## CFEP LOBBYING DAY FEB 5

Citizens For Equal Protection (CFEP) and Nebraska Advocates For Justice and Equality (NAJE) will sponsor a Lobby day at the Nebraska State Capitol on Wednesday, Feb. 5, beginning at 8:30 in room 1023 (near the West entrance).

CFEP and NAJE want to raise awareness about pending legislation that would add a definition of "sexual orientation" to the Nebraska Fair Employment laws and the Nebraska Fair Housing laws. Two separate legislative bills will be introduced towards these ends. Please note: The Employment bill was known as LB 19 during the last session but has been introduced as LB 441 this year. The housing bill doesn't have a number at the time of this writing.

It is an essential part of the legislative process to have citizens communicate directly with their elected representatives. "In person" meetings are very powerful and can put legislation on a senator's radar screen that might otherwise be overlooked.

Please consider attending. We will meet at 8:30 for a brief presentation and then draw senators off the floor of the legislature to talk to constituents. No, you don't have to do this alone. There will be "experts" there to join you and your senator if you wish. All we need individuals to do is introduce themselves to their senator and offer a rational, personal reason for support of the Fair Housing and Employment Non-Discrimination bills. We will provide any talking points you might need or you can speak from your heart.

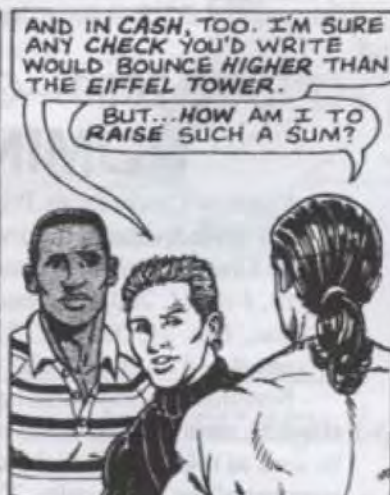
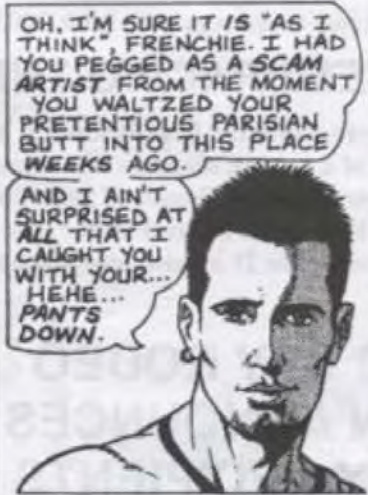

Is Henry Kissinger – Nobel Laureate and the most famous diplomat of his generation – also a war criminal? Provoked by the Christopher Hitchens book, filmmakers Jarecki and Gibney have constructed a movie, *The Trials of Henry Kissinger*, which is both brilliant legal brief and chilling psychodrama.

Some of Kissinger's most ardent supporters (Alexander Haig, Brent Scowcroft, William Safire) vie with his detractors (writers Seymour Hersh, William Shawcross, Hitchens himself).

Charges that Kissinger was instrumental in creating the coup that toppled Chilean President Allende, that he undermined LBJ's Vietnam peace talks (prolonging the war by seven years), engineered the secret bombing of Cambodia, and approved Indonesian president Suharto's use of U.S. arms to massacre 100,000 East Timorese have resulted in summonses by five nations seeking to depose him. The film plumbs the depth of one man's sour, as it questions tenants of international law: do war criminals reside only in nations whose interests are inimical to our own – or are we our own worst enemy?

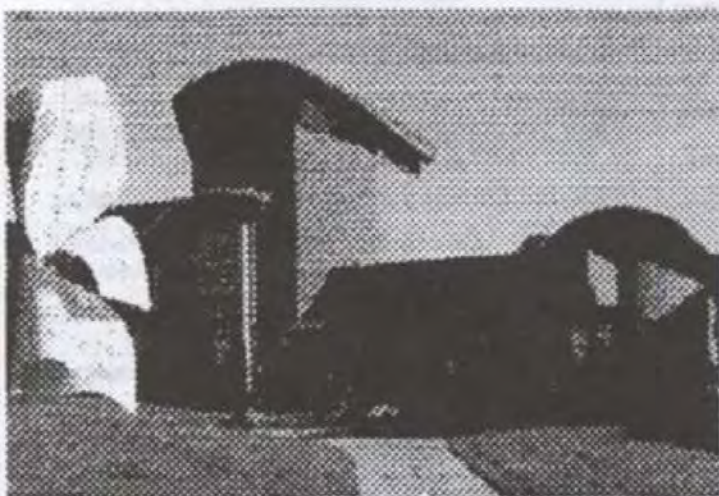

## SYNOPSIS:

### **24 HOUR PARTY PEOPLE** by Michael Winterbottom

Manchester, 1976. Tony Wilson (Steve Coogan) is an ambitious but frustrated local TV news reporter looking for a way to make his mark. After witnessing a life-changing concert by an unknown band called the Sex Pistols, he persuades his station to televise one of their performances, and soon Manchester's punk groups are clamoring for him to manage them. Riding the wave of a musical revolution, Wilson and his friend create the legendary Factory Records label and The Hacienda club, and bands like Joy Division, New Order, and the Happy Mondays emerge to change the industry forever. Packed with an incredible soundtrack and a famous cast of characters, *24 Hour Party People* is a sprawling, energetic, and humorous history of one of the most important periods in modern music.

### **THE FAST RUNNER** by Zacharias Kunuk

### **ALL OR NOTHING** by Mike Leigh

Penny's love for her partner, taxi driver Phil, has run dry. He is a gentle, philosophical guy, and she works on the check-out line at a supermarket. Their daughter Rachel cleans in a home for elderly people and their son Rory is unemployed and aggressive. The joy has gone out of Phil's and Penny's life, but when an unexpected tragedy occurs they are finally brought together to rediscover their love. *All or Nothing* is set on a London working-class housing estate over a long weekend, and also tells the stories of a range of Phil and Penny's neighbors, some of whom become involved in the family's lives and all of whom experience an emotional journey.

### **HEAVEN** BY Tom Tykwer

From the director of *Run Lola Run* and the producer of *The English Patient*, comes *Heaven*, the last film written by the late master filmmaker Krzysztof Kieslowski, over a probing exploration of the modern world and its moral choices. *Heaven* stars Cate Blanchett and Giovanni Ribisi. Philippa (Cate Blanchett), a British teacher living in Turin, Italy, has seen many friends, including her husband, fall victim to drug overdoses. Philippa has repeatedly contacted the police with information about Turin's biggest drug dealer but, complicit in his dealings, they have completely ignored her. So Philippa decides to dole out her own form of justice—setting her off on a journey, aided unexpectedly by a young police officer (Giovanni Ribisi), that moves through retribution and redemption, innocence and crime, and hope and desire as she goes from a young widow to a fugitive on the run.

### **INVINCIBLE** by Werner Herzog

"Following a string of documentaries, Werner Herzog returns with his first dramatic feature in a decade, and though it's based on the true story of Zische Breitbart, a Polish Jew whose feats of strength astounded Weimar Berlin, it unfolds with the elemental power of a legend. Zische (Jouko Ahola), a simple blacksmith from a modest family, is lured away from his shtetl by a wily theatrical agent, and once he arrives in Berlin he's booked at a cabaret presided over by a wicked clairvoyant (Tim Roth). At first Zische performs in a blond wig as "Siegfried, the Iron King," part of the seer's scheme to curry favor with high-ranking Nazis, but after the strongman reveals his racial identity to the audience and declares himself "the new Samson," he begins drawing a combustible mix of brownshirts and defiant Jews. Ahola, a Finnish bodybuilder twice named "the Strongest Man in the World," makes his screen debut in this English-language film, and though his acting is unschooled, to say the least, Herzog shrewdly uses his blunt sincerity to counterpoint Roth's spectacularly icy performance." —J.R. Jones, *The Chicago Reader*

### **SECRETARY** by Steven Shainberg

This wicked little black comedy, adapted from a short story by Mary Gaitskill, chronicles the perverse attraction between a young typist (Maggie Gyllenhaal) and her uptight boss (James Spader), a sadomasochistic tango that strikes unexpected chords in each character. The young woman is a self-mutilator, and when the attorney spans her for a minor mistake, she knows she's found the right job. The film's romantic conceit turns on the decidedly un-PC notion of female submissiveness, but director Steven Shainberg (*Hit Me*) twists the story into a sly and stylized study of two lonely souls who come to realize they're made for each other. Spader is both haughty and tender as the sadistic control freak, and Gyllenhaal is even better as the love-starved kitten, crawling around on all fours and meowing for more. Angelo Badalamenti wrote the creepy score; with Lesley Ann Warren as the typist's overly solicitous mother and Stephen McHattie as her self-loathing father.

## **MCC FOUNDER PERRY TO LEAD SAME-SEX MARRIAGE ACTION- OMAHA RESPONDS AS WELL!**

When the Los Angeles courthouse opens at 9 AM on Friday morning, February 14 – Valentine's Day – veteran civil rights activist Rev. Troy D. Perry and his partner of 18 years, Philip Ray DeBlicek, will be standing in line. They plan to apply for a license to marry. "And I'm encouraging thousands of gay and lesbian couples to do the same," said Perry, whose churches perform more than 6,000 same sex weddings each year. "It's time to move the debate on gay marriage forward. It's time for equality. It's time for the US to catch up with Sweden, Denmark, the Netherlands, Germany, France and other countries that provide marriage rights for gay couples." Rev. Troy Perry is encouraging GLBT couples to go to courthouses and municipal offices on February 14, Valentine's Day, and apply for marriage licenses.

"For me it's not a religious issue, it's a legal issue. It's a matter of equality and simple justice. If my country is to live out its promise of equality, all laws must be applied equally, and that includes our marriage laws. Imagine the power that will be unleashed if thousands or tens of thousands of gay and lesbian couples apply for marriage licenses on the same day," said Perry.

Rev. Barbara Sagat, Pastor of MCC Omaha, states " My partner, Rev. Sharon Stover and I have decided to join in this special challenge! We plan to join MCC Folk around the Country and apply at Omaha City Hall for a marriage license. We will be contacting the press and attempting to garner coverage for this action. If there are others that are free to join us in this action- either by also requesting a license or by coming to show support for our actions, please call the Church office at 345-2563. I would also love, if I can find the right couple, to perform either a Holy Union, or a reaffirmation of Vows, in the courtyard outside City Hall! We can hold this service for one couple, or as a mass affirmation for many who want to make public their desire to have their unions recognized.

"What an opportunity! I will not perform a 'mock union' just to get publicity, but if anyone is interested in having their relationship blessed, reaffirming their vows, or in some other way participating in this event please let me know. This event can be as large or as small as the community wants it to be. Let MCC Omaha hear from you if you want to participate! Only God can change hearts, but together, we can certainly help God in that process!"

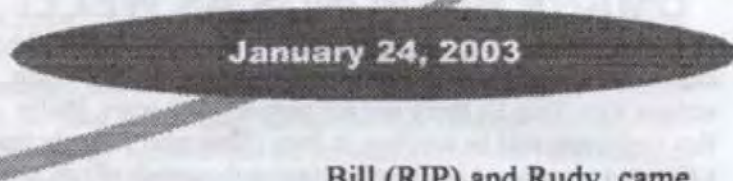
