

This tangy recipe fares equally well when made on the grill or in a skillet. With summertime grilling season in full force, I recommend the grill so as not to heat up your kitchen.

Sweet n Sour Marinated Chicken

#### Ingredients:

4 chicken breast halves

1/4 c apple cider vinegar

1/4 c orange juice

1/4 c lime juice

1/4 c lemon juice

1/4 c brown sugar

3 tbsp whole grain mustard

1 tbsp minced garlic

1/2 tsp salt

1/2 tsp pepper

2 tbsp olive oil

#### Directions:

- 1. Combine all ingredients except olive oil in a large glass bowl
- 2. Slowly pour olive oil into mixture while stirring with whisk
- 3. Place chicken in marinade, cover and chill 8 hours
- 4. Drain and dispose of marinade
- In a large skillet (or on the grill) cook over medium heat for 6-8 minutes on each side.

# New poll in Iowa Shows Broad Opposition to Constitutional Same-Sex Marriage Ban

If you buy the results of a new Quinnipiac University poll, Iowans like legal same-sex marriages considerably more than the court ruling that allowed those unions to happen.

According to the poll of 1,256 vot-



ers surveyed July 12-15, 55 percent of Iowans oppose a constitutional amendment banning same-sex marriages, with 36 percent in favor. The poll's margin of error is +/- 2.8 percent.

Only three demographic groups broken out within the polling data supported an amendment, Republicans 58-33, born again Evangelical Christians 61-34 and protestants who attend church weekly, 56-36. Overall, Democrats, Independents, men, women, protestants, Catholics, including those who attend

church weekly, Iowans with and without college degrees, all income groups and age levels, even Iowans over 65, oppose an amendment.

But the April 2009 Iowa Supreme Court ruling that struck down Iowa's ban on same-sex marriages is favored by just a 47-44 margin in the poll. The ruling is unpopular with Republicans, men, Iowans without college degrees, older Iowans, Evangelicals and both Catholics and protestants who attend church weekly.

Curiously, of those surveyed, 18 percent oppose the ruling but also oppose an amendment to ban same-sex marriages.

And by a 57-31 margin, Iowans polled believe that if an amendment did pass, it would be struck down by the courts. Not one demographic group though it would be upheld.

So of the two campaigns that opponents of marriage equality waged – bash the courts and stop the weddings — one had an impact, while the other has proven to be a monumental flop. A fair number of Iowans, already distrustful and unhappy with government and public institutions for myriad reasons, have been receptive of the argument, though flawed, that un-elected judges went too far. Those Iowans bounced three Supreme Court justices from the bench.

But the crusade to deny hundreds of Iowa couples access to civil marriage rights has largely failed. We heard the dire predictions of moral decay and social problems and have seen nothing of the sort. We've gotten to know these couples and appreciate why they fought this battle. There's no need to amend the Iowa Constitution.

That doesn't mean the debate ends. But it is interesting to see a full one-third of Republicans now oppose an amendment.

# Ohio Officials Ordered To Recognize Gay Couple's Marriage

Married on July 11 in Maryland, John Arthur is in hospice care and "certain to die soon." He and his husband have sued to ensure their marriage is recognized by Ohio officials at Arthur's death.

A federal judge in Ohio ordered state officials Monday to recognize the marriage of two men that was performed in Maryland on the death certificate of an Ohio resident in hospice care who



the judge says "is certain to die soon."

"The end result here and now is that the local Ohio Registrar of death certificates is hereby ORDERED not to accept for recording a death certificate for John Arthur that does not record Mr. Arthur's status at death as 'married' and James Obergefell as his 'surviving spouse,'" Judge Timothy Black wrote in granting the couple a temporary restraining order Monday. The order is in effect until 5 p.m. Aug. 5, unless the court extends the order at a later date.

"By treating lawful same sex marriages differently than it treats lawful opposite sex marriages," the judge concluded, Ohio's 2004 constitutional amendment banning recognition of same-sex couples' marriages and Ohio's statute addressing the same issue "likely violate[] the United States Constitution."

The couple's attorney, Al Gerhardstein, said in a statement, "This order is a major step on the march toward marriage equality in Ohio."

Addressing the constitutional question, Black explained, "Although the law has long recognized that marriage and domestic relations are matters generally left to the states, the restrictions imposed on marriage by states, however, must nonetheless comply with the [U.S.] Constitution."

To that end, the court examined the Supreme Court's decision striking down part of the Defense of Marriage Act this June in United States v. Windsor, the 1996 decision in Romer v. Evans, and in other decisions addressing differential treatment found to be unconstitutional under the Constitution's guarantee of equal protection of the laws.

Looking at Ohio's bans on recognizing same-sex couples' outof-state marriages, while acknowledging its recognition of the marriages of opposite-sex couples who would not be allowed to marry in Ohio, Black concluded, "The purpose served by treating same-sex married couples differently than opposite-sex married couples is the same improper purpose that failed in Windsor and in Romer: 'to impose inequality' and to make gay citizens unequal under the law."

According to the order, Obergefell and Arthur live in Cincinnati, Ohio, and "have been living together in a committed and intimate relationship for more than twenty years." The order also notes "they were very recently legally married in the state of Maryland pursuant to the laws of Maryland recognizing same sex marriage."

The order notes that Arthur is dying of amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS), which prompted the couple to fly to Maryland on July 11 to get married.

As Black put it, the couple "traveled to Maryland in a special jet equipped with medical equipment and a medical staff necessary to serve Mr. Arthur's needs, whereupon Plaintiffs were married in the jet as it sat on the tarmac in Anne Arundel County, Maryland. They returned to Cincinnati that same day."

Ohio Attorney General Mike DeWine's office defended the state's laws in filings with the court on Monday, but Cincinnati city lawyers representing Dr. Camille Jones, the vital statistics registrar for the city, declined to defend the law, telling the court, "The City will not defend Ohio's discriminatory ban on same-sex marriages, but the City's vital statistics registrar is bound to follow Ohio law until that law is changed or overturned."

Asked about the court's issuance of the order on Monday evening, Kasich spokesman Rob Nichols told BuzzFeed, "We don't comment on pending litigation other than to say the that the governor believes that marriage is between a man and a woman."


# N.M. Attorney General to Court: Let Gay Couples Marry

New Mexico's attorney general said he will not legally defend the state's statute that prevents same-sex couples from marrying.

Gary King told the New Mexico Supreme Court that he would not argue on his state's behalf in a lawsuit filed by a gay couple in Santa Fe who were denied wedding licenses, the Asso-



ciated Press reports. Currently the state does not have a law that explicitly bans gay and lesbian couples from marrying. Instead, "female" and "male" designations on marriage license application forms have indicated a so-called ban on marriages for same-sex couples.

"There is no doubt that... the New Mexico Constitution requires the State to treat equally any of its citizens seeking legal recognition of their marriage, and that any statutory scheme interfering with that guarantee of equality is flatly unconstitutional," King wrote, according to Think Progress.

He also advised the justices to invalidate the state's rule prohibiting marriage equality.

# Hospital and Clinics Named as "Leader in LGBT Healthcare Equality"



OMAHA, Neb. - The Nebraska Medical Center and UNMC Physicians recently received recognition from the Human Rights Campaign, America's largest civil rights organization working to achieve equality for lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) Americans. The announcement was made after all four criteria for LGBT patient-centered care, as defined by the Healthcare Equality Index (HEI) were met. The process included an online survey administered by the Human Rights Campaign to ensure that participating healthcare organizations are meeting legal, CMS and Joint Commission requirements for LGBT patient-centered care.



"This is the first time that any healthcare institution in Nebraska has been accredited," said Jean Amoura, M.D., Department of Obstetrics/Gynecology.

Dr. Jean Amoura and Dr. Susan Swindells, medical director of the HIV clinic, led the initiative to become "Leaders in LGBT Healthcare Equality". A record number of 121 Veterans Health Administration (VA) medical centers across the country, including the Omaha VA, also participated.

The HEI survey reviews non-discrimination policies for LGBT patients and employees and provides participating healthcare organizations with a needs assessment that includes access to free expert training.

A diverse group of employees in key work areas received training on best practices for meeting the needs of LGBT patients and employees. As part of the process of receiving leadership status, leadership representatives from The Nebraska Medical Center and UNMC Physicians were also asked to participate in a training webinar.

"We are deeply appreciative of the support we received from The Nebraska Medical Center and UNMC Physicians leadership and delighted to receive this recognition as an inclusive and LGBT-friendly healthcare enterprise," said Dr. Swindells.

## Life Beyond Therapy

#### Mr. Faithful

I'd like to share an email with you, as I think that the writer has some interesting ideas to consider:

#### Dear Michael:

Why is there so much emphasis on sex in the gay community? I was in a long-term relationship that recently ended. I was faithful to my boyfriend and (to my knowledge) he was faithful to me. Now that I'm single, I am meeting all these gay men in "committed" relationships who just want to have sex with me. What the hell is wrong with people? Why isn't anyone faithful anymore?

If this gentleman was my client, here's what I'd say:

#### Dear Mr. Faithful:

I imagine it's pretty hard to end a long-term relationship. You've been out of the dating scene for quite a while. Give yourself plenty of time to readjust. Keep your expectations reasonable and realize that it usually takes about 6 months after a long-term relationship for the "shock" to really wear off. The transition to being single doesn't happen overnight: it's a process, not an event. Getting used to being on your own is bound to be tough, whether your relationship was monogamous or not.

And let's talk about monogamy. Just because your relationship was monogamous, doesn't mean it's the perfect model for everyone. If it worked for you, great. It doesn't work for everyone. It sounds like the monogamy issue pushes your buttons. If so, own it and take responsibility for your reactions. I'd even suggest a little introspection to see why non-monogamy or "open" relationships bother you so.

You say that "married" gay guys are hitting on you. Fair enough. Maybe it's all about them. But, are you willing to look at your possible part in all of this? For example, are you doing something to attract them?

I wonder if you are meeting single men too. If not, perhaps you've got something going on where you are attracting "unsuitable" guys (e.g., not single). Why not take a look at your own motivation: what is it you want right now? Do you want to have fun and date? Do you want to find someone great to settle down with? If you don't know what you want, you may be putting out mixed signals. Again, take responsibility for your part in this.

Do you remember what flirting is? Perhaps your memory is a

bit hazy. While some guys take flirting as playful fun; other guys may take flirting as a sign that you'd like to have sex with them. Could this be your situation? Maybe you think you're just being friendly and outgoing and it's being misinterpreted as "I'm available for sex and you look good to me".

Many relationships are not 100% monogamous. Is this a crime? Many of my clients in long-term relationships tell me that their relationships go through cycles of being "open" and "closed". In previous columns, I've written about the joys and perils of each. Neither is better, they're just different. See if you can stop judging people and accept that these guys find you attractive. You simply need a gracious way of saying, "Thanks, but no thanks" to the married men who find you hot. Tell them something like: "I'm flattered, but I'm really looking for single guys". By saving something like that, you're being gracious to them and putting out what it is you really want. Eventually, the married guys will leave you alone and the single guys will get the message. Who knows? Maybe these "married" guys will introduce you to their single friends, if you graciously rebuff their advances, rather than condemning them. Condemning someone rarely gets you anywhere: politely telling people what you DO want is likely to get you much further. Try it and let me know how it goes for you.

# Enigma Code breaker Alan Turing to be given Posthumous Pardon

Alan Turing, the Enigma code breaker who took his own life after being convicted of gross indecency under anti-homosexuality legislation, is to be given a posthumous pardon.

The government signaled on Friday that it is prepared to support a backbench bill that would pardon Turing, who died from cyanide poisoning at the age of 41 in 1954 after he was subjected to "chemical castration".

Lord Ahmad of Wimbledon, a government whip, told peers that the government would table the third reading of the Alan Turing (statutory pardon) bill at the end of October if no amendments are made. "If nobody tables an amendment to this bill, its supporters can be assured that it will have speedy passage to the House of Commons," Ahmad said.

The announcement marks a change of heart by the government, which declined last year to grant pardons to the 49,000 gay men, now dead, who were convicted under the 1885 Criminal Law Amendment Act. They include Oscar Wilde.

Ahmad told peers: "Alan Turing himself believed that homosexual activity would be made legal by a royal commission. In fact, appropriately, it was parliament which decriminalized the activity for which he was convicted. The government are very aware of the calls to pardon Turing, given his outstanding achievements, and have great sympathy with this objective ... That is why the government believe it is right that parliament should be free to respond to this bill in whatever way its conscience dictates and in whatever way it so wills."

The government threw its weight behind the private member's bill, promoted by the Liberal Democrat peer Lord Sharkey, after a debate that featured a contribution from a peer who worked at Bletchley Park. Lady Trumpington told peers: "The block I worked in was devoted to German naval codes. Only once was I asked to deliver a paper to Alan Turing, so ... I cannot claim that I knew him. However, I am certain that but for his work we would have lost the war through starvation."

Turing broke German ciphers using the bombe method, which allowed the code-breakers to crack the German Enigma code. His colleague Tommy Flowers built the Colossus computer. Ahmad described Turing as "one of the fathers, if not the father, of computer science".


Sharkey has campaigned for a pardon after being taught mathematics at Manchester University in the 1960s by Robin Gandy, Turing's only doctoral student, who became a close friend and was the executor of his will.


Sharkey said: "As I think everybody knows, he was convicted in 1952 of gross indecency and sentenced to chemical castration. He committed suicide two years later. The government know that Turing was a hero and a very great man. They acknowledge that he was cruelly treated. They must have seen the esteem in which he is held here and around the world."

# Majority of States Still Allow Housing Discrimination against Gays

It seems hard to believe but there are still scores of states in the U.S. where you can be denied housing because you are gay. There are a handful of states in America that have laws protecting individuals from being denied housing based on their sexual orientation, but a lot of progress still needs to be made in order to address the bigotry and profiling that can affect a gay individual's choice on where to live.



The National Fair Housing Alliance has recently addressed this matter in a report in that can be

accessed online at: www.nationalfairhousing.org. This report was released on April 11, 2013 and is meant to educate and enlighten the community at large about the huge problem with housing discrimination against the LGBT community.

The National Fair Housing Alliance is a powerful consortium of over 220 private and non-profit fair housing organizations, and state and civil rights agencies from all over the United States. The organization, which has been around since 1988, helps make sure that the LGBT community has equal access to apartments, houses, mortgages and insurance policies.

Recently, Rea Carey, the Executive Director for the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force, testified before congress that LGBT people "may experience outright hostility... may be subject to violence or property damage" during their search for housing. This is one reason why it is so important to ensure you are working with an LGBT/LGBT friendly realtor when you are looking for a home in any city. This can help prevent you from landing in a community where you may feel unwelcome, or worse. Additionally, the FBI has reported an increase in hate-crimes based on sexual orientation in the last three years. In 2012, National Fair Housing reported 175 complaints of housing discrimination based on sexual orientation and another 45 based on gender identity.

The report also includes some real life examples of how gay couples can be turned down for housing by banks or condominium boards and how often a reason will be "made up" to cover up for the prejudice or bigotry against LGBT individuals. There are also accounts of what can happen if you accidentally buy into a hostile neighborhood.

The sad fact is there are real estate agents that will say anything to get a home sold, including saying that a neighborhood is gay friendly, when it may be actually quite hostile to the LGBT lifestyle or gay couples. The result can be name-calling, damage to the property and violence, resulting in your need for an

appeal to state and federal human rights commissions to set things right.

The states that do protect against housing discrimination based on sexual orientation include; California, Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, Hawaii, Illinois, Iowa, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Minnesota, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, Oregon, Rhode Island, Vermont, Washington, Wisconsin and the District of Columbia.
