Romani Art Exhibit Arrives in October

For centuries Romanies (gypsies) have lived on the margins of society, traveling from place to place, often being chased, persecuted and repressed. Yet art and romantic literature can depict this nomadic life as idyllic—a chosen lifestyle filled with untamed happiness and unquenchable passion.

"The World Through Romani Eyes," an exhibit of amateur Romani art that comes to the National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library in October, takes a more sincere look at this way of life, through the eyes of those who know it best.

The World Through Romani Eyes is a collection of paintings and sculptures created by non professional Romani artists from the Czech Republic and Slovakia. It conveys the Romani lifestyle with the honesty of

folk art, often in vibrant hues and through simple snapshots of life. You'll see dark-skinned Romani faces, Romani camps, the placid countrysides they called home and the traditions that unite them.

This exhibition originates from the Museum of Romani Culture in Brno, Czech Republic. It was exhibited at the Czech Embassy in Washington, D.C., earlier this year and will be shown at the National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library through Jan. 2, 2000.

This Madonna with Christ child, carved in wood, is part of the Romani art exhibit that opens at the NCSML on Oct. 15. The opening reception for museum members is Tues. Oct. 19, from 5:30 – 7:30 p.m.



P. Buckley Moss Paints the Museum

P. Buckley Moss, the artist known for her watercolors, etchings, silkscreens and lithographs of pastoral Iowa scenes, geese and Amish children, has created a watercolor of the exterior of the National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library. The watercolor will be unveiled Sunday, Sept. 26 at 4 p.m. during a 3-5:30 p.m. museum fundraiser at Lakeside, home of Tom and Nan Riley, Limited-edition prints will go on sale that day and will be available afterward for \$95. The project is spearheaded by Peppertree Studios, who has generously agreed to make the NCSML a benificiary of the sale of the prints. The late afternoon fundraiser will include ethnic appetizers

and beverages, live music, trolley rides, and a chance to stroll around the picturesque grounds of one of the area's most magnificent and historic estates. Tickets are \$30. Reservations are required.

If you're a Moss fan or hoping to learn more about her art, head to the NCSML the morning before the Sunday benefit. From 8:30 until 11:30 a.m. Moss Museum Executive Director Peter Rippe will explain symbolism in Moss art. The museum Guild is providing kolaches and coffee. Peppertree Studios is sponsoring the event. Tickets are \$15. Proceeds benefit the NCSML. Seating is limited to 150 people, so reserve early.

Museum Launches Magazine

The NCSML is creating a history journal this fall. The twice-yearly history journal is called *Slovo*. Content will include essays, photo essays, research articles, and book and film reviews. *Slovo* will cover a wide spectrum of Czech and Slovak topics on a national and international level—art, folk art, sports, history, politics, travel, etc. The journal will be available free to museum members.



Free Janacek Concert for Museum Members

NCSML members will be admitted free to a concert by the Janacek Chamber Orchestra in King Chapel on the Cornell College campus in Mount Vernon, Iowa, on Monday, Sept. 18. The concert, part of the college's "Music Mondays" series, begins at 8 p.m. Cornell has generously offered to waive the \$8 ticket price to encourage museum members to attend the concert by one of the leading ensembles of its type in the Czech Republic. Founded in 1964, the orchestra comprises 12 leading string musicians from the Janacek Philharmonic Orchestra, led by violinist Zdenek Dejmek. The program for the evening will be Sinfonia in A Major by Myslivecek, La Follia by Corelli, J.S. Back's Concerto for Violin and Strings in a minor, BWV 1041, St. Paul Suite by Holst, and Janacek's Suite for Strings.

COLLECTIONS UPDATE

Trip Acquisitions

As most of you are aware, this summer Dan Baldwin and I accompanied Heritage Tours on a two and a half week tour of the Czech Republic and Slovakia. I can finally formulate a mental image of the extraordinary cities, land, and people we represent at the National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library. While soaking in the culture, we obtained several new acquisitions for the collections.

In the Czech Republic we found a WWI document with accompanying photograph. Encased in an intricately carved wood frame, they were originally presented to a soldier who served in the Czechoslovak Legions. Visitors can already see this artifact in the Three Struggles section of the *Homelands* exhibition, in conjunction with the recently added Library of

Congress loans of the Czechoslovak Declaration of Independence and original letters from Masaryk to Wilson.

Other trip acquisitions include a sheepskin coat from a family in Východná, Slovakia, and a best man's hat and a woman's vest from Ždiar,

Slovakia. While in Bohemia we purchased three early 20th century puppets. In Moravia we acquired a traveler's cane. We also met a well-respected Moravian woodcarver from whom we still hope to acquire a carving.

On a personal note, the trip was a wonderful and fulfilling experience. Some of my expectations came true – such as the beautiful architecture of Prague and the quaint settings of some of the small towns. However, I was not prepared for the incredible natural scenery, the juxtaposition of modern and old lifestyles (especially in the Slovak countryside), the glaring remnants of communism (such as the monolithic apartment buildings), or how familiar the people would seem. I hope to enjoy many future trips to these two countries.

NCSML Web Site Has Been a Smashing Success

Visitors discover our museum through a number of different ways, including word of mouth, the media and the prominent traffic signs along Interstate 380. Additionally, the museum has had a web site for the past two years. This relatively new form of communication allows the museum to present information about the museum's attraction and activities to a whole new group of people in a way that's appealing and up-to-date. We consider our experience with the internet to be a complete success. Here's why.

When someone connects to the museum's web site at www.ncsml.org, they find the museum's "home page." This page is the entryway or index to other pages within the web site. The web site currently has 10 pages devoted to various topics such as exhibits, museum news and information, library, calendar of events, how to donate artifacts and



books, visitor information, membership, Heritage Hall rental, museum gift store, national news and events, Czech points of interest in Cedar Rapids, other web sites and Czech & Slovak organizations in the US.

As a clearinghouse of information, the museum also has a very extensive set of links to other web sites devoted to matters Czech or Slovak. Located at www.ncsml.org/ links.htm, these other web sites are arranged according to subject, such as cultural and fraternal organizations, travel & tourism, arts and entertainment, reference, media, government, genealogy, museums, history and culture, business, and libraries with Czech or Slovak materials. If there is another web site with a Czech or Slovak connection, chances are it will be listed here.

E-mail has proven to be a great way to exchange information with or pose all sorts of questions to museum staff. Popular questions concern genealogy, Czech and Slovak history and culture, book or artifact donations, and gift store merchandise. The beauty of e-mail is that you can send messages quickly and efficiently, thus saving staff time and postage. An internet "success story" started with a man wanting genealogical information. I directed him to a few different sources of genealogical information and thought that was that. However, I received another message from him indicating that he read an article in a fraternal organization's publication that the museum was mounting a new exhibit (*Homelands*) and inquired whether we would be interested in exhibiting his vintage 1935 Czech motorcycle. I forwarded this offer to curator Carmen Langel, who then secured the motorcycle loan.

Czech & Slovak 20th Century Struggle for Independence Added to Museum Exhibit

The Czechoslovak Declaration of Independence has been loaned to the NCSML from the Library of Congress through Jan. 2 and is now exhibited in the gallery along with a permanent collection of rare Prague Spring photos,

"Russians shot all over it with their submachine and tanks. It was done from them on purpose, so they can show us Czechs who is in power over the country. It was an ugly and dictatorial act ..."

Former Czechoslovak Television cameraman Vladimir Najdrovsky, describing the scene in his 1968 photo. plane wreckage and other Library of Congress documents that combined tell the tumultuous story of the Czech and Slovak path to independence in the last 80 years.

The three-part independence exhibit includes the English version of the Declaration of Independence, a document issued in 1918 and inspired by American democratic ideals. The Library of Congress loan, the first in what may be a series of loans to the National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library, also includes photos and letters from

Czechoslovakia's first president, Thomas G. Masaryk, to U.S. President Woodrow Wilson. The photos and documents were part of a Library of Congress exhibit, "The Birth of Czechoslovakia October 1918," which ran last fall in Washington, D.C.

The exhibit also includes plane wreckage, retrieved by an Ely, Iowa, minister, from the site where Slovak Gen. Milan Stefanik died 80 years ago in Slovakia. Stefanik, whose name appears on the Czechoslovak Declaration of Independence, is considered Slovakia's 20th century hero. On May 4, 1919, on his way to be named Minister of National Defense in the new Czecho-Slovak Republic, his plane burst into flames and crashed in Slovakia. A Moravian-born minister, Ludvik Burian, who settled in Ely, was at the scene of Stefanik's death and retrieved pieces of the wreck, including a wool cuff from Stefanik's uniform.
