

Cookie Walk, an annual fundraiser of Guild of NCSML, promotes the delights of traditional holiday baking: creation and consumption!!!

Some 90 customers, many of whom arrived one hour before the "Walk" began, bought more than 214 lbs. of cookies and candy, for a total of \$1863 in profit for the Guild, and ultimately, NCSML. With proceeds of \$729 from Cafe and Craft Market, the successful event earned \$2592 for Guild projects.

Nineteen volunteers began Walk preparation Friday, and there were 35 volunteers working the Walk, the Cafe, and the Craft Market on Saturday.

Cookies fashioned after reindeer and mice, Czech and Slovak favorites, a variety of homemade candies, and bags of snacks were just a sample of the beautiful array of goodies available for purchase. Cafe provided coffee, cocoa, and cider, as well as koláče and potica, and Craft Market items drew much interest.

### Minutes of the August 2013 NCSML Guild Meeting

The Guild of the National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library met at the First Presbyterian Church near Ely, Iowa, on Saturday, August 3, 2013, at 9:30 am. There were 44 members and 14 guests present. Church members Joanne Chadima and Sharon Furler provided music before the meeting. Pastor Julie Schuett welcomed the group.

**Program:** Joanne Chadima introduced Ed Vavra, who gave a very interesting and informative program on the history of the church and Czech immigration to the area. President Diane Hayes introduced Museum curator Stefanie Kohn, who gave a brief update on the Museum and its current exhibits.

Guild members Shirley Alexander, Jeanne Vogt, and Sandra and John Hudson each said a few words about what the Guild means to them and how they got involved in the Guild.

**President's Report:** Diane Hayes welcomed visitors and invited them to become Guild members. She mentioned that the revised by-laws have been presented to the Museum Board and they are pleased with the work the committee has done.

Diane told the group Jeanne Vogt will be the chair of the nominating committee and will find members for the committee. At the September meeting the Guild membership will vote on the proposed nominating committee. ### Minutes of the September 2013 NCSML Guild Meeting

The Guild of the National Czech and Slovak Museum and Library met at the NCSML on Saturday, September 7, 2013 at 9 am. There were 46 members and 1 guest present. Diane Hayes called the meeting to order at 9 a.m. and Donna Merkle led the Pledge of Allegiance.

**Program:** Diane Hayes introduced V.P. of Development for the NCSML, Jason Wright. Jason told the group just how big and successful the NCSML is and talked about how areas of the non-profit organization are funded. Volunteers and their hours are very important to the Museum's budget!

An Invitation: Diane Hayes introduced Jan Stoffer, Director of Education and Visitor Services. Jan invited all the volunteers to bring family and friends to a volunteer fair on September 25. There will also be a tour of the Babi Buresh House following.

Jan also told the group that Sara Jacobmeyer has taken the position of Museum Program Coordinator and they are currently looking for a Volunteer Coordinator.

**President:** Diane Hayes read a letter from Abigail Ibisch, former Program and Volunteer Coordinator. Diane also asked the members if anyone knew where the Guild scrapbooks and volunteer brochures were that had been used at the opening of the Faces of Freedom exhibit.

Diane Hayes gave a summary of a meeting with the Public Health Department on September 5, 2013. It has been determined that this Guild may cook and bake items off-site when holding Guild fundraisers. Also, Carol Wohlleben will be holding a Safe Food Handling class for members in the near future.

**Recording Secretary:** Diana Geoffrey asked for additions or corrections to the August 2013 meeting minutes. There were none, Sylvia Popelka made a motion to accept the Minutes as read. Marge Stone seconded the motion and the motion passed with a 100% vote.

Corresponding Secretary: Loreen Svoboda read the volunteer hours for July 2013. Forty-four members contributed a total of 748.5 hours with the most hours donated by Diane Hayes. Loreen read a card from Alicia Jackson and sent cards this past month to the Krall's (65 wedding anniversary), Ed Vavra (thank you), Helen Christophersen (miss you) and Jeanne Vogt (sympathy).

Loreen asked those who signed up for small groups meet after the meeting to organize the individual groups. Museum Board of Directors Representative: Carol Wohlleben gave reports from the July and August NCSML Board of Directors meetings. She was happy to report that the Board of Directors approved the new Guild by-laws. Also that committees are being formed to work on continued Museum growth, including national initiatives.

**Treasurer:** Sally Stejskal stated that the Guild's ending balance for August was \$11,183. Sally handed out the new Guild budget. Thank you Sally for all your hard work putting this information together! She also reminded members that dues are now due December 1 of each year.

Nominating Committee: Jennifer Greve made a motion to accept the nominating committee of Jeanne Vogt, Shirley Alexander, and Betty Sheets. Suzanne Long seconded the motion. The motion passed with a 100% vote. The committee will present its slate of officers for 2014 at the October meeting.

**BrewNost:** Suzanne Long stated that the Guild will be serving 1,000 dessert bites at this year's BrewNost. Volunteers for the evening are asked to wear red tops and black pants. Also she asked members who have Facebook to "Like" the BrewNost page in order to get the word out to friends and family.

**Fundraising:** Cookbooks- Donna Merkle told the group that 500 Guild cookbooks have been ordered and should be here by mid-month. She stated that Guild cookbook sales to the Museum Store from 2007 to date have been \$20,269.34. The Guild has sold \$15,837 in that time.

Pork Dinner- Donna Merkle said that the fundraiser of a soup supper has been changed to a traditional Czech pork dinner. The pork dinner is to be held Friday November 1, 2013, from 5 pm to 8 p.m. Tickets will be available at the October meeting for those who want to sell them. The committee consists of Donna Merkle, Bonnie Rohlena, Karen Zacek, Karen Hospodarsky, Diane Moore, and Barb Hill.

Cookie Walk: Mary VanHouten asked all members to keep the December 7, 2013, Cookie Walk in mind and that sign-up sheets will be available at the October Guild meeting.

Policy and Procedures: Committee chair Sally Stejskal handed out the new Policy and Procedures to the membership. She defined policy and procedures and gave a brief summary. Any web content regarding the Guild will be decided in the future as the Museum is currently looking into a new computer system. Sally thanked her committee members Shirley Alexander, Mel Holubar, Carol Wohlleben, and Diane Hayes.

**Attendance Lottery:** The following people donated items to the attendance lottery. Diane Hayes, Jeanne Vogt, Betty Sheets, and Marj Nejdl. Diane Hayes adjourned the meeting at 10:45 a.m.

# Guild Adds 'old world craft' team to BrewNost, Old World Market

# Traditional ornaments adorn trees in Rozek Grand Hall, Library

Year 2013 marks the 10th anniversary of Dell Mills' Czech and Slovak ornaments adorning trees on display at National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library. Although Del began researching these ornaments years before 2004, that was the first year they embellished trees at NCSML for public viewing.

This year, the 15-foot tree in Rozek Grand Hall features Czech ornaments, and a graceful tree in Skala Bartizal Library features Slovak ornaments.

Dell's personal heritage is Danish/English/Scots. However, he became intrigued with the culture of Czechs and Slovaks and began investigating holiday ornaments following "1000 Years of Czech Culture," a symposium sponsored by NCSML in 1997. Dell sought information about holiday ornaments and received nearly 400 replies, a number of which came from the Czech Republic.

His collection of ornaments includes some 300 traditional symbols of Czech and Slovak culture, and some 85 per cent of these have been created by Dell. On the Czech tree, gingerbread cookies enhanced by paper drawings were contributed by a bakery in Prague. Those were lost in the Flood of 2008, along with some 90 per cent of all the ornaments. Dell has re-created those lost, and securing replacements is an on-going project.

"We will continue to add to the tree until we have all replacement ornaments and more," Dell said.

Some ornaments are made of clay. Popcorn threaded on strings and apples are artificial. It takes Dell some 45 minutes to make one Moravian Star. All of the ornaments on the Slovak tree are straw. Dell has documented a list of ornaments and their symbolic origins.

This year's trees were decorated on November 19, and the last day of tree exhibition will be January 7.

The Guild of the National Czech and Slovak Museum and Library met at the NCSML on Saturday, October 5, 2013 at 9 a.m. There were 42 members and 2 guests present. Vice President Donna Merkle called the meeting to order at 9 a.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Minutes of the October 2013 NCSML Guild Meeting

Donna Merkle introduced Museum Program Coordinator Sara Jacobmeyer who gave a presentation on the Old World Christmas Market. The market will be held on Saturday, December 7, and Sunday ,December 8, 2013. There will be many activities for kids and adults alike. Including the Guild's Annual Cookie Walk.

**President and Vice President Reports:** There were no reports from the President or Vice President. **Recording Secretary:** Diana Geoffrey asked for any additions or correction to the September meeting Minutes. The Minutes were approved as presented.

**Corresponding Secretary:** Diana Geoffrey read the volunteer hours list for August 2013. 124 volunteers contributed a total of 705.5 hours in August. Bonnie Holubar had the most with 49.5 hours.

**Treasurer's Report:** Sally Stejskal reported that the balance as of September 30, 2013, was \$11,226.00. Sally told the group that the Executive Board had voted to send a \$25 donation in the name of Bette Krall to the NCSML. She also stated that the invoice for the cookbook order, which has been delivered, has not yet been subtracted from the total.

<u>Kitchen Expense:</u> Sally Stejskal told the group that Diane Hayes, Carol Wohlleben, and Museum staff have decided in order to rectify the kitchen situation two more induction burners and various pots and pans will be purchased. Diane Hayes is donating one of the burners. The rest will be purchased by the Museum and the Guild will contribute \$200 to the total expense.

<u>Membership</u>: Sally Stejskal reminded everyone that membership dues of \$10 are due by December 2013. The Guild goal for membership this coming year is 160 members. Betty Sheets has updated membership lists if anyone needs them. Also if anyone needs a copy of the new Policy and Procedures, see Sally. The membership decided to send a sympathy card to the family of Mary Jo Langer.

Museum Board of Directors: Carol Wohlleben stated that the Board did not meet in September. She did, however, announce that the Museum has hired a new Volunteer Coordinator. He is Jerry Campbell and will start October 16, 2013. The Museum would like to have a welcoming ceremony at a later date and has asked the Guild to participate.

Nominating Committee: Jeanne Vogt listed the officers on the slate for 2014. They are: President-Diane Hayes, Vice President-Ed Popelka, Recording Secretary-Diana Geoffrey, Corresponding Secretary-Diana Moore, Treasurer-Sally Stejskal and Museum Board Representative-Carol Wohlleben. The new office of Historian has not yet been filled. Jeanne mentioned that if anyone else is interested in any of the offices to let her know. The membership will be voting on the 2014 Executive Board at the November 2013 meeting.

BrewNost: Suzie Long reported that everything is in place for the 10<sup>th</sup> Annual BrewNost. She has pans and recipes for those who volunteered to make dessert bites and also schedules for those volunteering for the event. Dress for the evening should be red or white tops and black bottoms. Five people are still needed for the 7:30 to 9:30 shift. Suzie read a note from Kecia Boysen stating that volunteers that night may partake in the food either before or after their shift. But will not be able to have any alcohol unless you have an actual BrewNost ticket.

**Pork Dinner:** Donna Merkle reported that the menu has been set and advanced sales of tickets start today and ends October 25, 2013. Members may pick up tickets to sell from Donna after the meeting. Donna stated that Ed Popelka has submitted the press release for the event to Rob Merritt. Ed and Sylvia Popelka will offer a gourmet dinner to the person who sells the most tickets.

**Aprons:** Donna Merkle reported that Loreen Svoboda is ordering red aprons that are 24 inches long with pockets and an adjustable neck strap. Loreen is working with Marj Nejdl on a design to be screen printed on the front and they should be available for the pork dinner. The new aprons will be available for Guild members to purchase.

### 'Vision for Future' includes broadening audience, traveling throughout U.S., enlisting more volunteers

"Vision for the Future" was the September Guild membership meeting program.

The presentation by Jason Wright, Vice President for Development, gave members a backward glimpse of the origins of National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library up to the present day, with NCSML's current Mission and Vision statements highlighted. From the "little house" to the "sign company building, to "the red roof" to today's "world class museum and library" ... Jason explained goals beyond opening a world class facility to being the leading educational resource for the culture, to engaging diverse national audiences, to the installation of the permanent Faces of Freedom: The Czech & Slovak Journey exhibition.

Broadening the audience of NCSML includes taking exhibits "on the road," going to festivals, participating in panel discussions, and attending important gatherings and events. All of these involvements take Museum staff to strategic cities through the U.S., Jason explained.

He also informed the group about areas from which income is derived and how museum monies are spent. The increasing importance of voluntarism was noted. The Endowment Fund, providing stable income, was outlined by Jason, as were the benefits of The Legacy Society.

### Old World Christmas Market embraces diversity, tradition

Museum Program Coordinator Sara Jacobmeyer presented an overview of Old World Christmas Market as the October program for Guild of NCSML. Sara explained that this two-day holiday welcomes all cultures, and this year's Market partners with festivities of Very Cherry Christmas in New Bohemia.

The December 7-8 event includes Guild's Cookie Walk and beverage station as well of the group's booth of handmade crafts. 
