Dear Dr. Kuhn:

Enclosed are the proposals you charged my committee with drafting toward achieving significant integration of minority groups at UMBC.

In the course of our discussions we found that four of the recommendations included in A Study in Integration by the Committee on Integration (University of Maryland, College Park, April 1969) were particularly in line with our own thinking. These recommendations appear in our report as II: A, 3; II: C; III: F; and IV: D.

The names of the student representatives have been omitted from the report because of their decision against participating on university committees until the Black Student Union was firmly recognized. I have, however, maintained communication with them and we both felt that it would be in the best interests of both the students and the committee that their names not appear on a completed document which they have neither seen nor to which they have fully contributed.

Let me add that I am sitting on the Recruitment task force of the Higher Education Council for Urban Affairs (HECUA), and if I can be of special service to the university in this capacity, please feel free to call on me.

I enjoyed this committee assignment and I hope our work will be a significant contribution toward integrating and strengthening UMBC.
