NEW OXFORD ANNOTATED BIBLE “BREAKTHROUGH FOR GLBT PEOPLE”

The New Oxford Annotated Bible, Third Edition.

This ecumenical study Bible contains the Revised Standard Version of the Bible. This new edition was supervised by Oxford University with study and research notes edited by the world's outstanding biblical scholars. This is the world's premier study Bible — and in a major breakthrough for GLBT people of faith everywhere — its footnotes and study materials incorporate many of MCC's biblical interpretations and views. In the new study Bible, the views and interpretations of the "clobber passages" use the theology and interpretations we have developed within MCC! Imagine the joy I felt when I recently opened a package from a scholar, educator and friend to find a copy of **The New Oxford Annotated Bible, Third Edition** — along with a handwritten inscription that read, "Thanks for your life and ministry which have helped to shape the scholarship of this edition. May God continue to bless you and UFMCC in your quest for truth."

Let me share a few illustrations with you:

- For 33 years, we have been teaching that the sin of Sodom and Gomorrah, understood in the Jewish context of that day, was the sin of severe inhospitality to strangers. This interpretation appears in The New Oxford Annotated Bible.
- In Jude 7, this version offers the alternate reading that the people of Sodom and Gomorrah "went after other flesh" — leading to the interpretation that their sin was against angelic visitors, not other humans, and thus could not be a reference to homosexuality.
- In Romans 1, the footnotes in the new version indicate that this passage is used "to denote not the orientation of sexual desire, but its immoderate indulgence," that is, it is not a prohibition of God's gift, but a prohibition against its misuse.
- 1 Corinthians 6:9-10 adopts MCC's interpretation that these verses prohibit temple prostitution — not homosexuality. The Leviticus passage is the least clear — though it is set in the larger context of differentiating the Children of Israel from the hostile nations that surrounded them.

All-in-all, the world renowned biblical scholars who prepared The New Oxford Annotated Bible have adopted a great deal of MCC's own scholarship and theology: There is no biblical condemnation of homosexuality — only prohibitions against its misuse, just as there is no biblical blanket condemnation of heterosexuality, only prohibitions against misuse of that gift.

I am pleased to commend this new study version of the Holy Scriptures. I believe it will be an important addition to the library of every MCC leader — and will be used by God to further open the doors of all faith communities to love, embrace and affirm God's GLBT children.





IRIS PHOENIX SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

The Iris Phoenix Scholarship Fund was established to provide scholarships for individuals who self-identify as gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgendered, or as children of gay, lesbian, bisexual, or transgendered persons.

Each year there will be at least one scholarship awarded in each category (gay, lesbian, bi, transgendered or child of a GLBT person) in which there are applicants who meet established criteria. The total number and the dollar amount of the scholarships will be determined by the Scholarship Committee based on the number of successful applicants and the funds available for distribution.

Equal consideration will be given to any program of post-high school education, including but not limited to college, technical, and trade schools. Monies from the Scholarship Fund may be used for tuition, housing, books, and /or supplies (copy of contract or lease may be required).

Recipients must enroll in a program of higher education within 6 months of the announcement of the award. All monies awarded must be used within one calendar year of the award or the money will revert to the Scholarship Fund and, at the discretion of the Scholarship Committee, may be awarded to other applicants or may be held for future use.

Eligibility Criteria:

- 1) Resident of Nebraska or Iowa or be registered to attend a school in Nebraska or Iowa
 - 2) Self-identify as gay, lesbian, bisexual, or transgendered or as the biological, adopted, step, or foster child of a gay, lesbian, bisexual or transgendered person.
- Enclose with Application Form:**
- 1) Proof of residency or a letter of acceptance from a school in Iowa or Nebraska
 - 2) A signed statement self-identifying as gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgendered or as the child of a GLBT person. (If applying as a child of a gay, lesbian, bisexual, or transgendered parent, include a statement from the GLBT parent. If the GLBT parent is deceased or otherwise unable to sign such a statement, include a statement signed by a gay, lesbian, bisexual, or transgendered person who was personally acquainted with the parent and is able and willing to certify that the parent self-identified as a gay, lesbian, bisexual, or transgendered person.)
 - 3) A Personal Statement that includes a personal history and a description of any community service or involvement.
 - 4) A statement describing your Educational Goals.
 - 5) Letters of recommendation from 3 persons not related to you. At least one (1) of these letters of recommendations must be from an individual who self-identifies as gay, lesbian, bisexual, or transgendered.
 - 6) A statement of Financial Need such as those utilized by the particular school or university.



LINCOLN ACTIVIST SHOP GOES UNDERGROUND

Boondoggles, a Lincoln shop that sells an array of Queer/LGBT pride items, as well as a variety of radical social and political items, has moved and expanded. The shop began by selling its wares on shelf space rented from another Lincoln business, The Ozone. On April 1, Boondoggles opened in its own space, a full-sized activist resource and gift store. The new location is the lower level of 122 N. 14th Street, in Lincoln.

"We're in the basement of Zero St. Records, the punk rock record shop," owner Angela Hatcher explains, "I tell people we've gone underground because we're downstairs, plus the entrance is in the alley between Homer's and Zero St. Records -- sort of tucked away."

Angela is undaunted by the fact that the new store is in an alley as opposed to a more visible location. "Sure, I have to explain to people that our entrance is basically right across the alley from Homer's dumpsters, but I find that amusingly appropriate. I know that Boondoggles customers are intelligent enough to find us, anyway. And it's worth it just to be able to expand as much as we have. I mean, we just outgrew those shelves... now we can have way more tee-shirts than we had room for before and I've added a lot more gift items." Boondoggles has become visible in the area by vending at events such as the Omaha Pride Parade and Lincoln pride events, as well as events such as Lincoln NOW's

"Womanstock" concert and UNL campus events like the "Choice Groove" festival held by Student's for Choice. The store's website (www.ideviate.net) has also grown with the help of advertisements in such feminist publications as "Bitch" and "Bust."

The store specializes in selling tee shirts, bumper stickers, buttons, books and zines, jewelry and gift items with an emphasis on social and political issues such as Queer/LGBT rights, feminism/riot grrrl, environment/animal rights, free thought, punk, and activism.

"I look at Boondoggles as a resource, not just a business," Angela says. "I sell stuff that I believe in. It's fun stuff, but also very serious. Nebraska -- and America in general -- is horribly conservative and while I find all these close-minded theocrats and their flocks of gullible little sheep incredibly funny, they're also very scary. It's important, now more than ever, for people who see what's going on to express themselves. Loudly."

SAGE volunteers are needed in Omaha to keep the Rainbow Outreach GLBT Resource Center open during the daytime Monday through Saturday each week. Center President Lynn Rogers explains that senior volunteers are some of the best people to operate the Center during the daytime. "We have several groups that meet here on different evenings that can cover the phone lines and drop-ins at night. But retirees are great during the daytime since many of them prefer to be out during daylight when Omaha busses are most efficient at getting them downtown and home again."
