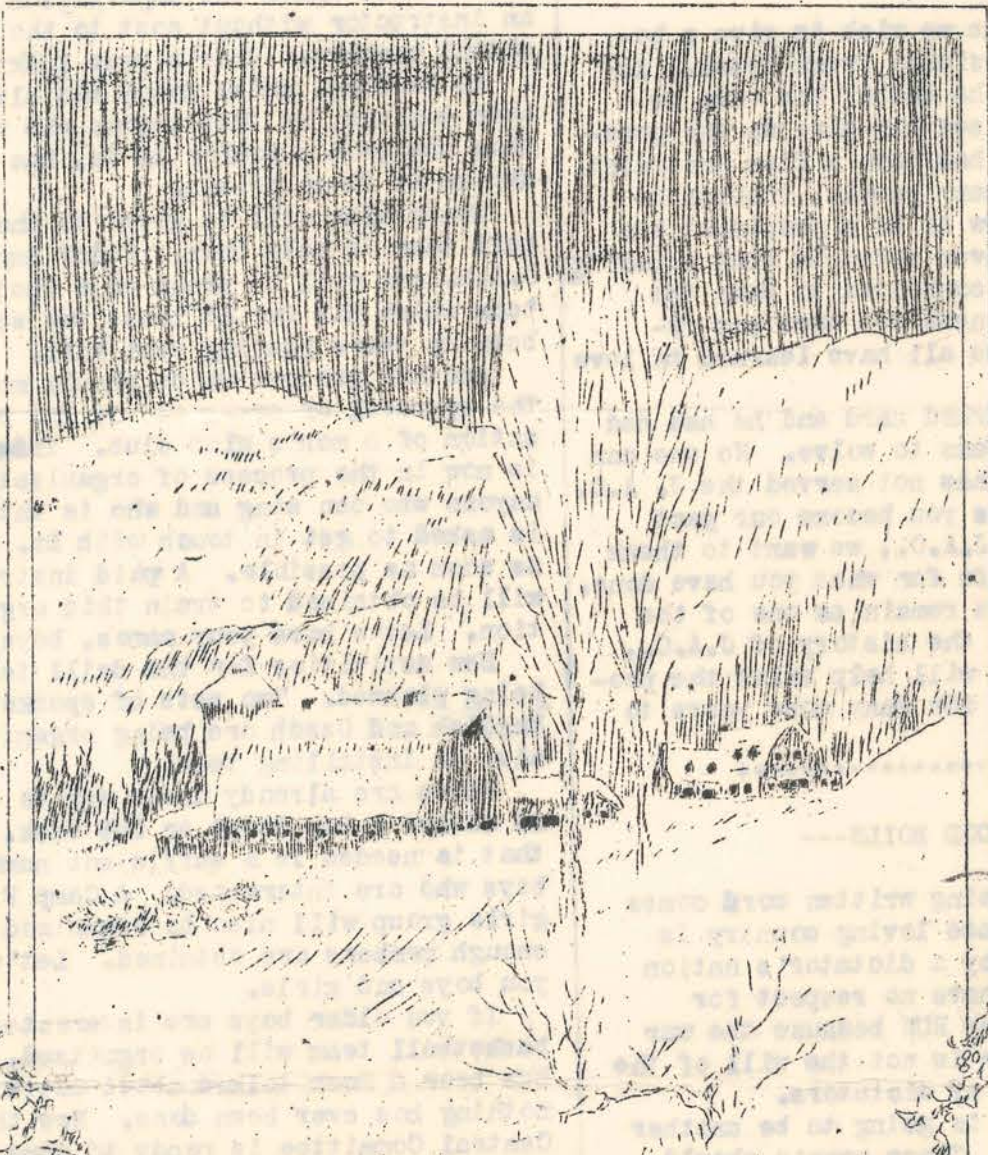

## --HADY ANDY ANSWERS--

- Q; How can I remove the printing from flour sacks?  
 A; Cover the printing with a thin layer of lard, rolling up the bag and putting it away for a few days. Then wash in boiling water.
- Q; How can I prevent stretching when laudering lace collars?  
 A; Care should be taken when laudering a lace collar to insure a good fit. A good method is to baste it on a piece of white cloth before washing. Let dry, remove from the cloth and press with a warm iron. There will be no stretching or tearing of the lace.
- Q; How can I prevent sliced bananas from turning black?  
 A; Pour a little orange, lemon, or grapefruit juice over the bananas. This same method will prevent peeled apples from discoloring.
- Q; How can I test the purity of butter?  
 A; Place a small amount of butter in a teaspoon and hold it over a flame. If the butter is pure, it will foam quietly and boil. If impure, it will crackle and sputter as it becomes hot.
- Q; How can I make an unsightly flower pot more attractive?  
 A; Cover the flower pot with about three thicknesses of paraffin paper, then a layer of colored crepe tissue paper. The paraffin prevents the moisture from coming through.

Dr. Sedlacek gave the following advice to Frank Sysel.

"Frank, drink plenty of water and that will prevent you from becoming stiff in the joints."

"Yes, said Frank, "but some joints don't serve water."

## WHY DON'T THEY?

Manufacture a tandem umbrella, so two people can walk together in comfort in the rain.

Cultivate a square pea for ease in eating.

Insist that all clerks, as well as floorwalkers, in stores, wear distinguishing badges in their lapses to avoid embarrassment for hatless customers.

Have keyholes that automatically illuminate when the key touches the door.

Show on seed packages how the plant looks when it first comes up, so that we amateur gardeners can tell the plants from weeds.!

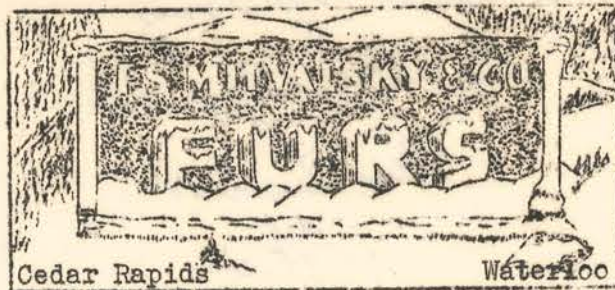


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
