

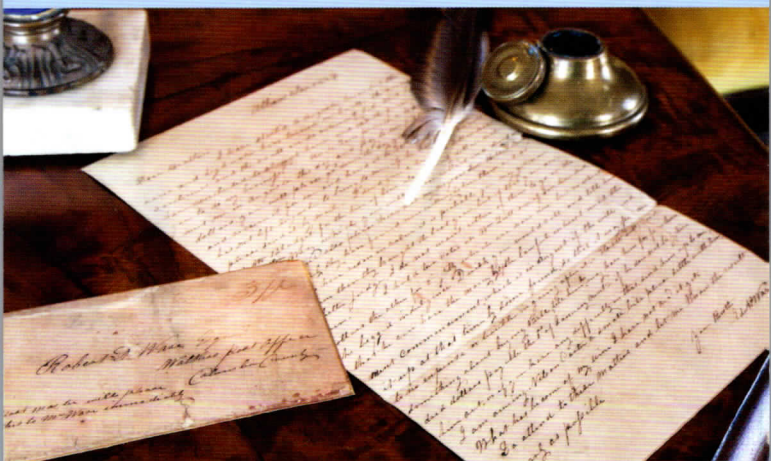

Athens, Georgia



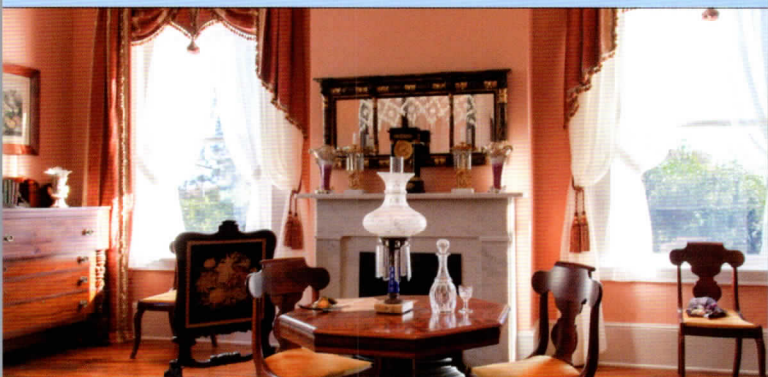
The Ware-Lyndon House, circa 1856, placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1976, is the only surviving building from the Lickskillet neighborhood of Athens, one of the most fashionable districts of its time. The Ware-Lyndon Historic House Museum is part of the Lyndon House Arts Center complex.



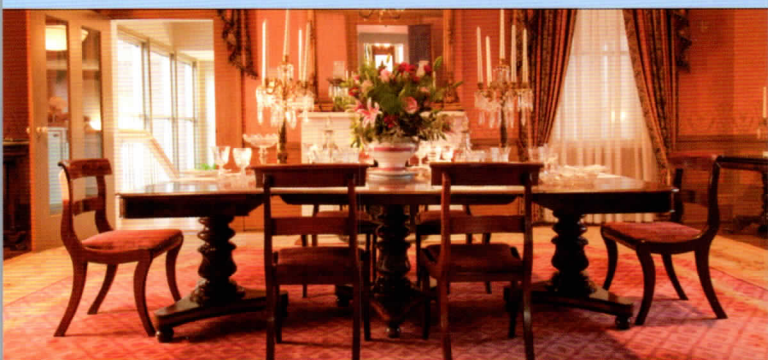

Built circa 1850, the two-story Ware-Lyndon Historic House architecture exhibits an excellent blend of 19th C. Italianate and Greek Revival styles. The original owner, Physician and Athens' first Mayor, Edward R. Ware sold the property to Dr. Edward S. Lyndon in 1880 and it remained a Lyndon family residence till the early 20th C. The first floor of the home features a dining room and double parlor housing one of the finest American furniture and decorative arts collections of the Victorian period in Georgia. The upstairs bedroom contains a fine Federal Style Bed and an Athens area antebellum wardrobe. The history room showcases memorabilia of the resident families and of Athens history. Visitors will enjoy the historically designed formal garden on the property.
