SAFETY FOR THE GLBT COMMUNITY

Attacks on the Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual and Transgender community are unacceptable and many can be prevented.

This information helps you be part of the solution. There's no need to give up activities, but there are ways to make life safer. You can avoid attack, or reduce injury by using positive and effective methods to deal with potential attackers. A lot is common sense stuff, but in the moment, when confronted or are witness to attack - you want to react quickly. Read on, talk to a pal, have a safety action plan ready. Refuse to be a target!

STREETWISE

- Try to leave any venue with friends.
- If you leave with someone you've just met - introduce them to someone you know or staff. Make sure the person you're leaving with knows others are aware you are leaving together.

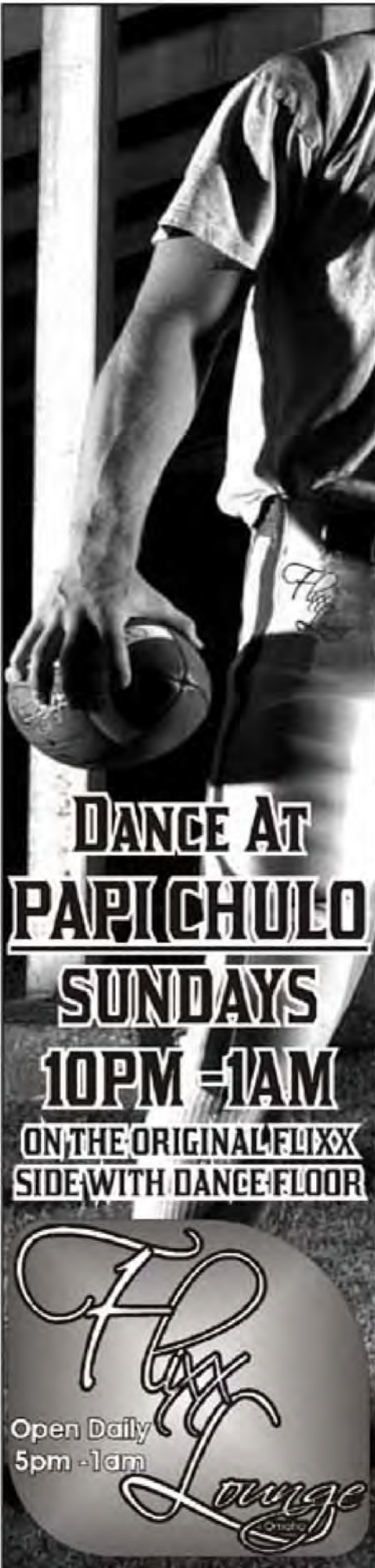

- Trust your instincts. If you think something is wrong, remove yourself from the situation.
- Stay alert - awareness is your best self-defense. Know what and who is around you at all times, especially if walking in unfamiliar streets.
- Project confidence - walk as if you know where you're going. Don't walk alone - especially if you are upset, drunk or high.
- Be aware of potentially dangerous places - badly lit streets, dense bushes, alleyways, hidden doorways etc.

• Attackers expect a passive victim - carry a personal attack alarm. Keep it accessible and use it if you encounter trouble. Try to attract attention.

TROUBLE

What would you do if trouble occurred? Preparing for all possibilities could provide a split second advantage.

- If you feel threatened or unsafe, trust your instincts and leave.
- If you see someone being har-

assed or hear a personal attack alarm, respond - help them or call for help.

- Be bold - don't hesitate to shout. Attract attention.
 - Harassment is often a prelude to assault. If you decide to answer back, be prepared for any consequences that may happen.
 - Stay calm and try to de-escalate the situation.
 - If all attempts to de-escalate or escape fail - remember you are your most important person. Only you can decide whether to fight back. A person who is being attacked has every right to defend him/herself using reasonable force. An umbrella, car keys, a comb are examples of items carried which could be used against an attacker. The law doesn't, however, allow items to be carried especially for self-defense, such as knives, clubs or customized objects. Consult your local police station for more details about the law in your area.
 - If you're harassed in any way - verbal insults, vandalism, physical assault, etc., record the details of the incident and report it to any police station.
 - If you receive abusive or obscene telephone calls - hang up immediately.
- Don't say anything; an emotional reaction is what the caller wants. Consider reporting the matter to the police or seek advice from the phone company advice line.

WITNESS

- If you hear a personal attack alarm or calls for help, determine where the sound is coming from. Dial the emergency number in your area and, if you're in sight of the attack, use your own personal attack alarm and yell.
- The purpose is not to physically intervene but to scare off attackers.
- Think about everything you are witnessing for the police report. Make notes if you can.

VICTIM

- If you're the victim of an incident, call the police - dial the emergency number in your area and report the incident. It's vital to report quickly what has happened and you can do this in complete confidence. Don't be afraid to contact the police. They need your help to track down the perpetrator as soon as possible and stop them claiming more victims.

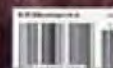

- If you want to pass on info, but don't want police contact, a remote reporting unit can be a confidential go-between. If you've been assaulted - don't shower, wash or change your clothes. If you do you may be destroying vital evidence.
- Don't drink alcohol or take other drugs. You'll need to give a clear account.
- Try to put down on paper a description of the attacker(s) and the incident. If your keys are stolen, with I.D. of where you live - don't return home alone.
- If you share your house, call home and let them know. Replace your front door locks.
- Consider asking a friend to be with you.
- Call Victim Support in your area - they can help with referral to counseling, confidential documenting of the assault, legal advice and the police.
- Both Nebraska and Iowa have hate crime laws that include sexual orientation.

STUDENT SAFETY

- Be alert; walk with purpose and confidence.
- Travel with your friends to and from school.
- Look out for friends, don't get separated.
- Carry your bag close to you with the clasp facing inwards. Carry your house keys in your pocket. If someone grabs your bag, let it go. If you hang on, you could get hurt. Remember your safety is more important than your property.
- If you think someone is following you, and you have checked by crossing the street - more than once if necessary - then go to the nearest place where there are other people - a mall or anywhere with a lot of lights on - and call the police. Avoid using an enclosed phone booth in the street, as the attacker could trap you inside.
- If you go jogging or cycling, try to vary your route and time. Stick to well-lit roads with pavements. On commons and parklands, keep to main paths and open spaces where you can see and be seen by other people - avoid wooded areas. If you wear a personal stereo, remember you can't hear traffic, or somebody approaching behind you.
- Don't take short-cuts through dark alleys, parks or across waste ground. Walk facing the traffic so a car cannot pull up behind you unnoticed.
- If you use a wheelchair, keep your valuables beside you, rather than at the back of the chair.
- If a car stops and you are threatened, scream and shout, and set off your personal attack alarm if you have one. Get away as quickly as you can. This will gain you vital seconds and make it more difficult for the car driver to follow. If you can, make a mental note of the number and description of the car. Write down details as soon as possible afterwards.
- Don't hitch-hike or take lifts from strangers.
- Cover up expensive looking jewelry, cell phones, laptops, iPods, etc.
- Report all bullying or harassment incidents to your teachers or administrators. Then, it is very important to also tell your parent so they know about each incident at school, or going to or from school.

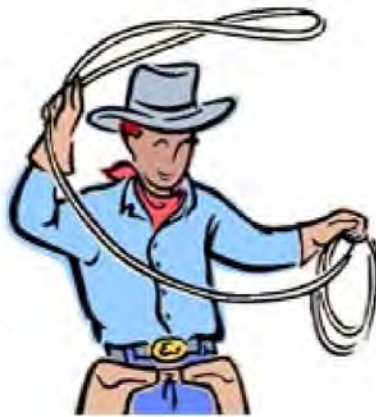

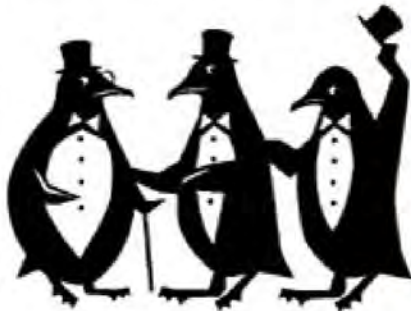

Four Snaps in a Z Formation

Gay Penguin Story Tops Book Complaint List

Not all penguin stories are equal in the public's mind. "And Tango Makes Three," an award-winning children's book based on a true story about two male penguins who raised a baby penguin, topped the American Library Association's annual list of works attracting the most complaints from parents, library patrons and others.

Overall, the number of "challenged" books in 2006 jumped to 546, more than 30 percent higher than the previous year's total, 405, although still low compared to the mid-1990s, when challenges topped 750.



"We're still in . . . the mid-range in terms of how many challenges we get," Judith Krug, director of the ALA's Office for Intellectual Freedom, told The Associated Press during a recent interview.

"And Tango Makes Three," by Justin Richardson and Peter Parnell, was published in 2005 and named by the ALA as one of the year's best children's books. But parents and educators have complained that "Tango Makes Three" advocates homosexuality, with challenges reported in Southwick, Mass., Shiloh, Ill., and elsewhere.

The ALA defines a "challenge" as a "formal, written complaint filed with a library or school requesting that materials be removed because of content or appropriateness." For every challenge listed, about four to five go unreported, according to the library association. Krug said 30 books were actually banned last year.

"Books aren't banned nearly as much now as they used to be, because communities are much more active in fighting that," Krug said about the bans, which can lead to books being removed from both school and public libraries.

Other books on the 2006 list include two by Nobel laureate Toni Morrison, "The Bluest Eye" and the Pulitzer Prize-winning "Beloved," both cited for language and sexual content; Cecily von Ziegesar's popular "Gossip Girls" series, criticized for sexual content and language; and Robert Cormier's "The Chocolate War," for language, violence and sexual content.

Krug said she has statistics for challenged books through the first few months of 2007, when there were widespread reports that librarians were banning Susan Patron's "The Higher Power of Lucky," the story of a 10-year-old's physical and spiritual journey and winner of the prestigious Newbery prize for the best children's book.

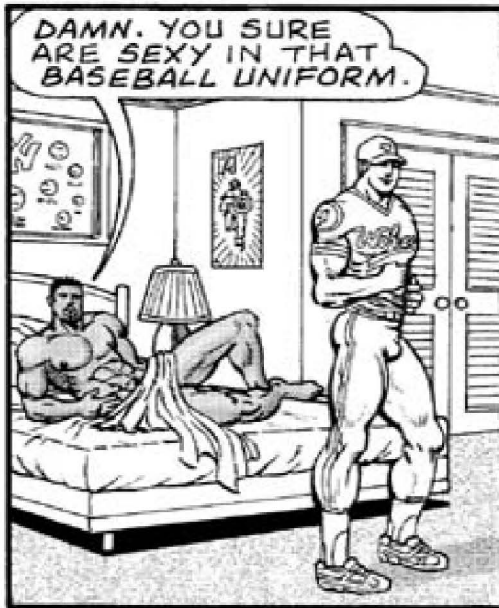

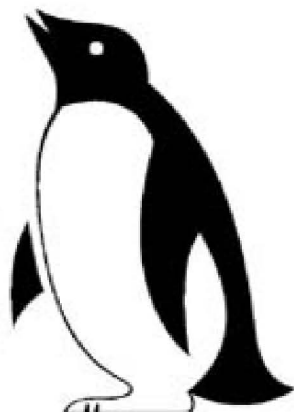
Librarians had complained on an Internet list serve, LM_Net, about the book's use of the word "scrotum," the sac holding a man's testicles. But when The Associated Press last February contacted several librarians who had posted critical comments, all said they were either carrying "Higher Power" or hadn't decided.

Krug confirmed that the ALA had received no reports of "Higher Power" being banned or even challenged. The publisher, Simon & Schuster, agreed, saying Tuesday that it had not heard of any problems at libraries.

"When a book gets in trouble, we usually learn about it pretty quickly, like with 'Tango Makes Three.' We knew about that right away," said publicist Paul Crichton of Simon & Schuster, which also released the penguin book.

"But to my knowledge, that hasn't happened with 'Higher Power of Lucky.' That was a case of much ado about nothing."

The ALA, the American Booksellers Association and others in the publishing community will hold their 26th annual Banned Books Week from Sept. 29 to Oct. 6, highlighting works that have been banned or were threatened with removal. (Hillel Italie, AP)



Gay History on View at the Smithsonian

A collection of artifacts from renowned gay activist Frank Kameny is now on display in the Smithsonian National Museum of American History in Washington, D.C.

The Frank Kameny Collection includes such objects as the protest signs from the 1960s demonstrations in Washington and Philadelphia, gay rights buttons with Kameny's famous phrase "Gay Is Good" and a photograph of protesters picketing in front of the White House on Oct. 23, 1965, which Kameny helped organize.

"This is the first time the Smithsonian has ever included displays of gay civil rights artifacts," said Bob Witeck, CEO of Witeck-Combs Communications, Inc. "This exhibit gives (the gay rights) story equal treatment alongside other movements."

Kameny's artifacts will rest in the "Treasures of American History" exhibit alongside such historic American objects as the Greensboro, N.C., lunch counter from the 1960 desegregation protest, the ruby slippers worn by Judy Garland in "The Wizard of Oz," Abraham Lincoln's top hat and Thomas Edison's light bulb.

The Smithsonian describes "Treasures of American History" as representing "the breadth of American history . . . conveying the significance of each object as a treasure of American history."

Other objects in this case, titled the New Acquisitions of the National Museum of American History, include a pair of boxing gloves worn and signed by Joe Louis from his fight against Max Schmeling, a teapot reading "No Stamp Act" and a rare photograph of a freed slave wearing an American flag.

The exhibit closes Oct. 29. (The Advocate)
