Court Upholds "Don't Ask, Don't Tell"

A federal court in Massachusetts ruled Monday against 12 gay and lesbian veterans who challenged the constitutionality of the military's "don't ask, don't tell" ban on openly gay personnel.

In a 40-page decision, U.S. District Judge George A. O'Toole Jr. granted the government's request to dismiss the lawsuit filed in December 2004.

The case, Cook vs. Rumsfeld, was the first major attack on the "don't ask" policy after the Supreme Court's 2003 ruling in Lawrence vs. Texas. The gay and lesbian plaintiffs had hoped that the landmark 2003 ruling, which struck down sodomy laws and upheld gays' privacy rights, would help their cause.

The Lawrence decision also overturned the high court's 1986 Bowers vs. Hardwick decision, which had been used in previous court rulings to uphold the military's ban.

"We continue to believe the military's ban is un-American and unconstitutional," said C. Dixon Osburn, executive director of Servicemembers Legal Defense Network, which represented the plaintiffs.


"There is no reason lesbian, gay and bisexual Americans should be prohibited from serving our country," Osburn said. "The men and women in this lawsuit represent the best of our armed forces. They are patriotic, dedicated veterans. America should welcome their contributions and honor their commitment to our country."

Collectively, the 12 plaintiffs have earned more than five dozen awards, medals and commendations in their years of military service, according to the Servicemembers Legal Defense Network. The group has "fought long and hard" to be reinstated in the military, said Steve Ralls, the legal network's spokesman.

"I don't anticipate that their fight has ended with this decision," Ralls said.







"Attention: Omaha area GLBT homeowners in trouble! There is a solution!"

Many Omaha area gay and lesbian homeowners who have had trouble with credit cards and so on have found that there is *one* place in Omaha where they can be treated with respect.

No "better than you" attitude, no "b.s.", no guilt just for being

gay or lesbian.

At last, finding financial help doesn't have to be like a "coming out" at Thanksgiving dinner with everyone pointing fingers, and finding fault.

Mindy Hahne, of Service First Home Mortgage in Omaha's Midtown area works at a GLBT friendly outfit that specializes in helping Omaha area GLBT homeowners in need.

Hahne says she takes great pride in being gay and lesbian friendly. And treating the folks she helps like family.

"A lot of people in the GLBT

community don't realize that even without gay marriage, or civil unions, there are already several equal protections in place for gay and lesbians as real property owners! Maybe because no one else wants to tell you about them!" Mindy says.

Hahne has helped many gays and lesbians over the years, many personal friends.

"I am the one person in town that *specializes* in helping gay and lesbian folks with debt consolidation, each out, credit repair and so on!" Hahne says.

"These are good people with damaged credit reports and/or hard to prove income! Not through any fault of their own! I specialize in helping the gay and lesbian community get a fair shake from the financial industry!" Hahne says.

Hahne says she has a lot of connections to Wall Street money, "I have personal relationships with investors *nationwide*, even *internationally!* Fair-minded people who want to fund loans for people with past credit problems!" she says.

"Many of them have a social conscience! And they take pride in helping gay and lesbians in particular! Just like I do! They use my proprietary system as their own little bit of "social activism!" Halme says.

These investors are people who buy 'pools' of mortgages of 50 million dollars at a whack! 50 million bucks! It's taken me 4 long years and it's been really hard to find these 'fat cats!' People who are 'likeminded' about what I do for the Omaha gay and lesbian community!" Mindy says.

"Not only is it illegal to discriminate against the GLBT community, it's just plain wrong!" Hahne says. "The self-limiting perceptions held by some in the community are just as much of a problem as the crooked people who perpetrate the discriminatory practices themselves!" she says.

Hahne says, "It's my personal mission to change the mindsets! And to liberate everyone from the restraints!"

"I grew up in a house where we didn't have much money! And my parents understood just how money *really* works even less! Nowadays, it's a lot of fun for me to help people get control over their money and their lives!" Mindy says.


Senior 50+ Group Meeting

- Lifelong, age appropriate sexuality education in schools, seminaries, and community settings.
- A faith-based commitment to sexual and reproductive rights, including access to voluntary contraception, abortion, and HIV/STD prevention and treatment.

Rev. Haffner is an ordained minister with the Unitarian Church in Westport, Connecticut and is the author of From Diapers to Dating: A Parent's Guide to Raising Sexually Healthy Children and Beyond the Big Talk: Every Parent's Guide to Raising Sexually Healthy Teens as well as several books for congregations on sexual health. She speaks and conducts workshops around the world and appears regularly in the national media. She has a Masters of Divinity from Union Theological Seminary and a Masters of Public Health from the Yale School of Medicine.

Rev. Haffner will speak at 7:30 PM on Wednesday, May 10 at the Scott Conference Center (6450 Pine Street). The event is free and will be followed by a reception. For more information, go to firstuuomaha.org.


▼ Every person in the community, gay and straight, who supports equality & human rights is welcome to be part of the 2nd annual Pride Walk.
