up, being a tour guide, receptionist and giving a helping hand in the gift shop. Dedication week brought a great opportunity that could not be passed up as the Dedication Pins' were well received by the public. A profit was made and the museum will benefit from this project as well.

Interest in the Czech community was visible with the guilds assistance at Houby Days, St. Joseph Dance, Ethnic Fest and St.Mikulas festivities.

By providing educational topics at guild meetings, we have completed our mission. We look forward to achieving more in 1996 in a variety of ways with enthusiasm and dedication.
