Ford Changes Mind

Amid growing criticism from gay rights leaders and their allies across the country, Ford Motor Co. on Wednesday said it would continue to advertise its luxury brands in the gay press, reversing an earlier decision. The move came under allegations that the nation's number 2 automaker had caved to a threatened boycott by the antigay American Family Association. The AFA on December 1 announced that after meeting with Ford, it had decided to cancel its boycott, noting that Ford had met some of its demands to be less friendly to the gays and lesbians.

But after meeting with several prominent gay rights groups on Monday, Ford issued a letter stating that it would continue to financially support gay events and causes and that it had decided to amend its decision to pull advertising for its Jaguar and Land Rover brands from gay publications, a decision it claimed was based solely on budgetary reasons.

The letter, sent to the seven gay rights organizations that met with the company, drew quick praise from the groups, which issued the following statement: "We welcome today's statement from Ford Motor Company and commend their firm stance in support of inclusion. It is an unequivocal reaffirmation of Ford's historic commitment to our community and the core American values of fairness and equality. Moreover, it is conclusive proof of what Ford leaders have repeatedly assured us—that there never was any deal with anti-LGBT organizations concerning Ford's support for our community. We are proud to be back in gear with Ford and look forward to working with them in the years ahead." (Advocate.com)



Miss Susan Advises Judge Pious

The following is an adaptation from Miss Susan's Etiquette Tips for the Socially Conscious Judge: A Guide to Honorable Conduct Toward Gays and Lesbians in the Courtroom, originally published in the St. Louis University Public Law Review in the Spring of 2005. Dear Miss Susan,

My favorite Bible story when I was a little boy was the story of Sodom and Gomorrah (Genesis 19:1-30). As a judge, I sometimes feel the need to look beyond Man's law to the higher law that binds us all together as a civilization. In those moments, I return to Sodom and Gomorrah for a solid legal precedent. Recently, I read the entire story of Sodom and Gomorrah into the record at the end of a bench trial, right after I found that the gay defendant was guilty of first degree purse-snatching. I just don't understand why the state supreme court vacated the conviction and remanded the case for a new trial. Can you help?

Love, Judge Pious

Dear Judge Pious,

I regard my own spirituality as a source of strength and passion, so I can appreciate that religious teachings play a central role in your life. However, you must not allow your religious beliefs to interfere with your judicial duties. Careless sermonizing in the courtroom can lead to unfortunate and unexpected results.

Let me illustrate my point with a parable from the State of Nebraska. In State v. Pattno, the presiding judge read aloud from a long biblical passage referring to homosexuality before sentencing a gay defendant. (Although the court did not provide a citation, the passage appears to be Romans 1:20-28.) The defendant appealed his sentence, arguing that the judge was biased against him because of his sexual orientation.

In analyzing the case, the Nebraska Supreme Court began by noting that criminal offenses (and the sentence imposed for committing a crime) are mandated by statute. The defendant's sexual orientation was irrelevant to either his crime or his sentence, so the biblical passage was similarly irrelevant.

The court also expressed concerns over the separation of church and state. Although there may be instances where a judge can properly express religious beliefs in the courtroom, the court discouraged the use of scripture in sentencing proceedings because it could appear that the judge is relying on personal religious views rather than statute when determining the proper sentence. The court was influenced by United States v. Bakker, where the Fourth Circuit Court of Appeals observed that courts "cannot sanction sentencing procedures that create the perception of the bench as a pulpit from which judges announce their personal sense of religiosity and simultaneously punish defendants for offending it."

When a judge relies on irrelevant considerations in sentencing a defendant, a reasonable person could be led to believe that

the judge is biased. Thus, the court found that there was at least an appearance of bias because the presiding judge may have relied on his own irrelevant, religious beliefs when sentencing the defendant. The sentence was therefore vacated because defendant was denied due process of law.

Your purse-snatching case is very similar to Pattno. The story of Sodom and Gomorrah had nothing to do with purse-snatching, so your state supreme court may have questioned whether you were convicting the defendant of purse-snatching or sodomy. Since sodomy is not illegal, your supreme court may have felt that the best course of action was to remand for a new trial on the charge of purse-snatching alone. In the future, I would recommend that you read the story of Sodom and Gomorrah in church rather than in court.

If nothing else, I hope you will learn from your mistakes. Recently, the Pattno trial judge decided to disregard Pattno when sentencing a different defendant in a factually similar case. Prefacing his comments with "I would probably be better off not saying anything," the judge stated that "if people would continue to read [the Bible], they would find that it's not a message of condemnation, but of hope." The Nebraska Court of Appeals found that the trial judge's insertion of his own personal religious views was "explicit and unmistakable." Thus, the trial judge had again deprived a defendant of due process, and the case was remanded for another sentencing.

The rewards of this position are unlimited: exposure to many wonderful people and organizations; networking with people across the country; working closely with Lincoln Pride, Kansas City Gay Pride, Capital City Pride in Des Moines and TC Pride in Minneapolis to promote our regional prides; meeting national entertainers and speakers and so much more.

A Topeka-based church run by Fred Phelps and consisting mainly of family members has picketed several funerals of soldiers killed in Iraq. The family contends American soldiers are being killed in Iraq as vengeance from God for protecting a country that harbors homosexuals.

The ordinance unanimously approved Monday by the St. Joseph City Council is similar to a proposed state measure that would bar protests at or near a funeral from an hour before a funeral service to an hour after it ends.

Republican Sen. Charlie Shields and Democratic Rep. Martin Rucker, both of St. Joseph, proposed the legislation last month after a protest during the August funeral service of Spc. Edward Myers, a St. Joseph soldier killed in Iraq.

Though St. Joseph's ordinance has raised First Amendment concerns, it had the support of Meierhoffer Family Funeral Home and Crematory and Rupp Funeral Home, along with several veterans.

"I have to say that that day was a very traumatic day for the family," Rupp Funeral Home's J.L. Robertson said of the impact the protest had on Myers' family.

Couples began registering their unions earlier this month; they can hold ceremonies after a mandatory 15-day waiting period.

Sir Elton John, who will exchange vows later this week with partner David Furnish, wrote a commentary Sunday in The Observer, calling for gay rights around the globe.

"Next Wednesday, on the happiest day of my life, when I celebrate a civil partnership with David, I will be thinking, however, about those less fortunate than we are. In many countries, having a same-sex partner is still outlawed." he wrote.

"Throughout history, gay people such as myself and David have often been made scapegoats by those who fear that we are a threat to the status quo," he continued.

More than 600 same-sex couples are expected to hold civil partnership ceremonies on Wednesday, the AP reported.

Celebs Toast Elton John at Bachelor Party

LONDON -- Celebrities mobbed a West End nightclub for a glitzy bachelor party to toast the upcoming civil union between Elton John and David Furnish.

Ozzy and Sharon Osbourne, Elizabeth Hurley, Bryan Adams, Gary Barlow and Kid Rock were among those who streamed into the gala event Monday night in London's Soho neighborhood. John and Furnish slipped into the Too2Much venue just minutes before the show started.

Shirtless waiters wearing black ties and riding boots served guests flutes of champagne. The nightclub, once a strip club known as Raymond's Revue Bar, has an auditorium with red leather and banquette seating, a bar decorated with Swarovski crystals, chairs dipped in rubber and sculptured glass walls.

Deliveries of sushi and presents arrived at the main entrance as the celebrities partied on. Though the couple had asked revelers to give donations to AIDS charities in lieu of gifts, Cilla Black playfully promised to ignore the instructions.

"I'm going to get them the tackiest toaster I can find," the singer told reporters.

The star-studded bash came ahead of a private ceremony to seal the couple's civil partnership.

Hundreds of same-sex couples plan to form civil partnerships in England and Wales on Wednesday, the first day that such ceremonies become possible under new legislation offering gay men and lesbians many of the legal protections available to married heterosexuals.

Court Upholds New Orleans' Partner Policy

A state appellate court in Louisiana has upheld a domestic partner plan and registry instituted by the city of New Orleans in the late 1990s.

According to Lambda Legal, New Orleans started offering health insurance to the partners of gay and lesbian city employees in 1997. Two years later, the City Council set up a registry allowing same-sex couples throughout its jurisdiction to formally record their partnerships.

In 2003, a group of citizens sued the city, claiming that their status as taxpayers gave them the right to challenge the policies in court. Usually, a disinterested third party is not allowed to challenge a law or intervene in a suit that does not have a direct impact on their lives. Indeed, a lower court dismissed the suit last May, ruling that the group lacked legal standing to sue. In a

decision announced Monday, the Fourth Circuit state appellate court agreed.

The petitioners were represented by the conservative Alliance Defense Fund (ADF). There is no indication yet whether the ADF plans to appeal the decision to the Louisiana Supreme Court.

The conservatives claimed that the domestic partner plan violated the state's law against same-sex marriage, a statute that has since become embedded in the state Constitution. This same argument has also been advanced in Michigan, where the ACLU is fighting to clarify the scope of the Michigan marriage amendment, and in Ohio, where Lambda is confronting an attack on Miami University's domestic partner plan on the same grounds. Marriage and partner opponents also sued in Utah after the mayor of Salt Lake City authorized benefits by executive order earlier this fall.

In rejecting the Louisiana case, the 2-1 appellate majority ruled that the plaintiffs "have not established the minimal requisite interest, and therefore lack the requisite interest sufficient to afford him a right of action."

In a dispatch, the Associated Press reported that the ADF attorneys suggested to the court that state law allows taxpayers to contest any public actions that increase government costs, regardless of the amount in question. Their view was accepted by dissenting judge Patricia Rivet Murray, who nonetheless acknowledged that the cost of the benefits had a "minuscule" impact on the city budget.

Indianapolis Approves LGBT Rights Law

The City Council of Indianapolis narrowly approved a measure Monday night that forbids discrimination in employment and housing based on sexual orientation or gender identity. The nondiscrimination ordinance passed with a 15-14 vote, and it holds for all businesses and landlords in Marion County, where Indianapolis is located.

The measure extends a policy currently in place in many large companies, the governor's office and City Hall, according to the Indianapolis Star.

The Human Rights Campaign (HRC), the nation's largest LGBT lobby group, praised the City Council's decision on Tuesday.

"The City Council sent a clear message that Indianapolis values all of its citizens and will tolerate discrimination against no one," said HRC President Joe Solmonese. "Indianapolis is another great example of a city in the middle of America that is moving the country closer to equality and fairness for all Americans."

Last April a similar measure failed by a 18-11 council vote.


