

HANDY ANDY ANSWERS

- Q. How can I remedy soup that is too salty?
- A. Add two or three pinches of brown sugar to the soup. This will remove the salty taste, but will not sweeten the soup.
- Q. How can I avoid getting rough hands on washdays?
- A. Add a few drops of vinegar to the rinsing water on washday, and it will help prevent the hands from becoming rough.
- Q. How can I remove water stains from furniture?
