Museum Guild Program February 5, 2005 "Wild Life — Birds"


Presented by Jim Durbin

Jim presented an interesting lecture and showed slides of photographs he had taken of his beautiful gardens which he landscaped with ponds, waterfalls, flowers and trees. The pictures of the birds who visited his gardens were especially enjoyable.

We learned that birds are very clean so they can keep their feathers fluffy, which helps control their body heat. Another interesting fact was that long-billed birds eat insects and so must migrate, while short billed species eat nuts and seeds so remain in this area throughout the winter.

Jim has been a member of the Audubon Society since 1989 and has also been a member of the Linn County Bird Society Board. When asked if we could visit his gardens, he cordially responded "In April or May".

Jan presented basic information regarding the Garnet Exhibit before handing out extensive supplemental information to aid Guild Members and volunteers.

We learned that garnets are found in every color except blue. The blood red garnets are mined in the Czech Republic while others are mined in India, Africa and Arizona. The majority of the pieces on exhibit are from The National Museum in Prague, while others are on loan from private individuals.

We were then treated to a preview tour by Curator Edie Blanchard. The sparkling monstrance is the highlight, while the oldest piece is a cross on a rosary which dates back to 1480.

We all agreed it is an incredible exhibit.

Museum Guild Program
April 2, 2005

"Grant Wood at 5 Turner Alley"
Presented by Candy Wong

The Cedar Rapids Museum of Art will offer an exciting exhibition to the community beginning September 10 of this year. The staff at the museum has put forth a great effort to bring some of Wood's most important pieces to the city for this special event. Candy Wong, co-chair of the exhibit, told Guild members that a great deal of negotiation and diplomacy was necessary to work with institutions across the US to bring several Wood works for the 100th anniversary of the Museum of Art.

Grant Wood painted many of his best known works while living at 5 Turner Alley, the carriage house of the Turner Mortuary including "American Gothic". The Art Institute of Chicago has agreed to loan this work to the museum for the three month exhibition. This is the second time the famous painting has returned "home". The last time it was here was sixty years ago, the fifteenth anniversary of the painting featuring Wood's sister and his dentist.

Grant Wood moved to Cedar Rapids at the age of ten and this change of environment changed his perspective on all he saw. The country was moving from agrarian to an industrial society. It was the time of the Great Depression as well as the advent of electricity for common usage.

Candy said the exhibit will offer an excellent opportunity for education by tying the art and artist to the changing times. The museum is developing a curriculum packet for all lowa schools and will obtain grants to enable as many students as possible to view the exhibit.
