CONDITIONS GOVERNING LOAN OF OBJECTS TO THE LYNDON HOUSE ARTS FOUNDATION, INC.

CARE AND PRESERVATION

- The Lyndon House Arts Poundation, Inc. (hereafter LHAF) will give the same care and protection to borrowed
 objects as it does to comparable objects in its own collections.
- Evidence of damage at the time of receipt or during the LHAF's custody will be promptly reported to the Lender.
- The LHAF will not clean, repair, restore, conserve, or otherwise alter loaned objects without the Lender's
 written consent.
- The Lender certifies that the objects to be loaned are in good condition and able to withstand the ordinary strains of packing, shipping, and handling.

INSURANCE

- Unless otherwise noted, the LHAF will insure borrowed objects subject to policy terms and conditions. The
 Lender is responsible for providing a value for each object.
- If the Lender elects to provide his/her own insurance, any failure of the Lender to provide the agreed upon
 insurance constitutes a complete release of the LHAF from any liability for damage to or loss of the property
 placed on loan.
- If the Lender elects to waive insurance, this waiver constitutes a complete release of the LHAF from any liability arising from the loan.
- If a valuation is not provided by the Lender, the Lender shall agree to accept an insurance value set by the LHAF and that value is not to be considered an appraisal.

REPRODUCTION AND CREDIT

- Unless otherwise notified in writing by the Lender, the Center may photograph or reproduce by other conventional means, borrowed objects for educational, publication, and/or publicity purposes.
- At the Lender's request, any or all use of the borrowed object(s) will be prominently credited as the property of the Lender.
- It is understood that the general public may photograph objects while on exhibition only for non-commercial, educational purposes.

OWNERSHIP

- The Lender warrants full title as the sole owner of the object(s) listed on this agreement or as the legal representative of the owner(s).
- It is the responsibility of the Lender to give prompt notice to the Center if there is a change in ownership of the objects on loan or if there is a change in the identity or address of the Lender.

RETURN OF LOAN

- Unless otherwise notified in writing, the Center will release borrowed objects only to the Lender or his/her legal representative.
- Unless otherwise agreed upon in writing, the loan will terminate on the date specified in the loan agreement.
- . The Lender must give the LHAF, Inc. three months prior notice in writing for the recall of a loan.
- Loans may be withdrawn from an exhibition by LHAF Board at its discretion.
- If LHAF, Inc. is unable to contact the Lender within one month following the expiration of the loan period, and no special arrangements have been made in writing for the return of the work, then the loan will be placed in storage at the Lender's risk and expense. If the Foundation's effort to return the borrowed object(s) is unsuccessful, then at then end of five years following the expiration date, the Foundation reserves the right to deem the loaned property an unrestricted gift and claim title.
