Dobry Den, Guild Members,

NOW is a wonderful time to say how well our Guild demonstrated this quote preparing for and serving the museum in its Grand Opening. Thank you all so much.! Your dedication and hard work are outstanding. You continue to build a tremendous reputation.

Our traditional pastries are so recognized and enjoyed that several groups have requested kolaches (koláče) and even appetizer plates for their NCSML functions. The first week of September 20 dozen koláče were made and sold. Bonnie Rohlena, Diane Hayes, Cyndi O'Brien contributed with me. At the "Distinctive European Jazz Concert" held in Heritage Hall in August, some 100 guests enjoyed plates of cheeses, fruits, and vegetables. As Guild President, I want to thank my executive officers, Guild members, and NCSML staff for supporting me through my presidency. This has been an incredible and wonderful experience.

Special Choir Sings Selected Anthems, Hymns for Grand Opening

As part of the Grand Opening ceremonies, the National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library wanted to include the singing of the US, Czech and Slovak national anthems during the ribbon cutting ceremony on Saturday, July 14. Staff also wanted to have an ecumenical service and blessing of the building on Sunday, July 15. Guild member Donna Merkle assisted NCSML staff member Leroy Bradway with this project.

Leaders of various churches in the greater Cedar Rapids area with a connection to the local Czech community were invited to participate in the Sunday blessing program. Members of the community were invited to form the choir that would lead the public in singing the anthems for both events, plus religious hymns representative of each country for the blessing of the building.

Donna selected "Andělské přátelství" written in 1653 by Adam Michna z Otradovic to represent the Czechs for the blessing ceremony. To represent the Slovaks, she received assistance from the Slovak Embassy in Washington, D.C. in selecting "Bože, coš ráčil" for the Slovak hymn. For the American hymn, she selected "On Eagle's Wings", not only because it is a popular hymn among many Christian faiths, but also because the eagle is a symbol of America and, with the Raptor Resource Center in Decorah, a unique statesponsored connection to this majestic bird.

Approximately 40 people from the Cedar Rapids - Iowa City Corridor joined the Czech Heritage Singers of Cedar Rapids to form the Grand Opening Choir for the two-day event. They only had three rehearsals before a "dry run" on the Thursday before the big event to learn the basics of Czech and Slovak pronunciations and to master completely new melodies. Donna is extremely proud of everyone who participated, because they did indeed grasp the idiosyncrasies of the Czech and Slovak languages and mastered the melodies in an incredibly short amount of time - and well enough to give a strong and confident presentation to the public for both events.

Minutes of the May 2012 NCSML Guild Meeting

The Guild of the National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library met at St. Wenceslaus Church, on Saturday, May 5, 2012 at 9:00 AM. Carol Wohlleben, President, called the meeting to order at 9:00 AM and led the Pledge of Allegiance. There were 60 members and 1 guest attending. We had 1 new member join.

Program: Shirley Alexander introduced Jan Stoffer, NCSML Director of Education who led a program on Visitors Services and the Sleger Immigrant Home. She gave floor plans of the new Museum spaces and led us on a slide show tour of the facility in the perspective of what visitors will experience. The official new address for the NCSML is 1400 Inspiration Place SW, Cedar Rapids, IA 52404. The tour went from the underground parking garage, to Grand Hall then to the Welcome Desk/Information Station. This is where visitors will buy tickets and get directions through the Museum. We then viewed the Sleger Immigrant Home. It was home to 5 generations of the Sleger family for almost 100 years. The next Guild meeting is 06/02/12 and will be held at the new Museum, main building, 9am. We will learn the new building and meet the staff. There will be lots of training in July so please come to what you can as it will be about the opening in July as well as volunteer training on the facility, exhibits and processes.

Recording Secretary: Suzie Long passed out copies of the April 2012 Guild meeting Minutes before the meeting and asked members to read and make corrections as necessary. Once reviewed by the membership a motion to approve the Minutes was made by Lavanda Woosley and seconded by Jennifer Greve. The Minutes were approved as accurate.

Treasurer Report: Betty Sheets gave the ending balance in the Guild account as \$8817.19. No new bills were presented but she stated the account gained 14 cents in interest.

Museum Representative: President Carol Wohlleben read the report in Mel's absence. He attended the Legacy Society Luncheon on 04/19/12 where deceased Guild member Leo Modracek was honored for his contribution to the Endowment Fund. He attended the April NCSML Board Meeting on 04/24/12 where Gail Naughton reported the NCSML is looking for sponsorships for the Grand Opening and BrewNost. The immigrant house will be done by the end of April and at a cost less than the bid. Durant, the architect design firm for the new Museum has filed for bankruptcy, but it should not have any effect on the completion of the Museum or the opening date. On 04/15/12 the Museum closed on the Joens building. It will need over \$9,000 in repairs to bring it up to code for possible lease in the future. The Board approved \$15,000 for updates to the Hurych building. At this point just cosmetic updates will be made to improve the look of the structure. The Board will write a letter to the City stating it is interested in purchasing 4 vacant properties that are near the Museum should they become available for sale. They could be used later for expansion and parking. The grand opening of the Czech Mitas Tire Company will be 04/26/12 in Charles City and some of the Board and Staff plan to attend. The Guild will participate in the Houby Days parade, 05/19/12 and will need volunteers to carry 2 banners, 3 flags and hand out candy, flyers and beads to the spectators. We will also have the decorated trailer with live music.

Guild Business: Beth DeBoom and Dave Stauffer reviewed the upcoming Taste of Czech and Slovak event that will be held o5/18/12. Attire will be dark pants, red shirt with Guild aprons, head scarves and visors. Bob Stone gave the Czech and Slovak words of the day which reviewed greetings and salutations. Diane Hayes said she will have pans and recipes at the next meeting for bakers for Babi's Bakery for the Opening event. She also reviewed that she has several people baking to send poppy seed cupcakes to the "Leaving Czechoslovakia" event in Chicago. Jan Stoffer had a call for volunteers for school tours and the Grand Opening event. Diana Geoffrey thanked the days Hostesses; Betty Gallagher, Suzie Long and Jennifer Greve and stated she still needs Host/Hostesses for July, August and beyond. Carol Wohlleben reviewed the need for a Kitchen Committee to organize the new kitchen and train volunteers on the use of the equipment. Betty Sheets made a motion for the Guild to put \$1000 of the proceeds from the upcoming Taste of Czech and Slovak event towards the Kitchen Committee. \$250 to the NCSML as needed and the remaining \$750 for the Guild to spend on kitchen supplies as necessary. The motion was seconded by Chris Curfman and it was approved by a 100% yes vote by the membership. Dave Stauffer said the History Committee is still in need of pictures from 2011 and 2012 events. If you have pictures, or will have in the future, please give them to him or Chris Curfman at any Guild meeting. It would be nice to label the picture on the back with the event, date and who is in the picture. They will be used in yearbooks and it will save a lot of time and guessing if they are labeled.

Meeting Attendance Lottery: Hand painted, Czech inspired birdhouse, donated by Marj Nejdl- won by Bob Hejkal. Potted Gerbera Daisies, donated by Suzie Long- won by Laverne Fisher and Marge Pace.

A motion was made by Jeanne Vogt to adjourn, it was seconded by Barb Pulkrab and approved with 100% yes vote.

Minutes of the June 2012 NCSML Guild Meeting

The Guild of the National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library met at the new NCSML, on Saturday, June 2, 2012 at 9:00 AM. Carol Wohlleben, President, called the meeting to order at 9:00 AM. Vice President, Cyndi O'Brien led the Pledge of Allegiance. There were 59 members and 3 guests attending. We had no new members join.

This was a very abridged meeting due to the fact that the program would be an extensive, guided tour of the new Museum. Reports were handed out for the membership to read and make any corrections to rather than be read in order to save time.

President and Vice President Report: No reports were given.

Recording Secretary: Suzie Long passed out copies of the May 2012 Guild meeting Minutes before the meeting and asked members to read and make corrections as necessary. No corrections were noted.

Corresponding secretary: Carolyn Holubar thanked the Guild membership for all of the thoughts, prayers and cards extended to her during her surgery and recovery periods. She read a letter from Gail Naughton giving Thanks to the Guild membership for all we do in support of getting the new Museum opened. Also for all the hard work related to the Grand Opening events that will be held July 14th and 15th 2012. Doug Wenzel talked about development as well as what is expected of Board members for the future. Leah Wilson gave a power point presentation: "What Moves You?" It would be impressive to have well known National Board Members. Gary Rozek reported on new Museum progress. Minor items come up that could delay occupancy, but won't impact the Museum Grand Opening. Gail Naughton and other dignitaries were invited to Czech and Slovak dinners, in Chicago, May 20th and 21st. Both organizations will send Ambassadors, Honorary Counselors and Dignitaries to the NCSML Grand Opening event. The NCSML is sponsoring an Oral History exhibit in Oak Park, IL, opening May 11, 2012. Mel gave thanks to all who participated in the Houby Days Parade. He reminded us of RAGBRAI coming July 26th and 27th.

Guild Business: Diane Hayes and Suzanne Charipar talked about the upcoming Babi's Bakery that will take place for the NCSML Grand Opening event July 14th and 15th. The Guild will supply baked goods as well as volunteers to work the Babi's Bakery table both days. There will be 2 shifts each day. Baked good will be delivered Saturday to the North dock area, the Riverside Park entrance between 8-9am. They had sign up sheets for workers and bakers, as well as pans and recipes for the bakers to use. Diana Geoffrey stated Hosts/Hostesses were still needed for July, August and September. The membership filled the requests before the meeting ended! She also gave thanks to the day's Hostesses: Marie Webster, Linda Koehler and Fern Fackler. Carol Wohlleben stated there will be a need for a Kitchen Committee meeting, but it won't happen until all of the equipment comes.



Minutes of the August 2012 NCSML Guild Meeting

The Guild of the National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library met at the NCSML, on Saturday, August 4, 2012 at 9:00 AM. Carol Wohlleben, President, called the meeting to order at 9:00 AM and led the Pledge of Allegiance. There were 50 members and no guests attending. We had no new members join.

Program: The Organization, Kidizens, a youth group from Wilson Middle and Jefferson High Schools gave a slide show program on what their Organization does and how they made an impact in Czech Village in 2012. A motion was made by Diana Geoffrey to close the meeting, seconded by Bob Hejkal and approved by the membership.


