Bush Took a Clumsy Approach

President Bush should be ashamed. He has treated religious conservatives with more disrespect than Hollywood or the so-called liberal press ever could.

The president has used these conservatives' opposition to gay marriage as nothing more than a political prop to be trotted out just as the election season begins. And he apparently believes that they are naive enough to fall for his clumsy and half-hearted gestures.

Last weekend, after two years of virtual silence on the subject, the president launched a low-profile push for an amendment to the U.S. Constitution banning samesex marriage, although he knew perfectly well that the amendment would not pass the Senate. (It didn't.) It's not even clear that he wanted it to pass.

After all, his wife, Laura, recently told Fox News that gay marriage should not be "used as a campaign tool." Vice President Dick Cheney opposes the amendment, as does his daughter, Mary, a lesbian who has called the amendment "fundamentally wrong."


But the GOP is in trouble. Polls show that voters are more inclined to trust Democrats than Republicans on important issues. Even Bush's most faithful constituents - religious conservatives - are dispirited, believing the president has ignored them since he was re-elected.

So now, just in time for the campaign season, Bush trots out a ban on gay marriage, expecting religious conservatives to show the same missionary zeal for GOP candidates that they did two years ago. In 2004, GOP operatives managed to get gaymarriage bans on the ballot in 11 states, an initiative that drove social conservatives to the polls and probably gave Bush the winning edge in the battleground state of Ohio. Karl Rove hopes to recapture some of that magic in November.

Clumsy Bush Story Continues from Front Page

But the president's heart isn't in it. On Monday, when Bush assembled a group of religious conservatives to talk about a gaymarriage ban, they met in the Eisenhower Executive Office Building rather than in the Rose Garden, where the president usually launches important initiatives or promotes prominent causes.

By all accounts, Bush takes religion quite seriously. So why is he treating an article of faith among his ultraconservative constituents as if it is just another wedge issue to be exploited for a few more votes? He ought to treat their sincerity with the respect it deserves by telling them the truth: A constitutional amendment banning gay marriage is not an issue on which he wishes to expend what little political capital he has left. It is not one of the pressing issues of our time.

Prohibiting same-sex unions would have absolutely no effect on the state of traditional marriage. Britney Spears - whose first marriage lasted less than a day - has done much more to discredit traditional marriage than gay couples have. Nor does the Bible bestow a singular blessing on unions between one man and one woman. The marital arrangement most often cited in the Bible is polygamy.

Besides, as Bush well knows, the stability of a pluralistic democracy depends on laws that respect the equality of all men and women, whether they are Muslims, Jews, Baptists, Wiccans or atheists.

Among James Dobson and his right-wing ilk, there is a misconception that mixes up religious traditions with civil marriages. Churches may control who is married by their clerics and institutions. But no group's religious views should stand in the way of two consenting adults - two men, a man and a woman, or two women - who want to go to a courthouse, city hall or Las Vegas love chapel to get married, if they so choose.

Catholics worked this out a long time ago: If you wish to be married in the church, you must follow the teachings of the church. Otherwise, you can go to the courthouse. Or you can find another church that suits your beliefs.

What Dobson and his followers are trying to impose is a Christian version of sharia - religious law. That wouldn't bode well for an Iraqi democracy, and it wouldn't bode well for this democracy, either.



Brazil Pride Draws Estimated 2.4 Million

An estimated 2.4 million people took to the streets of Sao Paulo over the weekend to celebrate the Brazilian city's 10th annual Gay Pride parade, the Associated Press reported.

The record attendance -- the largest in the world, according to organizers -- topped last year's official crowd count of 1.8 million, and was a far cry from the 2,000 people who took part when Sao Paulo's first Pride was held a decade ago.

Floats made their way down the Avenida Paulista in the city's financial heart as dance music blared from huge loudspeakers.

Some revelers dressed up as Batman, Elvis Presley, Cinderella or Marie Antoinette; others as gay cowboy lovers Jake and Heath from the Oscar-winning "Brokeback Mountain." Still others gave a nod to World Cup soccer, wearing the national team colors of yellow, green and blue, the BBC reported.

The theme for this year's event was "Homophobia is a crime," to highlight proposed anti-discrimination laws. Discrimination is still widespread across Brazil. Eighty-one Brazilians were killed last year because of their sexual orientation, activists say.

One participant, Juliana, said the tolerance level varied greatly across the country.

"Here I guess we are privileged, in Sao Paulo, because here we can be open almost every day," she told the BBC. "But for most of the people, they can't be open every day at all."

Schwarzenegger to Address GOP Gays

In what may be his first appearance in front of a LGBT audience since he took office in 2003, California Gov. Arnold Schwarzenegger plans to headline a fund-raiser for a national gay Republican group in Hollywood next week.

Many LGBT Californians have not been happy with the governor after he vetoed an historic same-sex marriage bill in September, the first to be approved by both legislative chambers without a court order.

But the Log Cabin Republicans are defending Schwarzenegger's scheduled appearance at their June 29 event.

"There is a better than 50-50 chance this man will be the governor of California for the next four years, and for the gay com-

munity to label somebody based on one veto is shortsighted," Log Cabin President Patrick Guerrero told the Associated Press.

The Republican actor-turned-politician, whose initiatives have foundered and whose poll ratings have dipped in the last couple of years, is being challenged in November's general election by Democratic state treasurer Phil Angelides.

"We thought allowing him to address these issues in a friendly setting -- as well as giving him a chance to get another look at who gay and lesbian families are -- was important both for him and for us," Guerrero said.

He said the governor is reciprocating Log Cabin's loyalty for endorsing him to unseat Democratic Gov, Gray Davis in the 2003 recall.

The \$250-a-plate fundraiser comes as Schwarzenegger considers whether he will veto a bill requiring LGBT history to be included in public school curricula.

The governor already has indicated he opposes the measure, and Log Cabin has not taken a position on it.

Organizers of this year's San Francisco Pride celebration, set for Sunday, gave Schwarzenegger their "pink brick" award for the public figure believed to have hurt the cause of LGBT rights the most.

Fred Phelps: "God hates fags"

"Sodomy is an abominable sin, worthy of death," says Fred Phelps and his Westboro Baptist church in Topeka, Kan.

"Sodomites are wicked sinners before the lord, they are violent and doom nations, are abominable to God and are worthy of death for their vile, deprayed and unnatural sex practices."

This is the message that over 5 million viewers have seen after visiting Fred Phelps' Web site, godhatesfags.com.

A friend of mine recently e-mailed me the site; I thought it was a cruel joke, until I clicked the link.

According to Fred Phelps and his church, homosexuality is the only sin in which America is contemplating giving civil legal rights. Gays and lesbians are compared to murderers, rapists and embezzlers. If America gives homosexuals rights, Phelps believes that all the sinners should be granted the same.

At the Westboro church, homosexuality is considered the most heinous sin in the eyes of God. They make it clear that God does not hate homosexuals because of their sexuality; homosexuals exist because God hates them. Apparently this is an important distinction. God has washed his hands with these perverts and wants nothing more than damnation for them all.

They blame homosexuals for the terrorist acts of Sept. 11, 2001, Hurricane Katrina and the war in Iraq. God is showing the world that he will not tolerate this lifestyle, much like he did in the bible when he demolished Sodom and Gomorrah (read the "How Typical: A Gay Christian, to get my take on this story).

Because of God's hatred toward homosexuals, Phelps and his followers were in Lincoln on Feb. 25 picketing a memorial for 1st Lt. Garrison Avery.

They held signs saying "God Hates Fags," "AIDS Cures Fags," "Fags Burn in Hell," and "Thank God for AIDS." But this soldier was straight, why were they picketing?

According to the Westboro church, these solders are not heroes. They are lazy, incompetent idiots looking for jobs because they're not qualified for honest work. They were raised on a steady diet of gay propaganda in the home, on TV, in church, in mass media - everywhere. Therefore, with full knowledge of what they were doing, they voluntarily joined a gay-infested army to fight for a gay-run country now utterly and finally forsaken by God who Himself is fighting against that country. "They turned America over to fags; They're coming home in body bags."

Honestly, where do I start? First of all, I want to say that I am sickened, disgusted and mortified that I was one of the 5 million viewers who visited this Web site - 5,434,609 to be exact.

I don't even know how to respond. What do you say to someone who is so full of hate? Should I be upset, hurt, or sad and sorry for the people speaking these words?

When I see mothers, couples and even small children holding these signs, what am I supposed to do?

I show them pity. I pity these people for being raised in such a hateful environment, for believing that they are the only ones who will dwell in the kingdom of God. More than anything, my heart goes out to them on the day they stand before the Christian God, not judging others, but instead being judged themselves.

The Bible was meant to guide, inspire and encourage Christians in their faith. Phelps' church has done nothing but contort, embarrass and defame this book of God.

I find comfort in the fact that the Westboro congregation only consists of 90 individuals, mostly family, but my heart still goes out to them. I don't understand how they can be so blinded. There is not one Christian church, or Christian other than their own who claim to have these same beliefs. Even churches that teach homosexuality is a sin are embarrassed and ashamed of Phelps and his followers.

I'm a gay Christian, I've said it many times - whether you agree that it is possible or not, I don't really care. I know I am not going to hell. I know God is not punishing the world because of my sexuality, and most importantly I know that I will one day stand before God and be accepted into his arms.

This church can protest all they want, they can send their children out on street corners, doll in one hand and sign in the other. They can teach hate and suffering to their followers.

The old saying "Sticks and stones can break my bones but words will never hurt me," may seem childish, but holds truth. When I go to lay my head down tonight, I'm not going to be thinking about what's written on the signs, but instead about those holding them. I'm going to say an extra prayer. I'm going to pray that God instills truth into Fred Phelps and his congregation, and that he reminds them of an important verse "For as you have been judging, so you will one day be judged yourself" (Matthew 7:2).
