


And I do have a couple interesting submissions that came in after you picked up the stuff for this month. ## PRISONER PROJECT FOR NEBRASKA & IOWA

I want to again clarify the prison project. The project is meant to keep the prisoners in Nebraska and Iowa informed of what is going on in the community while they are out of circulation. I continue to hear from prisoners in Kentucky and Nevada who request free ads and free magazines. Because of the cost involved in publishing and mailing of the magazine, we are no longer able to provide this service to out of state prisoners. When we did, the response was overwhelming with as many as 70 magazines being mailed out. This is a considerable expense for a nonprofit organization to bear. My suggestion is to find others in the prison system who would be willing to subscribe to the magazine and share the cost and the magazine. The cost is \$19.00 per year.

We will publish ads from out of state prisoners who send stamps or a money order to pay for their ad. We do not offer free ads to prisoners.

I would appreciate it if those who are in prison would share these guidelines with others and refrain from sending letters asking for free magazines and free ads. It is a time consuming effort for me to respond to each of these requests. Your cooperation would be greatly appreciated.

For those of you who are in Nebraska and Iowa, please continue to let us know who you are and we will be happy to respond to your requests.

As always, we advise our readers to respond responsibly to those requesting pen pals. Do not send money or material things to the prisoners. We are offering an opportunity for those who are incarcerated to have correspondence from the outside.

But since you didn't care enough to write, we didn't have an article to publish. Hmmm? Seems that you are criticizing us for something you didn't do. A little strange, isn't it?*

I'm sorry to hear that someone is having a hard time learning about the Heartland Gay Rodeo Assoc. Since it is obvious you read the New Voice, I don't see how you've missed hearing about us. The New Voice has been very good about printing the date, time, and location of our regular monthly meetings in their calendar section. They also list our address in the resource section every month. I did miss the deadline one time this year. And at least two other members submit articles on a fairly regular basis.

As editor of our monthly newsletter I can tell you that we send copies to Q, Panic, and the old 2001 every month. If you're not into the bar scene, our mailing list also includes gay friendly bookstores in Iowa and Nebraska, the UNL Gay Resource Center, Citizens for Equal Protection, National Organization for Women, EAGLE, Frontrunners, GLAGN, SAGE, PFLAG, ICON, even PGSS in Scottsbluff and a C & W group in England, plus numerous other groups and businesses.

This year will be the third time we have had a table at National Coming Out Day in Omaha. This was our first summer for having a table at the Imperial Court Picnics, WomenFest, and the Omaha Pride Parade. And I can't begin to tell you all the events our Des Moines membership has participated in. For the past two years we have been telling everyone that would listen about hosting the 12th Annual International Gay Rodeo Convention this past July. We had a couple of members who lived in Lincoln who used to distribute the newsletter and other information in your fair city. We regularly attend the ANGLE meetings, and I know some of the people present live in Lincoln. Since I live in Iowa I don't get to Lincoln often. Perhaps you'd volunteer to distribute our newsletters and other info in your area.

As I am the Correspondence Secretary, I pick up all the mail from the Post Office Box and answer all mail in a timely manner. This includes requests for newsletters, applications, rodeo information. We even had a student from UNL attend our Awards Banquet last fall so that we could answer questions for a research project he was doing. In my opinion we disseminate information about H.G.R.A. as best we possibly can. If you know of other ways, please let me know. # FOCUS ON THE FAMILY IS OUT OF FOCUS

The homophobic Focus On the Family group has a new article on its America Online site that gives destructive and warped advice to teachers dealing with students who come to them with questions about their sexual orientation.

The author, Beth J. Leuders, claims that, "Young people scarred by molestation and family violence or duped by the moral apathy in our society often push their sexual curiosity to the limit. These vulnerable kids become the prime targets for pro-gay groups looking for young recruits on high school campuses." Later, Donna Rene Hopkins, a counselor for New Creation Ministries, which tries to "reform" lesbians and gay men by encouraging them to deny their feelings and try to live as heterosexual, suggests that "the gay community is feasting on what is basically already a turbulent and confusing time in an adolescent's life."

Both the writer and her sources clearly have an anti-gay agenda, making false claims about lesbians and gay men as predators of the young, about the lie of "recruitment", and about the myth that people are gay because of childhood molestation or abuse.

In addition to hauling all of the usual lies and stereotypes about lesbians and gay men out of their war chest, Focus On the Family points teachers in the direction of a number of radical religious organizations which claim to be able to "cure" homosexuality, and a handful of books that are all anti-gay radical religious right propaganda. The article's guise of being a "guide" for teachers could mislead them into doing something harmful to lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgendered youth, leaving them feeling even more alienated and confused.

With lesbian and gay young people so at risk for suicide, alcoholism and drug abuse, Focus On the Family is doing the most destructive thing it can to America's gay youth, denying their sexual orientation and propelling them into a cycle of despair.

Let Focus On the Family know how destructive its lies and myths about lesbians and gay men are to young people. 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

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
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# POETRY with Brian E. Bengtson

who pamper their bored feet and piss in our yards.


Elders of villages had passenger seats

## DRUG ABUSE BEHAVIOR & HIV RISK

HIV education outreach is a vital component of AIDS Services Organizations. The purpose is to prevent the spread of HIV and AIDS. Speeches, trainings, testing, counseling and hotline attempt to convince people to reduce their risk of HIV infection. We now know many people must change their current behaviors. Research shows that changing behaviors is not easy. The most effective method of changing behavior is through peer education. Input of individuals who are at risk of infection is critical in designing risk reduction programs. When it comes to IV drug use, ethnographer Steve Koester says successful and realistic HIV-risk reduction strategies are designed by drug users themselves. During training with the Denver Health Department, participants had the chance to talk with users and peer educators about what they have learned. Getting to know the community, the hangouts and the leaders in a group is essential. This is time-intensive and slow going, but builds trust that specialists aren't going to report users, or interfere with their use. Koester started by paying users to tell him about their drug use. For several months, two doctoral students basically hunted out where the users bought, sold and injected.

One student reported he would walk down the street and everyone would nod, a signal they had a supply to sell. After several months, they stopped trying to sell to him and accepted he was just doing research and was not going to interfere with their business. Eventually, researchers built trust to such a level they were allowed to document heroin preparation and injection on video.

A second round of paid interviews began to flesh out risk behavior the users were and were not willing to take to protect themselves. If they usually shot up at home, one user said, they rarely shared needles. If they did, it was with family or sex partners who did not share outside the group. People who shot on the street were more likely to recycle or rent needles, and might pick up syringes visible in the gutters, grass or streets of Denver.

The users identified their own risk behavior and what changes were realistic. For example, a street injector has to be more mobile and has less time to inject, often seconds. That user will take more risks and won't carry a bleach kit. A home shooter will be more likely to use a bleach kit if sharing with others.

As both Koester and the users themselves agreed, knowledge won't change behavior, but taking the time to learn the context of risk behaviors goes a long way in learning how to design practical risk reduction programs.

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## CAUGHT WITH YOUR PANTS DOWN?

While murderers, rapists, drug dealers, and thieves run rampant in our city, the Omaha Police Department has made lonely homosexuals in Elmwood Park its new priority. The OPD has assigned a seemingly constant battery of officers to patrol the "cruise" park looking for male to male sexual activity. One source informs me that, on the other hand, heterosexuals can perform sexual acts unimpeded in the park. Once the police detect homosexual activity, they arrest the suspect and hand them a ticket for Lewd Conduct.

Lewd Conduct is a crime under an Omaha City Ordinance which carries a penalty of up to six months in jail and/or a \$500 fine. Lewd Conduct is purposely or knowingly doing a lewd act. A lewd act is defined as, "any act of a sexual nature which is offensive to the average person of a group which is intended or likely to observe it." This ordinance has been tested in the Nebraska Supreme Court and found to be constitutional.

The problem is that OPD issues these tickets like they were entrance tickets to the park. Hundreds of tickets are issued every year. The following are a couple of examples that led to a lewd conduct charge:

a. Pete was in one of the parks when he was approached by an undercover police officer and asked to engage in sexual acts. Deciding that the person was unattractive, Pete declines his invitation. The officer persists and suggests sexual favors three more times before Pete decides to flee the park. The officer follows Pete to another location about three miles away where he approaches Pete's car and again asks him to at least expose himself to the officer. Pete, feeling rather flattered, complies. The officer, laughingly, issues him a ticket stating, "I didn't think you were going to fall for it, Pete."

b. Ken was in a bathroom in one of the parks. Having to relieve himself, he went to a bathroom

and began to use the wall-mounted urinal. An undercover police officers seated on the toilet next door began to make grunting noises and looked through a hole in partition between the two urinals. Ken, thinking that a small pig has escaped from the zoo, turned to look to see what all the noise was about. He was issued a ticket because the officer could see his penis through the waist level peep hole.

One might be thinking that this is entrapment. However, entrapment in Nebraska is very hard to prove. The accused must prove that he had no tendency to perform the act that he did absent the prodding of the police. It generally doesn't work.

The ramifications of receiving this charge can be very great. The name alone implies that the accused is a pervert and immoral. It can place jobs, relationships, and freedom in danger. The consequences are not worth the thrill; keep your pants up!

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# THE REBIRTH OF DARROL K. STEPHENS

I pondered the many things that have occurred in the last month. The most outstanding was the honor of walking with Darrol to the rebirthing of his life and spirit.

I did not realize the wonderful process of death and transformation of new life that occurred in our home. I am reminded of the kind of full circle that happens in life. How a circle is one without a beginning and without an end. Thus it was so with Darrol and his final days.

I have spoken enough with Darrol's parents to know that when Darrol was born he was rocked to sleep, and his mother sang to him, bathed him, fed him, changed his diapers and clothes, responded to his pain with comfort, helped him take his first steps and laughed with every full face grin he made.

Following the natural growth process, Darrol acquired the skills to become an adult in that he learned to love and give comfort to himself and others, feed himself, bathe himself, relieve himself, walk without assistance and laugh at many things in life. These became second nature to Darrol as with most of us — we too have accomplished this independence.

It was a very short time for us as friends when the very things acquired in growing began to become unnecessary for the move to rebirth. One of the first things Darrol gave up was holding his bowels and urine. He began to require a loving group of people to provide the care. Just as mothers do, we lotioned, cleaned, changed, washed and put moisture barriers on him. Next Darrol no longer needed his legs to move him about because the journey of rebirth and flight does not require legs. We then moved him about in a wheelchair for as long as possible. The third step was the inability to feed himself fully and negotiate combing his hair or brushing his teeth. We then began the process of feeding him the things he liked and brushing those beautiful teeth many times a day. Soon water and food became something that was not of any value from us just as if he had returned to the womb for his sustenance. Little by little, swallowing became impossible, and the medications changed from medicines to arrest AIDS to ones that would give him comfort. They were all given by suppositories, and Darrol was so patient with me as I learned the art of insertion. In the final stages, Darrol became less able to communicate with adults and began to smile at things that amused him. I imagine that Darrol was a baby that smiled and it was easy to return his joy. Singing the 60's and 70's music to him with the made-up words I created when I didn't know the correct words made him grin. Next Darrol began to sleep more and required less play time but more rest time as his body was growing tired. Soon Darrol lived in between two worlds and sometimes seemed far off. We continued to talk to Darrol, loving and caring for him, always being in close physical, intimate nurturing just like a big sister or mother. Finally, the functions of breathing were what we watched change. He breathed strong, then more congested, then less and less with gaps of no breathing, next a panting kind of breath, next a shallow breathing pattern with most of the movement in his lower stomach rather than the chest. Then on June 12, 1996 with Reverend Wuf (Bob) at one side holding Darrol and me on the other Darrol rebirthed right

in front of us. We were loving, crying and giving permission for the transformation of Darrol to leave through the open window. A lady always knows when to leave, quoted from "Fried Green Tomatoes", and it is true.

The awesome experience of loving someone and being given the honor to be a chosen presence during the most vulnerable state of living existence still lingers with me. The love that filled our home ever reminding me to be kind to others and to avoid taking things so seriously still exists. The Spiritual connection of motherhood I felt with Darrol's mom, but most of all the process of a butterfly moving back into the cocoon, that he may rebirth in the heavens, not bound by the limitations we struggle with, images fully in me daily. God Bless each and every one of you for your financial, spiritual and physical strength through this metamorphosis.

## TUBING THE NIOBRARA

In August I was lucky enough to go on a Women Only trip to Valentine, Nebraska for a day of tubing on the Niobrara River. We camped out at Smith Falls State Park Friday and Saturday nights with 34 women from the Omaha-Lincoln areas.

The main reason I'm writing this article is to inform everyone about some difficulties we had with our arrangements. Originally Linda and Joanne had talked to Supertubes at National Coming Out Day last year and picked up some literature. They chose to use this company because they are "family" owned.

Jo and Linda met in Lincoln with the owners of Supertubes back in May or June and set up the weekend. Linda informed them she would try to get 40-50 women to participate. The owners of Supertubes even said they would join us on the tubing trip, since it was to be all women. Linda asked if they required a deposit, she was informed that there was NO WAY they would forget a trip with 50 lesbians!

Over a period of almost 3 months Linda called Supertubes approximately every 2 weeks with updates as to how many women had actually signed up for the trip. They even have recorded conversations with them, stating that everything was set.

Well, 2 weeks before the scheduled trip Linda called once again to give the final tally and was informed that we didn't have a reservation! Not under her name, nor under Joanne's name, nothing. And there was no way they could accommodate us; they had reservations for other groups on OUR weekend. Perhaps we could come the following weekend. Well, we all took vacation time, and a former Omaha resident was flying in from Reno, Nevada. NO, we could not change weekends.

Linda called me in a panic and I suggested she call one of the other tubing companies in Valentine and see if they could help us. She called Sharp's Outfitting and they not only accommodated us, but offered their shuttle bus to us free of charge (Supertubes was going to charge us \$25). Sharp's picked us up at noon on Saturday and drove us to the dam to get on the tubes. We did have one snag, the last group of women had to wait about 1-1/2 hours to get their tubes. For some reason, Sharp's didn't have enough tubes waiting for our use. But, we spent 6 wonderful, wet hours on the Niobrara. What a blast!

We had 6 tubes in our group and we decided to stop and wait for the next group so we could go down the river together. We didn't realize how fast the current was and when we attempted to stop, our cooler tubes turned over and we lost some of our sodas. I still need to dry out my camera, I had it around my neck so it wouldn't get wet. Wrong! I got off the tube to get it to change directions and the 2 feet of water under my feet turned into 5 feet shortly downstream. With that current I had a lot of difficulty getting back onto my tube. And my camera suffered the most, it went underwater numerous times!! Some of the women brought those big water guns that shoot 50 feet, and we had some fun water fights with our other groups and even with strangers passing by on their canoes. Our group even pulled over and ambushed Linda's tubes with our water guns.

Now that I've recuperated from my sore muscles and exhaustion, I'm ready to go again. In fact, we've already planned a trip next summer with some friends and all our kids. And Linda has begun planning a winter retreat to the Raccoon River Resort in January. We've already signed up for the snow angel competition and her special version of the Newlywed Game.

## MILITARY WITCH HUNT EXPOSED IN HAWAII

In the September 2 U.S. News & World Report, an article called "Is the Air Force Asking and Telling? Gays Allege a Witch Hunt at a Hawaiian Base," reported on the zealousness with which the military has recently asked, told and pursued gay men at Hickam Air Force Base.

According to U.S. News, the military gave Senior Airman Bryan Scott Harris, who is facing a long prison term for sexually assaulting another man, a reduced sentence if he would turn over the names of other military members involved in acts of sodomy. Additionally, the military also demanded that Harris identify anyone who bought a drink at Hula's Bar and Lei Stand, a Honolulu club with a heavily gay clientele. Again, according to the article, military investigators have asked Honolulu's Metropolitan Community Church, which ministers to gays and lesbians, for membership lists and records of commitment ceremonies.

Since President Clinton ordered the "don't ask, don't tell, don't pursue" policy, the article suggested that the military has stepped up its pursuit of lesbians and gays.

The Servicemembers Legal Defense Network, a legal advocacy group, has been attempting to break this story for months, and U.S. News & World Report should be commended for a balanced and well-researched report that goes beyond the coverage seen elsewhere in the mainstream media. ## PINE-SOL LADY HAD TWO MOMS from GLAAD

In an interview with the *San Francisco Chronicle*, Diana Amos, best known as the Pine-Sol lady, spoke about growing up in an interracial family headed by two lesbian mothers.

The article recounts her experience in the early 1960's as a young African American girl who moved with her mothers from an Indianapolis ghetto to her alternative family in San Francisco with a new Jewish lesbian mother and two new siblings.

"To the 38-year old Amos, her story is cut from the wholesome cloth of American life. It just happens to have an unorthodox shape," wrote *Chronicle* staff writer Steven Winn. "When you're a kid, you understand love," says Amos, "and that's what I felt when my mother got together with Norma. Suddenly she was singing and cooking again. And my sister and I had these two other kids to play with."

Winn described the ways in which the children could not speak of their mothers' relationship in public because it could have cost them their jobs. Amos also said racism broke up her family. Norma eventually moved out, facing the additional pressure of disapproval from her own mother.

The article also reports that Amos went on to professional success and a happy heterosexual marriage.

## MAN ADMITS MOTIVE IN DOUBLE MURDER: THEY WERE LESBIANS

The man charged with the killing of Roxann Ellis and Michelle Abdill of Medford, Oregon has said he killed them because he hates homosexuals and bisexuals.

The development in the case has been reported by the Oregon media. The statements by the accused killer, Robert Acremant, have refocused attention on the case and re-opened wounds in the Medford community.

Ellis and Abdill, an openly lesbian couple and local activists, were murdered "execution style" last December. Their bodies were found bound and gagged in their pickup truck. Soon after his arrest, Acremant made a variety of statements regarding the killings, including at first that it was a botched robbery. Later, he said he knew the women were lesbians and that it made it "easier" for him to kill them.

## BARNEY FRANK'S POLITICALLY INCORRECT MENAGE-A-TROIS

On August 27, during the "Strange Bedfellows" segment of Comedy Central's Politically Incorrect, openly gay Representative Barney Frank (D-MA) appeared in bed with regulars Al Franken and Arianna Huffington.

Huffington apologized on behalf of all Republicans for Dick Armey's infamous "Barney Fag" comment last year and for his attempt to justify it as a slip of the tongue. Frank replied, "My mother has reported that in the 59 years she's been Elsie Frank, no one has ever introduced her as 'Elsie Fag'."

At the end of the segment, both Franken and Huffington kissed Frank on the cheek and said good night to one another.

Afterwards, the other guests on the program discussed the segment. Senator Joe Lieberman, a Democrat from Connecticut, noted that Frank was one of the funniest and smartest people in Congress. Comedian Joan Rivers said, "It's so sad that someone would use the gay thing against someone else. If they don't want gays in the military, just make the uniforms ugly."

## POSITIVE: LIFE WITH HIV ONE IN THREE AMERICANS KNOW SOMEONE INFECTED WITH HIV

How does a person who is diagnosed with a chronic illness such as HIV/AIDS cope with the everyday challenges of life? How do families and friends face the challenge of day to day life with a loved one who is infected with the virus that causes AIDS? An innovative television series has been developed to answer questions such as these.

"*POSITIVE: Life with HIV*" explores the experiences and everyday challenges of people living with HIV and AIDS. The four-part series features real people who give personal accounts of their lives and the lives of friends, families and loved ones who are directly affected by AIDS. It is a forum for those infected and affected by the virus to share the experiences, challenges and triumphs of living everyday with this disease.

"Our job," said Juanita Anderson, Executive Producer of *POSITIVE* for AIDSFLMS, "was to create a series that showed life from inside the epidemic, from the many points of view of people living in some way at some stage, with the virus. From news coverage to made-for-TV movies, television perpetuates stereotypes of all kinds that do a disservice to the people who are supposedly being portrayed. In the case of people living with HIV, this is particularly damaging given the terrible stigma associated with the disease."



Emcees Dustin Logan and Frank Nowicki climbed to the top of scaffolding to announce the seven hot leathermen who vied for the coveted title in such events as prejudging interviews, Fantasy wear, presentation of their sexual fantasy, jockstrap competition, and the infamous "Mystery Category" which is not announced until just before the event. This year's mystery category had 5 very macho, very sexual men making greeting cards for selected holidays and composing verses for their cards. (Now just who was it that made the life size greeting card complete with glory hole?)

The Fantasy competition opened with a performance of selections from "Rocky Horror Picture Show" by the contestants and several of the IMSL title-holders and staff. The number was incredible — especially when the house came down as the owner and producer of the International Ms Leather Contest, Miss Amy Marie Meek, took the stage as the "transsexual transvestite from Transylvania." Those of you who know Amy will know that her usual style is tee shirts, head bands around hair that is shaved on the sides and long in back, shorts or overalls, and hiking boots. To see her decked out in full "drag" with curled wig, make-up, leather, lace, and an unbelievably long "tool" — well, this alone was worth the price of admission to Fantasy. (Love you, Amy!)

The contestants were: JC, Mr. Fantasy - Colorado; Kevin Watson, Mr. Fantasy - New Mexico; Rick Strube, Mr. Fantasy - Nebraska; Jeff Sappenfield - Mr. Fantasy - Texas; Mike



Warner - Mr. Fantasy Tennessee; Robert Riley, Mr. Fantasy - Minnesota, and Steve Collier, Mr. Fantasy - Missouri. They were a diverse group, both in appearance and style, producing a broad spectrum of fantasies. Our own Rick Strube captivated the audience with his smile — a grin which spreads across his face with delight at each new experience, especially during his rather playful fantasy when he took on the role of the puppet Pinocchio. JC, Mr. Colorado Fantasy, is a mountain of a man with an imposing presence both on stage and off. He used his strength and power to full advantage in his fantasy which ended with a heated branding iron applied to his partner's ass. This fantasy was staged to perfection, with the branding iron put downstage to heat while the scene unfolded. The presence of that branding iron never left your awareness and you could feel the tension rise throughout the fantasy much like a Stephen King mystery. The final act was a thrilling moment of tension relief and gave an illusion of reality that was incomparable.

Jeff Sappenfield, Mr. Texas Fantasy had a rather shy smile that went well with his down home style. His long legs looked quite at home in blue jeans, chaps, or in a jock strap as he acted out his locker room fantasy and charmed his place into the first alternate position.

Fantasies ranged from an eerie funeral scene



to a playful birthday party fantasy presented by Mike Warner, Mr. Tennessee Fantasy. There was a barber shop scene, a motorcycle repair scene, and an incredible scene in which the central figure soared to new heights of pleasure as his body released strong endorphins in response to hot wax poured over newly shaved skin.

Obviously the judges had a most difficult challenge but at the end of the evening Mr. New Mexico Fantasy was named the new International Mr. Fantasy, Jeff Sappenfield was named first alternate and Rick Strube was second alternate. The contestants named Mr. Congeniality for the event, but this year they contestants were all so great that there was a three way tie for the title. So, taking home the title of Mr. Congeniality were JC, Mike, and Rick.

Judges for the event were: Bob Ewing, head judge, JD Buehert, Cindy Bookout, Harley McMillen, Dave Rhodes, Larry Everett, Alan Selby, Scott Rodriguez, and W.W. Walker. The MAX was decked out with an erotic montage of the art work of Chuck Wilson, which was a perfect setting for the event. It was an exciting event, filled with wonder, laughter, and the arousal of strong emotions. What more could one ask?

Experimental Cinema: The Films of Barbara Hammer

*Nitrate Kisses* (USA, 1992, 63 minutes) & *Tender Fictions* (USA, 1995, 58 minutes)

Thursday, November 21, Friday, November 22, and Sunday, November 24

*Nitrate Kisses* explores eroded emulsions and images for lost vestiges of lesbian and gay culture. This first feature by Barbara Hammer, a practicing pioneer of lesbian cinema, weaves striking images of the sexual activities of four gay and lesbian couples with footage that uncovers the forbidden and invisible history of a marginalized people. *Nitrate Kisses* encourages the viewer to save scraps, letters, books, records, and snapshots in order to preserve our ordinary lives as history. Archival footage from the first gay film in the U.S., *Lot in Sodom* (1933), and footage from German documentary and narrative films of the '30s are interwoven with current images of desire in this sexy and haunting documentary.

With *Tender Fictions*, Barbara Hammer constructs an autobiography before someone does it for her in this post-post-modern sequel to her 1992 award-winning documentary, *Nitrate Kisses*. Childhood stories of the artist as a young lesbian and intimate tales of the lesbian as a young artist underscore the filmmaker's life of performances. With a Swiss army knife she robs an American Express Bank in Morocco, accosts a shepherd in a field on International Women's Day, and tap dances on Shirley Temple's star on Hollywood Boulevard. This child movie star was the ideal by which Hammer's ambitious mother measured her own Barbie. Grandma, already a cook for Lillian Gish in Hollywood, introduced the cute, loquacious child and her mother to D.W. Griffith. Lesbian autobiography is a slender genre, so Hammer draws from general culture studies for critique and to provide an ironic edge to the synthesized "voices of authority." Using personal archival footage of the AFL-CIO faculty strike at San Francisco State College supported by the Black Panther Party (1968), the first San Diego Women's Music Festival (1965), and the "Take Back the Night March" in San Francisco (1979), Hammer challenges a younger generation to visualize a world before they existed. The stories tug at your heart, the theory teases your intellect, and the fragile line between truth and fiction provoke you in this dense and hypnotic montage.

**French Twist** by Josiane Balasko  
(France, 1996, 100 minutes) **Sunday, Dec. 8**

"Josiane Balasko (*Too Beautiful for You*) wrote, directed and stars in this French comedy about Laurent (Alain Chabat), a brash philanderer; Loli (Victoria Abril), his juicy peach of a wife; and Marijo (Balasko), the beefy, crop-haired lesbian stranger who wonders in to fix their sink, stays for dinner, and ends up changing their menage big time. Laurent can't figure out why happily heterosexual Loli falls for Marijo's barrel-chested charms, but we can: She may be the butchest cookie this side of *Go Fish*, but she offers Loli attention, tenderness, and laughs, and she shakes up Laurent's smug macho world but good. (Abril shoots off sparks of pleasure like a little rocket and walks around naked like she's wearing the most chic fashion - which, of course, she is.) There are lumpy patches of sentiment thrown in, but otherwise this '80s-style farce is funny, breezy, erotic, and so matter-of-fact about the infinite variety of human sexuality."

# LEATHER ENGINEERS OF OMAHA: OUR FIRST YEAR

Much has happened since August of 1995. It was Saturday, day two of "Fantasy '95," that I approached Bob and Dustin about forming a leather club in Omaha. Explaining, actually complaining, to Bob that at the time I was tired of not being involved in a leather community and wanting to do something about it, Bob, Dustin, and I agreed to meet when things settled down a bit. About mid September we gathered at Gilligan's, coming to the meeting full of ideas and with a list of leather curious men and women. I met with skepticism from Bob and Dustin because of prior experiences that Bob had with a club we had both been former members of. Working together, we agreed that our goals and ideas were obtainable, setting another meeting later in the month to discuss our ideas further. During the second meeting we worked out more details, deciding to create a traditional men's leather club. During this meeting I picked the founding members. We set our first official meeting for October 1st. Attending that first meeting were 10 eager men wanting to educate ourselves and our community about the leather lifestyle in a positive manner. We wanted to be a social club that was designed to bring back the joy of being gay leathermen and not a fund-raising organization. We had many meetings, sometimes every week for the next month and a half, getting much of the needed ground work done. About mid October officers were elected. I was named President, Jim G. Vice-President, Rick N. Secretary, Bob E. Treasurer, Rick S. Historian, Dustin L. Road Captain. On November 2, we had our first meet and greet which was held at Gilligan's. It was our first public appearance as a club so that the community had a chance to get to know us and allow us to find out who might be interested in joining our club. Our first pledge class began in April, and we accepted two new members in June. Our newest pledge class consists of 6 men, who are currently still going through the pledge period.

I began working with Cindy Bookout to get the women's group underway, and in April they held their first meeting at the Chesterfield. Most of our members attended to lend their support. This new organization is now known as W.E.L.T. (Women of Educated Leather Tactics).

Late spring and summer kept our club extremely busy. We attended Interna-

tional Mr. Leather in Chicago, and sponsored the welcome party for Fantasy weekend. Two of our club brothers also prepared for 2 international contests. Rick S. placed 2nd runner up to International Mr. Fantasy, and Rick N. will compete for International Mr. Drummer in late September in San Francisco. It was during Fantasy weekend that we were able to premier our club T-shirts and club colors. They were well received and admired, receiving many compliments from our local community and our out of town guests. We also attended Aunt Mike's underwear night and we were out in force at ICON's Fourth of July and Labor Day Picnics.
