South Dakota Governor Vetoes Anti-Trans 'Bathroom Bill'

South Dakota Gov. Dennis Daugaard today vetoed a bill that would have restricted transgender students' use of restrooms, locker rooms, and other gender-specific facilities in public schools.

The bill "does not address any pressing issue," said the governor in his veto message, according to the Associated Press. Daugaard also insisted that such decisions were best left to local school officials and



that the law posed grave risks for costly liability for schools and the state. Indeed, the American Civil Liberties Union had threatened legal action if the bill was signed.

"I am so happy right now. You have no idea," said Thomas Lewis, an 18-year-old Sioux Falls transgender high school student, in the Associated Press report. He noted that while his school supports him, the veto shows that "the government's not going to hold me back from who I really am."

The measure would have been the first law of its kind in the nation requiring trans young people to use the facilities designated for the gender they were assigned at birth, not the ones matching their gender identity. LGBT groups, businesses, and child advocacy organizations had all called on Daugaard to veto the bill, which they deemed stigmatizing and dangerous to transgender youth, in addition to being unnecessary.

If it had been signed into law, advocates say that the bill may have fueled escalating legislative attacks against transgender people that are unfolding in more than three dozen proposed new laws across 16 states. But advocates hope that the veto signals a critical turn in favor of trans equality that may bode well in the push to stop similar anti-trans bills pending in other states, including one that remains alive in South Dakota, which would restrict trans students' participation in sports.

"Governor Daugaard chose to do the right thing and veto this outrageous legislation attacking transgender kids," said a statement issued by Human Rights Campaign president Chad Griffin. "Today, the voices of fairness and equality prevailed, and these students' rights and dignity prevailed against overwhelming odds and vicious opponents in the state legislature."



San Diego Drag Performer Attacked as Bystanders Watch

Kickxy Vixen-Styles, a greeter at Rich's, was assaulted by a man at around 3:30 a.m. Sunday, after the bar closed.

The attacker, who had been removed from the club earlier by security, had waited for Vixen-Styles in the parking lot. The man approached the performer from behind, and then used a vehicle as a weapon.

"I'm done for the night and
I'm walking to my car when all of a sudden he's behind me and
I try to get in my car but it was too late," Vixen-Styles told the
San Diego Gay & Lesbian News. "He grabs my door open, and
at that point I'm stuck between my door and him slamming it
against me and trying to break my window."

Vixen-Styles was visible to the crowd still in front of Rich's. But screams for assistance were ignored.

"A group of four trans girl[s] just sat across the street watching instead of getting help," Vixen-Styles said.

"I just felt so helpless and in a way just let down by the people around," Vixen-Styles added.

Eventually, a bystander did alert Rich's security team, who "handled the attacker," the San Diego publication reports. No arrest was made.

Vixen-Styles describes the man as in his 20s, medium build, Middle Eastern, with black hair and a goatee.

Students Embarrass Rick Perry With Explicit Questions About Gay Sex During College Visit

"In 2002, you supported Texas's anti-sodomy law. Do you dislike bootysex because the peeny goes in where the poopy comes out?" was just one of the many questions Rick Perry was asked while speaking at Dartmouth College over the weekend.

The Texas governor was there to speak about the results of the midterm elections and, of course, to plug himself for president in 2016.

Prior to his speech, a flyer was circulated among students with

proposed questions for the governor. Some of those questions included:

You once played yourself in the movie Deep in the Heart; would you ever let someone go Deep in Your Fart (cavity)?

You have fought hard against abstinence plus safe-sex education in favor of a strict abstinence only policy. You have also taken a strong position in opposition to abortion. Is this because you want people to not know what condoms are, and not be able to terminate unwanted pregnancies, so they have to have anal sex?

I know you have been very strong on all foreign policy issues, including Somali pirates, but what is your stance on butt pirates?

Does your ideal anti-sodomy law prevent me from playing with my own poop shoot?

You have recently said that homosexuality tears the fabric of society. If I showed you hard science that anal sex does not tear the fabric of your butt hole, would you change your mind?

According to people in the audience, Governor Perry became

visibly uncomfortable and deflected the questions as best he could. When things started getting too out of hand, president of the school's College Republicans group, Michelle Knesbach, grabbed the microphone and demanded students quit asking such vulgar and inappropriate questions.

Unfortunately, her efforts were in vain, because immediately after that, a student brought up that, so far, Perry has accepted a total of \$102 million in campaign contributions during his various political campaigns. "Would you have anal sex for \$102 million?" the student asked.

As soon as the speech was over, an embarrassed Perry hurried off the stage.

Knesbach told The Dartmouth she was "horrified" by the questions. "They were phrased in incredibly insulting ways," she said.

But it wasn't just student Republicans who were appalled. Some student Democrats, too, thought the questions went too far.

"I think it's really disappointing that anyone would undermine a serious political event with sexually explicit questions," Spencer Blair, the president of the College Democrats said. "Neither I nor anyone from College Democrats would ever condone such behavior."

They might not condone that kind of behavior, but we do.














Film Streams to Restore and Reopen the Historic Dundee Theater

OMAHA (2/24/2016) – Film Streams' board and staff are thrilled to announce our organization will launch a major project to restore and reopen the 91-year-old Dundee Theater and

secure its place in Omaha for many years to come.

When the Dundee reopens it will join the Ruth Sokolof Theater in North Downtown as the second venue operated by Film Streams.



In that sense, this isn't a move for our organization but rather a new milestone that will enable us to expand our programming in a variety of ways while saving something dear to our hearts: the last single-screen cinema in Omaha and the lone survivor among the neighborhood movie theaters that once existed across our city.

This incredible opportunity to restore and reopen the Dundee is made possible by a visionary gift from The Sherwood Foundation, which purchased the Dundee Theater with the intention of donating it to Film Streams. That gift now paves the way for our organization to serve as the new stewards of an Omaha cultural landmark.

Opened in 1925 as a venue for vaudeville, the Dundee Theater (4952 Dodge St.) has undergone several changes through the years. It has been known at different times as a venue for art films and foreign releases and once served as the site of an incredible 118-week run of THE SOUND OF MUSIC.

In May 2013, the previous owners of the Dundee Theater closed the venue for renovations. Since then, they announced their decision to close and sell the cinema after a remarkable 36 -year run. At that point, like so many others in our community, we worried that Omaha's oldest operating movie theater had screened its last film.

Today we're ecstatic to announce the Dundee will live on.

Following an extensive restoration led by Alley Poyner Macchietto Architecture, the theater once again will feature films 365 days a year, including first-run American independents, foreign films, documentaries, classics, and various special engagements. It will allow Film Streams to bring even more great films to Omaha, to collaborate with even more community partners, and to significantly expand our Arts in Education program.

There's a great deal of work to be done over many months, with a grand re-opening expected by 2018. Saving the Dundee will require a multimillion dollar restoration and renovation, including critical improvements to the building itself. Film Streams will need help from throughout our community to make this project come to life, and we look forward to sharing details about how the public can get involved.

Film Streams' board and staff feel this is a challenge built for our organization. We love film, and we love our community. The Dundee represents both.

Could Indonesia Be Facing an Antigay Crackdown?

Indonesia might be in beginnings of an antigay crackdown, suggests a story in The New York Times.

Maybe because of the absurdity of the request, or maybe because it's indicative of a larger problem, the most widespread headlines came



when Indonesia's Communications Ministry recently told instant messaging apps such as WhatsApp and Line that they must scrap any emotion inclusive of gays and lesbians.

The government faced criticism by Human Rights Watch for the emoticon ban and a recent string of antigay moves, many of which are also highlighted in the Times article.

"President Jokowi should urgently condemn anti-LGBT remarks by officials before such rhetoric opens the door to more abuses," said Graeme Reid, LGBT rights director at Human Rights Watch, in a statement. "The president has long championed pluralism and diversity. This is an opportunity to demonstrate his commitment."

The group sent a letter to the president warning of a "surge of anti-LGBT incidents" that includes students at the University of Lampung being told they will be expelled for LGBT activism and lecturers threatened with firing for academic work on LGBT issues. Muhammad Nasir Djamil, the country's minister overseeing higher education, had warned of the "serious" problem of LGBT discussion groups and academic studies, saying, "The LGBT community should not be allowed to grow or be given room to conduct its activities."

The Times's Jeffrey Hutton reports that the National Commission for Child Protection announced last week that it wants to ban LGBT content from television and radio. And it reports that "Islamic vigilantes" have been searching boarding houses for gays and lesbians.

In 2014, Aceh province approved Sharia Law requiring 100 lashes with a cane for gay sex. The law took effect last year and applies even to non-Muslims. Now the antigay attitude seems to be spreading to the rest of the country.

Although homosexuality is legal in Indonesia, the world's

populous Muslim-majority country, the chairman of the People's Consultative Assembly, Zulkifli Hasan, said in January that it "should be banned because it does not fit with the culture of Indonesia."

The Times speculates that a surge of antigay animus could be the product of an election year.

Op-Ed: It's Not Irresponsible to Like Bareback Sex

After the first reported case of seroconversion on PrEP, one HIV-Activist rises above the noise.

A thought for my fellow gay men: It is 100 percent OK that so many of us want to have bareback sex



Even when the risk of complications due to sex is not zero (and when can we really ever guarantee that the risks related to any activity are zero), it is completely, 100 percent OK that we have the desire to bareback. The decision to have bareback sex has never meant that we are stupid, irresponsible, or immoral — it did not mean that in the pre-PrEP [pre-exposure prophylaxis], pre-TasP [treatment as prevention] (undetectable) era, and it certainly does not mean that now. It means that we are human and that it is tremendously challenging (and sometimes impossible) to change our sexual desires and practices.

It is a bummer that the first case of PrEP failure has been found in someone who was being adherent to Truvada — and very sad for that individual that they have acquired HIV. For some HIV-negative gay men, this single case will be enough to dust off the condoms and try to adhere to them again — and that is totally fine. Condoms are easier for some of us, and/or some of us have a very low tolerance for risk when it comes to our sex lives. The decision to use condoms is 100% OK.

For other HIV-negative gay men, this will still seem like a very remote risk, and they will continue to rely on PrEP as their sole HIV prevention method — and that is also 100% OK. We are not designed to all be the same — we all have different perceptions and different backgrounds. For some of us it is easy to use condoms, and for some of us it is nearly impossible. It's all OK, and I hope that we can accept our variations and our diverse approaches to having sex.

What is disheartening within the current HIV prevention movement is seeing just how much we still feel the need to police each others' bodies and our sex lives. We have PrEPnazis and condom-nazis — people both inside and outside of our communities who go well beyond offering information and advice and instead move into coercion and manipulation

in an effort to get gay men to have the kind of sex that we deem appropriate for them. We frequently do not honor individual choice and empowerment, and it sets the stage for the often bitter, shaming, and defensive debates that we continue to have around PrEP, TasP, and condoms.

As we individually and communally weigh all of the information that we have received over the past five years about TasP and PrEP, I hope that we can accept, respect, and honor each others' sexual decisions as we individually interpret what we've learned and conduct our own cost/benefit analyses of condomless sex.

Even more importantly, I hope that we can each learn to shamelessly and confidently own our decisions to use or not use condoms without feeling that we must defend our choices at every turn, without feeling gripped with fear and shame each time a report comes out saying that nothing in HIV prevention is perfect.

We are all doing the best we can with the information we have — we are not stupid, we are not immoral, and we are not irresponsible.



Canada's Dreamy PM Will Posthumously Pardon Man Imprisoned For Being Gay

Canada's prime minister, Justin Trudeau, is scoring more brownie points with the gays. But this time it's for more than his shirtless boxing photos.

Over the weekend, the 43-yearold leader announced plans to posthumously pardon Everett George Klippert, a former City of Calgary bus driver who was labeled a dangerous sex offender and locked up in prison 50 years ago after telling police he was gay.



"The prime minister intends to recommend that a pardon under the authority of the Royal Prerogative of Mercy be granted posthumously to Mr. Klippert," Trudeau's office said in a statement.

It all started after an arson attack in 1965. Klippert was questioned about the fire by police. Though it was ultimately determined that he was not involved, during questioning he did admit to having consensual sexual relations with four men. Because of this, he was charged with four counts of gross indecency.

In 1966, a Crown-appointed psychiatrist concluded that Klippert's homosexuality was "incurable" and that, therefore, he was a "dangerous sexual offender." A judge agreed and sentenced him to prison, where he stayed locked up until 1971, two years after homosexuality was decriminalized in Canada. Today, Trudeau hopes to right that wrong, and as many others his office can find. The weekend's statement went on to say that the prime minister will look to pardon other members of the LGBTQ community who were unfairly convicted on charges such as gross indecency and buggery.

"As Canadians, we know that protecting and promoting fundamental human rights must be an imperative for governments and individuals alike, and this includes gender identity, gender expression and sexual orientation," the statement said.

Trudeau also announced he will march in Toronto's Pride parade on July 3, making him the first sitting Prime minister in Canada to participate in the event.

Chinese TV Viewers Outraged By Sudden Cancellation of Popular Gay Drama

A popular gay-themed Chinese drama was unexpectedly dropped by online streaming services this week, and fans of the show are not particularly happy about it.

Addiction, a 15-part web series that portrays the lives of queer high schoolers, was removed from iQiyi — China's version of Netflix — on Monday after censors decided the show was "unfit for viewing," reports Time.



While there has yet to be an official response from Addiction's team of producers about the show's cancellation, Time notes that there have been more than 110 million online responses from fans in the aftermath of the show's disappearance. A majority of the comments posted online reportedly expressed disappointment with the censorship and the perceived disapproval of LGBT people in Chinese culture.

"I anticipated that it would be wiped out from the internet, but I still feel sad," one fan said in a report by the South China Morning Post. "When will our society become a multicultural and more tolerant one?"

On YouTube, the series appears under a similar title, Addicted.

I am turning 63 this year, and am being increasingly asked by friends: "When are you going to retire?" It's a fair question, since AARP started sending me membership cards 13 years' ago. In my case, I don't want to retire because I really like the work I do: having a private practice, doing work-



shops and writing books and newspaper columns is (mostly) fun for me, so why would I quit?

However, in reality, some day I might want to work less. Or, if my health changes, I may need to work less. In that case, what would I do with myself? How would I be as a "retired" LGBTer? I'm not sure, but I'm sure thinking about it.

While I haven't had any clients who were lottery winners (yet), I have had a number of clients who had the opportunity to retire early. For example:

A client who, at 35, sold his business for several million dollars. Initially, he was really happy, but after taking several long, luxurious vacations, he misses having a purpose and a structure for his life.

A client who was diagnosed with a serious disease in his early 40's and thought he should retire, but was afraid that if he did, his will to live might falter.

A client who, at 47, inherited over \$2 million dollars and wondered if she should stay with her job because even though it's stressful, she finds it very fulfilling.

A client who, at 62, is just burnt out from his job and has the money to retire, but afraid to because "without my job, what would I do with my time?"

A client who retired at 65 and now, at 68, has been offered consulting work that he might enjoy. Should he jump back into the working world, or stay with "retirement"?

After much reflection, it seems to me that it's okay to retire, but not to "quit" on life. Without our work, what do we do to create meaning and structure? We all – regardless of age – need to have certain elements in our lives to be fulfilled. These include:

Mental stimulation – We need to be around interesting people who talk about provocative subjects. The Taoists says, "travel is the best teacher", offering us lots of new people, places and things to be intrigued with and stimulated by.

Body - Our bodies need to be stretched and exercised. Regard-

less of our health (or lack thereof), our bodies need movement, and not movement that we hate. Finding something that is enjoyable is the only way that most of us will stay active.

Spirit – This is often overlooked. I'm not talking about religion, I'm talking about a spiritual connection, e.g., "This isn't just about me, there's a big world out there and what is my place in it?" and "What am I here to give and what am I here to get?"



As a younger person, I thought gardening and walking were boring. Now, at 62, I enjoy both of these activities. I still like to dance to interesting music, but nightclubs aren't such a good fit for me anymore. As we age, what is fun for us and how do we find it?

Most of us won't be able to retire before our 60's, so these questions may not reflect a pressing need for you. But, why not plan ahead a little? Surely, you've changed in the past 10, 20 or 30 years, and those changes will continue into the next 10, 20 or 30 years. Why not give some thought to when you'd like to retire (if at all) and how you'd like it to be.

Who knows? It may happen sooner than you think.

Whenever it happens for you, may it be the most fulfilling time of your life.

The Hungry Homo

Lemon Lush

Ingredients

1 cup flour

1/2 cup butter

1/2 cup chopped pecans

8 ounces cream cheese

1 cup powdered sugar

1 (8 ounce) containers whipped topping, divided

1 (3 ounce) boxes lemon pudding mix

1/2 cup sugar

2 1/4 cups water, divided

2 egg yolks

Directions

Mix flour, butter& chopped pecans together like biscuit dough and press into 8×8 inch baking pan. Bake at 400°F for 20 minutes or until brown.

Mix together cream cheese, powdered sugar and 1 cup whipped topping and spread over first layer while still warm. Stir lemon pudding mix, sugar, 1/4 cup water and egg yolks together in a medium saucepan. Stir in 2 cups water. Stirring constantly, with wire whisk, cook on medium heat until mixture comes to a full boil. (NOTE: if you are using instant pudding or a different flavor, use the ingredients & directions for

preparation on the package!).

Cool 5 minutes, stirring twice. Cool about 30 minutes more and spread over two previous layers. Cool completely and top with remaining whipped topping.

Fried Rice

Obama's New Budget Will Help Keep LGBT Youth Safe

President Obama's budget includes money for battling discrimination, but the Republicans want to eliminate departments that protect us.

This has been an important few weeks in the fight for LGBT youth. And I'm not talking about the voting in New Hampshire.

A quick glance at what's going on around the country gives a clear sense of the height of the pitched battle currently underway.

High school students in Franklin County, Tenn., are being forced to defend their Gay-Straight Alliance against public backlash despite the fact that the formation of a GSA is a federally protected right. Over a dozen states are considering bills that would prevent transgender students from using restrooms and locker rooms that correspond with their gender identity—a violation of federal Title IX protections. In Maine, Gov. Paul LePage is stopping the Maine Human Rights Commission and the state Department of Education from creating rules for school districts on safety and equal treatment for LGBT students, despite federal law and a recent Maine Supreme Court decision in favor of a transgender student.

In all of these cases, and in many more around the country, state and local officials are wielding their power in attempts to deny LGBT students safe and equal access to education and their rights under federal law. In each community, local advocates, including GLSEN chapters, student leaders and their allies and partners are fighting back to defend hard-won progress. It is astounding how far people will go to perpetuate discrimination, and how much energy and time we have to spend defending our gains. These examples all hinge on legal, policy, and court battles that have been fought and won. But as we know far too well, victories are events, and real change is a process.

This week, President Obama released a budget proposal that included critical funds for making sure that process continues to move forward — increased funding for the Office of Civil Rights at the U.S. Department of Education. During the Obama administration, OCR has become the primary champion of all students' civil rights and educational access, including pioneering work on behalf of LGBT youth. Perhaps you've heard about OCR's settlements with districts over LGBT students' rights, requiring action to address profoundly hostile school environments. Or maybe you saw that the assistant secretary for civil rights, Catherine Lhamon, will soon publish the full list of colleges and universities that have obtained religious exemptions from federal civil rights requirements in an easily searchable database, to make sure the public is fully informed.

Opponents of LGBT equality, who seek to roll back the current advances made by and for LGBT youth, have certainly taken note. And many have been quite clear that OCR is firmly on their list for elimination, along with the rest of the federal Department of Education. That battle will now play out in the budget and appropriations process, and we must be vigilant.

OCR has consistently been receiving more and more complaints each year, not only on LGBT issues, but also on race and ethnicity, disability, national origin and sex, all of the dimensions of discriminatory practice that affect LGBT youth and their peers. Over the last several years, OCR has received in excess of 10,000 complaints per year, with only 450 attorneys to investigate and follow up. The current backlash against newly empowered and visible LGBT youth is sure to ramp up the number of reports received in the coming months. Increased funding now is essential to bridging the gap between the promises of the law and the reality of students' lives.

Legal victories are critical milestones. But they only mark the end of the beginning of the fight to transform people's lives. Public investments in civil rights enforcement are as essential to the life chances of all marginalized and oppressed communities as water delivery infrastructure is to public health, or roads and bridges are to the national economy. And all of these public investments stand alongside national defense as among the core functions of government in a democracy.

The LGBT community faces numerous challenges and pressures in this chaotic and alarming election year. But we cannot allow the essential daily grind of making rights real — and the quiet political battles raging around that work — to be overshadowed by the high drama of high-level politics. Right now, the Senate's approach to the budgeting process is of greater import to our daily lives than any comments made by presidential candidates today or over the next several months. We owe it to ourselves, all of our civil rights partners and, especially to LGBT youth, to keep our eyes on that prize.







