



Daniela Sipkova-Mahoney

The cover of this issue features a remarkable and accomplished folk artist. Daniela Sipkova-Mahoney was born in Prague, where she studied international business and foreign languages. Later she worked as a receptionist and secretary for a hotel in Prague.

While working for an automobile trade show in Frankfurt in 1982, she met Patrick Mahoney, a businessman from Portland, Oregon. In the fall of 1982, she came to visit him in the United States and in the spring of 1983, they married. In February 1983, six months after her arrival to the United States, she started egg decorating as a hobby.

Gradually she developed the egg decorating into a business, participating in major art and craft shows nationwide. Every year Daniela added something new, postcards, informational booklets, posters, and innovative egg designs. She captured the attention of local galleries and gift stores. Before long, convention planners, schools and churches, and other groups were hiring her as a guest speaker.



By 1987, her business was well established. She even began workshops in people's private homes to accommodate their busy schedules. In 1988 she was accepted into The Artists in Education Program with Portland Public Schools, offering a multi-cultural program. The

objective was to increase students interest in geography, foreign languages and international studies through the art of attractive egg decorating and other folk art forms.

The highlight of her artistic career was an assignment with Epcot Center in Walt Disney World in Florida. In April, 1989, at the occasion of the grand opening of MGM Studios, Daniela was invited to demonstrate the art of egg decorating in one of their gift stores.



Mahoney also submitted her work to the White House under the Bush, as well as Clinton administrations.

In August, 1992, Daniela staged a large exhibit of Czech and Slovak folk arts and ethnic clothing in the Central Library of Portland. In conjunction with the exhibit, two lectures were presented, being sponsored by the Oregon Council for the Humanities.

Also in Portland, Daniela organized a large Czech and Slovak Mayfest Celebration dinner dance in Masonic Temple in 1992 and in Paesano Club in 1993. These events were joint fund raising efforts of Autistic Children's Activity Program and Ivy Bear Czech Restaurant. Part of the proceeds benefited the Autistic Children's Activity Program.

She is very interested in working with the disabled, since she has an autistic son, Patrick. The goal of her work is to educate the public about life in Eastern Europe, yesterday and today. She enjoys sharing her talent with others.

Daniela resides with her husband, Patrick and two children in Portland.



Exciting New Exhibit

The photography of three great artists, loaned to us from the Slovak National Museum in Bratislava, is making a big noise in Cedar Rapids. Slovakia In Pictures is ninety-five combined works of Pavol Sochan, Karol Plicka and Martin Martincek, three photographers of merit who have captured the folklife and beautiful rural landscape of Slovakia.

The exhibit, researched and compiled by Dr. Jan Botik, a research fellow in ethnic studies at the Slovak National Museum, opened on March 9, and will be shown through the month of April.

Dr. Botik personally installed the fascinating exhibit with assistance from Museum & Library volunteer, Stan Kosek.

Slovakia In Pictures explores the history and ethnic life of the Slovak people from approximately 1890 to 1960. Dr. Botik has delivered to Cedar Rapids a collection of never before assembled works, representing folk life in "the old country." In the Dr.'s words, "They show the landscape and its people, and how connected they've been to their professions, customs and rituals."
