AUTHOR MARC ADAMS TO SPEAK AT OMAHA - PFLAG MAY 10

Marc Adams, author of the Lambda Literary Award finalist and Silver pen Award recipient autobiography, *The Preacher's Son*, will speak at Omaha - PFLAG at 7 PM on May 10, 2001, at the First United Methodist Church, 7020 Cass, Mead Hall.

The Preacher's Son chronicles Adams' life growing up gay as the son of a fundamentalist Baptist minister in rural Pennsylvania where he endured a childhood of physical, emotional and spiritual abuse. He went on to attend —by choice— Jerry Falwell's Liberty University where he also was employed for 3 1/2 years in the student recruiting/university relations department. His book articulately reveals life at Liberty and the struggle to conform to the standards for which he would have been a martyr. He shares about his years as an ex-gay. It culminates with his coming to terms with being gay and his coming out to his fundamentalist family.

In this talk to the Omaha-PFLAG, Adams will share some of his life's story, share from his other two books, *Light and Still Water*, as well as talk about HeartStrong, Inc., the non-profit organization he co-founded with his partner, Todd Tuttle. HeartStrong, Inc., is an outreach to gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgendered students (current and former) of religious schools, colleges and universities. It is the only such outreach of its kind in the world.

Since its release at the end of 1996, *The Preacher's Son* has been garnering praise from bookstores, reviewers, the mainstream press and the gay and lesbian media. Not to be discounted, Adams says, is the overwhelming number of letters and emails that he has received from men and women, gay and straight, who have read his book and found themselves changed.

"Every time I open my mailbox and find another letter, I am incredibly humbled. I knew I had a responsibility to share my story. I just didn't expect to get such emotional and heart breaking letters. I feel such an awesome responsibility when I read about how what I've shared has touched people."

STUDENT, BRETT JOHNSON, TO RECEIVE NEA AWARD

On July 3 in Los Angeles, California, Nebraska Student Brett Johnson will receive the Suanne Big Crow Memorial Award from the National Education Association in recognition of her work attempting to add sexual orientation to the school harassment policy of the Millard School District. Brett spoke out passionately at a meeting of the Millard School Board, describing incidents where students at a Pep Rally called out "faggot" and not one staff member seemed concerned. An opposing football team from an all male school was taunted with comments about wearing "soap on a rope." And again no one intervened. After speaking in front of the School Board, Brett was called a "dyke" and "lezzie" by other students and was called into the administration office and asked why she would "embarrass" the school administration in such a way. Instead of backing off, Brett appeared at the next School Board meeting with 60 supporters and this time related the homophobic incidents she had endured. The School Board refused to add "sexual orientation" but did change the policy to read "all" harassment.

This response spurred Brett on to become more active on behalf of her gay friends and she formed a Gay Straight Alliance at her school, once again in the face of almost overwhelming opposition. Brett is active in Proud Horizons, a support group made up of gays and allies; is a member of the GLSEN/PFLAG Speaker's Bureau as a "student perceived to be gay," and has been an active speaker and organized a group to walk in the 2000 Pride Parade. Brett also received a scholarship to attend the GLSEN National Convention last year and will be attending the Gay/Lesbian Task Force's Creating Change Conference this fall.

GLSEN/Omaha nominated Brett for this award.

MATT SHEPHERD FILM
APRIL 23
HASTINGS COLLEGE

Journey to a Hate Free Millennium, the work of two Los Angeles filmmakers, Brent Scarpo and Martin Bedogne, centers on recent hate crimes and features interviews with family and friends of the victims. Scarpo is touring college campuses with a program centered around the documentary. Matt Shepard's beating death in October 1998, in Laramie, Wyoming, made national news. The film features footage of Judy Shepard, Matthew's mother, reading a statement she wrote and read at the trial of Russell Henderson, one of the two men charged with her son's murder. In a letter of support to the filmmakers, Judy Shepard wrote, "There is tremendous need to address these issues with our young people, in order to create a world where every person is accepted and valued, and therefore ensure that what happened to Matthew, and our family, will never happen again."

Others featured in the film include the family of Jasper, Texas, dragging victim James Byrd, parents and friends of Columbine High School shooting victims, and well-known political, religious, and entertainment figures. The filmmakers believe racist killings, schoolhouse shootings, and homophobic attacks should serve as the nation's "wake-up call." A lack of self-love and self-respect is the underlying hate behind these crimes, Scarpo said. "It's not a gay thing, it's not a black thing, it's not an Asian thing," Scarpo said. "It's a hate thing, and hate is nondiscriminatory."

The presentation includes approximately 35 minutes of footage from the documentary interspersed with dialogue among audience members about hate and what we can do to stop it. According to the filmmakers, this project is their vision for an American culture free of prejudice and hate. Audience members are asked to close their eyes and imagine a world without hate. "If we can't imagine it in our heads, it's never going to happen," Bedogne said. "A world without hate is a place where everyone can reach their full potential."

Scarpo will present *Journey to a Hate Free Millennium* for the first time ever in Nebraska to the students and staff of Hastings College and the Hastings community on April 23 at 8 p.m. in French Memorial Chapel.
