2004 Museum Guild Annual Report

Presented by Andrea Siebenmann, Guild President, at the NCSML Membership meeting on January 17, 2005

Last year marked an important hallmark in the Guild's history – in April, we celebrated our 10th Anniversary. We had a very fine celebration with a birthday cake, and a special issue of the The Guilded Pages newsletter was dedicated to this occasion and to one of the five founders, Patty Hikiji, as well.

What a very busy year we had! We held our regular monthly meetings as scheduled, and with the assistance of Zula Oujiri and her Program Committee, we had an opportunity to hear good speakers and learn more about our neighbors, the city and a variety of activities or programs available in the area.

Last year, the Guild fiscally supported Museum through the purchase of presentation equipment in the amount of \$2,299; and contributed \$1,000 to the Spring temporary exhibit. The total amount of this support was only a few hundred dollars less than the previous year's combined contribution to the Exhibits and Museum Endowment Fund. On the income side, our two major fundraisers brought in needed funds in 2004, but overall, the expected income was lower than in 2003 by about \$1,500. In addition, the new Guild cookbook project was launched in the spring, and the first marketing phase cost more than was initially budgeted for. But with the new funding stream from the cookbook sale, expected to begin as early as May 2005, the Guild will be able to return back to the level of contribution which it pledged in 2003.

The Guild's main mission is to support all aspects of the Museum's functionining, its activities and programs. The Guild members do so generously every year through their volunteer work. In 2004, total of 9,765.50 volunteer hours donated by 74 Guild members helped support the function of the permament as well as both temporary exhibits, the History Conference in March, many musical performances including the visit of the Silesian choir and the Quarteto Telleman, exhibit opening receptions, new Museum fundraiser "Brewnost", the Dance festival in July, the Museum store's "Cooking in Babi's Kitchen" program, and many others. Well, above this all, the Guild events such as the Taste of Czech and Slovak, Cookie Walk, the Ethnic Fest, hosting of the meetings, were also generously supported by many of our Guild members, who certainly deserve to be saluted for such dedication.

The number of volunteer hours mentioned earlier indicates that the Guild members put in over 3,000 hours more compared to the previous year! Such statistic certainly reflects a truly generous spirit of our members as they sold goods at the Museum store, greeted and sold tickets to the Museum visitors, taught the public how to bake fine Czech or Slovak traditional foods, held classes on traditional crafts, cooked and served meals and beverages, hosted visitors, helped promote events, created Guild web pages, baked hundreds of cookies and kolaches, tended to the garden and so on. Testimonials on the Guild members' volunteer work, which were published in several issues of the Guilded Pages newsletter in 2004, speak volume about how the volunteer work at the Museum enriched many of their lives.

During 2004, the Guild welcomed 8 new members keeping the membership count at 104.

Looking at our past accomplishments, we can certainly stop for a moment and pat ourselves on the back. However, not for too long, since there are so many exciting opportunities lined up in for the Museum that we'd better not miss out on being part of it all!

Adjournment by Marge Stone at 11:15 AM.


