The Finals Rodeo is going to be held at the Chance Ridge Event Center in Elkhorn NE, which is a suburb of Omaha. The Finals rodeo will be the first event to take place in this brand new facility. One of the highlights of the weekend will be special performance by Nashville recording artist Steff Mahan. "We are very excited about having Steff perform at Finals. This will be a special treat for both the contestants and the audience." states Bryn Geerdes who is in charge of rodeo operations and a contestant for Finals.



In addition to the rodeo, the International Royalty Contest will be held on October 14 -15 at the Marriott Hotel in Omaha. Contestants from all over the United States will vie for the title of Mr., Ms., and Miss IGRA.


The net proceeds from Finals will be donated to local charities. Over the years, IGRA along with the local associations have donated millions of dollars to charitable organizations.





Men's Support Group Omaha Moderator Steps Down

It is with deep regret that I must at this time step aside after nine years as moderator of the Men's Support group Omaha.

I greatly appreciate the opportunity I have been given to learn from others and develop personal skills that have helped shed light on my life decisions.

On September 5th, 1995, the Men's Support Group Omaha met in the basement of the Metropolitan Community Church at 819 S 22nd Street, Omaha. That first meeting turned into many meetings over the next nine years.

Over 378 individuals from ages 17 to 76 joined the peer listening group meetings throughout it's nine years. Many individuals became regular weekly attendees. While others came to a couple of meetings and hopefully got what they needed from the group and continued their journey.

On August 19, 1999 the group paid a final tribute to one individual member who attended nearly every Tuesday night meeting. Jim Watson. Born October 10, 1926, served two tours of duty in the Navy, finally lost the battle of cancer that lasted several years. Jim could always be depended on to be at the Tuesday night Support Group meetings. I am proud to have been called one of his friends. And I would not of met him if it wasn't for the weekly meetings.

The last nine years has been a learning experience on more levels than I could explain. The many individuals that I have met over the years have also helped me through my path in life. And I would like to thank them for sharing their life experiences with me and the group.

Kansas City AIDS Clinic Closes

On Tuesday, August 31, for-profit company HCA Inc. closed the outpatient Midtown ID Clinic in Kansas City, Mo.. which has primarily treated HIV patients during its 18-year history, the Kansas City Star reports. HCA opted to close the clinic when MIDC failed to submit a business plan. Also, an arrangement under which HCA would have given MIDC \$100,000 to remain open as a nonprofit organization separate from HCA's other divisions fell through on Monday. Kansas City mayoral spokesman Donovan Mouton says patients treated by MIDC will be directed to other AIDS clinics in the area, but MIDC officials and patients say they have yet to be told where to turn for services. Desi Bravo, MIDC's manager, says it could take up to a year for all of the clinic's patients to find new health care providers. MIDC patients can obtain free copies of their records by calling (816) 753-2600, according to HCA spokesman Rob Dyer.
