
Elton Says Discard the V-Card



The March on Washington

Thursday, October 8th my partner Jonathan and I headed for Washington, DC. It was our first time traveling there together and for such an event; Equality Across America March on Washington.

On the way I brought a book that I bought a while back that I was meaning to read. Jimmy Carter wrote "Our Endangered Values." I became more informed in reading that one book that I have been by watching any news network for a month! The path of our countries perception of human rights, civil rights, foreign policy, political party agendas are only as worthy, valued and honest as we are led to believe. We have much work to do. We can't remain silent.

My first impression is that we all have seen the major sites of DC in movies, photos, commercials, etc. Seeing them in person invokes such a different response deep down; justice, accomplishment and pride of historic proportions. During the day and during the night the images and displays take on a life of their own.

One planned trip was to the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum. The facts, the stories the visuals, the building itself really stirred up emotions that were painful, deep and tearful. Anger, frustration and hurt are very vivid feelings and emotions that I had. I have more questions now than what I did before visiting this museum.

Sunday, October 11th was the big day; The March on Washington. How many will show? They were hoping for at least 60,000. I arrived at the rally site in advance of the parade. I

took photos, met with others and talked with some of those being presented.

Rev. Troy Perry, the founder of the MCC Churches was the first to speak. His first words were I am glad you are here today. By this time there were hundreds and hundreds of people there at the rally. A few minutes later Troy was invoking the spirits of those who have made contributions to advance and represent the GLBT community. By then thousands and thousands were there. Rev. Perry kept talking and moving us all. By then tens of thousands were here and as I looked down the street all I saw was people; old people, young people, people with different color skins, different color signs. If the energy could have been tapped, we could have powered the city!

As the list of speakers continued all I could do is sit and watch people, they kept coming! It was then that several things came crashing into my head. For more than 250 years slavery kept people down, during many years people were killed for not having blue eyes, blond hair and heterosexual, and in 2009 in the most powerful nation in the world, people whom love each other are prevented from being in loving, committed marriages. As the tears streamed down from my face I realized then that for the last 42 I have been tolerated and not equal in the eyes of the laws of this country. I realized I had not REALLY spoke up.

Our country has no right to hold other countries to any higher standard until it ends discrimination itself. Everyone of us regardless if want the right or would ever use the right needs to do whatever it takes to insure we usher in 100% equality, without exception!

I am reminded of the words written by Pastor Martin Niemoller in the 50's "First they came for the communists, and I did not speak out because I was not a communist." "Then they came

MEDITATION MADE EASY

It's trendy to meditate. Movie stars do it, the Dalai Lama does it, even your next-door neighbor does it. But what is it?

Meditation is about taking time out from your day, stopping your activities and doing nothing but being with yourself. There's nothing mystical or magical about it. If you've ever sat quietly under a beautiful night sky, gazed up peacefully at a majestic tree or stood on top of a hill, looked out at the vista and felt



calm and good, you were meditating. We all do it "accidentally" now and then, but what happens when we do it purposefully? What happens when you WANT to meditate? WHY even bother?

There are tremendous mental and physical health benefits to meditation – even magazines like THE ADVOCATE, OUT and TIME say so – and it's free, requires no equipment and has no side effects. Well, if it's so great, why don't we do it? Many of us are afraid to meditate because we don't want to slow down, go within and look inside. We're afraid we'll find a treasure trove of shit we don't want to deal with, so we live in denial about all the crap in our lives and hope that, by avoiding it, it will all go away.

While it's hard to tell yourself the truth, it's better to know where you're at, even if it's sad or painful, because then you can do something about it. Meditation is a form of focused attention...you bring your concentration to yourself. The benefits of meditation come not from how long you do it, but the sincerity of your effort. Five focused minutes can be more powerful than 45 half-assed minutes.

Like yoga, there is no ONE way to meditate. A simple and easy way to start meditating is to follow these three steps: (1) sit quietly, (2) focus on your breathing or on a phrase you repeat to yourself, like "peace", and (3) notice what comes up (thoughts, emotions or physical sensations).

Here are some other ways to begin meditating. Try them and see which ones you like. These meditations are adapted from the wonderful book, Wherever you go, there you are: mindfulness meditation in everyday life by Jon Kabat-Zinn.

- Mountain meditation: Picture a serene and beautiful mountain. Sit and breathe in the image of your mountain. As you sit, let your head become the peak, your shoulders and arms the sides of the mountain, your buttocks and legs the base. Experience in your body the sense of quiet power and grace of the mountain. Allow yourself to feel centered, rooted and powerful as your mountain.
- Lake meditation: See in your mind's eye a beautiful and calm lake. Once you have a clear image of the lake, allow yourself to "become" the lake. Experience the quietness of the lake and let yourself become the stillness beneath the surface.

even when the surface is blown by storms. Use the lake image to sit or lie down in stillness...not going anywhere...peaceful and content.

- Tree meditation: Yep, this one is about feeling as elegant, powerful and rooted to the ground as a majestic tree. If you get sleepy when you meditate, try this type of meditation: you do it standing up. Feel your feet firmly on the ground and let yourself stand tall, yet relaxed. Close your eyes and sense your surroundings: feel the air on your skin, hear the sounds all around you, and enjoy the peace and grace of being like a wonderful, tall tree.
- Walking meditation: Some people find it hard to sit down and meditate, but enjoy walking as meditation. Walking meditation differs from regular walking in that you focus on the walking itself, not your destination. Bring your attention to each step you take as it comes and goes. Doing walking meditation very slowly helps you focus. You can walk back and forth in a straight line or in a circular path: keep it simple. As you walk, let your gaze be a few feet in front of you, and allow the walking to gently calm and relax you.
- Lying-down meditation: Lying down is a great way to meditate: if you fall asleep, your sleep will be more restful, and if you can stay awake, your body can completely relax, more than in any other meditation posture. Let your body sink into the floor, bed or ground and feel your body from head to toe.
 Remind yourself that "you" are not just your head; reclaim your entire body as the real "you".

Try these different kinds of meditation and see which ones you like. Meditating is a great way to get rid of stress, worry and anxiety without the hassles and expense of medication. Let yourself have fun while you feel more peaceful: it's a great combination.

Out Marine on Vandalized

Billboard Speaks

The former U.S. marine featured on a defaced billboard promoting gay acceptance speaks out about the incident.

A billboard featuring former U.S. marine Tim Smith was torn down Friday night in Memphis, Tenn. The ad showed Smith, 27, in uniform and read, "I'm gay and I protected your freedom."

The serviceman, who was kicked out of the military under its "don't ask, don't tell" policy, says he was shocked when he received news about the vandalism. "It was more or less shock and then it turned to righteous indignation and anger towards whoever had done it and that the act had even been committed," Smith told WPTY-TV.

The billboard was one of five rented by the Memphis Gay and Lesbian Community Center to promote National Coming Out Day on October 11. Smith, a student at the University of Memphis, says the billboard will be replaced "as soon as the materials and prints come in," reports the local ABC affiliate.

Memphis police are investigating the incident as a theft of property and have not yet classified it as a hate crime.

Gay, Lesbian Neighbors Feud in U.K.

A gay man in Manchester, England, is accused of trying to poison his lesbian neighbors and kidnapping their cat.

A gay man and his two lesbian neighbors in Manchester, England, are engaged in a bitter dispute that includes allegations that he tried to poison the women with slug pellets and kidnap their three-legged cat.

Gary Stewart was arrested after he served Marie Walton and Beverly Sales a peace offering of curry, which the women discovered was studded with slug pellets. The pellets contain the chemical metaldehyde, which can kill children and animals but is generally less harmful to adults.

Stewart admitted to the attempted poisoning in court, according to the Daily Mail. Neighbors said the act was the culmination of an "apparent hate campaign."

"Residents said that when Stewart had initially moved in with his partner, Paul Kleisier, several years ago they had been perfect neighbors," reported the Daily Mail. "But over time they became 'vindictive' and began arguments with residents over

Diane's Story

"My partner and I had been together for 14 years when I received the worst phone call of my life. There had been a terrible accident, and she was being flown to the hospital by helicopter. The hospital staff wanted to know how to get in touch with her next of kin. Mine was the only phone number they could find in her wallet. I gave them her parents' phone number, got into the car and drove straight to the hospital.



Gay biographer William Mann, who recently chronicled the life of Katharine Hepburn, and made a convincing case that the late actress may have been transgender, now celebrates the first 40 years of film legend Taylor. In the just-published biography, subtitled Elizabeth Taylor in Hollywood, Mann doesn't offer any shocking new revelations, but he does recount the myriad romances, scandals, and near-death experiences the woman the Vatican once labeled an "erotic vagrant" has survived.

Taylor, 77, beloved by gay fans as much for the time and energy she's donated to AIDS-related charities and fund-raising as for her celebrated film work (including two Academy Awards) and endlessly fascinating personal life, remains relevant and newsworthy. Earlier this month, Taylor made headlines when she underwent surgery to repair a faulty heart valve, and tweeted to fans afterward that "it was like having a brand new ticker."





According to an update on her Twitter page, New York's junior senator Kirsten Gillibrand is meeting with Department of Defense officials today to discuss overturning "don't ask, don't tell."

Since assuming office in January, Gillibrand has championed overturning the policy, and according to her Twitter feed, today she is taking action. At approximately 10:45 a.m. Eastern, Gillibrand tweeted, "I look forward to meeting with Dept of Defense officials today to discuss the latest with DADT policy."

While serving in the House of Representatives, Gillibrand voted against repealing DADT, but since filling Hillary Clinton's seat in the Senate, she has had a change of heart.

The Senate is still searching for a sponsor of legislation that would repeal DADT -- it will most likely not be Gillibrand

since she doesn't serve on the Armed Forces Committee.

NPR Says No to Antigay Maine Ad

Stand for Marriage Maine is illegally using content from an All Things Considered story in its television ads, according to National Public radio, which is demanding the spots be pulled.

An antigay political group has used content from an NPR story that aired in September 2004 to advocate for a people's veto of the new Maine marriage equality law, the Portland Press-Herald reports. The ad, which started airing October 16, uses audio from the story titled "Massachusetts Schools Grapple With Including Gay and Lesbian Relationships in Sex Education" and suggests that Maine kindergarten-aged children could be taught about gay sex.

"NPR did not license use of this story or its content, and would certainly not have licensed or permitted it if we had been asked," said Dana Davis Rehm, NPR's senior vice president for marketing, communications, and external relations, in a statement. "NPR is a highly respected news organization and does not allow its content to be used by political or advocacy groups. Such use is harmful to the integrity and independence of NPR. NPR does allow -- even encourage -- personal, noncommercial



use of our content, so long as it is not modified, and not used in a manner that suggests NPR promotes or endorses a cause, idea, website, product, or service. The use made by Stand for Marriage Maine violated all of these terms."

Rehm has also requested that YouTube take down the ad, and sent a cease-and-desist notice to the ad agency that created the spot.

Scott Fish, a Stand for Marriage Maine spokesman, said, "Once we've had a chance to digest it, we will issue a response."

Schwarzenegger Signs Bill Honoring Gay-Rights Activist

(CNN) -- California Gov. Arnold Schwarzenegger has signed a bill commemorating Harvey Milk, the first openly gay politician elected to public office in the state, a spokesman for the governor said Monday.

"He really saw this signing as a way to honor the gay community in California," spokesman Aaron McLear told CNN in a telephone interview.

Schwarzenegger vetoed a similar bill last year, saying he believed Milk should be recognized at the local level.

But since then, "Milk has become much more of a symbol of the gay community," McLear said, citing the eponymous movie starring Sean Penn, Milk's posthumous receipt of the Presidential Medal of Freedom and his induction into the California Hall of Fame.

Milk served briefly as San Francisco's supervisor before he and Mayor George Moscone were assassinated in 1978 by Dan White, a city supervisor who had recently resigned but wanted his job back.

Under the measure, the governor each year would proclaim May 22 -- Milk's birthday -- as a day of significance across the state.

The bill was one of 704 signed Sunday -- most of them near the midnight deadline -- by Schwarzenegger, said spokesman Aaron McLear.

The legislation passed the state Senate in May and the state Assembly last month.

The legislation has been divisive, with the governor's office receiving more than 100,000 phone calls and e-mails, most of them in opposition, spokeswoman Andrea McCarthy said last month.

But she added that most of the Twitter posts the governor received were in favor of the bill.

Schwarzenegger vetoed a similar bill last year, saying he believed Milk should be recognized at the local level.

Milk was a "unique" historical figure who led a civil rights movement and then was "assassinated in his public office for being who he was," State Sen. Mark Leno, a Democrat, told CNN last month.

The day of significance would not close schools or state offices, according to its text.

However, Randy Thomasson, the president of SaveCalifornia.com, said the bill was vague and could allow for a number of things at schools, including gay pride parades or "mock gay weddings."

"Harvey Milk was a terrible role model for children," said. Thomasson, whose organization opposed the bill. "The reality is Harvey Milk is a hero to so many people and a great role model," said Geoff Kors, executive director of Equality California, the group that backed the bill introduced by Leno.

"It's very appropriate that the state he worked in and passed the first gay rights bill in the country should honor him."

He said the bill marks the first time any state has officially honored an openly gay person.

Leno said that claims that the bill would lead to schools holding gay-pride parades and similar activities were "hyperbole." The bill "mandates nothing," he said, although it "affords an educational opportunity."

President Obama posthumously honored Milk with a Presidential Medal of Freedom this year, and Sean Penn portrayed him in the 2008 film "Milk," for which he received an Oscar for best actor.

Obama Death Threats Escalating

Can the Secret Service keep up with the spiraling threats on President Obama's life?

The White House has registered a 400% uptick in threats on President Obama's life versus threats on President George W. Bush's, straining the Secret Service and making some question whether the agency is equipped to protect the president.

The reports of increased threats against Obama come from an

internal congressional report uncovered by The Boston Globe.

Besides being charged with regularly protecting 32 people, including first lady Michelle Obama and former president Bill Clinton, the Secret Service arranges security for high-profile events



and probes financial crimes. According to the Globe, some government officials want the Secret Service to abandon its financial investigations so it can focus on keeping the nation's leaders safe.

The Southern Poverty Law Center reported in August that the number of white supremacist militia groups, which typically despise African-Americans and gays alike, has grown by 35% since 2000.
