


A THANK YOU

ATTENTION ... RECIPES NEEDED!!

Cookbooks (1) Mushrooms (2) Dumplings



A meeting with Penfield Press was held November 20th. The enclosed page 1 contains instructions, and page 2 is a form to be used in submitting your recipes. Please send them immediately to the address shown on page 2 (Penfield Press).

Penfield needs 100-115 recipes using mushrooms, and another 100-115 recipes for dumplings, as these are two separate books.

Recipes are needed from contributors by January 25, 1998. (It would be a good idea to do this now before we get busy with the holidays). Credit and a complimentary cookbook will be given to each contributor and to the Guild. The Guild will receive \$300 for our efforts from Penfield Press for making these books possible. (\$300 for mushroom recipes and \$300 for dumpling recipes for a total of \$600).

It is possible to use recipes you find in publications that you have modified or adapted. To use an existing recipe which is in a copyrighted publication, three things need to be changed. The changes can be ingredients, methods, and name in any combination—as long as a total of three things are changed. DO NOT COPY RECIPES FROM EXISTING BOOKS JUST AS THEY ARE PRINTED WITH ONLY A CHANGE OF NAME.

The publisher will return typeset pages of recipes to contributors so they can check that all is correct.

The publisher reserves the right to edit as necessary, with approval, and to delete contributions.



FLAKY NUT CRESCENT ROLLS

(Makes two rolls)

1 Pkg. active dry yeast 1/4 c. warm water 2 c. sifted flour 1 tbsp. sugar 1/2 tsp. salt 1/2 c. chopped almonds or pecans 1/2 c. chilled butter
1/4 c. scalded milk
1 slightly beaten egg yolk
Meringue Filling
or Nut Filling
*** I use the nut filling



Soften yeast in water. Sift together dry ingredients. Cut in butter until mixture is like cornmeal or peas. Mix cooled milk and egg yolk. Add with yeast to flour: Stir to make soft dough. Cover, chill for a few hours or overnight. Halve dough. (keep half chilled) On floured surface roll one piece in 12" x 9" rectangle about 1/8" thick. Reserve 2 tbsp. meringue filling for glaze. Spread dough with half of remainder. Sprinkle with half the nuts. Roll as for jelly roll, seal edges and ends. Place roll, seam down on jelly roll pan. Shape into crescent, flatten slightly. Repeat with remaining dough. Cover, let rise in warm place until almost double. (about 1 hour) Brush with reserved meringue. Garnish with sliced almonds. Bake in moderate oven at 375 degrees F. about 20 minutes or until done.

Meringue Filling:

Fold 1/2 c. sugar into 1 stiff beaten egg white.

Nut Filling:

1 lb. ground nuts

1 c. sugar

2 tbsp. melted butter or margarine

1 tsp. vanilla

1 tsp. almond extract




Mix nuts and sugar with a fork. Add melted shortening, vanilla and almond flavoring and mix well.

Any leftover nut filling can be frozen.
