


Boss Allegedly Grabbed Man's Butt, Drew Penises on Paychecks, Must Pay \$2.2M

A jury in New York City has awarded Raymond Rosas, a former restaurant supply truck driver, \$2.2 million after he accused his former bosses at Balter Sales Co. of extreme sexual and racial harassment.

Rosas claimed his boss, Barry Rosenberg, would draw "a picture of a penis" on his paychecks, "would repeatedly try and grab Rosas's buttocks," and would frequently try to lick Rosas's face. Rosas reportedly asked Rosenberg to



The verdict, reached last week, still needs to be approved by a federal judge.

Rosas's lawsuit claimed his supervisor, Mark Balter, wasn't sympathetic and regularly talked down to minority drivers. Balter, according to court filings, said to Rosas, "What is it with you guys ... you must have a Latin attitude."

When Rosas complained about Balter's way of communicating with minority drivers in 2011, he claimed Balter told him, "I can't believe the way things are going in the recession that you can tell me that you think I am talking [offensively]."

Balter fired Rosas in January 2012, and Rosas soon filed his lawsuit. Balter filed a countersuit against Rosas in 2013, alleging that the former employee stole boxes of restaurant equipment worth \$700. Balter filed a police report, and Rosas was given a desk appearance ticket, but those charges were dropped. Rosas said the company fired him and filed the report as retribution for speaking up about the harassment. The jury agreed with Rosas and dismissed the countersuit.

"The jury was absolutely right," Rosas's lawyer, Derek Smith, told the Daily News. "The jury was angered at the way Mark Balter treated his employee." Rosenberg's attorney told the paper he wouldn't comment until after the judge approved the verdict.

It was not immediately clear if either Rosas or Rosenberg is gay and no indication their sexual orientation was relevant to the alleged harassment.

Focus on the Family Founder: 'We Lost the Entire Culture War'

A prominent evangelical leader who founded several of the nation's most virulently anti-LGBT groups has admitted that he and his contemporaries have "lost the entire culture war" when it comes to fighting LGBT equality, reports Right Wing Watch.

James Dobson, an evangelical Christian author and psychologist, founded Focus on the Family in 1977, was a founding member of the certified anti-LGBT hate group known as Family Research Council in 1981, and is listed as a founder of the right-



wing, antigay legal group Álliance Defending Freedom. That organization, now based in Arizona, has become a powerful fundraising behemoth dedicated to fighting marriage equality and trans-inclusive nondiscrimination protections, and to enshrining a "right to discriminate" against LGBT people in state laws.

Speaking to televangelist Andrew Wommack on The Gospel of Truth TV show November 24, Dobson reflected on the day the U.S. Supreme Court ruled in favor of nationwide marriage equality in fatalistic terms.

"I had a black cloud over me after June 26, when that decision was handed down," said Dobson, referring to the high court's pro-equality ruling in Obergefell v. Hodges. "And [as] I was contemplating this foreboding, this black cloud, it hit me like a ton of bricks. ... That decision is not really about gay marriage. It's not. It's about everything else. It's about the entire culture war."

"It's about control of the public schools and it's what happens in universities," Dobson continued. "It's about the economy and it's about business and it's about the military and it's about medicine. It's about everything. We lost the entire culture war with that one decision. The gay marriage thing was just part of it, but it's going to touch every dimension."

Dobson, who rose to prominence in the 1990s after launching what was at the time a Christian radio show called Focus on the Family, has a long history of demonizing LGBT people and bemoaning societal steps toward equality.

Earlier this year, Dobson laid bare his fundamental confusion about what it means to LGBT, claiming on his radio show in April that being bisexual meant having "orgies." He also suggested that ministers who spoke the "truth" about homosexuality were at risk of being charged as "accomplices" to antigay hate crimes.

Dobson blamed the 2012 massacre at Sandy Hook Elementary in Newtown, Conn. — where a lone gunman killed 26 people, including 20 children — on a nation that has "turned our back on God." Dobson specifically pointed to marriage equality and legal abortion as evils for which God "has allowed judgment to fall upon us."

ISIS Throw 4 More Gay Men to Their Deaths

Islamic State (ISIS) militants executed four more gay men in Iraq over the weekend.

Two young men were thrown off the roof of a building in Mosul under the pretext they were a gay couple.

'On Sunday afternoon, Daesh called on the people of Mosul to gather in the square of Bab al-Toub in order to witness the



execution of the two allegedly men,' an eyewitness told ARA News.


'The victims were taken to the top of a building and were brutally thrown off the roof.'

Also on Sunday, the Terror Monitor group tweeted photos of a separate execution of two 'gay' men, who were thrown from a building in Nineveh into a pile of cement blocks.

The photos show an imam reading out their sentence and large crowd of spectators:

ISIS has branded LGBTI people 'the worst of all creatures.'

The jihadist group executed nine men and a boy accused of being gay in Syria last month and have claimed responsibility for the killings of at least 30 other gay men.

Israeli Military Lifts Ban on **HIV-Positive Recruits**

Earlier this week, the Israeli military announced that it has scrapped a ban on HIV-positive recruits and will soon begin enlisting HIV-positive soldiers to non-combat roles. Military conscription is mandatory for all secular Jewish citizens of Israel but. previously, HIV-positive people were automatically deemed unfit for service. This shift in policy makes the Middle Eastern nation one of the most progressive in the world in



terms of inclusion towards a community that remains largely stigmatized.

Haaretz reports that the new policy will be put into effect in the coming weeks, and that HIV-positive people will then be able to enlist and serve in a variety of positions, excepting combat roles. While only a small number of people are expected to be affected per year, Col. Moshe Pinkert told Haaretz that this marks a "very important step...for the acceptance of people with HIV into society and reducing the social stigma."

Gays, lesbians, and bisexuals have been able to serve openly in the military since 1993, with transgender people being afforded the same right in 2013.

US Senator Marco Rubio Reveals how Anti-Gay He'd be if **Elected President**

US Senator Marco Rubio makes no attempt to sugarcoat his opposition to LGBTI equality in a new interview.

One of the top five polling candidates in the crowded Republi-

can presidential field tells the Christian Broadcasting Network he would seek out potential Supreme Court justices who are against same-sex marriage and abortion.

He is critical of the high court for its 5-4 vote in June that made same-sex marriage legal in all 50 states. Two of the votes for marriage equality came from justices appointed by President Barack Obama.

... There is no way that you can read that Constitution and deduce from it that there is constitutional

right to an abortion, or a constitutional right to marry someone of the same sex,' Rubio said.

'You need judges that understand how constitutionally flawed that those two kinds of rulings and others have been and that's what the most important thing the next President will do is appoint Supreme court Justices that actually will apply the constitution irrespective of their personal feelings about the issue.

Rubio would also reverse some executive orders made by Obama that seek to end LGBTI discrimination.

... Things like gender equality in restrooms,' Rubio said. 'You've seen some local districts and others been forced to, you know, provide girls access to a boys' bathroom and so forth.

He added: '... But also ensure that we're not doing anything that at any part in our government that is putting organizations that are motivated by their faith or organized around their faith from having to violate the tenants of their faith and that includes government contractors.

'There are many government contractors and small companies who provide services to the government who are faith-based people, and they are, they are being compelled to sin by government in their business conduct. That is not something we should be supporting."

Gay Victim in San Bernardino Mass Shootings Died a Hero

Daniel Kaufman, believed to be the only gay person killed during last week's mass shooting inside the Inland Regional Center inside San Bernardino, died a hero.

The death toll of 14 could have been higher had Kaufman – who ran a coffee cart and worked as a job trainer at the facility – not tried to save the lives of others before he lost his own.



It's been revealed that Kaufman was in the hallway of the facility when the shooting started and he began shouting 'Get out! Go! Get out now! Hurry!'

He began to push people out of harm's way and rushing them towards a door to escape. It was during this process that Kaufman was shot and killed.

He is being credited with saving at least four lives, according to The Pride.

Kaufman had been trading texts with his partner three years, Ryan Reyes, throughout the morning of the attack and Reyes had said 'he was his usual cheerful, chattering self.'

Reyes, 32, who had to wait an excruciating 22 hours before finding out his boyfriend's fate, is expected to appear on TV's Dr. Phil this week to speak about his late partner and the tragedy.

Syed Farook, an inspector at the San Bernardino County health department, and his wife, Tashfeen Malik, opened fire on a holiday party that was taking place inside the center on Wednesday, killing 14 people and injuring another 21.

It is being investigated as a possible act of terrorism.

Farook and Malik were later killed during a shootout with the police.



Minnesota Man Abducts Teen, Rapes Him for Four Days in Sex Dungeon

A Minnesota man has been arrested for kidnapping 19-year-old man and raping him for four days in a sex dungeon.

Wilbert Glover, 55, was charged with kidnapping and firstdegree criminal sexual conduct on 24 November.

According to the criminal complaint, the teen – only identified as DNB – was choked out from behind on November 20 while walking on the street.



When he woke up, he was blindfolded and chained in a basement, and was then anally raped over the next four days.

On the fourth day, DNB was able to break his left wrist out of handcuffs and broke a bar in the sex dungeon's concrete wall, and broke off that chain as well. He then crawled through a bathroom window that he smashed with a fire extinguisher.

He then knocked on doors until someone answered.

'I opened the door and there's this kid just standing there. And he had all these chains and a fire extinguisher,' Tina Meudeking told KARE-TV.

'He said he was attacked from behind and choked until he passed out, and woke up in the basement.'

When police arrived, DNB was crying. He had scabs around his eyes, wrists and neck, and his clothes were soiled.

DNB was maced and told not to remove his blindfold, and never saw his attacker.

So police had to look for a house with a broken back window. When they located it, they arrested Glover, who denied living there.

A five-gallon bucket full of used condoms was also found in the basement.

Glover was convicted of attempted murder and kidnapping in Illinois in 1987.

He is now being held on \$1 million bail, and faces up to 70 years in prison if convicted.


Three Dead, Five Wounded in Attack on Gay Fest in Mexico

An attack by gunmen on a gay festival in Acapulco, Mexico, over the weekend left three people dead and five wounded, Agence France-Presse reports.

It wasn't immediately clear if the Sunday attack on the Reina Gay festival in the resort town was specifically antigay or part of the generalized violence plaguing the region. Acapulco has the highest homicide rate in Mexico, and several schools in nearby rural areas have had to suspend classes recently due to violence, according to AFP.

The people killed when the gunmen fired into the crowd were all men, aged 23 to 33, a police official told AFP Monday. Five others required hospitalization for their injuries.

STUDY: Dating Apps 'A Major Factor' in Spread of HIV in Asia

Just in time for World AIDS Day, a new study on teenagers in Asia has found smartphone dating apps complicit in the spread of HIV. Because the apps increase the opportunity for casual sex, researchers say, their growing use is a major factor in what is being dubbed a new HIV epidemic.

For example, in the Philippines alone, HIV infection rates among teenagers have reportedly doubled in four years, while in Bangkok, young gay men have a one-inthree chance of being infected.

These findings, unveiled after two years of research by the United Nations Children's Fund, were first reported Monday by U.K. newspaper The Guardian.

"With the rise of these apps, the probability and risk of infection will increase multifold because it makes it so much easier for [young gay men] to date other guys and hook up for sex," Wing-Sie Cheng, HIV adviser for UNICEF in east Asia and the Pacific, told The Guardian.

While worldwide, HIV infection rates are decreasing generally, UNICEF found that infections among people aged 10-19 have increased in Asia and the Pacific region, home to more than half of the world's adolescents.

Officially, there are at least 220,000 infected preteens and teens in the region, while the actual number is likely much higher, according to UNICEF.

Also, the U.N. believes doctors in that part of the world are treating fewer than half of those adolescents. And there has been a steady increase year after year in the number of AIDSrelated deaths.

"We need to work better with mobile app providers to share information about HIV and protect the health of adolescents," Cheng told The Guardian.

But at least in the U.S., mobile apps Tinder and Grindr have bristled at such connections, such as the one made on billboards that went up in Los Angeles in September. The ads from the AIDS Healthcare Foundation suggested the apps were linked to the spread of STDs and offered free testing. In response, Grindr removed all of AHF's ads and Tinder called its lawyers, who sent the group a cease and desist letter.

Martin Shkreli Wishes He Could Charge More for \$750 Pill

After becoming a congressional whipping boy and an icon of corporate greed for jacking up the price of a medication by 5,000 percent, CEO Martin Shkreli has one regret: he should have charged more than \$750 a pill.

Shkreli aired the sentiment on Thursday at a New York health care gathering, Politico reports.

"I think I could have it raised it higher and made even more profit," Shkreli said at the Forbes Healthcare Summit. His detractors should try being a CEO, he said: "See how well you do."

The head of Turing Pharmaceuticals claims his only job is to make money for investors and that pharmaceutical companies should be able to operate like any moneymaking corporation.

Shkreli's company bought Daraprim in August and quickly raised

the per-pill price from \$13.50 to \$750. Daraprim is the cornerstone component of a combination of two or three drugs used to treat toxoplasmosis, an infection in the brain that can cause blindness, seizures, and neurologic deficits in movement. It is acquired by ingesting the toxoplasmosis organism via undercooked meat and contamination with cat feces. People with immune system deficiencies, especially people with HIV, are particularly at risk.

Shkreli's decision to use Dauraprim as a cash cow led to con-



gressional probes, investigations from the New York attorney general, and rebukes from politicians, including Hillary Clinton and Bernie Sanders.

"I know society can't put you in jail for violating your fiduciary responsibility," Shkreli said Thursday.

Louisiana's Next Governor Will Protect LGBT Workers by Executive Order

John Bel Edwards is still a month away from being sworn in as Louisiana's next governor, but he's already signaling a change from the Bobby Jindal administration by announcing plans to issue a pro-LGBT executive order.

The Times Picayune of New Orleans reports that sometime after his inauguration January 11, Edwards will sign an executive order to protect his state's gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgender state employees and government contractors from getting fired, being discriminated against and harassed.



No timetable was announced by the governor-elect's transition team.

"People deserve not to be fired from their jobs because of who they are," Matthew Patterson of the LGBT advocacy group Equality Louisiana told the newspaper.

It is currently legal to fire someone for being gay or in a samesex relationship throughout most of Louisiana. The Times-Picayune reports that New Orleans and Shreveport are the only cities that have enacted laws to prevent businesses from

firing a person for being LGBT.

The newspaper notes the executive order would not protect nongovernment employees, nor would it necessarily apply to state government outside the governor's control, such as the judiciary.

Jindal and another Republican governor, Mike Foster, would not offer protections to LGBT state workers and contractors, as Democratic former governors Edwin Edwards and Kathleen Blanco did. In fact, Jindal called Blanco's executive order "unnecessary" when he took office in 2007. In May, a little more than a month before the Supreme Court ruled in favor of marriage equality, Jindal issued an antigay executive order he said was designed to "protect religious freedom."

Edwards faces certain opposition. A conservative Christian state lobbying group, the Louisiana Family Forum, vows to fight the order.

"I have equal concerns that religious liberties may be jeopardized," Gene Mills, head of the Louisiana Family Forum, told the paper.

U.S. Marine Convicted of Killing Transgender Woman

A United States Marine was convicted in the Philippines Tuesday of killing a woman after he discovered she was transgender, according to the Associated Press.

However, the court found Lance Cpl. Joseph Scott Pemberton of New Bedford, Massachusetts, guilty of homicide, and not murder, resulting in a far less severe punishment, reported the Philippine Star.

Witnesses testified that Pemberton strangled Jennifer Laude and dunked her head into a toilet bowl in a hotel room. They had met that night in October 2014 at a disco bar in Olongapo, a city northwest of Manila, according to the wire service.

Two of Pemberton's U.S. Marine colleagues testified Pemberton used a slur when he told them what happened: "I think I killed a 'he/she," the Associated Press reported.

According to police, Pemberton became angry with Laude upon discovering she had male genitalia, CNN reported.

In court, Pemberton claimed he acted in self defense and that Laude was not dead when he left her in the hotel shower, according to Reuters.

The Filipino court rejected Pemberton's "trans panic" defense and convicted him of homicide.

For his crime, Pemberton was sentenced to 6 to 12 years in prison, but credited for the year he has already spent in detention. He was also ordered to pay Laude's family 4.6 million pesos (\$98,000) in damages including burial costs, according



to the wire service.

Laude's mother, Julita, told the Associated Press she was not pleased with the short jail sentence and had hoped Pemberton would be found guilty of murder, which could have resulted in a 40-year sentence.

"But the important thing is he will be jailed," she said, crying. In her grief, she misgendered Laude, saying "My son's life is not wasted."

In October 2014, Jennifer Laude's family climbed the fence of the military base where Pemberton was being held because they wanted to see the man accused of killing their loved one and were not allowed legal entry.

The Laude family's lawyer, Harry Roque, told the Associated Press "this is a bittersweet victory because it is not murder," adding that "if what he did isn't cruelty, I don't know what is."

Pemberton is temporarily being held in the New Bilibid Prison in Muntinlupa City, according to the Star. The U.S. Embassy is reportedly going to confer with the Department of Foreign Affairs about where Pemberton will ultimately be imprisoned.

The Star reported Laude family's lawyers claimed that the U.S. refuses to turn Pemberton over to Philippine authorities.

Under the Visiting Forces Agreement between the United States and the Philippines, the confinement or detention of U.S. personnel shall be carried out in facilities agreed upon by authorities from both countries.

Near the courthouse, dozens of Jennifer Laude's supporters rejoiced when the verdict was announced and burned an effigy of Uncle Sam, screaming "Justice for Jennifer!"

The demonstrators were held back by police, fire trucks and iron railings, according to the wire service.

The outrage surrounding the murder was heightened due to tensions regarding the United States military presence in the Philippines, which the Associated Press reported many Filipinos feel undermines the sovereignty of the country.

Dear Michael:

I don't seem to be very good at making – or keeping – friends. I'm kind of a loner and always have been, but I'd like a friend to



Friendless in San Diego

Dear Friendless:

Years' ago, I facilitated a group that helped my clients develop and fine-tune their social skills. Making and keeping friends is a skill and, like any skill, it can be learned.

Friendships take time, energy and commitment. If you're not good with communication or understanding social cues (what is often called "emotional intelligence"), relax. You can, with some focus and effort, become better at being a good friend and attracting quality people into your life.

From years of helping clients go from friendless to friend-ful, here are some ideas for your consideration in how to master the skills of friendship:

Loneliness – Most of us want friends so we don't feel lonely. Loneliness is an emotional response to not feeling connected to other people or it can be experienced even when we're surrounded by other people but not relating to them. To me, loneliness is a kind of psychological "alarm clock", letting us know that we are drifting towards isolation and that we need human interaction (e.g., friends).

Impatience – Many of us lack patience when it comes to making new friends. We want great friends and we want them NOW! Unfortunately, it rarely works like that. Some people are impatient with friends they already have: they interrupt their friends with some version of "Get to the point, already". If this has been a problem in your friendships, try this the next time you get impatient and annoyed: take a deep breath, make eye contact with your friend and repeat something that they said (to encourage yourself to really listen). If you typically find yourself rehearsing what you're going to say when a friend is talking, bring your attention back to your friend and tell yourself

"My turn will come. Let me listen to him/her as I want him/her to listen to me."

Forgiveness and flexibility – Every friend, no matter how great they are, is going to mess up. Can you forgive them, or do you hold a grudge and try to "make them pay"? It's got to be okay for YOU to mess up and for THEM to do the same; otherwise, your friendships will be very short-lived.

Enjoying your own company – what makes you attractive to potential friends? Usually, it's when someone sees you somewhere and experiences you as happy and confident. It's hard to be attractive when you're miserable. So, how can you enjoy your own company more and be better friendship "bait"? Do things and go to places you enjoy. When you're enjoying yourself, you naturally appear more attractive.


Finding Friends – How do you meet like-minded people? Well, what do you enjoy doing? Don't put yourself in situations that you don't enjoy: if you're not a party person, don't force yourself to go to parties in hopes of meeting friends. For example, if you love being outdoors, get yourself out there and start to notice other people a bit more. You could even smile and say, "Hello."

Phone Challenges – Lots of people don't like talking on the phone, you're certainly not alone. Texting is a good back-up. Some people don't like phone calls because they feel put on the spot when the phone rings: they don't know what to say. I suggest you use caller ID so that you can decide whether you are in a good place to talk to the person calling. If not, you can listen to their voice message and call (or text) them after you've thought about what you want to say/ask/share. If you do want to talk with them, take a deep breath before you pick up and greet them with some neutral phrase like: "Hi Chris, how's your day going?" or something equally friendly and benign.

Give some of these ideas a try and soon you won't be friendless anymore.

Christmas Quiche

Ingredients

1 sheet frozen puff pastry, thawed

4 slices bacon, cooked and crumbled

2 eggs

1 cup milk

2 cups shredded Swiss cheese

Salt and black pepper to taste

1 small tomato, thinly sliced

Methods/Steps

Preheat oven to 450 degrees. Press the puff pastry into the bottom and up the sides of a shallow casserole dish or 8 inch pie plate.

In a small bowl, beat eggs and milk with a fork until blended; season with salt and pepper. Sprinkle a thin layer of Swiss cheese in the bottom of the pastry crust. Sprinkle crumbled bacon over the cheese. Pour the egg mixture into the pastry and sprinkle with the rest of the cheese. Arrange slices of tomato on top.

Bake in the preheated oven for 20 minutes. Reduce the oven temperature to 350 degrees. Continue to bake for an additional 30 minutes, or until crust is browned.

Twice-Baked Potatoes

Ingredients

4 large baking potatoes

4 tbsp. butter

1/2 lb bacon

1 large onion, chopped

1/2 cup chopped fresh mushrooms

1 (8 oz.) container sour cream

1 (8 oz) pkg. shredded cheddar cheese

1 tsp. crushed red pepper

1 tsp. garlic powder

1 tsp. ground black pepper

1 tsp. chopped fresh chives

1 tsp. dry bread crumbs

1 tsp. salt

Methods/Steps

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Use a fork to pierce the potato skins. Bake the potatoes unwrapped for about 1 hour, or until soft, in the preheated oven. Place bacon in a large, deep skillet. Cook over medium high heat until evenly brown. Drain, crumble and set aside. Over medium-low heat, melt the butter in a large saucepan. Add together onion, mushrooms, red pepper, garlic powder, pepper, chives and salt. Cook slowly, stirring occasionally until the onions are soft. Cut open the baked potatoes and, keeping the skins intact, scoop the insides into a medium bowl. Transfer the onion mixture to the bowl. Mix in the

sour cream. Pour in 1/2 of the cheese and continue mixing until all ingredients are well blended. Use a large spoon to fill the potato skins with the mixture. Top with bread crumbs, the remaining cheese and bacon, Place the potatoes back into the preheated oven and continue baking for about 15 minutes, until the cheese is melted and the filling is slightly brown.



Here are 51 Weird and Cool Facts from LGBTI History

- 1 Some of the world's oldest rock paintings which were discovered in Sicily, made about 10,000 years ago, showed two male phallic figures having sex.
- 2 Ancient Roman historian Plutarch wrote about The Great Mother, an intersex deity depicted with both sets of genitals. Her sacred priestesses, as found in the earliest civilizations in Babylonia and Akkad, were eunuchs and trans women.
- 3 In ancient Assyrian society, if a man were to have sex with another man of equal status, it was thought that trouble would leave him and he would have good fortune.
- 4 A Hindu medical text dating back to at least 600 BC made several explicit references to gay people; kumbhika men who bottom during anal sex; asekya men who swallow semen; and sandha men who speak and act like women. The text also claimed it was possible for two women to create a child together but said it would end up being 'boneless'.
- 5 In Egypt 1503 BC, Hatshepsut became the second woman to rule and chose to take the title of king. She donned male clothing and wore a false beard.
- 6 Julius Caesar and Claudius were considered 'abnormal' for refusing to take male lovers. Julius had, at least, an affair with Nicomedes, the king of Bithymia, as a youth.
- 7 Ancient Celtic men openly preferred male lovers. According to Diodorus in the 1st century BC, he wrote 'young men will offer themselves to strangers and are insulted if the offer is refused'. Sex between men was very likely an important 'bonding ritual'.
- 8 One of the first Roman emperors, Elagabalus, could have been transgender. Before dying at the age of 18, it was reported the emperor had married a male athlete and would go out disguised as a prostitute.
- 9 Wales had a gay king. King Maelgwn of Gwynedd of the sixth century was described as 'addicted very much to the detestable vice of sodomy'.
- 10 St Thomas Aquinas, a priest from the 1200s, is considered the father of homophobia. At a time when homosexuality was often treated as an 'open secret', he preached widely that it was 'unnatural', similar to bestiality, and argued sodomy is second only to murder in the ranking of sins.
- 11 Did you know the church sanctified same-sex marriages in the so-called Dark Ages? Pope Sixtus IV, of the 1400s, was reported to have legalized sodomy during the summer months.
- 12 In the Klementi tribe of Albania, first observed in the 1400s, if a virgin swore before 12 witnesses that she would not marry, she was then recognized as male, carried weapons and herded flocks.
- 13 The French called homosexuality the 'Italian vice' in the

- 16th and 17th centuries, the 'English vice' in the 18th century, the 'Oriental vice' in the 19th century, and the 'German vice' starting from 1870 and into the 20th century.
- 14 Most people know the origins of the word 'gay', but the word 'lesbian' was first used from around 1590 to mean a tool a stick made of lead (from the isle of Lesbos) used by stonemasons. It was flexible so it could be used to measure or mold objects to irregular shapes. A 'lesbian rule' was also used to mean being flexible with the law.
- 15 Julie D'Aubigny was a 17th century bisexual French opera singer and fencing master who fought and won at least 10 life-or-death duels, performed nightly shows on the biggest opera stage in the world and once took the Holy Orders just so she could sneak into a convent and have sex with a nun.
- 16 An 18th century English term for sex between women was the 'Game of Flats'.
- 17 A molly house was an 18th century English term for a room or bar where gay men would meet. Patrons of the molly house would enact mock weddings and children being born.
- 18 Trans man Albert Cashier fought for the Union in the American Civil War. At one point, he was captured by the Confederates but managed to escape by overpowering a prison guard.
- 19 A Boston marriage, in the 19th century, referred to two women living together financially independent of a man.
- 20 The word 'homosexual' (coined in 1869) is older than the word 'heterosexual' (1892).
- 21 Edward White Benson, the Archbishop of Canterbury from 1883 to 1896, was thought to have been repressing his homosexuality. His wife, brother-in-law and five of his six children were also gay.
- 22 The word "Dude" used to be a homophobic slur.
- 23 UK Prime Minister Winston Churchill, when he was 21, was accused of 'gross immorality of the Oscar Wilde type'.
- 24 Doctors in the early 1900s thought bicycles would turn women gay.
- 25 Wings, the first Oscar-winning film in 1920, featured a manon-man kiss.
- 26 In the 1930s, a Disney comic strip showed Mickey Mouse as a violent homophobic thug. In the strip, he beats up an effeminate cat and called him a 'cream puff inhaler'.
- 27 The British secret intelligence service tried to spike Hitler's carrots with female hormones to 'turn' him into a woman.
- 28 Sister Rosetta Thorpe, a bisexual black woman, is credited with inventing rock n roll.
- 29 World War 2 genius and cryptographer Alan Turing said he had lost a mystery box of treasure in Bletchley Park but could no longer find it as he couldn't crack his own code.
- 30 The 1948-53 Kinsey study found a third of men had a homosexual experience.

- 31 A drag queen was the first openly gay candidate to run for US public office. José Sarria won 6,000 votes in his 1961 campaign for the San Francisco Board of Supervisors.
- 32 The death and funeral of Judy Garland is credited with inspiring the Stonewall Riots.
- 33 Pride in New York City was never really 'Gay Pride'. The first was mainly organized by bisexual woman Brenda Howard.
- 34 The original name for Pride was 'Gay Power'. Other suggested names included 'Gay Freedom', 'Gay Liberation' and 'Christopher Street Liberation Day'.
- 35 Dracula author Bram Stoker married Oscar Wilde's first girlfriend.
- 36 One of the first openly gay athletes was Dodgers outfielder Glenn Burke in the late 1970s. He told his teammates, who apparently didn't care, and was officially outed in 1982. He is also credited with creating the high-five.
- 37 A man who saved President Ford from assassination had his life ruined when the media outed him as gay.
- 38 L Ron Hubbard, the founder of Scientology, had a son Quintin who was tasked to take over from the Church of Scientology. When Quintin came out as gay, he died of an 'apparent suicide' in 1976.
- 39 Mel Boozer, the African American human rights activist, became the first openly gay person ever nominated for the office of Vice President of the United States in 1980.
- 40 Sally Ride was the first American woman to go into space. She was also the first LGBTI astronaut and remains the youngest American to have traveled to space at the age of 32.
- 41 In the 1980s, religious groups tried to ban Dungeons and Dragons for being satanic as it 'promoted homosexuality'.
- 42 In 1987, Delta Airlines apologized for arguing in plane crash litigation that it should pay less in compensation for the life of a gay passenger than for a heterosexual one because he may have had AIDS.
- 43 Princess Diana went to a London gay bar, accompanied by Freddie Mercury, disguised as a man.
- 44 The Etoro tribe in Papua New Guinea is where homosexuality is the norm and heterosexuals are excluded. They believe young men only become adults if they have a daily intake of semen to 'properly mature'.
- 45 Queen's The Show Must Go On was recorded as Freddie Mercury was dying due to complications from AIDS. According to Brian May, Mercury said: 'I'll fucking do it, darling' vodka down and went in and delivered the incredible vocal.
- 46 When Ellen DeGeneres came out on her sitcom, Birmingham in Alabama refused to show it. A local LGBTI group sold out a 5,000-seat theatre so people could watch it via satellite.

- 47 Stephen Hillenburg, one of the creators of Spongebob Squarepants, revealed in 2002 that Spongebob is asexual.
- 48 The couple in Lawrence vs Texas, the case that stopped sodomy being punishable in the US in 2003, didn't actually have sex. They weren't even a couple.
- 49 The country that watches the most gay porn is Kenya, a 2013 study found. In a recent poll, 92% of Kenyans claimed they thought homosexuality should be illegal.
- 50 Fun Home, the award-winning, lesbian musical, is the first in the history of the Tonys to be written entirely by women.
- 51 In 2015, it was announced a crater on Pluto's moon will be named after George Takei's Star Trek character, Sulu.








