The Reverend Tom Emmett III to be Senior Pastor of MCC-Omaha



MCC-Omaha is pleased to announce that Rev. Thomas Emmett III of Longmont, Colorado has accepted the position of Senior Pastor of Metropolitan Community Church of Omaha. Rev. Emmett was in Omaha from November 15 through November 19 meeting the congregation and members of the community. 86 worshipers gathered to hear his first sermon which was based on the story of God providing manna in the desert.

After service and a potluck dinner, Rev. Emmett answered questions for over an hour, discussing his commit-

ment to establishing a church environment base on Love, Acceptance, and Trust and his belief in open and direct communication. Rev. Emmett was then excused and the congregation discussed and voted on whether to call him as Senior Pastor. The vote was over 98% in favor of calling Rev. Emmett as Senior Pastor. Rev. Emmett's acceptance was immediate.

He then stayed on for two more days to look for housing and for a site to set up his antique business. Rev. Emmett anticipates moving to Omaha and beginning his full time Pastorate by February 1. In the interim he will be closing his antique business in Colorado and preparing to move. He does plan to be in Omaha for the Christmas celebration as well as other times during the next two months. Watch for details.

Rev. Emmett told congregants that he had been most impressed with the hospitality of the Omaha Community and with the quality of the lay leadership at MCC-Omaha. He looks forward to a time of planning and preparation for unprecedented growth in MCC-Omaha.





Don't be an old Scrooge, come on down and have some fun!



Many Omaha area gay and lesbian homeowners who have had trouble with credit cards and so on have found that there is *one* place in Omaha where they can be treated with respect.

No "better than you" attitude, no "b.s.", no guilt just for being gay or lesbian.

At last, finding financial help doesn't have to be like a "coming out" at Thanksgiving dinner with everyone pointing fingers, and finding fault.

Mindy Hahne, of Service First Solutions in Omaha's Midtown area works at a GLBT friendly outfit that *specializes* in helping Omaha area GLBT homeowners in need.

Hahne says she takes great pride in being gay and lesbian friendly. And treating the folks she helps like family.

"A lot of people in the GLBT community don't realize that even without gay marriage, or civil unions, there are already several equal protections in place for gay and lesbians as real property owners! Maybe because no one else wants to tell you about them!" Mindy says.

"Being gay or lesbian doesn't have to be a barrier to equal treatment anymore!" Hahne says.

Hahne has helped many gays and lesbians over the years, many personal friends.

"I am the one person in town that *specializes* in helping gay and lesbian folks with debt consolidation, cash out, credit repair and so on!" Hahne says,

"These are good people with damaged credit reports and/or hard to prove income! Not through any fault of their own! I specialize in helping the gay and lesbian community get a fair shake from the financial industry!" Hahne save.

Hahne says she has a lot of connections to Wall Street money, "I have personal relationships with investors nationwide, even internationally! Fair-minded people who want to fund loans for people with past credit problems!" she says.

"Many of them have a social conscience! And they take pride in helping gay and lesbians in particular! Just like I do! They use my proprietary system as their own little bit of "social activism!" Halme says.

These investors are people who buy 'pools' of mortgages of 50 million dollars at a whack! 50 million bucks! It's taken me 5 long years and it's been really hard to find these 'fat cats!' People who are 'like-minded' about what I do for the Omaha gay and lesbian community!" Mindy says.

"Not only is it illegal to discriminate against the GLBT community, it's just plain wrong!" Hahne says. "The self-limiting perceptions held by some in the community are just as much of a problem as the crooked people who perpetrate the discriminatory practices themselves!" she says.

Hahne says, "It's my personal mission to change the mindsets! And to liberate everyone from the restraints!"

"I grew up in a house where we didn't have much money! And my parents understood just how money really works even less! Nowadays, it's a lot of fun for me to help people get control over their money and their lives!" Mindy says.



The Fitness Corner

You've made the decision to join a health club. Where do you go? Health clubs are about as ubiquitous as Jackin-the-Box or McDonalds. I think there

Christian Right Urges Wal-Mart Boycott

The religious-right organization Operation Rescue/Operation Save America plans to boycott retail chain Wal-Mart's bid to become a member of the National Gay and Lesbian Chamber of Commerce, its director said Friday.

"We're dealing with a corporation that was built on familyfriendly principles," said the Rev. Flip Benham, the group's director. "What we as the church have to do is help Wal-Mart do what's right."

This decision came shortly after the Missouri Baptist Convention announced its own plans for a boycott of Wal-Mart due to its efforts to reach out to gay and lesbian consumers as well its decision to stock the Plan B contraceptive pill, the St. Louis Post-Dispatch reported last week.

Wal-Mart has also been under attack from more liberal groups who claim the chain should raise wages and improve working conditions. Just a day before Benham's announcement, the company reported that November may be the worst sales month in more than 10 years, despite the post-Thanksgiving holiday rush



at the end of the month.

Should either of these boycotts occur, their effectiveness remains to be seen. Patricia Edwards, a money manager at the Seattle firm Wentworth, Hauser, and Violich, warned that boycotts "have not been as effective as some of these groups would have liked." Large chains like Wal-Mart are often the only choice for customers on a tight budget or for those in rural areas. (The Advocate)
