
THE TASTE OF CZECH (Slovak & American Too)

Committee Reports

In the fifth year of the Museum Guild, 1998, it continued to fulfill it's purpose as outlined in it's mission:

The Mission of the Museum Guild of the National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library by providing unpaid (A.) volunteers:, and other (B.) financial and charitable support, and to serve as an (C.) education al, service and social organization for persons interested in the National Czech & Slovak Museum & Library.

A. Volunteers

There is no way to really estimate the worth of the hundreds of hours recorded and unrecorded each year. The past several years the hours have been close to 5000 hours of recorded time. "The Top Twelve" volunteers (recorded hours) have worked long and dedicated hours include (Over 300 hours) Bob and Marge Stone, (Over 200 hours) Dolores Usher, Anne Reif and Marj Nejdl, (Over 100 hours) Barb Pulkrab, Irma Rozek, Lydia Elias, Inez Popelka, Irma Modracek, Milly Ortner and Zula Oujiri. Special talents of Marj Nejdl (artistic endeavors) and Terri Spahn (Newsletter editing and publishing) have also mounted top volunteer hours.

B. Financial and Charitable Support

The Museum Guild has had two dedicated leaders working on the development of an American and Czech/Slovak cookbook. Those two are Beula Dvorak and Susan Uthoff. The cookbook went to press in the summer and 1000 cookbooks arrived in time for the tasting party called "The Taste of Czech" held early in December. We also sold pens that had been a continuing project from the year before. Guild Members continued to give charitable gifts to the museum. The most memorable gifts were those given by Emil and Evelyn Lamparek.

C. Educational, Service and Social

Social hour at the monthly meetings of the Museum Guild along with many donations of food and organization of receptions have been handled aptly by Frank and Barb Edmunds and Irma Kelly. Top volunteer hours were logged by all three Guild members.

The year was started by a Valentine Day Dinner that was a thank you prepared and served by the Guild Officers of 1997.

Great programs were provided by Guild members. They included Leona Poduska (Czech School), Bob Stone (Alfons Mucha), and Sarah Uthoff (One Room Schools). We also enjoyed a visit to Shellsburg to the home of Inge Schminke discussing Austrian History and a Tour of the St. Peter and Paul's Church in Solon with a discussion of Early Czech History in this part of Iowa. Several Guild members also participated in a program on Czech and Slovak Treasures where they shared family treasures.


