First Metro Area Pride Prom is Huge Success

Last October at the Coming Out Day panel there was a question from a Gay Straight Alliance (GSA) sponsor. "Do you think we could do a formal dance? You know, like a prom?"

Over the next seven months Proud Horizon Youth Group facilitators, several GSA sponsors, and a handful of youth met periodically to dream and plan what they might do. They picked a date after other school proms and before the summer activities began. Flyers went out to over a dozen schools in the Omaha and Council Bluffs area.

Students told friends that on Saturday, May 21st, a small group of students and adults would gather to transform a church multi-purpose room into a special place for fun, formals, friends and music. By 7 PM it was transformed for a prom unlike any other Omaha or the surrounding area has seen.

While the planning committee's formal evaluation is not complete, the smiles, laughter, dressed up youth dancing and reports of positive comments still being heard on Monday are some indication of how the youth felt.

Since this was the first time such a dance was attempted in the Omaha area, the planners were concerned that no one would come. They had hoped for 50 youth, dreamed that maybe 100 would come. When the last dance was over, the count from chaperones staffing the admission table was that a mere 111 youth attended Omaha's first annual Pride Prom. What a fabulous beginning to what could become an annual tradition for the LGBT youth and their allies in the greater Omaha/ Council Bluffs area.

PROTECT YOUR FOUR-FOOTED FAMILY MEMBERS

Many GLBT people and allies own pets. We all invest a lot of heart, time, money and energy in their care. Here are some ways to further safeguard these unconditionally-loving companions.

Many people have heard about the harmful effects of secondhand smoke on humans, but too few realize the impact on animals in their care. Cats and dogs are vulnerable. According to Veterinarian Jill Engelstad of the Strohbehn Veterinary Clinic in Council Bluffs, the lungs of cats and dogs are particularly sensitive to the impact

of second-hand smoke. It can especially exacerbate health problems in aging animals. Pet owners are encouraged to shield their four-footed friends as much as possible so they can enjoy a longer, better quality of life with their beloved pets.

A frequently undiagnosed condition in older cats is thyroid



troubles. When you see an older cat that seems energetic and spry, it can be a symptom of a hyperactive thyroid, which causes the feline metabolism to speed up.

Essentially, the cat burns itself out in old age. Your veterinarian can do a simple blood test to see if this is the case. Then you can do a range of things to correct the problem - anywhere from surgery and radiation to just giving your cat pills that keep the thyroid in check. Without treatment, a cat runs a substantial risk of a lethal stroke, so knowing about this fairly common problem can save cat owners some preventable heartache.

Dog owners should beware collars. You often see dogs with collars being walked on leashes. The hidden danger is that a

collar puts strain on the neck bones of a canine. Over time. these bones become loose and a sudden jolt (a startled movement by the animal) can dislodge one - instantly paralyzing the dog from the neck down. At this point the dog will have to either be put down or undergo risky surgery to remove the displaced bone in hopes of restoring movement to the dog's extremities. To save your-



self from this frightening scenerio, get rid of that collar and get a walking harness instead for your leash. One loop of a harness fits over the dog's head and then a second loop snaps around the dog's chest behind the front legs. This configuration moves the stress off the neck and onto the torso when you attach your leash. You can then walk your dog all over without worrying about neck damage.

The aforementioned cat thyroid problem and dog neck problem were experienced by pets of GLBT Center volunteers. While one pet cat perished from a hyperactive thyroid stroke before being diagnosed, it did ultimately save another pet cat from suffering the same fate, and the paralyzed dog survived expensive emergency surgery at the Iowa State University Vet Med Center and now walks briskly once more, although with a rigid gait. Help spread the word and let your fellow pet owners know how to avoid these problems so they can enjoy more quality time with their favorite animals!

I was wondering if you had a recommendation for types of condoms to use.

Dear Omaha Reader,

There is so much information in regards to the proper use of condoms, I simply can not list everything in this column. I have listed below a brief recommendation. I encourage you to research this further at AVERT.ORG. They have extended information on the proper usage of condoms.

There are two types of 'Male' condoms, polyurethane and la-

tex. There have been studies suggesting that each condom is more effective, so it is not clear as to which types is more reliable. However, the likelihood of breakages is very small for both types if the condoms are used correctly.

Latex condoms can only be used with water based lubricants, not oil based lubricants such as Vaseline. Using oil based lubricants can destroy the latex making it ineffective.

Some people may experience an allergic reaction to latex condoms. In this case you can use polyurethane condoms instead.

Polyurethane condoms are made out of a thin type of plastic. Polyurethane condoms tend do be more expensive than latex condoms. With polyurethane condoms, both oil and water based lubricants can be used.

Reintroduction of Homosexual 'Marriage' License Bill Will Fuel Petition Drive for California Marriage Amendment

Sacramento - Assemblyman Mark Leno (D-San Francisco) has announced he intends to "gut and amend" a bill to enable him to continue his attack upon marriage and the voters. Leno wants to insert homosexual "marriage" licenses into a bill that has already passed the Assembly, enabling him to pass the new bill through the Democrat-controlled state Senate, thus manipulating the system to give his defeated bill another chance of passing the Assembly floor later this summer. Leno's action comes two weeks after his counterfeit marriage bill, AB 19, was defeated on the Assembly floor, despite three attempts to pass it. "Mark Leno, be careful what you wish for," responded Randy Thomasson, president of Campaign for Children and Families (CCF), a leading West Coast pro-family organization which helped lead the six-month campaign to defeat AB 19. "The Democrat politicians' addiction to homosexual 'marriage' guarantees that a constitutional marriage amendment protecting marriage rights for a man and a woman will qualify and pass on next year's ballot."

In late July, VoteYesMarriage.com, a statewide marriage protection movement, will begin circulating petitions to protect marriage and marital rights for one man and one woman. The Voters' Right to Protect Marriage Initiative was submitted to the Attorney General's office on May 19. The initiative's website is www.voteyesmarriage.com.

"The Democrat politicians' obsession with destroying the essence of marriage will keep this issue front and center for California voters," said Thomasson, an organizer of VoteYesMarriage.com. "It's ironic. San Francisco Mayor Gavin Newsom inspired voters in more than a dozen states to protect marriage in their state constitutions. Now Mark Leno is annoying and aggravating average Californians, who will respond in force by signing petitions to place the Voters' Right to Protect Marriage Initiative on the ballot."

Iowa Senate Co-President Says Vote on Gay Marriage Amendment Unlikely

The leader of Democrats in the Iowa Senate says they will not cave to pressure on gay marriage. Senate Co-Leader Mike Gronstal, a Democrat from Council Bluffs, says it's "pretty unlikely" that the Senate will vote to allow a statewide vote on an amendment to the state constitution banning gay marriage. "We already have a state law that outlaws gay marriage," Gronstal says. Gronstal says he can't quite understand what Hurley's group is after. "First, they don't want (gays and lesbians) to get married...and then if they actually get married and they decide they don't want to be married, (Hurley's group) doesn't want to let them get divorced," Gronstal says. "I don't quite understand what their concern is." Gronstal says when Republicans were in control of the Senate in 2004, the constitutional amendment on gay marriage failed. Gronstal says he doesn't see the amendment passing in a Senate that's now equally divided with 25 Democrats and 25 Republicans. Gronstal made his comments during taping of the Iowa Public Television program "Iowa Press.'

Chicago Breaks Ground on LGBT Center

Chicago's largest LGBT social services agency broke ground Tuesday on the Center on Halsted, a new \$20 million community center that has been 20 years in the making.

Community leaders expect the center to offer a wide variety of activities and services in the heart of the city's vibrant gay neighborhood.

In planning for the building, center leaders traveled to lesbian and gay centers in Los Angeles, New York and San Francisco, and hoped they could create a place that would combine the best of all of them.

The \$20 million center will be home to more than 40 Chicagoarea organizations. Its other amenities are almost too numerous to list: a 175-seat theatre, a gym, classrooms, a computer center, a rooftop garden and more. The list of available services will include programs for domestic violence survivors, youth counseling and education services, individual therapy, HIV/AIDS and sexually transmitted disease programs. All will be housed under one roof.

"The beauty of the plan is that we can have so many different

groups from all walks of life in one center," said Modesto Tico Valle, the center's deputy executive director. "We can create a real synergy here with all these groups meeting each other and not duplicate each other's efforts."

Chicago Mayor Richard M. Daley, who attended the groundbreaking, said the center was a real "beacon of hope" for the community. Daley and tennis legend Billie Jean King are honorary co-chairs of the center. A rooftop garden will be named for Daley; the recreational space will be named for King.

The 135,000-square-foot building itself will be three stories high. A Whole Foods market will be the building's retail anchor. The building, at 3656 N. Halsted, was built in the 1920s and originally housed a car dealership. When the city bought the property, the facility became a maintenance garage.

The center's leaders struck a deal with the Chicago City Council to purchase the Lake View site from the Chicago Park District back in May 2001. They promised to keep the original facade of the building, which contractors are now taking apart brick by brick. Once the facade is removed, demolition of the building will begin.

The San Francisco-based architecture firm Gensler Architecture Design & Planning Worldwide designed the building.

Organizers have already raised \$15 million to build the center, the money a mix of private and public funds. A \$5 million grant came from the Illinois FIRST program, which is a state infrastructure improvement grant. A \$75,000 grant came from the Illinois Clean Energy Community Foundation based on the center's design elements, which include solar hot water heating, a

natural light and ventilation system and rainwater harvesting systems.

Leaders hope the Center on Halstead will open in 2006.

U.S. Episcopalians Defend Gay Bishop

Leaders from the U.S. Episcopal Church addressed Anglican leaders from around the world on Tuesday in Nottingham, England, to defend a decision to ordain an openly gay bishop.

The meeting, called the Anglican Consultative Council, is an international gathering of bishops, priests and lay people from the 38 national Anglican churches that meet every three years.

The 77 million-member Anglicans Communion is struggling to deal with homosexuality, with the North American churches generally taking a more inclusive stance. More-conservative leaders, mainly in Africa, Asia and South America, hold to the view that homosexuality is a violation of Scripture.

In February, Anglican leaders asked representatives of the U.S. Episcopal Church and the Anglican Church of Canada not to attend the council meeting. The decision to ostracize the two North American churches was in response to the U.S. consecration of Bishop V. Gene Robinson, a gay man living in a samegender relationship, and the decision by the western Canadian diocese of New Westminster to authorize the blessing of samesex unions.

Despite excluding them from the meeting, Anglican leaders did ask the North American churches to send representatives to the council to explain the theology behind their decisions.

Members from the U.S. delegation addressed the council for about 90 minutes, asking members to focus on unity. They presented a 130-page paper, prepared by six theologians and one historian.

One passage from the publication said: "Might Christ the Lord, unfolding the mystery of his redeeming work, be opening our eyes to behold a dimension of his work that we had not understood?"

"We were there to explain the rationale behind decisions made that were upsetting to the rest of the communion," said the Rev. Susan Russell, one of the presenters. Russell, who is president of Integrity USA, an organization representing gay Episcopalians and their supporters, said her group was well received by the council.

Russell spoke to the PlanetOut Network by phone from Nottingham. She said that after the presentation, Presiding Bishop Frank Griswold, the head of the U.S. church and another one of the presenters, made the statement, "We didn't go there to change minds, but I think we touched some hearts."

Episcopalians who oppose their church's stance also sent observers to the meeting.

Cynthia Brust, spokeswoman for the American Anglican Council, said while the audience was polite and attentive, the council members she spoke with afterward had not changed their opinions, and neither had she.

"From my perspective I was not persuaded to change my point of view that the Scripture is very consistent that sexuality needs to be confined between a man and a woman in marriage," she said. "I think the Episcopal Church made a terrible decision, one that was costly to them theologically, and I think our differences remain irreconcilable."

Russell took the opposite view.

"I experienced the breadth of the church looking in hope that our differences are reconcilable," she said. "I would say Jesus is a lot more interested in finding ways to reconcile our differences than he is in finding ways to split the church."

Anti-Gay Marriage Rally in Madrid

Thousands of people in the Spanish capital, including a squadron of bishops and a legion of nuns, have answered a call from the Catholic church to protest against gay marriage. The issue has divided Spaniards, most of whom describe themselves as Roman Catholic in a country where the church traditionally wields great influence but is seen by many as increasingly out of step with popular feeling. Spain's Catholic church recently dubbed gay marriages "a backward step on the path of civilization" but a majority of the electorate supports the Socialist government's liberal social agenda which will see same-sex unions become law by the summer pending final approval by the Senate.

Gays Set Group Hug Record

GERMAN gays and lesbians marching in the northern city of Hamburg on Saturday said they set a new world record for a group hug, with 16,000 people embracing each other for 10 seconds.

"This march should bring people together, regardless of whether people are homosexual or heterosexual," said drag queen Olivia Jones, one of organizers.

Braving cold and rainy weather, the marchers beat the previous group hug record set last year by 5117 Canadian high school students.

Police said overall around 22,000 people attended the so-called Christopher Street Day parade, a Gay Pride march which is held in numerous cities in Germany and elsewhere in Europe to mark the Stonewall riots following a 1969 police raid on a gay bar in New York City.

Crowd Protests Against Gays In Warsaw Poland

Hundreds of people took to the streets of the Polish capital on Saturday to denounce gays and demand tough new laws against homosexuality. The show of force - called The Normal Parade - was organized by the militant Polish Youth, an offshoot of the ultra conservative Law and Justice Party. The rally was called in response to last weekend's Pride parade in the city in which several members of Polish Youth were arrested when they tried to break up the march. The parade had been banned by Warsaw mayor Lech Kaczynski but Pride organizers ignored his order.

Iowa Court Won't Challenge Civil Union Ruling

DES MOINES, Iowa -- The state Supreme Court refused Friday to tamper with a lower-court decision that dissolved the civil union of two women, saying the conservatives who sued were not harmed and had no standing in the case.

The high court noted that it was not judging the merits of the claims by the legal arm of the Des Moines-based Iowa Family Policy Center, a church and a handful of state legislators.

"Rather, our task is to determine whether these plaintiffs are the proper parties to bring this action," the court wrote.

Their lawsuit challenged a ruling by Judge Jeffrey Neary that let Kimberly Jean Brown end her civil union with Jennifer Sue Perez. The two were joined in March 2002 in Bolton, Vt., according to Brown's divorce petition. Neary granted a divorce, later altering the ruling to say it terminated a civil union.

The plaintiffs argued that the judge had overstepped his authority by recognizing gay marriage, but the Supreme Court disagreed.

"We fail to see how the district court's action in dissolving a civil union of another couple harmed in any specific way these plaintiffs' marriages and for this reason, they have shown no legally recognized interest or personal stake in the underlying action," the high court said.

The court also rejected an argument by Matthew Wentz, pastor of the Church of Christ in Le Mars, that the decision threatened his ability as a minister to solemnize marriages.

Messages left Friday for officials with the Iowa Family Policy Center and three state lawmakers who were plaintiffs in the case were not immediately returned.

The judge, who won a retention vote last fall, declined to comment on Friday's ruling.

Gay Leaders to Ring NYSE Closing Bell

"I'm really excited about this," Schubert said. "It's a historic event and a momentous milestone in the movement toward equality that the world's largest stock exchange so recognizes the community during the month of June."
