

Lesbian and Gay Couples in San Francisco Are Granted Marriage Licenses

SAN FRANCISCO -- The City and County of San Francisco today became the first government in the United States to grant marriage licenses to same-sex couples. City officials followed a directive set in motion by Mayor Gavin Newsom. Advocates heralded the move as the most significant moment in the fight for equal marriage rights for same-sex couples.

"For many Americans, their wedding day is one of the happiest days of their life," said Geoffrey Kors, executive director for Equality California, the state's leading gay rights advocacy group. "For these San Francisco couples, it is no different with one exception. Yesterday, they couldn't get married. Today, they can. To suggest that these couples are experiencing a profound sense of happiness is an understatement."

Dorothy Ehrlich, executive director of the ACLU of Northern California, added: "Just as we told the state in 1974 when they passed a statute limiting marriage to a man and a woman, that kind of discrimination against same-sex couples violates the California constitution's promise of equality. Discrimination in marriage was wrong then and it's wrong now."

Lesbian and gay couples began gathering late this morning at the County Clerk's office following an announcement by the mayor's office indicating that they would begin issuing licenses. In total, four couples were granted marriage licenses.

Among the first to be married were Del Martin, 83, and Phyllis Lyon, 80, who have been together for more than 50 years. Martin and Lyon met in Seattle in 1950 and began dating in 1952. They moved to San Francisco in 1953. The two women founded the Daughters of Bilitis, the first national lesbian rights organization. "Phyllis and I demonstrated our commitment to one another more than half a century ago," said Martin. "Today, San Francisco has demonstrated its commitment to us through equality and fairness."

"Gay and lesbian Americans are part of the American family," said National Center for Lesbian Rights Executive Director Kate Kendell. "We pay taxes and contribute to society and therefore desire and deserve the same rights and protections as other Americans."

On the same day, State Assembly member Mark Leno (D-San Francisco) introduced the Marriage License Non-Discrimination Act (MLNDA), sponsored by Equality California. The bill would end discrimination in the issuance of marriage licenses statewide, allowing samesex couples to obtain marriage licenses anywhere in California.

Newsom told the San Francisco Chronicle on Tuesday, "A little more than a month ago, I took the oath of office here at City Hall and swore to uphold California's Constitution, which clearly outlaws all forms of discrimination. Denying basic rights to members of our community will not be tolerated."

Editor's Note: As of printing, more than 1000 licenses have been issued with most of those same sex couples getting married on the spot.

Cats is coming to the Orpheum Theater

The show that revolutionized musical theatre is coming to the Orpheum in Omaha for five performances, February 20-22, 2004. What began as a musical about cats after Andrew Lloyd Webber picked up T.S. Eliot's *Old Possum's Book of Practical Cats*, a book of poems purchased in an airport bookshop, has become the longest running show in Broadway's history. Winner of seven Tony Awards including Best Musical, Best Book of a Musical, Best Lighting and Best Costumes, *CATS* features 20 of Andrew Lloyd Webber's timeless melodies, including the high song, "Memory."

Now that it's been seen by over 8,250,000 audience members, it's time to introduce *CATS* to a new generation. Midnight. Not a sound from the pavement. Suddenly an explosion of music and lights reveals a larger than life junkyard. Probing car lights tear across the darkened landscape of bottles and boxes, briefly catching the darting image of a running feline. Tonight is the one special night each year when the tribe of Jellicle Cats reunites to celebrate who they are. This is the story of *CATS*.

Two kittens appear as trouble makers, who enjoy talking and playing around, while they burglarize houses. One of these playful kittens is Mungojerrie, who is played by gay cast member Mario Martinez, who took the time to talk to "The Gavzette."

"This is my first tour and it has been fun the past year and half traveling with CATS," said Martinez." I enjoy the show, because it has tough choreography and great music."

Martinez graduated a year ago from the Boston Conservatory with a degree in music theatre.

"I started getting into dance in high school and ended up loving music theatre. I really enjoy *CATS*, because of the good energy it has. My character is fun, because I crawl and play around with other cats. This character fits me, as I can be a little crazy."

Some of the more challenging aspects of the show have been pointed out by Martinez, with moves such as a double cartwheel that is partnered.

"The show is an eye-filling, huge spectacular for all ages. People see different things each time they see the show. Each cat has a different personality and is different thing to bring every performance, different casts portray it differently. Every cast has a different energy. The audience participation, makes the audience feel a part of the show."

This will be Martinez's first time to Omaha, in which he is prepared to go out and hit the clubs. Aside from clubbing, Martinez loves to read Novels (Including the classics), and listen to about any type of music especially pop. "Anything that will keep me entertained."

Future plans for Martinez are to take another tour, do commercials, or make it onto Broadway.

Other facts about CATS include:

On May 11, 1981, *CATS* opened at the New London Theater in the West End. Eight years later it celebrated its first important milestone: after 3,358 performances *CATS* became the longest running musical in the history of British Theatre. *CATS* played its final performance on its 21st birthday, May 11, 2001.

In 1982 CATS opened at the Winter Garden Theater in New York City and continued to live up to its motto "Now and Forever." On June 19, 1997, CATS became the longest running musical on Broadway. It ended its 18-year run on September 10, 2000.

Perspectives

This past week I was fortunate to get a letter back from Senator Chuck Hagel's office on the federal marriage amendment. I had written him on behalf of opposing the federal marriage amendment. Here is a glimpse of what he wrote in his letter.

"Marriage between a man and a woman is an honored social institution that dates back thousands of years in civilization. It is for this reason I am opposed to same-sex marriages."

He goes on to talk about the Massachusetts ruling. He then goes on to say he supports a states right to choose. He is in favor of the defense of marriage acts, which congress passed in 1996. He then says his beliefs run along former Congressman Bob Barr who has the same opinion.

There are some issues with Hagel's way of thinking. 1) Yes marriage is an old institution, but originally it was a uniting of a man to his property. (Women were property.)

Hagel does not understand the history of marriage so allow me to inform you. According to "Liturgy for Living," the Episcopal Church's teaching series, Marriage was not a sacrament of the church until 800 AD. The issue was that marriage was a government function not recognized by the Church. People would get authorization by the state and then receive a blessing from the church. Then the Roman Catholic Church started to become the political power of Europe. This merged politics and religion making marriage a church/state joint recognition.

According to John Boswell's book "Same-sex Unions in pre-modern Europe, within the confines of Christianity there were same-sex unions in the church. There were even popes in the past that are buried next to the same-sex lovers. The problem with the evidence is that these documents are sealed by the Vatican and denied by the Church that they exist.

Same-sex unions are a part of history, but we have failed to recognize them.

The other issue at hand is that the Constitution is there to give rights, not take them away. We as GLBT people should have our rights protected. We live in a society that still does not give full rights to women. There are laws, but no amendment protects women and only considers legal pay ¾ to that of a man.

The other issue of why the majority should be able to dictate to the minority is the thought that our love is not equal. They tried that with banning inter-racial marriage. Eventually the courts had to step in. There are many problems with marriage in our country and homosexuals are not it. How does my marriage with a guy hurt heterosexuals? The truth is, it does not. But the truth is that not allowing same sex marriage hurts homosexuals.

I am a man of God as I work for the Church. I think in light of it all, it is time we stand up to the religious right and clear the name of Christianity politically. I am tired of these calls from fellow Christians that make the rest of Christianity look oppressive.

Perhaps the best action in figuring out what is good for our country would be a challenge to Senator Hagel and all those who are involved politically, to decide the issues based on five criteria:

- Does it facilitate justice? The answer is yes, equality is justice; oppression is not. People may not agree with our unions, but homosexuals deserve protection, from losing jobs, from being bashed, and respect for their families.
- Does it affirm the value and dignity of human life? The answer is yes. Allowing us to marry is affirming our dignity. Telling us no is not respecting us and our ability to love and be in a committed relationship.
- Does it produce a positive systemic impact? It is very positive for gay people to be given the right to marry. Hold them to the same standards as heterosexuals. The responsibility to not just run away when the relationship gets tough. Tell them they are married now, affairs are not ok. It may not be positive to the radical right, but it hurts them not at all.
- Does it provide a fresh connectedness to what has gone before? The answer is that homosexuality has been around since the beginning of time. We see people like Matthew Shepard who lose their lives, because of who they are. We see a second mother who cannot visit her son in the hospital because legally the child is not hers. Hate is going on everywhere it is time to change. Homosexuals are not going to go away.
- Lastly, does it keep the door open to the future? If we amend anything federal or state we are closing the door. Hagel may very well keep the door open at the federal level, but he is allowing the door to be closed at the state level. Nebraska has shut the door on homosexuals and their rights.

I challenge all of us to get involved. We have a story to tell and we need to tell our story to people so they understand. We need to share our love with the politicians to let them know we are people that deserve equality. For anyone who claims that marriage is a sacred honored institution between a man and a woman really does not know their theology, they are merely reading the issue for face value, they are not theologians or historians, but people who have trouble thinking beyond an instruction booklet.





If He was MY Father.....

WASHINGTON, DC - A new Web site today thrust US Vice President Dick Cheney's openly lesbian daughter Mary to the center of the nationwide debate over gay marriage. Dear-Mary.com is soliciting public letters to Mary Cheney that will be published on the Web site and in nationwide newspaper and magazine ads paid for by money raised via the site.

"DearMary.com brings the battle home for Dick Cheney, literally," said John Aravosis, creator of the Web site and national co-chair of DontAmend.com, a national civil rights organization opposing any effort to add anti-gay amendments to the US Constitution (DearMary.com is a project of DontAmend.com.)

"If the Vice President thinks gay relationships are such a threat to society that we need to amend the US Constitution, then he needs to explain why a lesbian in a same-sex relationship is running his re- election campaign," Aravosis added. "Are we a threat or aren't we?"

Mary Cheney, 34, has been openly lesbian for years, and worked as a "professional homosexual" advocating for the gay community while working as the paid gay liaison at Coors, and while serving on the board of the national Republican gay rights group, the Republican Unity Coalition (RUC). Mary Cheney has since quit the RUC and now runs her father's re-election campaign where she is reportedly earning \$100,000 a year (source: Washington Post).

"Mary Cheney is a lesbian in a committed relationship," said Robin Tyler, national cochair of DontAmend.com. "Even though she cannot take responsibility for her father's actions, she can and should take responsibility for her own. Just because her father is the vice president is beside the point. Is it moral for Vice President Cheney to put his boss before the welfare of his family? It is time for the child to have the courage to publicly stand up to the father and say, 'don't do this, it is just plain wrong.' Other children in far less privileged positions have done it. So, where is Mary Cheney?"

During the 2000 election, then vice presidential candidate Cheney said during a debate that he believed the gay marriage issue should be left to the states. Just a few weeks ago in an interview with the Colorado press, VP Cheney flip-flopped, saying he'd now support a federal constitutional amendment to ban gay marriage.

"Vice President Cheney attacks our families, yet seems to think his family is irrelevant to the debate," said Aravosis. "The vice president is a hypocrite. He is selling his daughter to the highest bidder in the name of 'family values.' The American people have a right to know that this man is no role model for our families or our nation."

DearMary.com is a project of DontAmend.com and the Equality Campaign, Inc. We are a national grassroots campaign devoted to stopping any amendment to the US Constitution that would be marriage equality for the LGBT community. DontAmend.com was founded by veteran civil rights advocates Robin Tyler and John Aravosis, who also where cofounders of the successful StopDrLaura.com campaign targeting anti-gay radio host Dr. Laura Schlessinger.

Editors Personal Note:

I find it extremely troubling that the Vice President of the United States will not fully support his own lesbian daughter. And she seems to have accepted that. Politics does indeed create strange bed fellows but when it comes to blood relations..... well I just feel sad for both of them. Vice President Cheney has his priorities in the wrong place. His FIRST responsibility is to his family, then to his President and country.

If I were in her shoes and in this situation, I would not be so understanding and forgiving of him. And I would make it well known to all GLBT people in this country.

Two Couples Apply for Marriage Licenses on Freedom to Marry Day

Rev. Barbara Sagat and Rev. Sharon Stover were joined by Carla Petersen and Sharon Van Butsel in Omaha's Freedom to Marry Action on Thursday, February 12. The two couples arrived at the Douglas County Courthouse just after 8am, walking past a group of protestors standing in the frigid air. The couples proceeded to the Marriage License Bureau without incident and completed the necessary applications while Channels 7 and 42 filmed their actions. Each couple then stepped to the window and presented their applications along with their identification. Each couple in turn was advised that because both partners were female, the license could not be issued. After advising the staff that they would be back next year and every year until licenses could be issued, the couples stepped into the hall for brief interviews with the TV stations.

As the interviews were ending, the protestors arrived inside, escorted by a sheriff's deputy. The protestors demanded the opportunity to state their views but were initially reluctant to give their names to the media. The two couples left quietly while the protestors were speaking to the media, pausing outside long enough to look at the signs that had been stacked outside.

It was a quiet, low-key event but one that clearly supported the Freedom to Marry Day. Next year the Freedom to Marry Day Action will be held on Monday, February 14 (Valentine's Day). Consider marking your calendar now so that 2005 will see a dozen couples stepping up to ask for equal rights.





Nebraskans Split Over Same-Sex Ruling

LINCOLN, Neb. - Same-sex marriage opponents in Nebraska are calling a Massachusetts court ruling legalizing such unions judicial activism.

Nebraska is considered to have one of the nation's strongest

laws banning same-sex marriages.

Massachusetts' Supreme Judicial Court ruled Wednesday that only full, equal marriage rights for gay couples are constitutional. That clears the way for the nation's first same-sex marriages in the state as early as May.

Nebraska Family Council executive director Al Riskowski said the Massachusetts ruling is a troubling example of courts dictating to legislatures, rather than the other way round. He said the court is tinkering with a social institution of marriage between a man and a woman.

David Bydalek of Family First says the ruling underscored the need for a federal marriage amendment to keep activist judges

from redefining marriage.

The executive director of Nebraska American Civil Liberties Union said the court did the right thing in leveling the marriage playing field for same-sex couples. Tim Butz said cultural and anti-gay bias and religious beliefs have clouded what should be a simple issue.

"This is not a tough issue when you just look at treating two


people equal (to others)." Butz said.

Butz said the decision doesn't mean Nebraska would have to recognize same-sex marriages performed in Massachusetts. That is because Nebraska has a constitutional amendment prohibiting gay unions.

Nebraska's amendment is being challenged in U.S. District Court in Lincoln by a coalition of gay rights and civil rights or-

Plaintiffs in that case are not seeking legal recognition for samesex marriages, but claim the ban prohibits them from lobbying lawmakers for gay rights.




