



Jan Hus

after whom this lodge has its name, was a famous Bohemian (Czech) protestant in religion; born of humble parents in Husinec, near Prachatice, Bohemia, July 6, 1369. He became a priest in 1400. Hus was a realist in philosophy, and adopted the views of Wycliffe, whose doctrines he preached, giving great offense to the religious authorities. Hus appeared by citation before the Council of Constance, and, though provided with a safe-conduct from the Emperor Sigismund, he was adjudged a heretic, and burned alive July 6, 1415.

HORAK INN

At this place of business a few Bohemian Odd Fellows met during the year of 1884 and the early part of 1885 and formed the Jan Hus Club of Odd Fellows, which on March 4, 1885, was instituted as Jan Hus Lodge No. 51, I. O. O. F. This was the only Bohemian (Czech) lodge west of the Mississippi river.



HISTORY

Of Jan Hus Lodge No. 51, I.O.O.F. Cedar Rapids, Iowa.

Compiled by Louis H. Straka

On the 22nd day of September, 1880, the Sovereign Grand Lodge of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows held the Annual Convention in Toronto, Canada, and among the important decisions made was one that eventually led to the organization of the only Odd Fellow Lodge in the State of Iowa, conducting the work in the Bohemian (Czech) language. It was then and there decided to authorize the organization of lodges doing their work in foreign languages, and soon thereafter, a German lodge was organized in this city.

Due to the large number of Bohemian settlers in Cedar Rapids, the idea was soon born among a few of the Odd Fellows of the Czech descent that a lodge working in the Bohemian language would prosper. Meetings were held in private homes and at Horak's Inn on North First Street, East, until there was formed Jan Hus I. O. O. F. Club, and the brothers worked with untiring efforts to bring about the establishment of regularly instituted lodge of Odd Fellows doing the work in the Bohemian language.

Among the members taking part, we must mention the following, naming them in the order as they appear in the first regular minutes of the lodge on March 4, 1885:V. L. Blahnik, V. J. Dvorak, Em. Gerdl, Frank Horak, Jos. Kucera, Frank Mitvalsky, John Petrovitsky, W. F. Severa, Jos. Swab, Fr. Witousek and Jos. Zahorik. Out of these that kept the membership intact only one is surviving—Past Grand W. F. Severa, who as we are told was one of the main cogs of this preliminary working committee. He joined an Odd Fellow lodge in Racine, Wis., about sixty years ago, then moved to Belle Plaine, Iowa, coming to Cedar Rapids, Iowa, and worked ceaselessly until the day came for the installation of the new lodge.

Palacky Lodge, No. 630, of Chicago, Illinois, the first Bohemian lodge of that metropolis, was invited to induct the newly born Jan Hus Lodge. Under the guidance of District Deputy Grand Master, Bro. William Inks, member of Star Lodge, No. 166. Mechanicsville, Iowa, the meeting of the Jan Hus Odd Fellow Club was open to order at 2 P. M. on March 4th, 1885, and the following members were introduced and their official titles announced as follows: F. Fucik, District Deputy Grand Master, of Palacky Lodge; C. Fordyce, District Deputy Warden, of Cedar Rapids Lodge No. 141; District Deputy Grand Secretary, Em Holy, of Palacky Lodge; W. Kaspar, District Deputy Grand Treasurer, of Palacky Lodge; J. Beranek, inside guardian, of Eureka Lodge No. 44, Iowa City, Iowa; August Jacobi, outside guardian, of Mozart Lodge No. 183, of Cedar Rapids, Iowa; M. Sikyta, conductor, of Palacky Lodge; W. Topinka.

warden, of Palacky Lodge; J. Matousek, R. S. N. G., of Palacky Lodge; J. Fucik, L. S. N. G. of Palacky Lodge; A. Kanak, R. S. V. G., of Palacky Lodge; W. Smolik, L. S. V. G., of Palacky Lodge; E. Haase, R. S. S., of Palacky Lodge; J. Silhanek, L. S. S., of Palacky Lodge, and Louis Zavadil, chaplain, of Palacky Lodge.

Charter was read by Bro. Em. Holy, of Palacky Lodge, and after that the club was pronounced officially as Jan Hus Lodge, No. 51, I. O. O. F.

The first elected officers of the lodge were: V. J. Dvorak, N. G.; John Petrovitsky, V. G.; L. Blahnik, Secretary; F. Horak, Treasurer. The vote was unanimous. Bro. F. Fucik, district deputy Grand Master, named his suite: M. Sikyta, as district deputy Grand Marshall; L. Zavadil, as district deputy Grand Warden; Em. Holy, as district deputy Grand Secretary, and Vac. Kaspar, as district deputy Treasurer. The first officers of the lodge were then properly installed and appointed their officers. Four applications for membership were read and voted upon favorably.

First regular meeting of the lodge was held at 7 P. M. that day and the four candidates received their Initiatory Degree, which was exemplified by the staff of the Palacky Lodge.

The lodge prospered; 13 new members were taken in during 1885. Of interest should be mentioned that the officers were fined 10 cents a meeting if not present and if their excuse was not deemed sufficient.

The first meetings were held at the Odd Fellow Hall and rent paid to Cedar Rapids Lodge No. 141. In May of 1885 the Mozart Lodge No. 183 Hall was rented. This hall was located on the third floor of a building now occupied by Newman's, at the corner of Second Avenue and Second Street, Southeast.

It may interest the readers that during the first few years, loans were made to worthy brothers. In the way of refreshments, very often we come to \$1.85 item of expense for a "casket." We leave this to the imagination of our readers just what kind of refreshment this was.

In 1895, the lodge took over the renting of the third floor of the same building and rented it out to other lodges and societies. Building manager was getting 50 cents per meeting of all lodges or societies.

In 1908, the first meeting was held in the new Sokol Hall, our present meeting place. except for many years, the small hall on the second floor was used.

On February 2nd, 1910, the widows of deceased brothers were invited to the 25th Anniversary celebration on March 4, 1910. The committee for this celebration consisted of the following brothers and their wives: Frank and Barbara Ambroz, Frank V. and Anna

Shalda, John and Marie Petrovitsky, Jos. and Katherine Simon, Matt Petrovitsky, W. Zalesky and his wife, Ruzena, Vaclav and Frantiska Vorlicky, W. C. and Frances Benesh, Jos. Kozlovsky and Frank V. and Emma A. Hasek. Twenty-one brothers of the Palacky Lodge No. 630 and four brothers of the Praha Lodge, No. 231, of Chicago were present at this celebration. One hundred twelve brothers and their wives attended and the cost represented the sum of \$283.47.

On March 16, 1910, contest for membership started and two committees of five members each were appointed. During that year regalia was purchased at the cost of \$248.50.

On February 8, 1911, it was decided to purchase a token to the member who had the largest number of new applications in the contest. Bro. F. V. Slezak received this token. The contest or rather the committee was continued until the end of the year. On July 12, 1910, there were 133 members. At that time, the Trustees reported the assets of the lodge as \$4,140.19.

On March 13, 1912, Bro. L. H. Straka was appointed as a committee of one to attend the meeting of Bohemian lodges of United States which was held in Chicago with reference to the revision of the Czech rituals. At the end of the year, Trustees reported \$4,965.69 as assets.

On July 2, 1913, recording secretary's office was given over to a Past Grand and was not to be used as a stepping stone to higher offices.

On December 17, 1913, 68 members attended the first Homecoming meeting. Total membership at that time was 132.

On September 23, 1914, Veteran Jewels were ordered for Past Grands, John and Matt Petrovitsky.

On November 4, 1914, mention is made of P. G. Adolph Jandrt being appointed District Deputy Grand Master, for District No. 57, he having the distinction of being first such officer as a member of Jan Hus Lodge.

On December 9, 1914—There were 134 members. On motion \$100 was allowed to the Bohemian Benevolent Society for the widows and orphans of the World War in Czechoslovakia.

On July 7. 1915—Board of Trustees reported Assets of \$5,789.90. Membership 132.

On September 15, 1915—Four lots were purchased at the Bohemian National Cemetery for burial purposes. First brother buried there was Fred Tlustos. member of the Manufacturers Lodge No. 485, of East Moline, Ill.

On December 8, 1915, is was decided to hold the Anniversary Celebration on March 8th and 9th and Praha Lodge No. 231, of Chicago, was notified and asked to put on the first and second degree for us.

On December 15, 1915—Veteran Jewel was voted to be given Bro. Jos. Simon.

On January 5, 1916, Committee was named for the Anniversary Celebration in March consisting of Joseph Mekota, chairman, W. Vorlicky, Jos. Simon, Ad. Jandrt and John Mekota.

On January 12, 1916—Praha Lodge of Chicago reports that 70 or more brothers will come.

On February 16, 1916—C. S. P. S. Hall was engaged for the March 8th and also invitation of Maine Lodge No. 643 was accepted to visit them on March 10th and have work done in the third degree on our candidates.

On February 23, 1916—Anniversary Committee reports that Praha Rebekah Lodge No. 5 was invited to attend the celebration. In fact, all Odd Fellows and Rebekahs were invited. Additional committee for the celebration was named as follows: W. C. Benesh, John Havlovic, F. V. Slezak, V. Janda, V. Melsha, Wencil Novak, Wm. Kacena, Ant. Nemec, J. V. Rompotl, J. W. Pichner, C. C. Slapnicka, L. H. Straka and Joseph Klinsky.

On March 8, 1916—The meeting was held at C. S. P. S. Hall and Grand Master O. H. Sweeney and P. G. M. Mac J. Randall were present. Praha Lodge of Chicago exemplified the first and second degrees on eight candidates of our lodge: Frank Swanda, Frank Fojtik, Jos. Hradek, John Cimburek, H. J. Bulicek, M. T. Hasek, John Bures and Frank L. Cerveny.

On March 9, 1916, banquet was held for the members and visitors. March 10th, 1916, Maine Lodge was visited and work in the third degree witnessed. The cost of celebration was \$437.18.

On January 10, 1917, Trustees reported \$6,278.48 as assets of the lodge.

On June 13, 1917, communication from Grand Master was read instructing lodges not to suspend members who enlisted or were called to arms during the World War. Many of our brothers served the country, both in American and Czech legions.

On July 11, 1917—the lodge membership was 146, of which 48 were Past Grands. After the meeting the officers of the lodge served refreshments at their expense.

On September 25, 1917—\$14.40 was allowed from the Orphan Fund to the Grand Lodge as 10 cents per member for the support of orphaned Odd Fellows' families during the War.

On December 4, 1918, Bro. A. C. Cherry reported on Grand Lodge Session and informed us that all foreign working lodges must return the rituals by June 30, 1919, and transfer to English rituals.

On January 8, 1919—Board of Trustees reported \$7,055.16 as the Assets of the Lodge.

On April 9, 1919-Letter from Praha Lodge, No. 231, of Chi-

cago was read regarding the status of Bohemian rituals, asking to send a delegate and attend the meeting of all Bohemian lodges in U. S. A. to be held in Chicago on April 23, 1919. P. G. L. H. Straka was duly elected to represent our lodge.

On April 30, 1919—P. G. L. H. Straka reported on the meeting in Chicago. All the Bohemian lodges represented resolved to petition the Grand Sire, H. V. Borst, to continue the Bohemian rituals. At the same meeting a committee consisting of Bros. L. H. Straka, V. E. Vane and Adolph Jandrt were appointed to petition our Grand Master, J. M. Hazlett, to aid us in keeping the Bohemian rituals.

On June 25, 1919, the Committee on retaining the Bohemian Rituals reported unfavorably and moved to accept the English Rituals. This was adopted and took effect in the first meeting of July of that year.

On July 9, 1919—First meeting was held in the English language. Trustees reported \$7,133.20 as Assets. Bro. M. F. Simitz was the first Noble Grand under the English ritual.

On July 23, 1919—Bro. John Tykvart of Palacky Lodge of Chicago was a visitor, also Bro. Jos. Sveida of Karel Havlicek Lodge of Chicago. Bro. Ad. Jandrt reported on Praha Rebekah Lodge No. 5, stating that small attendance at meetings is alarming.

On July 30, 1919—Bro. W. Vorlicky reported on Praha Rebekah Lodge No. 5, stating that they will keep the charter and renew activities.

On August 20. 1919—First member was balloted upon favorably under the English Ritual, Bro. K. L. Jadrnicek.

On October 27, 1920—The retiring Treasurer, P. G. Jos. Simon was voted a token for his long and faithful service to the lodge.

On February 16, 1921—Motion was made and accepted to form a degree staff. Frank J. Chramosta, Frank V. Slezak and W. F. Kubik were appointed as Organizing Committee.

On March 23, 1921—A communication from Palacky Lodge of Chicago was read in regards of conferring the degrees on our class of candidates on or about April 29, 1921. The invitation was accepted.

On August 27, 1921—Letters were received from Maine Lodge and Kingston Lodge accepting our invitation to be with us on April 29, 1921. A class of 58 candidates was given the first, second and third degrees by Palacky Lodge of Chicago at the C. S. P. S. Hall. All these brothers were given special badges by the Palacky Lodge.

On July 6, 1921—The membership was 235. Of interest may be mentioned that the receipts during the first half of 1921 contained such items as \$559.00 for initiation fees and \$1,095.00 for the degree fees. Trustees reported \$7,299.77 as Assets of the lodge.

On August 24, 1921—Degree costumes were paid for amounting to \$1,250.00.

On September 21, 1921, P. G. L. H. Straka, as chairman of the Committee on the April visit of Palacky Lodge in this city reported final figures, showing that the total cost of \$790.51, of which less than \$470.00 was paid for by the lodge.

On September 28, 1921—Motion was made and accepted to have the degree staff members' names engraved on the Cup received from the Celebration Committee of the Grand Parade held at the occasion of laying of the cornerstones for the local junior high school buildings. Our degree staff won the first prize under the captaincy of Bro. Frank J. Chramosta.

On October 26, 1921, P. G. Jos. Mekota. Grand Lodge representative reported on Grand Lodge session of that year.

During the year of 1921 several invitations were received and accepted to put on work in many lodges of this district.

On November 30, 1921, a letter was sent to Palacky Lodge of Chicago stating that our degree staff will confer for them the first, second and third degrees on January 18, 19, 20 and 21, 1922.

On December 28, 1921—Communication was read from Palacky Lodge, of Chicago, stating that the celebration will start on January 25, 1922, and that they would like to see the degree staff on that day. The celebration will last through to January 29, 1922. It was also decided to invite P. G. John R. Price and G. M. Lynn J. Irwin to accompany the degree staff to Chicago.

On January 4, 1922—Bro. J. F. Schultz was presented a watch charm for getting the most candidates during the last membership campaign. At the same meeting Bro. Fr. J. Chramosta received a watch and chain for his excellent work and patience as a drill captain. It was also decided to purchase a loving cup and present it to Palackv Lodge at the time of our visit to Chicago on January 25, 1922. Trustees reported \$7,807.98 as Assets of the Lodge.

The work of our degree staff while in Chicago, was praised by all who witnessed it. The staff left via special train, both ways. Grand Warden. Bro. A. C. Cherry was also among those who went with the staff. Praha Rebekah Lodge No. 5 accompanied the brothers and conferred the Rebekah degree on candidates of the Vlasta Rebekah Lodge of Chicago and came in for its share of praises. Our staff worked there on a class of 150 candidates and each candidate received a token from our lodge. A picture of the degree staff of Palacky Lodge was presented to N. G. W. J. Vondracek to be brought back with him for our lodge. Our V. G. Ed. E. Hach presented the loving cup to Palacky Lodge on our behalf.

On May 3, 1922—Invitation to confer degree work at the Grand Lodge Session at Iowa City was accepted. On that same day the proposition to join with the other lodges and build a Temple was defeated by a vote of 60 to 8.

On July 5, 1922-Trustees reported \$8,404.17 as Assets.

On July 26, 1922—A movement was started to bring the next Grand Lodge session to Cedar Rapids, Iowa. Committees were appointed.

On August 30, 1922—Bro. J. F. Shultz reported that Jan Hus baseball team will leave that coming week-end for Chicago to play a game vs. Palacky Lodge Team on Sept. 6, 1922. The same team reported that they beat the Palacky team by a score of 6 to 5.

On October 18, 1922—It was reported that Jan Hus Lodge with its band at the Grand Lodge Session held at Iowa City, won the first prize consisting of \$100 in cash.

On December 13, 1922—Veteran Jewel was presented to P. G. V. E. Vane by the lodge.

On December 27, 1922—Trustees reported \$9,095.98 as the Assets of the lodge.

On July 11, 1923—Trustees reported \$9,704.12 as Assets.

On Dec. 12. 1923—140 members answered roll call. On that date P. G. M. T. Hasek was appointed to get in touch with the Grand Lodge regarding the juvenile branch of the order.

On Jan. 9. 1924—Bal. \$10,890.25 Trustees report as Assets. Membership 414.

On Dec. 2, 1925—A discussion was held to adopt an orphan boy at our Homes at Mason City, Iowa. Rec. Sec'y. was instructed to write the Supt. of the Homes.

Past Grand Master Irwin was the speaker of the evening. Past Grand Master Lemming as well as our Deputy Grand Master Norman D. Smith gave talks.

On Feb. 10, 1932—Grand Lodge Committee reports that they are trying to raise money to defray expenses of the Session to be held here in October and were selling tickets for a home talent minstrel show, brothers and sisters of the order taking part.

On Feb. 24, 1932—Bro. Horsky was appointed a committee of one to instruct our membership in the unwritten work, as our Lodge wants to be placed on the Honor Roll.

On April 6, 1932—Jan Hus Lodge joined with other organizations of the city in commemoration of Washington Bicentennial 200th birthday by planting 5 trees in Van Vechten Park in the name of Jan Hus Lodge No. 51, I. O. O. F.

On May 4, 1932—Bro. Horsky presented letter received from our Grand Master congratulating our Lodge for being placed on the Honor Roll for the unwritten work.

May 25, 1932—The Lodge had Honor Roll night and presented 40 commissions for the unwritten work to the brothers that were honored to receive them. Refreshments were served.

On Oct. 19, 1932—Jan Hus Lodge open lodge at the Grand Lodge Session held here and vacated their chairs for the Composite Degree Staff, after the degree work our Degree Staff put on the Flag Drill.

On April 5, 1933—Invitation to our Staff to confer the 1st degree on a class of candidates at the Eastern Iowa District Assn. to be held at Iowa City, Iowa, April 26. This was accepted.

On Aug. 30, 1933—Rec. Sec'y was instructed to send Bro. W. F. Severa birthday greetings, he being 80 years old on Sept. 3rd.

Oct. 25, 1933—Bro. W. F. Severa was presented with a 45-year jewel. Bro. L. H. Straka made the presentation in the Bohemian language. Bro. Jos. Simon pinned the jewel on Bro. Severa's coat. Bro. Severa thanked the brothers for the honor.

On Dec. 13, 1933—48th Annual Roll Call and honoring our Past Grands. Members present 163. Past Grands present 40. The Past Grands were honored by being seated on each side of the Noble Grand during our meeting.

On Jan. 3, 1934—Trustees report of total Assets \$21,050.41. Membership 340.

On Jan. 31, 1934—Jan Hus Lodge conferred 2nd degree at Elberon, Iowa, for the West Irwing Lodge. They had 10 candidates.

On Feb. 28, 1934—Invitation from Clutier Lodge asking our Degree Staff to confer the 2nd and 3rd degrees on a class of candidates March 24, 1934.

On June 13, 1934—Jan Hus Lodge Degree Staff conferred the 3rd degree on 17 candidates from Ely and 1 of our own in our hall. Refreshments were served after the meeting; 280-lb. hog, sauer kraut, rye bread and beer. We all stayed until the wee hours.

On Aug. 1, 1934—Invitation to put on Flag Drill at Clutier, Iowa, on Aug. 19, 1934, was accepted.

On Dec. 12, 1934-Annual Roll Call; 152 present.

On Jan. 2, 1935—Trustees report of Assets \$21,511.99. Membership 318.

On Jan. 9, 1935—Received communication from Palacky Lodge regarding the degree work for our 50th Anniversary.

On Jan. 30, 1935—Bro. Chas. Hermanek and Bro. Horsky are working hard to have 50 brothers from our Lodge on the Honor Roll. Keep up the good work boys we will be there.

On Feb. 6, 1935—The 50th Anniversary Committee made a report to the Lodge of their progress.

On Feb. 13, 1935—Jan Hus Lodge has 9 candidates to date for the degree work to be conferred by Palacky Lodge.

There are several other out side Lodges with candidates Palacky Lodge 15, Ely Lodge 5, Cedar Rapids Lodge 1.

On Feb. 16, 1935—The committee in charge of this 50th Anniversary hopes that our membership and visitors appreciate our efforts in making this Golden Anniversary of Jan Hus Lodge a pleasant remembrance.
