St. Ludmila Catholic Church Social Hall provided the setting for this successful social event/fundraiser, which featured accordion music by Leonard Reyman and Darlene Suchomel. Greeters included Czech Heritage Royalty: Amanda De Hoedt, Andrea Cada, Joey Mark, Carly Mark, Zoe Wolter, and Abby Frerick. Guild members were festive in their identifying aprons.

This year's fundraiser featured a logo, designed by Marj Nejdl. NCSML provided printing and the services of Leah Wilson, NCSML Director of Marketing and Communications, who doubles as chair of Guild public relations. Leah used our logo to design flyers and organized and expedited all promotion, with the assistance from Guild members.

Because NCSML Guild had to secure all new property lost in the flood, we established a Donor/Sponsor program this year, netting \$1450 from generous individuals and groups whose names were featured on a program with the tasting event menu.

Strong Partnerships Boost NCSML Mission in Post-Flood 2009

Our Guild Mission Statement is supported not only by Guild members, but by friends, neighbors, and civic and government leaders, and those who believe in the value of art, history, cultural diversity, and preservation of the past.

NCSML GUILD MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of the Museum Guild of the National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library is to support the activities, program and facilities of the National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library by providing unpaid volunteers, and other financial and charitable support, and to serve as an educational, service and social organization for persons interested in the National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library.

We held our 9th Annual Taste of Czech & Slovak May 15, and St. Ludmila Church Hall provided the setting. St. Ludmila Altar & Rosary Society was one of our sponsors, providing kolaches for this fundraiser. Monetary gifts from Donors and Sponsors helped Guild purchase property lost in the flood. Those funds replenished property necessary for staging that fundraiser. Guild's "Taste" kicked off Houby Days and provides another way for us to support Czech Village, as well as NCSML. Czech Heritage Foundation is a Houby Days booster also, and NCSML and Czech Heritage joined hands to reinvigorate our cultural history during this festival.

Czech Village-New Bohemia districts are both NCSML neighbors. A "mini-festival" commemorating the Flood of 2008 crest and area recovery was held Saturday, June 13, on both sides of the river. Guild members were a presence there.

Beginning June 20, Cedar Rapids Museum of Art began exhibiting art from NCSML national collection in a pass-through gallery. Some of our most beautiful pieces are on display in "Treasures from the National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library." This is an opportunity for another evolving partnership with new audiences as we recover from the flood. NCSML gallery attendants have been trained to work in the Museum of Art venue. CRMA docents are becoming more knowledgeable about our work as we are about theirs.

In a series of three community in-put meetings, held at the African American Museum, partners eager to support the future for NCSML met to discuss and suggest. NCSML Board will decide future status on July 28 and Gail Naughton, President/CEO, will give Guild members information regarding that decision at our August 1 meeting.

Our Mission needs the strong partnerships that are formed. The past and its preservation say, "This is our basis, our beginning." NCSML is dedicated to continuing and revitalizing the celebration of our past because of our need to learn from it, to remember our ancestors, and be proud of our heritage.

Grocery Stores of Yesteryear

Mark used many slides to show us the History of "mom-and-pop" grocery stores in Cedar Rapids. The stores started before the Civil War as general stores, providing provisions. As the population increased, the stores began to diversify. They were located in residential areas across the four quadrants of the city.

In the 1950's, the grocery stores faced the river. Very often, immigrants to the United States owned corner stores. The stores were about as big as a house lot. The store fronts were made of wood. The corner lots were sometimes left vacant for the stores.

There were 200 stores originally, many times two or three to a city block. The owners usually lived on the second floor. Family names could be seen on the top of the building.

With the advent of the automobile, the stores stopped near the Brucemore area, where people could afford to travel to do their shopping. The trolley system was well developed.

At this time, supermarkets sprang up. Some of these were Piggly Wiggly, Sun Mart, A and P, Eagle and Me Too. People would still shop at small stores to keep a "tab" and charge groceries. Store owners knew each other and helped each other out.


Irma was preceded in death by her husband Edward on March 21, 1987, and a brother Milton Mouchka.
