St. Wenceslaus Gym Building was the location this year, and it provided a fantastic spacious site for the Cookie Walk. The Gym was decorated with a tree, lights, tables decorations, and of course red tablecloths. The Guild officers prepared a warm and tasty light breakfast served for Guild volunteers before the 9:30 event opening. While volunteers were eating, patrons were waiting in the wings! The flux of patrons arrived between 9:30 and 10:45. And WHAT a selction of cookies arranged on the tables!!

At the start of the Cookie Walk, Svaty Mikuláš, along with the anděl and the čert, strolled strolled through the room. Donna Merkle provided music on her hammered dulcimer. She even let some budding musicians try the instrument. Heads were keeping rhythm, bodies were swaying, toes were tapping, and

voices joined in with the Czech Heritage Singers as they presented various holiday songs in Czech and English. There was even room for a Café with tables and chairs for patrons to enjoy coffee, cocoa, and cookies while listening to the music and enjoying the atmosphere.

Svetlusky (pronounced svyet-loosh-kee) means "Fireflies," and this youth ensemble, as the name implies is indeed spritely and brilliant as they perform Czech, Moravian, and Slovak instrumentatl folk music, folk songs, and folk dances.

Under the direction of Donna and Guenter Merkle since 2007, the ensemble is now a non-profit (501(c) (3) corporation. Membership is by invitation only, age 8 through high school. Fireflies sing, dance, or play traditional instruments. Donna is willing to help young musicians develop their skills. even if they are not quite ready to perform.

Costumes are now patterned after a region in Bohemia, but eventually will also be Moravian and Slovak. Fireflies has a rigorous practice and performance schedule, but they are eager to display their cultural music and accept numerous invitations.
