the irony of his remarks is lost on him."

Riverdance

The moon shines down midst the foggy outdoors. Suddenly the sunlight begins to appear as the Irish Dance Troupe begins to Riverdance on stage.

This impressive dance would be a combination of tap and clog dancing. The women have a bit of pivoting that gives it a bit of a ballet feel. The stunning part of the dance is there is little to know upper body movement in the dancing, but it is very swift and flowing art form.
