One style, represented in five cornices, incorporates an intricate valance motif with tassels, fringe, acorns on oak leaves and latticework. The frames have the original attachment eye hooks. Each:  $6\ 1/8"$  high x  $58\ 1/2"$  wide x 4" deep (typical).

The second style, represented in three narrower cornices, incorporates a Greek fret design with stylized valance border. Each: 3" high x 58 1/4" wide x 3 7/8" deep (typical).
