Few in Congress Back Gay Marriage

WASHINGTON — The Human Rights Campaign, the nation's largest gay civil rights group, is studying the ebb and flow of every development surrounding the status in Congress of a proposed constitutional amendment to ban same-sex marriage.

"We're mobilizing all of our resources to defeat it," said

Winnie Stachelberg, HRC's political director.

But when asked if she knows how many members of Congress support legal recognition of same-sex marriage on its own merits, separate from the question of a constitutional amendment, Stachelberg pauses.

"I can't tell you," she said. "That's not something we're

keeping track of right now."

Stachelberg said HRC has chosen to focus on the anti-gay constitutional amendment now, because that's the issue pending before the Congress. And that's the issue that poses the greatest threat to gays and their families — the specter that anti-gay discrimination might be enshrined in the U.S. Constitution, she said.

A check with HRC, the National Gay & Lesbian Task Force, Lambda Legal Defense & Education Fund, and Freedom to Marry — the largest gay civil rights groups working on the gay marriage issue — shows that none have conducted a systematic survey of members of Congress to determine their support — or opposition — to the idea of legalizing same-sex marriage.

In a preliminary, spot survey of some of the House members who have strong, pro-gay voting records, only 15 members could be identified who say they firmly support the right of

gays to marry. All are Democrats.

U.S. Rep. Barney Frank (D-Mass.), who is gay and is among the strongest advocates in Congress for legalizing same-sex marriage, said he could not come up with an actual number of House members who support same-sex marriage.

"I can say the number is growing rapidly," he said. "I would

say it's in the dozens."

When asked for a more specific number, Frank said he believes there are at least "50 or more" House members who support same-sex marriage.

As far as his fianci was concerned, Officer Cadet Jason Stewart was planning a simple weekend getaway to Toronto. But when a white stretch limo rolled up outside Joey Schwehr's Kingston, Ont., home Friday afternoon, he realized it was much more than that. It became the much-anticipated weekend they would say their yows, making Stewart, who attends Kingston's Royal Military College, the first man in the military to marry another man.

"The first time we went on a date, (Joey) said he wanted to be picked up in a white stretch limo with white roses in the back (Continued on Page 6)

City Mayors have not a clue

Marcia McRostie of Siouxland AIDS coalition was sitting in a restaurant recently when she ended up being witness to Mayor Ferris of Sioux City speaking out against homosexuality.

Part of his topic included recent events surrounding the City Council's vote against adding sexual orientation as a protected class against discrimination. Mayor Ferris stated he has studied sexual orientation more than he has studied anything else in his life and went on to say that the issue isn't really about sexual orientation, but about bestiality and pedophilia.

It is ridiculous when a mayor makes a public statement not really researching the facts like he says he has. Doctors and counselors will tell you we are not suffering from an illness, although pedophilia and bestiality are.

City officials in Omaha recently went on a rampage when they found out that a lesbian police officer was receiving domestic partner benefits for her spouse. One official thought it was not right despite what the police union said.

The question I have is, what is it hurting to protect gay and lesbian people? If we cannot get our own cities to go up to bat, how can we even get the legislative bodies of the state and federal government to protect us.

It really disturbs me that we would have someone so uneducated in office in Sioux City. He obviously has no street smarts! In Omaha why should our officials be concerned with a police officer having benefits for the one she loves. Is there not enough in Omaha to worry about with deficits and potholes in the streets? Does the city forget we even exist and that we have businesses and pay taxes to the city?

We are supposed to have more control over our local governments, because they are smaller. Cities should be about watching out for your neighbor and taking care of your own. There are enough of us GLBT people in Omaha and Lincoln that we should be a concern for the cities here as well as in Sioux City.

Maybe we as a community should be working harder to make the smaller changes before we go for the big one. This means maybe we should be working to get our cities to make policies to improve our life, then the counties and then the state and on up to the federal government.

We are not a community that can sit around and wait for the court system. That may come soon, but in the meantime it is a war on all fronts. We must take on our legislative bodies.

GLBT communities exist in the big cities. Big cities pull weight with state governments. They have more representation. We should work to push our officials in our favor who in return can petition the state. When we have mayors out of line it is best to also call and let them know they are out of line and should publicly apologize. When we demand this then we are asking for the respect that we deserve.

strongly opposes a constitutional amendment to ban gay marriage, but has not said whether he supports gay marriage. His office did not return a call by press time seeking to determine Kolbe's position on gay marriage itself.

Frank said most of the current House supporters of same-sex marriage come from New York and California.

D.C. Congressional Delegate Eleanor Holmes Norton (D-D.C.) is the only House member from the D.C. metropolitan area who has come out in support of same-sex marriage.

Among the most influential House members to declare support for same-sex marriage is Rep. Nancy Pelosi (D-Calif.), the House minority leader. Pelosi expressed support for same-sex marriage in a recent interview on the Fox News cable network.

"How do you stand on the issue," asked talk show host Neil Cavuto.

"I don't believe in discrimination of any kind," Pelosi said.
"Can same-sex couples marry?" Cavuto asked.

"Yes," replied Pelosi, who added that she approved of San Francisco Mayor Gavin Newsom's decision to issue marriage licenses to same-sex couples.

Rep. Mike Honda (D-Calif.) was just as matter-of-fact in his position on the issue.

"Only full marriage rights will guarantee same-sex couples equal protection under the law and provide them access to the same rights and benefits enjoyed by all other families," he said.

Lynne Weil, communications director for Rep. Tom Lantos (D-Calif.), said Lantos "absolutely supports" same-sex marriage.

Rep. John Lewis (D-Atlanta) is one of the only House members from the South who has expressed support for same-sex marriage.

and be surprised," said Stewart, 19, from the Fairmont Royal York hotel yesterday afternoon, just hours after they were wed.

Accompanied by a few close friends, the two were married at city hall. Last night, they celebrated at the Britney Spears concert after finding front-row tickets for \$150 apiece.

While neither of their families attended the wedding, Stewart said both groups are happy for them. "They knew we were engaged and going to get married. (Joey's) father took it well. I think his mother was a little upset that she wasn't going to be there for it," Stewart said.

But both of their parents, as well as about 300 friends and family, will be present when the two reaffirm their vows at the military college in October.

"Everyone's always been really supportive," said Stewart of his peers and teachers at the college. "I've never gotten any flack about it. Everybody's just gung-ho and most of my superiors are more worried about me getting married at a young age than who I'm getting married to."

Stewart and Schwehr, 20, dated for a little over four months after being set up on a blind date. They said their connection was instant. "It was so special. I just knew ... it's hard to explain, but I just knew. Every moment right from there, it was great," said Schwehr, who works at a clothing store in Kingston.

Since they met, Stewart said the two have spent every day together. He proposed to Schwehr at work about a month ago. "Since I started dating when I was about 16, I probably hadn't really been in love before until I met Joey," Stewart said. "We definitely wouldn't have gotten married if we didn't think we were perfect for each other."

When he told his mother last month that he was gay and he was getting married, she wasn't surprised. Unsure of how his father, a lobster fisherman in Nova Scotia, would react, she offered to tell him when he got home from work. A few hours later, Stewart got a phone call.

"My dad called me up and the only thing he said was, `Just tell Joey he's gotta look after us when we get older,'" said Stewart. "So they took it very well

Omaha Police Contract Includes Domestic Partner Benefits

Omaha has a new proposed police union contract and it includes domestic partner benefits. That is a first for an Omaha city contract.

City officials said the contract would offer funeral leave and sick leave to police officers who qualify for domestic partner benefits, if the measure is approved by the city council.

"It's a good, basic first step to open up negotiations in all this," said Chris Feistner, from our very own Rainbow Outreach Center. "We're glad to see it."

Feistner said the gays and lesbians he works with get very frustrated when they're denied domestic partner benefits. Until now, those frustrations have included the city of Omaha's employees.

"I think its a terrible thing to deny someone insurance, quit talking to them because of their lifestyle or what's going on in their household," Feistner said.

Councilman Chuck Sigerson said that when Nebraska passed the defense of marriage amendment in 2000, they decided not to recognize unions between same-sex couples. He said approving the new contract would be against voters' wishes, and added that although the proposed benefits are just funeral and sick leave, he worries it could "blossom into an entire gamut of improved benefits."

The police union asked for health insurance benefits for domestic partners as well. That was rejected as too costly.

We can only hope that those GLBT police officers, who often risk their lives to help and protect Omaha citizens, will eventually get this small token reward which their hetero counterparts enjoy without a thought about it's real value.

After all, these are "real" families just like any other families in America. They are just as loving and caring as any other.

Roman Catholic Church Plans Unprecedented Voter Drive

(Boston, Massachusetts) The Roman Catholic Church has begun a massive statewide drive to register voters in hopes of defeating Massachusetts lawmakers who support gay marriage. The Massachusetts Catholic Conference said there are tens of thousands of people who have never before registered to vote and they are "a formidable force".

It is the first time the Church has launched such a drive and comes just days before the legislature is to once more take up the issue of amending the state constitution to ban same-sex marriage. The voter drive was announced in The Pilot, the official newspaper of the Boston Archdiocese and is being regarded by some lawmakers as an open challenge and a blurring of the separation of church and state. The church says it isn't threatening anyone with anything except "Christian ethics".

The official position of the church is to oppose gay marriage and civil unions. It is already on record saying it regards civil unions as marriage by another name. About 67 percent of the Legislature is Catholic. "Legislators who decide to vote to harm the institution of marriage -- either by allowing same-sex marriage to stand unchallenged or by creating civil unions -- will feel a backlash in November," The Pilot said in an editorial this week.

The drive will be made through parishes, said Dan Avila, associate director for policy and research at the Catholic Conference, in hope of reaching the recent immigrants who attend in large numbers and young parishioners who may not yet have registered to vote.

"Churches typically serve the most underrepresented populations in terms of the rate of voter registration," Avila said. "Parishes are among the few institutions that can reach groups that are notably under-registered, racial and ethnic minorities, new citizens, youth."

The voter drive is being closely watched by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops and if it is successful similar drives could be mounted in other states.

Meanwhile, May 17, the day when town clerks in Massachusetts must begin issuing marriage licenses to same-sex couples is quickly approaching.

Today the state Department of Public Health told town and city clerks they'll undergo training in early May on issuing marriage licenses.

The new licenses must be gender neutral and issues such as dealing with out of state couples must be decided. An old Massachusetts law allows clerks to refuse licenses to people who are not residents.



I Have Been Waiting Patiently......

I have been staring with great anticipation out the window of my flat here in the heart of San Francisco, sighing heavily, waiting for the riots and the plagues and the screaming monkeys and the blistering rain of inescapable hellfire. I have my camera all ready and everything. There has been nothing. I see only some lovely trees and a stunning blue sky and my neighbor walking by with her pair of matching chow chows as a pained-looking woman struggles to parallel park her SUV. Same old, same old.

And this is San Francisco, gay-marriage HQ, Sodom-and-Gomorrahville, debauchery central. We are supposed to be careening off the nice, safe road of social acceptability right now, welcoming chaos, exploding into a fiery hellmist of our own sick godless depravity and dropping off the disgusted planet any minute now.

Where is my raging apocalypse? This is what I want to know. Where is the social meltdown? The moral depravity? I was promised an apocalypse, dammit. What am I supposed to do with all these tubs of margarine and confetti and kazoos? There have been more than 4,000 gay-marriage ceremonies in San Francisco so far. Hundreds more are just now kicking up a storm in Oregon and in beautifully rebellious little burgs around New York state. And, yet, nothing. No chaos. No reign of terror. Not even a lousy heat wave. Sigh.

Some homosexual couples have been married for more than three weeks now, living in utter godless sin as they drive their cars and shop and laugh and cry and go to work and pay their taxes and wonder about their dreams. Lightning has not struck them dead. The Hellmouth has not opened wide its gaping maw, hankering for some of the City's trademark Sourdough o' Sin. I am dumbfounded.

After all, gay marriage is supposed to ruin the nation, is it not? And look. Nothing. Not a peep. Not a single rabid spitting demon to be seen. Unless you count Lynne Cheney. Which you never, ever should.

I believe I have been misled. I was told repeatedly in extra-glowing terminology by multiple raging Bible-quoting drones that The Good Book expressly forbids gay marriage and gay sex, and to engage in either spells imminent doom and instant social bedlam and there are specific verses all about it. 

If he refuses to marry his brother's widow or deliberately does not give her children, he shall pay a fine of one shoe and be otherwise punished in a manner to be determined by law." (Gen. 38:6-10; Deut 25:5-10). Hey, it's right there, in the Bible. So it must be true.
