ENGLISH is the base of our education

To produce creative and communicative individuals is the aim of the English department. Having set their goal, the department attempts to achieve it by encouraging students to take more than the required three years of English. In their desire to capture the interest of all students, Drama, English Literature, Journalism, Creative Writing, and Public Speaking courses are offered in addition to the three tract program which provides for the varying degrees of proficiency in English.

As an innovation this year, the lay reader has been added to the English staff. A lay reader assists the teacher in correcting themes, and permits the teacher to assign more themes.

Team teaching, on an experimental basis this year, is another way to help the student receive maximum knowledge from his English course. In this system, each teacher lectures on a subject with which he is most familiar. Team teaching permits the student to see and interpret the subject from several points of view.

Thus the English department offers a comprehensive, diversified program to all students.


## MATH solves the problems of tomorrow

With the increased stress on math in America today, the math department has accelerated its pace. Honors sections in Algebra, Plane and Solid Geometry, Trigonometry, and Math Analysis are offered to students who excel in these fields. Such courses are taught with the idea of analyzing and probing into the whys and hows of mathematical problems. Students not bound for advanced college math courses take either General Math or Algebra 1; most of them go on to take Plane Geometry and Algebra 3. These courses provide the basic math knowledge necessary for everyday living while developing logical, orderly ways of thinking.

## SCIENCE opens new worlds

Emphasis on scientific studies has become increasingly important in this competitive day and age. Niles offers a diversified program enabling students to develop a broad and varied background of knowledge. Students can study the convertional General Science, Biology, Physics, and Chemistry or elect others such as Botany, Physiology, or Zoology.

The talented students can participate in the advanced placement program starting in their freshman year. Those students receive honor points, added points to their grade. This year Nilehi is one of nine Chicago area schools working in the CHEM program, an experimental Chemistry program stressing the lab work of the individual student. This new approach is offered to the average as well as advanced student.

## SOCIAL STUDIES holds the key to man's past and future

There is a saying that history repeats itself. Whether this saying is true or not, students at Niles have many opportunities to study the cause and effect of ancient problems and relate them to today's problems. Course such as Freshman Social Studies, Senior Social Studies, World History, and United States History help develop this skill. For students who wish to delve into history on a deeper level, honors World History and advanced placement United States and European History are offered. The last two courses can be taken for college credit. Niles diversifies its social studies curriculum by offering Psychology, Sociology, Family Living, Economics, and Latin American History. Such course diversity develops a student who is well-rounded and intelligent.

## FOREIGN LANGUAGE increases world understanding

The foreign language department at Niles is using many new devices and methods to teach language more effectively. The department studies both the language and customs of Spain, France, Germany, Russia, and Rome, with its invaluable heritage. In addition to classroom work, students go to the language lab once a week where tape recorders and recorded lessons increase speed and comprehension. This year, Nilehi has been experimenting with oral teaching and learning. Oral teaching is concerned primarily with the language as it is actually spoken in the foreign country. With the aid of modern, up-to-date equipment in the lab and a fine teaching staff, the foreign language department at Nilehi is giving more students the motivation to work toward world peace through better understanding.

Vocational courses offered to students at Niles prepare them for vocations after high school. Such courses cover skills ranging from those applied to the home to those which give opportunities in Industrial Arts.

The boys participating in these vocational courses receive competent instruction in creative work done with their hands. Instruction is given in Architectural and Industrial Drawing, Auto Shop, Electricity, Metals, Printing, and Woods. The experience they receive in operating welding and lathe machines, or in learing to design a house will become important assets to these boys in their future positions.

Future homemakers learn how to cook and sew properly on the modern facilities in the home economics room. Upon completion of the clothing and foods courses, they can go on to courses which provide training in home management and furnishing. These two vocational fields provide opportunities for those students who would otherwise be deprived of an equal chance for success.

## DRIVER EDUCATION teaches the skills for safe driving

Developing the knowledge, skills, and attitudes that make safe drivers are the aims of the Driver Education department's three phase program. In the first phase all students are required to take six weeks of classroom instruction in their sophomore year. In the second phase, students receive 14 hours of the Aetna Drivo-trainer. In this phase, traffic situations are simulated on a movie screen as the students drive stationary cars. During the last phase, the students receive 14 hours of driving behind the wheel. A rigorous course has been devised to give the student driver practice in driving in all types of traffic and situations. This three phase program has taught many students how to be good, safe drivers.

Dr. LeRoy Peterson Director: Special Education


An effective special education program on the elementary level results in a smaller number of exceptional pupils who need special education at the secondary level. A number of handicapped students are able to adjust and carry on their programs in the regular classes without any special facilities or special teaching methods and techniques. However, there are still a number of pupils who do need special education if they are to achieve to their optimum.

At the present time, the following types of exceptionality are receiving special education services on the high school level:
A. pupils with severe hearing difficulties.
B. pupils who are homebound temporarily due to illness, surgery, or results of accidents.
C. pupils who are educable mentally handicapped.
D. pupils with adjustment difficulties which are interfering with their learning.
Special education facilities and services will be extended after there is found to be a need.
