

## Drag Queen Extravaganza Makes Omaha First Stop Of National Tour

## The Masquerade

Omaha, get ready for a testosterone-driven night of glitz, glamour, and gals the likes of which you've never before seen on the Orpheum Theater stage because on July 4, "The Dixie Queen Road Show" tears into town for the first stop on its oneyear national tour.

"The Dixie Queen Road Show" is a two-hour drag queen extravaganza, the star of which is the premiere screening of the film *Dixie Queen*, a somewhat scandalous and ultimately revealing look into the life of Tara Nicole, a drag queen who grew up on a farm in Beu-



laville. North Carolina and now lives in Wilmington where her peers know her as the "Bitch Goddess of the Port City."

For the next year, The Lady Chablis, and Lady Bunny, two of the most famous drag queens in America, will share the stage with the best local drag queen stars from each road show city in a celebration of the film, *Dixie Queen*. The first half hour will be numbers by local drag queens, the second half hour will be performances by The Lady Chablis and Lady Bunny and the last hour will be devoted to the screening of the film.

Many may know Savanah's jewel, The Lady Chablis (a.k.a. "The Doll") as the star of the book (and Clint Eastwood-directed film) *Midnight in the Garden of Good and Evil* ("I'm the outrageously charming black drag queen who stole the two best chapters!"). The Lady Chablis is also the author of her own book, *Hiding My Candy*. International Ms Leather 18 and International Ms Bootblack 6 will be held July 16-18, 2004. IMsL Weekend 2004 will take place in Omaha, Nebraska; easy to get to and centrally located (just a tad North of Oz). Sparks will light up the skies and there are tons of activities surrounding our city's 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary that very weekend.



## **Healthy Activities**

When I first moved here I was walking down the street in my neighborhood on N. 30<sup>th</sup>, wearing an OU shirt. As these two little old ladies passed me, all of a sudden I heard the other one making a big deal about my shirt. Saying things like how dare he wear and OU shirt! So I am an OU fan? I grew up fifteen minutes from the University of Oklahoma. I may root for a team, but that is no reason to get all upset. It is ok maybe to pick on people, but to get mad about it is another thing. We know this happens, because we hear of fans slashing the tires, among other things, of the out of town guests. We have then carried a sport too far.

One thing that is great about a lot of the gay community is that I do not feel left out, because I can find friends to hang out with, not doing super bowl parties or watching Cornhusker football games. I am not an athlete.

To top it off, It is no secret that the arts are always the first to go in our schools, but hardly ever do we cut athletics. Many GLBT are in love with the arts. Studies even show that people who are in the arts, especially musicians, tend to have higher test scores than non artists. The reason is because it is a skill that requires use of both sides of the brain.

Why do we cut an activity that nourishes peoples souls and makes them better students and people? Being in the River City Chorus is such a release for me. It allows me to escape reality and get lost in music. It is wonderful!

As someone who has studied music and worked with music teachers, there is sometimes this mentality,

especially in elementary schools, that the music teacher is not a real teacher. This is a shame, because I guarantees you that the music teacher had just as much if not more demanding college curriculum. The typical college degree is 124 hours. Music will range from 130-160 hours.

Lady Bunny, who also appears in *Dixie Queen*, is most known as the founder, producer and Mistress of Ceremonies of Wigstock (and star of the film *Wigstock: The Movie*), the 20 yearold Labor Day drag fest that attracts some 35,000 bewigged



revelers. One of the country's hottest drag comediennes, she has been described as "an unholy amalgam of Dusty Springfield, Phyllis Diller, Barbara Eden, and Don Rickles."

"Here is a wonderful opportunity to bring together both the straight and gay communities for not only an unforgettable evening of entertainment, but to also learn about a sub-culture still seen by many as the 'last taboo'," said Miles Christian Daniels, who wrote, produced and directed the documentary. "The show unquestionably has crossover appeal."

In January of this year, "The Dixie Queen Road Show" premiered to a sold-out house at Thalian Hall, a 700-seat performing arts theatre in Wilmington, North Carolina. Daniels then made the decision to take the show to other cities across America. In addition to Omaha, other stops include Seattle, Philadelphia, Minneapolis, Houston, Cleveland, New Orleans, and Miami. "It's a winning combination," said Daniels. "In each city we book a prestigious performing arts theatre and—because of its neutrality—people who would not normally go to a midnight drag show at the local gay bar will come out to experience what those in gay and lesbian communities have known for years to be extraordinary fun."

According to Daniels, "The Dixic Queen Road Show" is "an Alist event people will talk about for a long time to come."

#### More About the Film Dixie Queen

Dixie Queen is described as "a film that that defies gay stereotypes" by writer, producer, and director, Miles Christian Daniels. "Most films about this underworld depict drag queens as one-dimensional caricatures: boozing, drug-addled queens found languishing in seedy gay bars," said Daniels. "What I found was a group of brilliant entertainers who are—first and foremost—painfully human."

Tara Nicole, who is not only a drag queen but also transgender, agreed to the film because she "wanted to help change the public's perception of drag queens." "We are hard-working people," said Nicole, echoing Daniels. "Most films about drag queens portray us as party animals found in freaky nightclubs, and that couldn't be farther from the truth in terms of who we truly are."

In a powerful stereotype-bashing twist, Tara's staunchest supporters are her own family members in rural Beu-

laville, who accept her unconditionally. Her father—a stoic 74-year-old tobacco farmer—says simply, "I don't think she can help it, do you?" Both Tara's father and aunt are interviewed on the family farm where they talk about total acceptance and family bonds.

But, according to Daniels, the most compelling scene is "Oh Happy Day" where Tara and other drag queens talk poignantly about how the issue of religion has been resolved in their personal lives. "Going into the film, I assumed that family and friends stood as the greatest obstacle in embracing ones sexuality, but I was mistaken," said Daniels. "Most I interviewed first heard that being gay was wrong from behind the pulpit-not from mom or dad. Coming to terms with one's identity in



the face of a religious system that condemns them to hell, is a distressing and lonely process."

The film, which premiered at the recent New York Gay and Lesbian Film Festival to a sold-out audience has been entered in independent film festivals both here and abroad.

## Test Fest 2004



## HRC Backs Sen. John Kerry for President

It may seem like a "dog bites man" non-news-story item, but the Human Rights Campaign endorsement of Democrat John Kerry for U.S. President does have some gay detractors. About a dozen GLBTs picketed outside the HRC Chicago gala last Saturday night because Kerry opposes same-sex marriage. Kerry does oppose the Federal Marriage Amendment, but he does not back same-sex marriage itself.

"Our movement can either decide to follow the failed strategies of the Clinton years, which gave us the Defense of Marriage Act and 'Don't Ask, Don't Tell,' or we can confront those who oppose equal rights, regardless of their party affiliations," the protesters said in a press release.

"From voting against the Defense of Marriage Act to actively opposing 'Don't Ask, Don't Tell,' John Kerry is a true leader for our community," said HRC President Cheryl Jacques. "Just six months into his first Senate term in 1985, he introduced a gay civil-rights bill. His aggressive support for our community continued unabated for the years that followed, demonstrated time and again by perfect HRC ratings on GLBT issues in Congress."



# What Marriage is For

Following is the text of a letter to the Omaha World Herald, sent regarding a recent article by Jeff Jacoby titled "Samesex union OK not only judges' fault". May 19th 2004

While certainly not alone in his opinions, I would like to respond to some issues in Jeff Jacoby's article (from New York Times News Service). Perhaps the reason that "the feared negative consequences of same-sex marriage rarely get more than a fraction of the attention paid to it's anticipated benefits," is the simple fact that the benefits of treating people fairly outweigh the consequences. I realize that it is anecdotal evidence, but MY marriage has certainly not been strained by granting the citizens of Massachusetts the freedom and equality that is guaranteed under the Massachusetts Constitution. I will also give only a passing nod to the fact that justices are appointed and not elected for a good reason, namely that they make decisions that are honest and fair, not necessarily decisions that will get them reelected. Far from a "antidemocratic threat," this is an important check on the power of lawmakers. Government by the majority should not be at the expense of the minority.

The point which I chiefly wish to address, however, is this "ancient definition of marriage" so many writers, politicians, etc, trot out as an argument against homosexual unions. It seems that only the pretty parts are ever included. My family background (predominantly German and Norwegian) happens to include a great many men who chose their wives based not on love but entirely on the likelihood of producing strong male heirs, a process, I must admit, not too far from judg-ing a heifer at the fair. Temperament was certainly important, but love? Certainly not. Is this the "ancient definition" to which Mr. Jacoby refers? Perhaps he refers to the long-standing tradition of arranged marriages? To quote a couple lines from Fiddler on the Roof: "You've heard he has a temper. He'll beat you every night? Well only when he's sober, so you're alright." These traditions were changed as civilization developed and the criteria for a good mate evolved. The idea of some magical "ancient marriage tradition" completely glosses over the fact that there are many things in these traditions that have been left behind, and for the better.


"We need to convey," writes Mr. Jacoby, " that the fundamental purpose of marriage is to unite men and women so that any children they may create or adopt will have a mom and a dad." This, at least, is a definition that is set in the present tense. However, it still leaves out a great deal. I will agree that it is very difficult for a single parent to raise children alone, even though it may often be safer and more healthy for the child if the biological parents are separated. On the other hand, I find it difficult to believe that it would be made more difficult by a loving and caring partner, whatever the gender of that partner may be. True, society may sometimes make it more difficult for a child with two mommies or two daddies, but that is the fault of society, not the child. Furthermore, if the child is involved enough in the parents' sex lives to be very well acquainted with the specifics of the sexual desires of the parents, then the bedroom door needs to be kept locked, and that goes for us heterosexual parents as well!

I happen to be acquainted with a number of same-sex couples who are involved in raising children, and would defy anyone to show how they love those children any less than a couple that might have biologically produced them. Yet aside from that, I still wonder about his "timeless meaning of marriage." "Same sex marriage," Mr. Jacoby tells us, "says that the sexual and emotional desires of adults count for more than needs of the children." I don't think it means that the desires of adults count for MORE, but they certainly do count. If not, where does that leave the rest of us? Is a couple somehow less important because they choose not to have children? Should a couple feel like they are a failure if they cannot have their own children, or feel forced to adopt in order to pay some debt to society? What about my grandfather, who remarried too late in life to have any more children? Is that marriage somehow less valid because it was not entered into to produce children but so that he could spend the rest of his life in the company of someone that he loves?

It is inevitable, I suppose, that a certain amount of resistance be raised to the idea of allowing the same privileges for same-sex marriages as for so-called "traditional" marriages. As other unpleasant, unfair, and altogether inhuman practices regarding equality of the genders of humanity have met with resistance before, so shall this. Even if enshrining male-female marriages in the Constitution is backed by some silent majority (and I'm not sure it is), it is important to remember that "popular" and "right" are two different concepts. Related, we hope, but different nevertheless. When we consider the message about marriage that we want the next generation to receive, I hope it is a message of love and respect of the needs and feelings of ALL those involved, parents and children together.

That is what marriage is for.

After all, how many Senators have come out in favor of gay marriage? If our enemies can spin this vote as being either for or against gay marriage, you just wait and see how many of our "friends" get cold feet.

#### REPUBLICANS USING OUR SEXUALITY AS POLITICAL WEAPON

Of equal concern: The Republicans are forcing the vote now so

that it will embarrass the Democrats before their party convention at the end of July in NYC. Yes, they are using our sexual orientation as a political weapon, hoping that any pro-gay Senators will lose votes in the fall by defending us now. So I say, fair is fair. If they have no problem using our sexual orientation as a political weapon, we should have no problem using their sexual orientation and other sexual proclivities as political weapons either. Anyone who supports the FMA, or works for a political person or entity who does, had better watch his back. The days of our community protecting you while you stab us in the back is over.

Last in line to ring the bell were Steve Goldenberg and Michael Dias, the first same-sex couple to apply for their marriage license in Falmouth.

They took the opportunity yesterday to announce their summer wedding.

Dias donned a yellow "Ask me about May 17th" button he picked up from a Crackle Barrel Restaurant somewhere along Route 95 in the south - coincidentally the day the chain introduced a new menu.

He said it is amazing how much has changed since the pair met in a Boston bar more than two decades ago.

Back then they would flicker the lights right before the cops raided the place.

"As a young man it was dangerous to be gay," Dias said. "You'd be arrested for dancing together."

But yesterday, there was nothing but happy faces toasting their pending nuptials with some juice and a slice of white cake.
