The Guild of the National Czech and Slovak Museum and Library met at NCSML on Saturday, November 2, 2013, at 9 a.m. President Diane Hayes called the meeting to order and Vice President Donna Merkle led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Diane Hayes introduced NCSML Library Director Dave Muhlena who took the members on a trip to the library to view and discuss the new "Tell Your Story" booth.

After everyone was back in the meeting area, Diane introduced the new Volunteer Coordinator, Jerry Campbell. Jerry told the group a little bit about himself and thanked everyone for welcoming him to his new position. Jerry then introduced Sara Jacobmeyer who asked the members for volunteers to work at the Old World Christmas Market.

President's Report: Diane Hayes mentioned Jan Stoffer's upcoming surgery and asked for volunteers to make meals for her husband and children while she is recovering. Diane announced that the 2013 <u>Audit Committee</u> will consist of Alicia Jackson, Leni Stastny and Linda Koehler. She also announced that member Mary Ann Kucera has been awarded the <u>Distinguished Service Award</u> by Coe College. Finally Diane congratulated everyone for all their volunteer hours this year.

Recording Secretary: Diana Geoffrey asked for any additions or corrections to the October 2013 meeting Minutes. The Minutes were approved as distributed.

Corresponding Secretary: Loreen Svoboda read the list of volunteer hours for the month of September. There were 58 volunteers contributing a total of 934.5 hours in September 2013. Diane Hayes contributed the highest with 60.5 hours. Loreen sent sympathy cards to the Langer and Krall families. She also sent notes to Jean Sweeney, Cynthia Hadish and Celeste Kenney, inviting them to come back to another Guild meeting. Treasurer's Report: Sally Stejskal gave the treasurer's report. The ending balance for October 2013 was \$5,197.

Election of Officers 2014: Committee chair Jeanne Vogt presented the committee's slate of officers for 2014. Pat Martin made a motion to accept the slate as presented. Mary Ann Kucera seconded the motion. Vice President Donna Merkle asked for further discussion. The motion passed with a 100% vote by the membership. Officers for 2014 are: President-Diane Hayes, Vice President-Ed Popelka, Recording Secretary-Diana Geoffrey, Treasurer-Sally Stejskal, Corresponding Secretary-Diane Moore, Historian-Linda Koehler and Guild Representative to the NCSML Board-Carol Wohlleben.

In accordance with the By-laws and Policies and Procedures of this Organization, it is resolved that the reelected or newly- elected President, Vice President and Treasurer are authorized to execute any documents required to give them access to the Guild's bank accounts.

Attendance Lottery: The following people donated prizes to the attendance lottery: Marge Sedlacek, Loreen Svoboda, Linda Koehler, Jeanne Vogt, Marj Nejdl and Betty Sheets. The meeting adjourned at 10:32 am.

February Program includes tips on making Guild news clear, effective

The nature of news and tips to make Guild news more appealing to media and more effective to audience were two topics addressed by Rob Merritt, NCSML Director of Communication, at the Guild's February meeting.

Included in Rob's presentation:

**What media organizations like Gazette and local television look for in news and how to make our news appeal to them as they make choices about what news to cover.

**When to use Facebook and twitter and when, instead, to employ more traditional methods of communicating.

**How NCSML staff can guide Guild with its organizational promotion and publicizing projects Guild does on its own. "Let's help each other out," Rob said.

**Determination of targeting AUDIENCE for each message we send, the importance of TIMING when sending messages, and use of "inverted pyramid" writing, starting with the most important information and ending with the least important.




Czech Cottage's Bob Schaffer presents Guild January program

Through a collection of video vignettes, Bob Schaffer, Czech Cottage, presented a fascinating program on Czech folk art and industry at the Guild's January meeting at NCSML.

One style of egg decorating called batik, using wax mask and various color dyes, the mining and manufacture of garnet jewelry, the engraving of Egermann glass in a small shop, and overlay glass blowing, cutting, and decorating in a large factory were all featured in Bob's program.

The Czech Cottage has been a showcase business in Czech Village since its opening in September, 1975. Nearly every year since the late 70s, Bob, and his mother, Jitka (a native of Czechoslovakia), have journeyed to Czechoslovakia and, after the Velvet Revolution, The Czech Republic.

The Czech Cottage is a long-time and faithful supporter of the Village and NCSML.

Minutes of the January 2014 NCSML Guild Meeting

The Guild of the National Czech and Slovak Museum and Library met at the NCSML on Saturday January 11, 2014, at 9 a.m. President Diane Hayes called the meeting to order and Vice President Ed Popelka led the Pledge of Allegiance. There were 38 members present. Diane Hayes introduced the new board members-Vice President Ed Popelka, Corresponding Secretary Diane Moore and Historian Linda Koehler.

Presidents Report: Diane Hayes reported that Mel Holubar will take Leni Stastny's place on the Audit committee. She asked for volunteers on January 22 to help clean out the Volunteer Lounge. Sylvia and Ed Popelka, Jeanne Vogt, Jan Axtell, and Cindy Monroe will assist with this job. She introduced Margie Sedlacek and Barb Hill as our new Social committee. A vote was taken as to whether to have treats at our monthly membership meetings. The vote was 16 to 9 in favor of Guild volunteers providing treats. A sign-up sheet was set out for the coming year. Diane H. announced that there will be a potluck following the February meeting. She also mentioned that the Guild can no longer set up for events at the Museum. This is a task that the Museum staff must do. Program: Diane Moore introduced the owner of the Czech Cottage, Bob Schaffer.
