Bush Rallies Same-Sex Marriage Foes

WASHINGTON -- President Bush rallied support Monday for a ban on same-sex marriage as the Senate opened a volatile election-year debate on a constitutional amendment to prohibit such marriages.

"Changing the definition of marriage would undermine the structure of the family," said Bush, who raised the issue's profile with an event at the Eisenhower Executive Office Building.

Bush criticized judges who have overturned state laws similar in intent to the proposed legislation. "Marriage is the most fundamental institution of civilization, and it should not be redefined by activist judges," he said.

Traditional marriage, Bush said, is the cornerstone of a healthy society and the issue should be put "back where it belongs: in the hands of the American people."

There was little chance of that in the near future. Neither chamber is likely to pass the amendment by the two-thirds majority required to send it to the states -- three quarters of which would then have to approve it.

Many Republicans support the measure because they say traditional marriage strengthens society; others don't but concede the reality of election-year politics.

"Marriage between one man and one woman does a better job protecting children better than any other institution humankind has devised," said Senate Majority Leader Bill Frist, R-Tenn. "As such, marriage as an institution should be protected, not redefined."

Judiciary Committee Chairman Arlen Specter, R-Pa., said he will vote against the measure on the floor but allowed it to get there in part to give the GOP the debate party leaders believe will pay off Election Day. Specter has chosen a different battle with the Bush administration this week -- a hearing Tuesday on





THE STONEWALL REBELLION...and OUR PRIDE!

It is never easy or quite accurate to pinpoint one event as the beginning of an entire movement...but many American LGBT people, we recognize that there have been hundreds of Actions that have signified our liberation throughout time, but we choose - JUNE 28.

1969 to Symbolize - OUR PRIDE!

Shortly after midnight, the police raided the Stonewall Inn, a tavern and dance bar across from Sheridan Square in Greenwich Village, which resulted in a mass uprising that lasted through the weekend. The NYC Police Department Morals Division entered the bar in the hopes of shutting it down. The transgendered people, gay men, lesbians and bisexuals that patronized the bar were tired of the frequent raids and resisted.

In 1969 New York, strict gender codes were enforced that required people to wear clothes appropriate to their biological sex. Many people were harassed, arrested, brutalized, and often raped by police officers for transgressing these codes. That night, police presented the bar with a warrant charging that alcohol was being served illegally. They threatened to shut down the bar and arrest all of the patrons. Those not wearing the legal number (three) of "gender- appropriate" clothes would be doubly charged. Some say a "butch"

lesbian resisted arrest, others say a young gay hustler, and some say a drag queen resisted arrest and a fight ensued. Joined by the crowds outside, people started throwing coins and cobblestones at the police officers until a full-scale riot emerged. The paddy wagon that was to hold the arrested patrons was in danger of being tipped over and fled the scene. Legend has it that drag queens formed a chorus line mocking the officers. Shortly after a torch was thrown inside the bar, the police called for reinforcements. The rioting continued through the entire night and following day.

There are many legendary reasons for why this night: the previous raids, the death of Judy Garland, the full moon, and the ever-popular Mars in retrograde. While all the facts of the STONE-WALL REBELLION are disputed, this action coalesced a movement already forming. This action of power in the face of oppression left many feeling invigorated and liberated. It sparked many actions and sent a powerful message to the larger LGBT communities and to the oppressors.

This STONEWALL REBELLION has been commemorated in June since 1970 in different communities. Today, we celebrate PRIDE in June to honor the courage to resist and rebel in the face of oppression. Their are members of OUR COMMUNITY who regretted that we resorted to violent means. Today...we have non-violent marches, and demonstrations to react to our hopes for EQUAL CIVIL RIGHTS, Same-Sex Marriage, Partner-Spousal-Children Health, Adoption, Tax Benefits and various elections and legislation in the spirit of PRIDE. We honor those who demonstrated...and came 'out of the closet' in the beginning...the STONEWALL REBELLION...the beginning of OUR PRIDE!





Spirit and Soul

The River City Mixed Chorus, Nebraska's only GALA (Gay and Lesbian Association) chorus, presents "Spirit and Soul: A Celebration of African-American Music" on Saturday, June 17th and Sunday, June 18th, 2006. Both performances will be held at the Strauss Performing Arts Center on the University of Nebraska at Omaha campus at 7:05pm.

The first half of the program ("spirit") will feature sacred music, including spirituals, gospel music, the sacred music of Duke Ellington, and a piece from "Sister Act 2," entitled "Joyful, Joyful." Members of the chorus will also share their own perspectives on how this music relates to them and to people of various religious or non-religious traditions. The second half of the program ("soul") includes Motown favorites like "Dancing in the Street", "I Heard it Through the Grapevine," and "Ain't No Mountain High Enough." There will also be blues, selections from "The Wiz," and music that embodies the beginning of the civil rights movement in America.


Hahne says, "It's my personal mission to change the mindsets! And to liberate everyone from the restraints!"

the ways the FBI spies on journalists who publish classified information.

As that hearing gets under way, debate on the marriage amendment will enter its second day on the Senate floor. All but one Senate Democrat -- Ben Nelson of Nebraska -- oppose the measure and, with moderate Republicans, are expected to block an up-or-down vote, killing the measure for the year.

Democrats say the amendment is a divisive bow to religious conservatives, and point out that it conflicts with the GOP's opposition to big-government interference.

"A vote for this amendment is a vote for bigotry, pure and simple," said Sen. Edward M. Kennedy, D-Mass. The Massachusetts Supreme Court legalized same-sex marriages in 2003.

Senate Democratic Leader Harry Reid of Nevada, who says he believes marriage is the union of a man and a woman, said he nonetheless will vote against the amendment on a test vote Wednesday.

"The reason for this debate is to divide our society, to pit one against another," Reid said in remarks prepared for delivery on the Senate floor. "This is another one of the president's efforts to frighten, to distort, to distract and to confuse America. It is this administration's way of avoiding the tough, real problems that American citizens are confronted with each and every day."

Mayor Gavin Newsom of San Francisco, which in 2004 issued more than 3,000 marriage licenses to same-sex couples, Monday denounced Bush's move as predictable and "stale rhetoric" aimed at rallying conservatives for this year's midterm elections.

"It's politics. It's pandering and it's placating a core constituency, the evangelicals," Newsom said on ABC's "Good Morning America."

White House press secretary Tony Snow acknowledged there was a political dimension to Bush's remarks Monday, but said the president was not calling senators to persuade them to pass the amendment.

"I'm not sure this is a big driver among voters," Snow said.

Bush's views on the federal marriage amendment differ from those held by Vice President Dick Cheney, whose daughter, Mary, is a lesbian.

Chency said he thinks Americans should do everything they can to tolerate and accommodate whatever kind of relationships people want to enter into. He said he does not think there should necessarily be a federal policy in this area.




