MUSEUM GUILD OF THE NATIONAL CZECH & SLOVAK MUSEUM & LIBRARY

In 1997, its fourth year, the Guild continued to support the Museum as set forth in the mission statement of the Guild: The mission of the Museum Guild of the National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library is to support the activities, programs and facilities of the National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library by providing unpaid volunteers, and other financial and charitable support, and to serve as an educational, service and social organization for persons interested in the National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library.

The value of the Guild to the Museum consists of three main areas:

1) Providing unpaid volunteers

2) Providing charitable support

3) Serving as an educational, service and social organization for persons interested in the National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library

The most noteworthy benefit the Guild provided to the Museum is the thousands of volunteer hours the members donated to the Museum to assist it in fulfilling its purpose. The Guild has 106 members. Seventy-nine (79) volunteered at the Museum, including 22 Guild members who recorded over 100 hours each. The Guild members provided 5,958.25 volunteer hours working in the gift shop, as docents, gallery attendants, as receptionists, demonstrating Czech arts and crafts, setting up for programs, and helping care for the grounds. To arrive at a monetary value of the hours donated, 5,958.25 computed at minimum wage equals \$29,113.09 in donated labor. The Guild also assisted at Houby Days, Czech School, St. Joseph Dance, The Ambassador's Dinner and St. Mikulas Day.

Secondly, the Guild presented the Museum with gifts including a book truck for the library, funding for library files and archival papers, engraved name tags for the Museum staff, as well as providing refreshments for various events. The total of these gifts is \$808.11. Combining the value of donated hours plus donated gifts comes to \$29,921.20. Our fund raiser for the year was selling writing pens and lapel pins promoting the exhibit A Thousand Years of Czech Culture.

Thirdly, participation in the Guild strengthens the interest in and knowledge of the Czech and Slovak heritage for those who are of that descent as well as for our friends in the Guild who are of other ancestry. The monthly meetings of the Guild provide programs that are educational and interesting as well the opportunity for social interaction. Guild members proudly promote the Museum to others.

The members of the Guild are aware that change is inevitable. We also know that the Museum will always be looking at new and better ways of doing things and the Guild wants to be a part of that progress. We are all proud of our connection with the Museum, whether it be because of pride of our heritage, pride in community, or a pride in the history of the Museum and our confidence in its future. It is with great pleasure that the Guild looks forward to serving the Museum in 1998.



PUMPKIN MARBLE CAKE

served at Museum Guild November 1, 1997 meeting


powdered sugar & cinnamon mix



- C. solid pack canned pumpkin 2 t. ground cinnamon 1 yellow cake mix pkg. 4 eggs C.C.C. 3/4 sour cream granulated sugar 1/4 1/2 vegetable oil 1/4 water
- 1. Combine pumpkin & cinnamon in a medium bowl. Combine cake mix, eggs, sour cream, sugar, oil & water in large mixer bowl. Beat on low speed until moistened. Then beat on high speed 2 minutes.
- 2. Stir 2 1/2 C. batter into pumpkin mixture. Spoon plain cake mixture & pumpkin mixture in alternate layers into a greased 10 C. bundt or round tube pan.
- 3. Bake at 375 ... 40 45 minutes until wooden pick inserted into center comes out clean. Remove from pan & cool on wire rack. Sprinkle top of cake with a cinnamon-sugar mixture. Let cake stand overnight for best flavor. Sprinkle with powdered sugar before serving.

Makes approximately 24 servings.

I would like to thank all of the Guild volunteers who made the commitment in 1997 and gave so generously of their time and talents to support the Museum, its programs and special events.




