



Many Omaha area gay and lesbian homeowners who have had trouble with credit cards and so on have found that there is *one* place in Omaha where they can be treated with respect.




Hahne says, "It's my *personal mission* to change the mindsets! And to *liberate everyone* from the restraints!"

Miss Susan Advises Judge Scandalized

The following is an adaptation from Miss Susan's Etiquette Tips for the Socially Conscious Judge: A Guide to Honorable Conduct Toward Gays and Lesbians in the Courtroom, originally published in the St. Louis University Public Law Review in the Spring of 2005. The entire article is being published in the Gayzette in serial form by special arrangement with the law firm of Koenig & Tiritilli, P.C., L.L.O.

Dear Miss Susan.

In a recent family relations case, three credible witnesses testified that a lesbian mother was seen holding hands with another woman at a Unitarian Church picnic (an organization that is known to be a haven for lesbians). A framed photograph of the mother embracing the same woman in front of the Statute of Liberty was also introduced into evidence. I am concerned that the children will suffer from irreparable gender identity confusion if they are exposed to the lascivious behavior of their mother. Mothers are supposed to be role models for their children! I grudgingly granted visitation to the mother, but only in the presence of a heterosexual employee of the state department of social services, and never in the presence of another homosexual. Do you think I should have gone further and denied all contact between the mother and the children?

Love, Judge Scandalized

Dear Judge Scandalized,

I'm not sure why you restricted visitation at all. The mother in this case appears to be a patriotic, church-going woman who is in a committed and loving relationship. I would say that she is an ideal role model for her children. Nevertheless, I see that you are concerned about the impact that the mother's new relationship may have on her children. I may be able to address those concerns by examining decisions of other courts in similar cases.

In Pleasant v. Pleasant, the trial judge ordered supervised visitation for a lesbian mother. The judge initially offered the mother unsupervised visitation if she would agree not to exercise visitation in the presence of "any other person of known homosexual tendencies" or at "any gathering or place of a 'homosexual nature." The mother candidly told the judge that she would not be able to abide by his conditions. The trial judge was concerned because the mother was involved in a relationship with another woman and because she had attended a gay pride parade with her son. In a rather amusing episode, the judge asked whether there had been any "unmasculine" men at the pride parade. When the mother denied that she had seen any unmasculine men, "the judge argued with her about the presence of so-called 'unmasculine' men."

On appeal, the Appellate Court of Illinois found that the restrictions were unwarranted. The court noted that "there is a strong public policy to preserve the relationship between a parent and child," and liberal visitation is generally preferred. Visitation should only be restricted if the child would be endangered by visitation. Since the court found no evidence that the

child had been harmed by his mother's relationship or by the trip to the pride parade, the restrictions on visitation were removed. The court noted that the child appeared to have enjoyed the pride parade.

Applying a slightly different standard, Maryland's highest court reached a similar conclusion in Boswell v. Boswell. In Boswell, the trial judge restricted a gay father's visitation by prohibiting overnight visits and to exclude the father's male partner from being present during visitation. In addition to the father's partner, the visitation order also excluded "anyone having homosexual tendencies... or [] anyone that the father may be living with in a non-marital relationship."

On review, the Maryland Court of Appeals began with the presumption that "the child's best interests are served by reasonable maximum exposure to both parents." As in Pleasant, visitation could only be restricted if the child were subject to actual or potential harm. The court emphasized, however, that a finding of actual or potential harm must be supported by evidence rather than stereotypes or personal bias. The court found no evidence that the children had been harmed by the relationship. Therefore, the restrictions were removed because they were not in the children's best interests.

Pleasant and Boswell illustrate the importance of contact between non-custodial parents and their children. Although it is sometimes difficult for a child to adjust to a parent's new relationship, the parent is still an important part of the child's life. If it isn't too late, I would urge you to reconsider your decision to restrict visitation in this case. You should ask yourself whether the mother's relationship with another woman really endangers the welfare of the children. On taking a second look, you may see that the best interests of the children are better served by a more liberal visitation schedule.

NBC Closes the Book of Daniel

A new television show about a pillpopping priest who talks to Jesus has been pulled from the NBC schedule for igniting little faith from viewers after just three weeks on the air, network sources said on Tuesday. The Book of Daniel, starring Aidan Quinn as a conflicted Episcopal minister with a Vicodin habit, debuted to mediocre ratings January 6 and sank steadily in the Nielsens in its two subsequent broadcasts. NBC has scheduled no further episodes beyond last Friday's telecast, and the drama, originally slated as an eight-part limited series, is not expected to return to the airwayes, network insiders said.

Besides proving to be a ratings dud, the show spooked some advertisers and sparked objections from the conservative American Family Association and several of NBC's smaller affiliate stations over its portrayal of Christian themes. A total of nine affiliates, including stations in Nashville, Tenn., Little Rock, Ark., and Terre Haute, Ind., refused to air at least some episodes of the show.

NBC Entertainment president Kevin Reilly told a gathering of TV critics on Sunday he was disappointed with Daniel's ratings and that "it's been tough sledding on the advertising front." Controversy can cut both ways in the TV business, making some advertisers reluctant to sponsor a show while sometimes generating publicity that helps build an audience.

Last spring Reilly told Reuters that NBC's development of the show was inspired in part by the success of religion-themed novels like the Left Behind series and Mel Gibson's movie The Passion of the Christ. Daniel, however, was a far cry from Passion or the conventional Easter-season TV specials that portray Christ in a biblical context.

On the NBC show-from gay creator Jack Kenny (Titus, Wanda at Large)-Christ, played by newcomer Garret Dillahunt, appears as an imaginary confidant to the Reverend Daniel Webster, an Episcopal rector beset with a host of family intrigues and pressures. His daughter sells marijuana, his teenage son sleeps with the daughter of a church elder, his brother-in-law embezzles church funds, and his sister-in-law has a penchant for sexual threesomes. Perhaps the sanest member of the family is his older son, a gay Republican.

Airing in a Friday night time slot that has proven especially difficult for NBC, a unit of the General Electric Co., the show averaged just 7.6 million viewers overall in its first three weeks. By comparison, NBC's most watched show this season, Law & Order: Special Victims Unit, draws about 14.6 million viewers. (Steve Gorman, Reuters)

Is "Gay" Okay?

I'm often put in awkward situations because of my sexuality. It's never intentional, but I feel ridiculous nonetheless. It happens in the car when someone says, "that's so gay." At work when someone calls a co-worker a faggot, and even at home when my sister calls me a "fudge packer". I know the people using these words aren't trying to be hurtful, but at the end of the day, it's still on my mind.

The one thing that most people don't understand is that all I want is acceptance. I don't want to be singled out as that one "gay guy," who everyone is afraid to offend or hurt. It shouldn't even be an issue. These words shouldn't be used whether I'm around the people saying them or not.

I've had a pretty easy life and thankfully never really had to deal with discrimination, but what about those who have? What about that boy who cried every night because his classmates called him a "faggot", or that young girl who is crying right now because someone just called her a "dyke." It's not as funny when you look at the big picture, the harsh reality that these words have.

Even if you're gay yourself, calling someone else "queer" in a joking manner is unacceptable. A queer person is a reality, not something funny. What are we trying to accomplish by using such words? We are only showing others that it's OK to get a good laugh at the expense of someone else.

You'll find in the black community that the word "nigga" is sometimes used quite frequently. It's normally okay to use the word only if you're in the black community, but only if that's the case. I wonder if those using this word ever think about where the word originated? I doubt their ancestors would laugh at a comedy special using this word in every other sentence. I just don't find it funny.

How can we teach acceptance and fight discrimination when we ourselves are using the words that are ultimately discriminating?

When I was younger I didn't even know what the word "gay" meant. In middle school if you dropped your books, you were gay. Forget your lunch, you're so gay. Do something embarrassing? Well then you're even gayer then before. I had no clue what I was saying, and what made it worse was that I was truly the "gayest" guy in school.

The only time I ever heard the word "gay" was when it was followed by something negative. It wasn't until high school when I truly found out what the word meant. Needless to say I felt like a complete fool.

I'm not going kid anyone here; I sometimes slip these derogatory words myself. So I'm as guilty as anyone else. The thing we need to understand is that there were so many people before us who fought for the right to be openly gay, to marry someone of a different color, or even to move into a certain neighborhood. These words were all thrown their way, people died because of them and fought to get them erased.

Unfortunately, here we sit in the year 2006 laughing at the expense of others and calling people gay. As often and unintentional as it happens, calling someone gay is just not OK.
