Zach Wahls To Give Speech At Democratic Convention

CHARLOTTE, N.C. - Zach Wahls (pictured), an Iowa man

with two mothers, was vaulted to Internet stardom in early 2011 with a moving plea to his state legislature on behalf of marriage equality. On Thursday, Wahls will take the stage here at the Democratic National Convention, according to two people familiar with the speaking schedule.

Wahls, then 19, argued that his family was no different than any other Iowan's and

should be treated no differently by the law. His speech went viral, garnering millions of views online and turning him into an overnight hero of the gay rights movement. He has since written a memoir, titled "My Two Moms."


Lesbian Doctor Is New Canadian Medical Association President

Anna Reid, MD, the first openly gay person to head the CMA,

says her sexual orientation has never stood in her way.

Canada's largest physicians' association got a new president this month — Anna Reid, MD, the first openly gay person to hold that post.

Reid was officially introduced as the 76,000-member Canadian Medical Association's president August 15 at the group's national



In her inaugural address to the CMA, she emphasized the need

for patient-centric care, for better service to the nation's aboriginal people, and for doctors to work collaboratively, radio station CJCD reports.

In a subsequent interview with Toronto's Globe and Mail newspaper, she elaborated on the need to address health care inequalities that exist even in Canada, which has national coverage. "Our public system is covering just part of what needs to be covered," she said. Also, services vary around the nation, she said. She noted that she treats many aboriginal patients, adding, "I want to advocate for the marginalized."

Reid is the CMA's first president from the Northwest Territories and is only the sixth woman to head the group. "Being a woman has never stood in the way of my doing anything and neither has being lesbian," she told the Globe and Mail.

Southern Decadence Arrests

9 Anti-Gay Preachers Nabbed For Disrupting New Orleans Celebration

A number of Christian fundamentalists may have claimed that gay revelers in town for Southern Decadence somehow prompted Hurricane Isaac's dangerous weather in New Orleans last week. As it turns out, New Orleans has little tolerance for antigay rhetoric, too, as nine preachers were arrested for "suspicion

of aggressive solicitation on Saturday after yelling homophobic epithets during a Southern Decadence demonstration.

The New Orleans Times-Picayune identifies the preachers as Patrick O'Connell, 45, Rolando Igleasias, 31, Cesar Chavez, 22, Daniel Hoogerhuis, 26, Danny Guevera, 20, Larry Craft, 52, Montes Diego, 32 and Gary Brown, 33.



The men were found to be in violation of an ordinance that prohibits "any person or group of persons to loiter or congregate on Bourbon Street for the purpose of disseminating any social,



political or religious message between the hours of sunset and sunrise," according to the publication. A police spokesman said the men were previously warned not to use bullhorns, but did not comply.

Justin Craft, 31, was arrested on suspicion of battery, resisting an officer and interfering with a law enforcement investigation. The Wisconsin Gazette reports that Craft allegedly punched a police officer who tried to confiscate his bullhorn.

Anti-gay resistance to the annual Southern Decadence celebration -- which the Wisconsin Gazette deems "a mashup of Pride, circuit party and Mardi Gras," and reportedly draws an estimated 120,000 LGBT visitors to the city each year -- are nothing new. Last week, one pastor went as far to suggest that Hurricane Isaac's arrival at the same time as Southern Decadence was "is a sign that God's patience with America's sin is coming to an end."

"The church, city and nation have not repented and the homosexual agenda is far worse than it was in 2005," Defend & Proclaim The Faith's Pastor John McTernan wrote in a blog. "New Orleans is still hosting Southern Decadence with open homosexuality manifesting in the streets of the city. It could be that God is putting an end to this city and its wickedness."

Rev. Grant Storms, known as one of the festival's most vocal (Continued on page 6)

Police, LGBT Community Bonded Through Reported Hate Crime

Things could have turned out so much worse.

The powder keg certainly was stuffed with enough explosives to do considerable damage to the Lincoln Police Department, the gay and lesbian community and the city's reputation.

- * Charlie Rogers, a 33-year-old lesbian woman, reported a horrific hate crime, saying three men came into her house while she slept and sliced anti-gay slurs into her skin.
- * Thousands immediately denounced the attack and rallied to support Rogers.
- * Police didn't rule out the possibility that Rogers staged the attack and eventually arrested her, accusing her of lying to investigators.

In the face of intense media attention, locally and nationally, a potential black eye was avoided.

Police kept LGBT leaders abreast of their investigation. In turn, those leaders urged their community to support Rogers, each other and have faith in a department with a reputation for taking hate crimes seriously.

"There was not a single moment where I lacked trust," said Tyler Richard, president of Outlinc, a nonprofit group advocating for the LGBT community.

The department met with LGBT leaders three times after July 22, said Public Safety Director Tom Casady, to keep them informed of what was going on.

"It felt very collegial," he added, which made one of the meetings a little awkward because it was organized by two mediators.

"But there really wasn't anything to mediate," Casady continued. "It was as if they had set up the meeting to bring two sides together but then realized there weren't two sides. We all know each other fairly well. We're all here for the same purpose.

"It was really, really gratifying to see that level of trust and collaboration."

That trust and collaboration were hardened in the crucible of the Rogers investigation, but forged over the past two decades.

The department dedicated a liaison to communicate with the gay and lesbian community 10 to 15 years ago, Casady said.

Richard said the liaison, Capt. Marty Fehringer, frequently comes to the monthly meetings of PFLAG (Parents, Family and Friends of Lesbians and Gays) to talk about hate crimes and how officers deal with gays and lesbians.

"They've been very open to getting feedback and making sure their officers have an understanding from the chief down that they're supposed to work with all populations and treat all populations with respect."

Richard said Lincoln police are professional and added that he wouldn't hesitate to tell someone to go to police to report a hate crime.

That's music to Casady's ears. To investigate and solve hate crimes, police first must know about them.

Lincoln police started tagging hate crimes before the law required it, and there are more reports than you might think. The city made up less than one-tenth of the state's population in 2010, but according to the FBI's last report on hate crime statistics, Lincoln recorded two-thirds of the state's 61 hate crimes that year.

Those numbers are more or less the same as they were five years ago when Casady, then the police chief, wrote a blog post titled "Tip of the iceberg." In it, he noted Lincoln reported more hate crimes than not only neighboring Omaha, which is more than twice as big, but much larger cities across the country as well.

"Now, if anyone really believes that Lincoln had more hate crimes than Atlanta, Denver, Omaha, St. Louis and most other cities way over our population ... you really need to get a grip on reality," he wrote in the post.

After police arrested Rogers for allegedly making up the attack, LGBT leaders rallied to support each other. They also said in a news release that, whatever Rogers did or didn't do, hate crimes happen in Lincoln, and that victims should report them to the same investigators who believe Rogers lied about an attack that captivated the country.

"Our recent experience gives us confidence that any crime in Lincoln will be thoroughly and fairly investigated."

GOP Senate Candidate Supports Life Sentences For Rape Victims Who Obtain Abortions

Rep. Rick Berg (R-ND), the candidate for Senate from North Dakota, once voted for a bill that would have made any woman who obtained an abortion guilty of a homicide crime — even if it were in the case of rape or incest. Indeed, the bill Berg supported does not even contain an explicit exception if an abortion is necessary to save the woman's life.



In 2007, Berg was among the small number of state representatives in the

North Dakota House who supported the measure. It also would have imposed penalties on doctors and anyone else who "aids, abets, facilitates, solicits, or incites" a person into an abortion:

A new section to chapter 12.1-16 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Intentional termination of human life – Preborn children. A person is guilty of a class AA felony if the person intentionally destroys or terminates the life of a preborn child. A person that knowingly administers to, prescribes for, procures for, or sells to any pregnant individual any medicine, drug, device, or other substance with the specific intent of causing or abetting the termination of a preborn child is guilty of a class AA felony. A person that intentionally or knowingly aids, abets, facilitates, solicits, or incites a person to intentionally destroy or terminate the life of a preborn child is guilt of a class C felony. For purposes of this section, "preborn child" includes a human being from the moment of fertilization until the moment of birth.

A class AA felony carries a maximum sentence of life without the possibility of parole in North Dakota. Chapter 12.1-16 of the North Dakota Century Code is the section of that state's law that covers homicide crimes such as murder or manslaughter.

Although one news outlet claims that Berg's bill contains an exception "when the life of the mother is endangered" such an exception does not appear in the bill's text. The language of the bill quoted above creates a new homicide crime without any exceptions whatsoever. It is possible that a woman who obtained an abortion to save her life could invoke a provision of North Dakota law permitting self-defense to prevent "imminent unlawful bodily injury, sexual assault, or detention," although even this is not certain because a life-threatening pregnancy is not "unlawful."

Berg was quick to denounce the comments of a fellow Senate Candidate, Rep. Todd Akin (R-MO), when he claimed that a woman couldn't get pregnant from "legitimate rape." Berg called the statement "insulting and reprehensible," and "condemn[ed] them in the strongest terms possible." But the assertion that a rape victim should be put in jail for not wanting to carry the child of her rapist is equally abhorrent. It is also largely unpopular — though the country is often split on abor-

tion rights, 75 percent of Americans believe that abortion should be legal in the case of rape or incest.

Lesbian Couple Face Discrimination at Nevada Hospital

Nevada woman Brittney Leon was experiencing complications from pregnancy when she checked into Spring Valley Hospital on July 20. When her domestic partner, Ann Simonelli, attempted to fulfil her role as a good partner by confirming that she could make any necessary medical decisions in a difficult situation, Simonelli was told she could not, because the couple did not possess a power of attorney.

Even when the couple said they were registered domestic partners, a hospital administrator told them that their policy re-



quired a medical power of attorney, the Las Vegas Review-Journal reports. According to the article, the hospital had no problem accepting Leon's insurance, which was through Simonelli's employer. The article also pointed to the Obama administration's directive through the Department of Health and Human Services, mandating certain rights for same-sex couples in terms of hospital care.

Leon's doctor kept Simonelli updated on Leon's progress, because the doctor knew the couple's situation. Simonelli and Leon also said other medical professionals were kind to them. However, a 90-minute period lapsed in which Simonelli was not told about her partner's difficulties, including a large loss of blood. During the complicated hospital stay, Leon lost the child.

A woman who said she was the hospital's spokesperson told the

Review-Journal that gay couples must have a power of attorney in order to make certain decisions. When the reporter asked her whether that policy violated the Obama administration's directive, the spokeswoman reportedly hung up the phone without answering the question.

"We went there thinking we had the state's backing, and then we were told we were wrong," Simonelli said. "It didn't matter that we were registered domestic partners. It should matter."

Simonelli and Leon said they would not press charges or report the hospital's mismanagement, but said they hoped more would be done to help gay and lesbian couples facing the same problems they had to endure.

THAT ELUSIVE PEACE OF MIND

We're all clear on what we're supposed to do in order to be happy. Get the right job. Check. The right partner. Check. The right house. Check. The right life with all the proper accourtements. Check. So how come so many of us get all this stuff (or come close enough) and still can't relax and enjoy our life?



What many of us are missing is peace of mind. Unfortunately (or fortunately) this is not something you can buy in the designer department at Neiman-Marcus or build from carefully chosen lumber from Home Depot. Peace of mind means that your mind is your friend: it doesn't continually try and mess with you, bring you down and tell you that you're a worthless piece of shit. Peace of mind means we like ourselves and we like other people; we feel safe in the world and trust ourselves. A peaceful mind is full of thoughts that create good emotions for us

No one I've ever met lives in such a place all the time, but we can all live here more-and-more. This column explores some ways to do so.

Religion: There are more LGBT-friendly religions around to choose from than ever-before. Religion offers you a structure in which to pursue your inner peace. It also offers a community of fellow seekers. This is no small thing: to be part of a community seeking inner peace can be powerful. For some of us, this kind of structure may be a good fit, for others, it's too constricting. If you're looking for a community to support you and with whom you can share the highs and lows of a journey towards peace, a church, mosque, temple or religious community may be helpful.

Meditation: Meditation has often been portrayed as some big mysterious thing. The truth is, meditating is about being quiet and listening to yourself. Period. Your thoughts can drive you crazy – have you noticed? Meditation is simple: the hard part is just slowing down enough to do it. There are lots of different ways to meditate - check it out. The real benefit of meditation – whatever type you try – is that it helps you slow down and see what you're thinking and what's going on with you internally. This greatly increases your access to feeling peaceful and contented more of the time.

Cognitive therapy and Affirmations: In some ways, cognitive therapy and doing affirmations are similar: both help you experience more peace of mind by replacing disturbing thoughts with neutral or positive ones. A simple cognitive technique is "thought replacement": you notice your thoughts, stop thinking the destructive ones and replace them with neutral or positive ones. Saying affirmations is similar: you repeat posi-

tive thoughts so they gradually replace your old, habitual negative thoughts. Here are some affirmations you can use in your search for more peace of mind.

To calm yourself down:

May I be quiet.

May I be relaxed.

May I be still.

May I be calm.

When you're going through a rough time:

May I be free of sorrow.

May I be free of pain.

May I be kind to myself.

May I be patient with myself

When you wake up in the morning, lay in bed and repeat these four thoughts every morning for a month (it only takes a minute or so):

May I be safe and protected from harm.

May I be healthy and strong.

May I be happy and content.

May I live with ease.

Cognitive thought replacement and affirmations are most effective when you do them consistently over time. You may not feel immediately peaceful today, but if you affirm "may I be peaceful" for a week or two, you're likely to experience feeling more peaceful each time you say it.

What is a spiritual path and what does it have to offer? Most of us start on a spiritual path because we want a way out of our misery...we're tired of suffering. We want happiness and peace of mind. Most of my clients on a spiritual path have some sort of structure that supports their process of questioning and discovery: they may meditate, pray, go on silent retreats, etc. One good place to start on your own path is a book like Jack Kornfield's "A Path with Heart" or Pema Chodron's "The Places That Scare You". Yoga, chi gong, gardening, hiking in nature and even good ole' psychotherapy can be components of a spiritual path.

Lots of us have no idea how to pursue peace of mind, but we have a helluva lot of questions about our life and purpose: this is a great place to start. Without asking the right questions, we may foolishly believe that our happiness lies in external events or people that we cannot control. To find peace of mind we need to do inner work: it's a journey into yourself.

You have your whole life to enjoy this journey, so relax. It's like growing a flower: you plant a seed, water it, care for it and allow it to unfold in its own time, or you can get out there with a knife and try to force the flower petals to open faster. Peace of mind is the same way: we plant seeds of peace and contentment, water them with prayer, meditation and whatever nurtures us, and allow it to unfold. And, when we do the work, it will...

By voting NO to this extreme Marriage Amendment, you're sending a message that you support the rights for all loving couples, gay or straight."











