

MUSEUM GUILD OF THE NATIONAL CZECH & SLOVAK MUSEUM & LIBRARY Annual Report January 25, 2010

Greetings to the Board of Directors and members of NCSML at this, your Annual Meeting. It is a privilege to present the Annual Report of Guild of NSCML.

Our Mission is to support activities, programs, and facilities of National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library. We do this with unpaid volunteers and other financial and charitable support. In addition, Guild serves as an educational service and social organization for persons interested in NCSML.

Our two major fundraisers provide important revenue as well as occasions of comraderie and fun for members AND community: The 9th Annual Taste of Czech & Slovak kicked off Houby Days May 15. Re-located to St. Ludmila Parish Hall, this most successful "Taste" to date was enjoyed by some 317 ticket holders. Prior to the event, \$1450 was donated to purchase Guild property lost in the flood and consumables. Some 97 volunteers, including several staff members, cooked or worked the event in some capacity. A new logo was established, and accordion music and youthful members of Czech Heritage royalty added to this festive and fun occasion. Taste of Czech & Slovak provided an important Houby Days celebration as well as earning a profit of \$3050. We also sponsored a float in the Houby Days parade and participated in Parade of Krojc.

Our second major fundraiser is Cookie Walk, and the 11th annual was held December 12. More than 168 pounds of holiday goodies were purchased by 125 delighted patrons. Some 73 members of Guild and their friends baked cookies and made candies, worked the sale, or donated money. More than \$1813 was the net profit of Cookie Walk, again the most financially successful such event to date.

During this past year Guild formed an Ad Hoc committee to conduct NCSML Public Programs. The spring Cooking in Babi's Kitchen session demonstrated three types of dumplings and a September session on Apple Strudel included "hands on" practice for all participants. The committee also worked with Village merchants for Houby Days dancing ensemble arrangements for 2009 and 2010, as well as needlework demonstrations.

Guild volunteers were Gallery Attendants at the Lindale Exhibit, "Pack Your Bags: Journey to America," as well as Cedar Rapids Museum of Art "Treasures from the National Collection."

Guild Social Committee contributed to five receptions: a retirement reception for Esther White May 28; Educators Open House at Lindale September 15; Red Chamber Music event at First Presbyterian Church September 27; book signing reception for two local authors at NCSML at Lindale November 14; Brundibar Opera at Legion Arts (CSPS Building) November 21.

On the social scene, on February 14 Guild chartered a bus and attended a performance of Czech Symphony at Gallagher Bluedorn in Cedar Falls. Supporting Recovery of Czech Village/New Bohemia, and saluting Museum partnership with them, Guild held its February membership meeting at The Bohemia. NCSML Guild, staff, and merchants numbered more than 60. For the Museum Gift Shop's Christmas in August promotion, Guild provided Czech and Slovak cookies.

Our mission includes continued education for volunteers, and this year Guild meeting programs focused on Mainstreet Iowa, NCSML Recovery, History of C.R. Grocery Stores, Czech and Slovak Weddings, the reign of an Iowa Czech and Slovak Princess, restoration of Woodrow Wilson Train Station in Prague, a presentation on the public input process for rebuilding the



NCSML ediface, Museum Collection and Update, Svetlušky (Fireflies) children's music ensemble, two Mt. Mercy College students' observations on life in Cedar Rapids in contrast to that in Prague. We also sponsored a community program on "Genealogy Going Digital," by a well known Czech genealogist.

Some 40 Guild members and friends from St. Wenceslaus Parish contributed to the success of NCSML's BrewNost 2009 in October. We baked, contributed everything from needlework to poppyseed babovka to the Old World Market, added to this year's event to provided a touch of authentic Czech and Slovak. We also provided logistical assistance at everything from providing desserts, to swiping credit cards at the door. Guild also provided holiday cookies for Christmas in August, staged at NCSML/ Lindale to promote Gift Shop's 2009 ornament sales.

In 2009, Guild made total CASH donations of \$6750 to NCSML.

Operating Funds: \$6000 Endowment Fund: \$200

Czech & Slovak Heritage Cookbook Award: \$500

Christmas in August baking: \$50

In addition, Museum Store cookbook profits were \$2764. Since its inception, cookbook profits realized by the Museum Store total \$11,027.66. Regarding the Cookbook Award of \$500, our publication was the Midwest Regional Winner for the 2008 Tabasco Community Cookbook.

We published four issues of Guilded Page, our newsletter. Membership topped 100, and the average meeting attendance was 39. Regarding recorded volunteer hours, 76 of our members volunteered 5981 hours in 2009.

The casual observer at one of our Guild meetings would not necessarily see us as "movers and shakers," but *indeed we are*. When our Guild members are not working directly on Museum business, they are supporting NCSML mission by volunteering for Czech School, attending Sokol events, decorating eggs and ornaments, working with Czech Heritage, baking kolaches, supporting Czech Village merchants, attending community input meetings, teaching children the traditional dance and music of the Czech and Slovak culture, and helping clean NCSML flood-damaged property.

We look forward to contributions to the Kosek Museum's "Rising Above: The Story of a People and the Flood" and all other support we can lend to celebration of our beautiful cultural heritage.

Světlusky Ensemble Celebrates Czech, Moravian, Slovak Dance, Music

Světlušky (pronounced svyet-loosh-kee) is a youth ensemble that was formed in Cedar Rapids in 2007 to perform Czech, Moravian, and Slovak folk dances, folk songs, and instrumental folk music. Under the direction of Donna Merkle, the ensemble focuses on the older folk culture before the advent of modern brass bands.

The ensemble currently consists of 6 girls and 5 boys ranging in age from 8 to 18. Membership in the ensemble is by invitation only and requires at least two of the following talents: sing, dance, or play an instrument, preferably one typically found in a folk ensemble in the old country. Such instruments include violin, clarinet, viola, and bass. Other instruments often used are flute, recorder, pišťalka (penny whistle), bagpipes, or cimbál (hammered dulcimer).

Světlušky, which translates as "Fireflies", performs only to live music, which they provide themselves. Occasionally, the ensemble's director assists on the accordion. As the group expands and develops, the goal is for youth singers and dancers to be accompanied exclusively by youth musicians.

The ensemble's current costume is modeled after a folk group from the town of Klatovy in southern Bohemia, Czech Republic. Guenter Merkle has designed the costume patterns, and he and Karen Lehmann have volunteered many hours to do all the sewing. The girls' costumes are uniform yet individualized with the use of various colors, ribbons, and lace trims. The boys' vests are typical of this region, but their white shirts and black pants are American. These white shirts will eventually be replaced with a special folk-style white shirt, and the long black pants will eventually be replaced with yellow knee pants.

Once the Bohemian costumes are complete, the ensemble will be transformed. Their program material and costumes will go together, and it will no longer be possible to criss-cross regions. So, future undertakings will involve creating Moravian and Slovakian costumes to pair with Moravian and Slovakian folk songs and dances. It is hoped that the ensemble will be able to perform separate programs from each of these regions.

Of course, it takes money to make things happen. That is why Světlušky has become a 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation. This status allows the group to accept tax-deductible contributions and to apply for grants, Světlušky will continue to improve and expand, which we hope will continue to add value to the Czech community of Cedar Rapids.

Thank you for your continuing support of this vibrant and exciting ensemble, which was the featured program at the October NCSML Guild membership meeting.

The Velvet Revolution:
Then and Now

Dr. Prager related to the Guild his experience as a participant in the days before the independence of Czechoslovakia. He is Scholar-in-Residence at Mt. Mercy College. The undercurrents began to surface, as the government sent troops to confront the striking students. Dr. Prager described "happenings" that were occurring around the country. Life choices were extremely limited.

Dr. Prager told us the nature of communication at that time. There was no Internet or wide-spread telephone service. Within a month and three days of the public protests, Vaclav Havel was elected president of a new republic.

Dr. Prager ended his talk by telling the Guild members how the next twenty years brought exciting changes in the economy, culture, education and political systems.

As an aside, Dr. Prager mentioned that his story is included in students' history books, which his daughter reads in school! --Fern Fackler
