HEDWIG AND THE ANGRY INCH

Rose Blumkin Performing Arts Center, Sat. Dec. 7

BENEFIT FOR NEBRASKA AIDS PROJECT

The transgender rock 'n' roll musical "Hedwig and the Angry Inch" makes its Nebraska premiere for one show only on Saturday, Dec. 7, at the Rose Blumkin Performing Arts Center, 2001 Farnam St. The off-Broadway hit written by John Cameron Mitchell, with music and lyrics by Stephen Trask, has become a cult favorite.

The Omaha production will be presented during "Night of a Thousand Stars," the annual benefit for the Nebraska AIDS Project. Directed by Eric Selk, the show features Randall T. Stevens as Hedwig and Andrea Lang as Yitzhak. The rock band, The Angry Inch, includes music director Rod Carlson on keyboards, Luann Cravens on bass, Bill Hoover and Ricky Collins on guitar and Roselle Ledesma on drums.

"Hedwig and the Angry Inch" tells the story of an East German girlie boy named Hansel, who lives his life with the hopes of finding this other half to make himself complete. Hansel agrees to a sex-change operation in order to go to the U.S. with an American G.I. he has met. The operation is botched, leaving one inch of genitalia, and Hansel, now Hedwig, is left to be neither man nor woman.

Rocker Hedwig finds herself living in a trailer park in Kansas, lost and alone. She lashes out in rebellion against her physical and emotional mutilation, all the while motivated by an overpowering desire to find her "other half," whoever or whatever that might be. "Hedwig and the Angry Inch" is a poignant meditation on loneliness, gender confusion and the romantic notion that sex is an effort to reconnect two halves of one ideal being.

The NY Times said that "Hedwig and the Angry Inch" brings "theater alive with the pounding sounds of rock 'n' roll and the funny sad voicing of a painful past...it is also an adult, thought-provoking musical about the quest for individuality. Time Magazine's review said, "The most exciting rock score written for the theater since, oh, ever!"

What We Know About GLBT Seniors

What we know about GLBT seniors in the United States comes from the pioneering social service research conducted by a small number of scholars since the 1960's. Most of these studies are of gay men; a smaller number are of lesbians. There are very few studies that include transgender or bisexual individuals or that examine the findings to discern issues of particular concern to bisexual and transgender seniors.

Future research must do better at gathering information on all GLBT seniors including people of color, low income and immigrant populations. The following sections synthesize what existing research on GLBT people tells us about GLBT seniors.

HOW MANY GLBT ELDERS ARE THERE?

We are unable to give an exact number of GLBT seniors for the same reasons that we cannot give an exact number of the total gay lesbian bisexual population of all ages in the U.S. Few national surveys ask about sexual orientation and

fewer still ask about gender identity making it difficult to accurately estimate the total of the GLBT population.

Estimates of the GLBT senior population in the U.S. depends on estimates of the overall GLBT populations.

Peter Fisher's reinterpretation of Kinsey's research estimates that 8% of the adult population to be gay or lesbian. Therefore 2.8 million gay men and lesbians could be age 65 and older in the U.S.²

RACIAL AND CLASS DIVERSITY

Like the general population, the GLBT population is racially and ethnically diverse and distributed throughout all economic strata. Many studies of gays and lesbian seniors over-represent white middle class and urban people. Therefore there is a need for much more empirical social science research on African-American, Latino-Latina, Asian Pacific Islander, and Native American elders. However some studies indicate the GLBT population reflects the racial diversity of the U.S. population as a whole.³

A 1999 study conducted for Senior Action in a Gay Environment found that 65% of 253 gay & lesbian seniors surveyed in N.Y. city reported living alone. This was nearly twice the rate of all people 65 years or older in New York City, of whom only 36% lived alone. In general women are more likely than men to live alone in part because widows are more common than widowers.

The New York study also found that less than 1 in five gay lesbian seniors are currently living with a life partner. In contrast to the nearly half of the general elderly population who are currently married. And that 90% of the gay seniors have no children, vs. only 20% of all seniors

Another more representative study found that 75% of gay and lesbian seniors in Los Angeles lived alone.⁴

It should be noted that while the lonely old gay man or lesbian is a long standing stereotype, many studies have refuted the view that loneliness is any more prevalent in older gay men and lesbian than it is among older heterosexuals or among younger homosexuals.

In fact the literature suggests that a positive experience and healthy adjustment to old age are both possible and frequent in gay men and lesbians.
