GERMAN GOVERNMENT GRANTS GAYS RIGHT TO MARRY

The German government on Friday, Nov. 10 passed a law allowing same-sex partners to marry, as well as extending the tax and inheritance rights of marriage to gay couples. The ruling red-green coalition voted unanimously in the Bundestag lower house for the legislation which allows for "gay weddings," where same-sex partners can register their relationship at state registry offices. The law, which is due to come into force next year, gives gay married couples the same pension entitlements as heterosexual couples, and gives foreigners in homosexual relationships with Germans the right to residency.

IN DECEMBER IMPERIAL COURT FOCUSES ON NEEDS OF CHILDREN AFFECTED BY HIV/AIDS

During the month of December the Imperial Court of Nebraska will focus its activities on the needs of families affected by HIV/AIDS. The primary focus is Toyz for Totz which will provide toys for 150 children who live in families with HIV/AIDS. The Imperial Court has set a goal of \$4500 which will provide \$30 in toys, clothing, or other gift items for each child. Those of you who have shopped for children this Christmas know that \$30 will provide only a few inexpensive toys for each child, but this may well be the only Christmas that these children receive. GAY VETS MEMORIAL

The American eagle wears a triangle on the "rainbow" granite statue dedicated by Arizona Rainbow Veterans -- the first of its kind in a National Memorial Cemetery. Arizona Rainbow Veterans (ARV) on Nov. became the first U.S. GLBT group to dedicate a military memorial in a National Memorial Cemetery. The memorial is a simple oblong "rainbow" granite block about 33" long by 24" high with an inscription that reads, "In Memory of All Veterans Who Served with Courage and Pride, Donated by Gay, Lesbian and Bisexual Veterans of America". It features two triangles as well as a third on the breast of an American eagle.

ARV's newsletter describes the memorial as intended "to honor the memory of all veterans who have fallen in our nation's battles, both at home and abroad. It will be a memorial to remember our colleagues who chose to risk their lives for their country while forced to be silent [about their sexual orientation]. It will be a memorial to our brothers and sisters who have given so much and who deserve recognition. ... For those who risked their lives every day in a world of bigotry to serve the country they loved. This is a memorial for those who have fallen to our country's enemies and those who died at the hands of fellow service members."

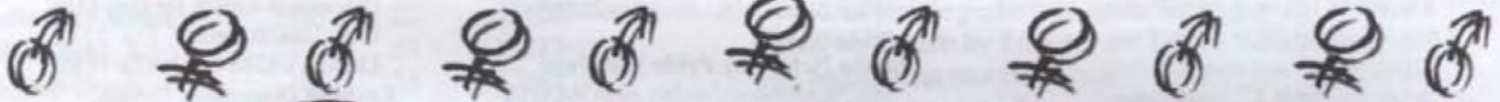

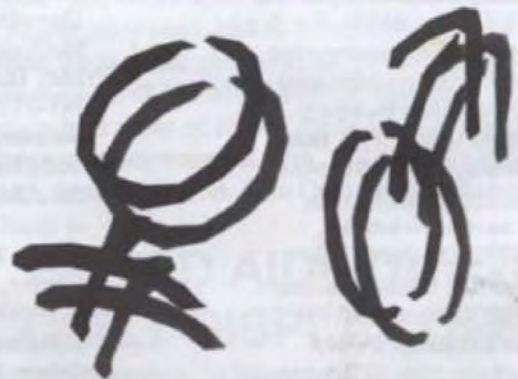
