Presented at the NCSML Annual Meeting, January 21, 2008

Hello again, I am happy to be in the position to report another active, productive, successful year for the NCSML Guild of 100 plus members.

During our annual December Cookie Walk and also the Taste of Czech during Houby Days in May, we cleared over a thousand dollars at each event. Our members participated in the community "Join Hands Day", May 5th. At that time a great deal of work was done on our current landscaping here and plans were made for the Green Space in the lot across the street.

On October 22 the NCSML Guild received a "Governor's Volunteer Award" from our state's first lady, Mari Culver, at Linn Mar H.S. Proudly, this award is now included in our Historian's book.

After three years of intensive work, by far our biggest accomplishment this past year has been beginning the marketing of our "CZECH and SLOVAK HERITAGE family stories, traditions and recipes" book. On February first you may have heard bells ringing and sirens going off as we placed several of the 1000 copies in the museum store and the contributors all over the county who had mailed us their histories, stories and recipes, started sending in their orders for books. We thank the Czech Heritage Foundation group for their initial monetary assistance.

As of this January 1, we have some of our second printing of 1000 Books on the shelf in the store and the Guild Committee is seeking other venues for marketing within the community and Midwest. This past year the store had cookbook sales of \$6,416.26 and the Guild showed a profit of \$4,989.21. Because of our monies the Guild was able to buy a new fax machine and a digital camera for the main office. A second thought was to have our book copyrighted and this process has been completed.

You can see why I asked to be able to give you our report this evening and it is with feelings of accomplishment, I vacate my two year position as president of the NCSML Guild and turn the gavel and position over to Marilyn Tucker.

"Guild Trip to Springfield Illinois"

"It was well worth a two day trip" was the comment Marj and Gary made regarding the Guild outing in October to see the new Lincoln museum. They reported on the tour which also included visits to the Lincoln Memorial, the Lincoln home, the Capitol Building and Lincoln's Memorial Park.

The new Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum demonstrates impressive technology with life-like statues and living action holographic images. The 145 million dollar building is twice the size of any other presidential library and houses the largest collection of Lincoln artifacts and documents.

Bob Stone was impressed with the comprehensiveness of the museum exhibits and the extensive displays related to all aspects of Lincoln's life.

Members also enjoyed a trip to the limestone state capitol building that was built in 1868 in the form of a Greek cross. Short visits were made to the Lincoln tomb in Oakridge Cemetery and the Lincoln Memorial on Lake Springfield.

The Lincoln Memorial Park includes gardens with plants from the states where the President lived-Indiana, Kentucky and Illinois. The grounds have five miles of trails where benches inscribed with Lincoln quotes offer resting places.

Museum Guild Program February 2, 2008 "1968" Presented by Jan Stoffer

An original exhibition by the National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library was launched Saturday, February 2 at the monthly Guild meeting. Jan Stoffer made a fabulous presentation to the Guild members and volunteers who will be accompanying and informing visitors who come to view and learn from the exhibit which will be open March 6, 2008, to January 25, 2009.

It was introduced as a multi-generational exhibit that may have different viewers expressing a variety of experiences, memories and reactions. <u>Listen to the visitors</u> is a key to identifying the generational influence that may prompt differing reactions.

Jan's informative training on the background of the exhibit subject matter was preceded by an explanation of generational variations that affect the way visitors may view the dynamic time, world wide, that is depicted in the exhibit, "1968"

Presenting a generation as a 20 - 22 year cohort, four generations were highlighted as

Silent Generation - persons born 1925 to 1942 Boomer Generation - persons born 1943 to 1960 Gen X Generation - persons born 1961 to 1981 Millennial Generation - persons born 1981 to 2001.

The numbers of persons, their heroes, family life, work, school life and significant life events were the focus of the insights to be considered as Museum docents and volunteers interact with visitors to what they see and learn from the exhibit.

The exhibit is intended for an audience of Junior High, High School and adult viewers. A masterful compilation of material was presented to those attending. It presents historical, economic, political and social high points that transformed the world.

Special timeline events from January 1968 through April 1969 aims to focus attention on happenings in Czechoslovakia and the United States but other world events are cited as they pertain to specific directions in the world scene.

A glossary of documents, terms and people pertinent to events in the time line are presented in a clear, readable fashion. This information will be a reminder or new learning for the persons who accompany museum visitors to the exhibit.

In a brief walk through the exhibit area, the work in progress was explained. The multimedia, multi-sensory plans lead to various attempts to provide a setting in keeping with the theme. Sound, color, pictures, banners, movies and simulations are all coordinated to help visitors relive the series of events that characterized the Prague Spring. This was a period of political liberalization in Czechoslovakia starting January 5, 1968, when

Alexander Dubcek came to power and running until August 21 of that year when the Soviet Union and The Warsaw Pact allies (except communist Romania) invaded the country.

Forms of government - Democracy, Communism, Capitalism, Fascism and Socialism are defined in the docent materials and the struggle of the Czech and Slovak people evident in their rejection of unpopular forms of government.

The presentation of this exhibit should be the crowning achievement for the producers and an enriching experience for both volunteers and viewers.
